LAST GAME: The D-backs capped a 4-2 road trip against division rivals with a series-finale, 9-1 win @ Padres
$\bullet$ Ryne Nelson got the win with 6.2 innings and 1 runs on 3 hits and 1 walk with 5 strikeouts.

- Eugenio Suárez had a career-high-tying 5 RBI (fifth time) with a go-ahead, 2 -run homer in the seventh inning and a bases-loaded, 3-run double as part of a 5-run ninth inning.

- Is 1 of 5 players (3 first basemen) since 2022 with 85+ homers and 250+ RBI (also: Aaron Judge/NYY, Pete Alonso/NYM, Matt Olson/ATL and Shohei Ohtani/LAD).
- Hit 2 homers on June 13 vs. Angels, the second of which traveled 464 feet, the D-backs' longest this season and the longest by any player this season at Chase Field.
- His 142 homers trail Steve Finley (153) for third on the club's all-time list.
