2025 HIGHLIGHTS

NEARLY 2.4 MILLION FANS: The D-backs posted back-to-back seasons of 2.3+ million fans in attendance at Chase Field and this season's 2,393,773 was the largest home attendance since 2008, fourth largest since 2003 and ninth all-time...1998 (3,604,237), 2002 (3,198,975), 1999 (3,015,948), 2000 (2,942,251), 2003 (2,805,542), 2001 (2,735,821), 2004 (2,519,560) and 2008 (2,509,058), 2025 (2,393,773).

80+ WINS: The D-backs had their third consecutive 80+-win season (also: 89 in 2024 and 84 in 2023) for the first time since 2017-19...also: 2011-13 (3 seasons) and 1999-2003 (5 seasons).

THE RESURGENCE: Following the trade deadline, from August 1-Sept. 25 (prior to the final weekend), the D-backs' 29-21 (.580) record ranked third in the NL and sixth in the Majors to the Mariners (32-17, .653), Phillies (33-18, .647), Brewers (32-19, .627), Guardians (32-19, .627) and Yankees (31-19, .620).

- The D-backs' last 31 games (16-15) included all 3 NL division winners (@ Brewers, @ Dodgers, vs. Phillies, vs. Dodgers), NL Wild Card qualifier (@ Padres), AL Wild Card qualifier (vs. Red Sox) and 2 teams in the thick of the Wild Card Race at the time (vs. Rangers, @ Giants, vs. Giants).

LATE CHASE IN NL WILD CARD RACE: The D-backs trailed by 10.0 games in the NL Wild Card race on August 1 and climbed all the way back to 1.0 game from the third spot heading into the final 4 games.

- Eliminated from playoff contention after a 7-4 loss in game 160 on Friday, Sept. 20 @ Padres.

PERDOMO'S MVP-CALIBER CAMPAIGN: **Geraldo Perdomo's** 7.0 bWAR (Baseball-Reference.com) led the NL and finished fourth in the Majors to Aaron Judge/NYY (9.7), Cal Raleigh/SEA (7.3) and Bobby Witt Jr./KC (7.1).

- Perdomo's** 7.1 fWAR (FanGraphs.com) was second in the NL to Shohei Ohtani/LAD (7.5) and ahead of Trea Turner/PHI (6.7) and **Corbin Carroll**/AZ (6.5).
- Third D-back all-time with a season 7.0+ bWAR (Baseball-Reference.com): Paul Goldschmidt (8.3 in 2015) and Luis Gonzalez (7.9 in 2001).

CARROLL CHARTER MEMBER OF 30+-HR / 30+-SB SEASON: **Corbin Carroll** became the first D-back ever to record 30+ homers and 30+ stolen bases in a season.

PERDOMO WINS 2025 LUIS GONZALEZ AWARD: **Geraldo Perdomo** won his second straight Luis Gonzalez Award...recognizes the player who best exemplifies the talents, spirit and heart of the D-backs legend both on and off the field, including baseball accomplishments, community impact and fan engagement.

ALL-MLB: **Corbin Carroll** (OF), **Ketel Marte** (2B) and **Geraldo Perdomo** (SS) appeared on the 2025 All-MLB Team ballot, recognizing the top players at each position during the regular season, with both First Team and Second Team honors.

CARROLL NAMED D-BACKS ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD NOMINEE:

On **September 15**, **Corbin Carroll** was named the D-backs' 2025 Roberto Clemente Award nominee...given annually to each player who represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy, and positive contributions, both on and off the field.

HANK AARON AWARD FINALISTS: **Corbin Carroll** (.259 AVG, 31 HR, 84 RBI, .884 OPS) and **Geraldo Perdomo** (.290 AVG, 20 HR, 100 RBI, .851 OPS) were named among the 10 National League finalists for MLB's 2025 Hank Aaron Award, an honor that recognizes the most outstanding regular season offensive performer in each League.

TRIO OF ALL-STARS: The D-backs All-Stars announced were 2B **Ketel Marte** (starting 2B), 3B **Eugenio Suárez** (reserve) and OF **Corbin Carroll** (reserve) at the MLB All-Star Game on July 15 in Atlanta.

FIRST D-BACK SHORTSTOP WITH A 20/100 SEASON: **Geraldo Perdomo** became the first D-back shortstop in franchise history with a 20-homer, 100-RBI season...collected his 100th RBI in his final at-bat on Sept. 28.

KENDRICK HONORED IN DC: On **April 4-5**, **Ken Kendrick** was honored at the 78th Annual Horatio Alger Award Induction Ceremonies in Washington, D.C...the Horatio Alger Award is bestowed upon exceptional leaders who have triumphed over adversity to achieve greatness...recipients personify the American Dream and their life experiences are proof that, with perseverance and unwavering belief, anything is possible in our country through the free-enterprise system.

HALL PRESENTED 61 NON-PROFITS WITH INAUGURAL GRANTS: On **April 25**, the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation honored 61 non-profit organizations who received an inaugural **Derrick Hall President's Circle Grant**.

- In total, in 2024, the local organizations received a combined \$303,400 for programming expenses, initiatives and a variety of education and youth mentoring programs.

HOUSE BILL 2704 BILL PASSES: On **June 27**, Governor Katie Hobbs officially signed House Bill 2704 into law, and on **September 3** at Chase Field, **Derrick Hall** with Governor Hobbs and dignitaries celebrated an exciting new chapter for Major League Baseball in Arizona during a special ceremony.

- The historic public-private partnership, signed through the leadership of Representative Jeff Weninger (R-Chandler) and the support of Governor Hobbs, created a funding mechanism to modernize, renovate and preserve an Arizona landmark, securing the D-backs' home in downtown Phoenix for another 30 years and guaranteeing an enhanced fan experience for generations to come.

2025 EVENING ON THE DIAMOND RAISES \$3.3 MILLION: On **March 22**, the D-backs celebrated and raised \$3.3 million to help make an impact in the Arizona community at their annual fundraising gala, "Evening on the Diamond," at Chase Field.

50-50 RECORD RAFFLES: The D-backs Give Back 50/50 Raffle supported by Avnet Cares generated a record \$5.6+ million, highlighted by a single-game record \$560,331 on Father's Day **June 15**.

D-BACKS RBI TEAM WINS WORLD SERIES: The D-backs Nike RBI Senior Baseball team won the Nike RBI Senior Baseball World Series Championship at the Jackie Robinson Training Complex (**August 4-10**) in Vero Beach, Fla. after defeating Indy Nike RBI 5-4 in walk-off fashion...the D-backs went undefeated (10-0) in the tournament.

D-BACKS.TV AND 12NEWS OVER-THE-AIR BROADCAST: D-backs games were broadcast for the second straight season on DBACKS.TV and, for the first time, in partnership with 12News, simulcast 10 over-the-air games.

JOE GARAGIOLA JR. INDUCTED INTO ARIZONA SPORTS HALL OF FAME: On **April 10**, **Joe Garagiola Jr.**, the D-backs' first general manager who helped lead the franchise to its first World Series in 2001, was inducted as a member of the 2024-25 Arizona Sports Hall of Fame class at Chateau Luxe in Phoenix.

- 8-member class: Arizona Diamondbacks' former GM and current Senior Director of Special Projects Joe Garagiola Jr., Arizona Cardinals owner Michael Bidwill, former Olympic and Arizona State swimmer Melissa Belote Ripley, former University of Arizona and NBA basketball player Mike Bibby, former U.S. Women's National Team soccer player and Mesa native Julie Ertz, former University of Arizona football standout Ricky Hunley, former MLB player and Scottsdale Chaparral alum Paul Konerko, and the late Matt Shott, former Sr. Director of Amateur Hockey Development for Arizona Coyotes.

PERDOMO NAMED D-BACKS HEART & HUSTLE AWARD WINNER: On **August 5**, **Geraldo Perdomo** was named the D-backs’ Heart & Hustle Award winner, announced by the Major League Baseball Players Alumni Association (MLBPAA)...the annual award is given to active players who exemplify a true passion for the game and who best embody the values, spirit, and traditions of the game.

DYNAMIC DUO: **Geraldo Perdomo** (20 HR, 27 SB) and **Corbin Carroll** (31 HR, 32 SB) were the third D-backs' teammates to each record 20+ homers with 25+ stolen bases, joining Paul Goldschmidt (24 HR, 32 SB)/Jean Segura (20 HR, 33 SB) in 2016 and Eric Byrnes (21 HR, 50 SB/ Chris Young (32 HR, 27 SB) in 2007.

- Were 1 of 4 pairs in MLB in 2025 to each record 20+ homers with 25+ stolen bases (also: Randy Arozarena and Julio Rodríguez/SEA, Pete Crow-Armstrong and Kyle Tucker/CHC and Francisco Lindor and Juan Soto/NYM).

CARROLL CHARTER MEMBER OF 30+-HR / 30+-SB SEASON: **Corbin Carroll** became the first D-back ever to record 30+ homers and 30+ stolen bases in a season.

- Became the 11th player in MLB history to accomplish a 30+-homer, 30+-stolen base campaign in their age 24 season or younger, joining Bobby Witt Jr./KC (2023-24), Julio Rodríguez/ SEA (2023), Ronald Acuña Jr./ATL (2019), Mike Trout/LAA (2012), Hanley Ramírez/FLA (2008), David Wright/NYM (2007), Alex Rodríguez/SEA (1998), Sammy Sosa/CHC (1993), José Canseco/OAK (1988) and Bobby Bonds/SF (1969).

- This year, MLB set a record with 7 players with 30+- HR/30+-SB seasons.

25+-HOMER, 75+-RBI SEASONS: **Corbin Carroll** became the 10th D-back all-time to record 2+ seasons of 25+ homers and 75+ RBI (2023, '25), joining Luis Gonzalez (5 seasons, 1999-2003), Paul Goldschmidt (4 seasons, 2013, '15, '17-18), Christian Walker (3 seasons, 2022-24), Ketel Marte (3 seasons, 2019, '23-24), Mark Reynolds (3 seasons, 2008-10), Steve Finley (3 seasons, 1999-2000, '02), Eugenio Suárez (2 seasons, 2024-25), Jake Lamb (2 seasons, 2016-17) and Justin Upton (2 seasons, 2009, '11).

MOST DANGEROUS 1-2 COMBO IN THE MAJORS: D-backs' 1-2 batter combination ranked best in the Majors in OBP (.366), SLG (.522), OPS (.888), extra-base hits (157), triples (18) and total bases (677)...also ranked in RBI (2nd, 199), AVG (2nd, .276), homers (3rd, 72) and walks (4th, 167).

- Batting First as starter: **Corbin Carroll** (72 G/340 PA), **Ketel Marte** (40 G/186 PA), **Geraldo Perdomo** (49 G/226 PA), **Tim Tawa** (1 G/5 PA)

TRIPLE PRODUCERS: The D-backs' 38 triples led the Majors, ahead of the Rockies (37) and Tigers (36).

START ME UP: From **August 27-end of season**, the D-backs starting rotation ranked among MLB in quality starts (2nd, 17), innings (T-4th, 162.1), ERA (6th, 3.55), opponent OPS (8th, .679), runs allowed (T-8th, 70) and starter wins (T-9th, 16).

ALL-TIME SEASON OFFENSE: The D-backs offense ranked in franchise history in OPS+ (2nd, 108), hit-by-pitches (2nd, 81), sacrifice flies (2nd, 64), home runs (4th, 214), extra-base hits (T-5th, 529), SLG (6th, .433), stolen bases (6th, 121), RBI (7th, 768), OPS (T-7th, .757), runs (8th, 791), runs per game (8th, 4.88), average hitter age (T-10th youngest, 27.8) and walks (11th, 545).

TRIO OF ALL-STARs: The D-backs All-Stars announced were 2B **Ketel Marte** (starting 2B), 3B **Eugenio Suárez** (reserve) and OF **Corbin Carroll** (reserve) at the MLB All-Star Game on July 15 in Atlanta.

2B Ketel Marte - Fan-Elected Starter:

- Led NL players in Phase 2 voting
- Second straight and third career start at second base (also: 2019, '24)
- First NL second baseman with consecutive fan-elected starts since Chase Utley with 5 straight from 2006-10
- First D-back with 3 fan-elected starts, second with 3 starts (also: Paul Goldschmidt) and third with consecutive starts (also: Paul Goldschmidt in 2014-15 and Randy Johnson in 2000-01)
- 3 All-Star appearances are tied for fourth in team history with Zack Greinke and Brandon Webb behind Paul Goldschmidt (6), Luis Gonzalez (5) and Randy Johnson (5)

3B Eugenio Suárez - Player-Elected INF Reserve:

- 2-time All-Star (also: 2018 with the Reds, player-elected at 3B)

OF Corbin Carroll - Player-Elected OF Reserve:

- 2-time All-Star (also: 2023 as fan-elected starter in LF)
- 12th D-back with multiple All-Star selections, joining Paul Goldschmidt (6), Luis Gonzalez (5), Randy Johnson (5), Zack Greinke (3), Brandon Webb (3), Ketel Marte (3), Patrick Corbin (2), Dan Haren (2), Miguel Montero (2), Curt Schilling (2) and Justin Upton (2).

ALL-STAR RECAP: **Ketel Marte** (starting 2B), **Corbin Carroll** (reserve OF) and **Eugenio Suárez** (reserve 3B) - were key contributors in a historic evening in Atlanta to help lead the National League to victory.

- Marte** (1-2, 2B, 2 RBI) became the first D-back with multiple RBI in an All-Star Game, as well as the first D-back with a RBI since Luis Gonzalez in 2005 @ Comerica Park (Detroit)...the now 3-time All-Star hit safely in each of his All-Star appearances and is tied with Devon White (3) for second all-time in All-Star hits, trailing only Gonzalez (4).
- Carroll** (1-1, HR, RBI) is the first D-back to hit a home run in the All-Star Game, with a solo home run off Tigers' RHP Casey Mize to also mark his first career All-Star hit...entering the game, Arizona was the only team to never record a home run in an All-Star Game.
- Suárez** (0-1, HBP) entered the game at third base in the fifth inning and had a high-light-reel barehanded play for the first out of the ninth inning...he was hit by a pitch in his second plate appearance which removed him from consideration for the end-of-game Home Run Derby.

FRANCHISE-HIGH 65 PLAYERS USED: The D-backs featured a franchise-high 65 total players (23 position, 42 pitchers), ahead of 2021 (64) and 2022 (57)...tied for third most used by a team this season (also: Angels), behind the Braves (71) and Orioles (70).

- The D-backs tied their franchise record with 42 different pitchers used (also: 2021).
- The D-backs 9 starting pitchers tied for their sixth fewest in franchise history (also: 2007, '12-13)...they used 6 in 1999, 7 in 2002 and 8 in 2020, 2008 and 2005.
- Their 12 rookie pitchers used ranked third in franchise history, behind 2021 (16) and 2016 (13).

HOME SWEET HOME: The D-backs’ 43-38 (.531) home record finished tied for their fourth-best home mark with 2023, behind 2017 (52-29, .642), 2019 (44-37, .543), 2024 (44-37, .543).

- It was their fifth winning season at home in the last 8 seasons, since 2017 (excl. 2020).

AMONG MLB'S BEST: Prior to the trade deadline, the D-backs ranked among MLB in sacrifice flies (1st, 42), triples (2nd, 26), extra-base hits (T-3rd, 366), sacrifice hits (T-3rd, 22), OPS (4th, .759), SLG (4th, .436), doubles (5th, 191), walks (5th, 377), runs (6th, 528), total bases (6th, 1,604), home runs (7th, 149), OBP (7th, .323) and hit-by-pitches (T-7th, 51).

- Since August 1, the D-backs ranked among MLB in sacrifice flies (T-1st, 22), sacrifice hits (2nd, 15), hit-by-pitches (2nd, 30), triples (T-2nd, 12), AVG (6th, .257), hits (6th, 463), OBP (6th, .327), stolen bases (7th, 50) and runs (8th, 263).

SUÁREZ COLLECTS 4 NL PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS: **Eugenio Suárez** earned his first 4 career NL Player of the Week awards this season to become the first D-back to win more than twice in a season and third-ever MLB player to win 4 in a season, joining J.D. Martinez (2017 DET/AZ) and Shohei Ohtani (2024 LAD).

- His opening week award (first of his career) marked the second consecutive season (and second occurrence all-time) a D-back was selected in the opening week of the season (also: Lourdes Gurriel Jr., March 28-31, 2024).
- It was the first time since 2001 that Arizona won (as a team) at least 4 awards in a season and third time overall (5 in 2001, 6 in 1999).

CARROLL'S SECOND STRAIGHT 30-20-10 SEASON: **Corbin Carroll** joined Bobby Witt Jr./KC (2023-24), Andy Van Slyke (1987-88) and Willie Mays (1957-58) as the only other players in MLB history to have 30+ stolen bases, 20+ home runs and 10+ triples in consecutive seasons [OptaSTATS].

BIG GAME KETEL: **Ketel Marte's** 20 home runs (18 go-ahead, 2 game-tying) that either tied the game or gave the lead at any point were third most in the NL, behind Kyle Schwarber/PHI (26 - 19 go-ahead, 7 tying) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (23 - 17 go-ahead, 6 tying)

- His 20 homers to tie the game or give the D-backs the lead were fourth in franchise history, behind Paul Goldschmidt's 23 in 2018, Matt Williams' 22 in 1999 and Goldschmidt's 22 in 2013.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE: 2 D-backs hit 10 years of MLB service time this season: **Eduardo Rodriguez** on July 6 and **Kendall Graveman** on June 28.

VICTORIES VS. NL WEST: The D-backs finished with a 26-26 (.500) record vs. NL West, their third straight season with a .500 or better record vs. their division (also: 2024/28-24 and 2023/29-23)...marked the third time in franchise history with 3+ straight seasons of a .500+ record vs. NL West along with 2017-19 (3) and 1999-2002 (4).

OPS LEADERBOARD: **Ketel Marte's** (.893) and **Corbin Carroll's** (.883) OPS marks ranked seventh and eighth, respectively, in the Majors:

MLB RECORD NUMBER OF PITCHERS WITH A SAVE: The D-backs’ 17 different pitchers with a save set a Major League record, surpassing 14 pitchers by the 2024 Dodgers and 2021 Rays.

- The D-backs' **9 pitchers with 2+ saves** finished as the most all-time since 1969 (*when saves became an official stat*).
- The D-backs’ **6 pitchers with 3+ saves** tied for second most all-time since 1969 with the 2025 Marlins, 2022 Rays, 2021 Reds, 1992 Braves, 1991 Brewers, 1991 Pirates, 1990 Pirates, 1984 Mariners, 1983 Athletics, 1973 Braves, 1980 Angels and 1970 Indians...the record is 7 pitchers set by the 2003 Tigers [source: Elias Sports Bureau]:

200+--HOMER SEASON: With their 214 homers, the D-backs reached 200+ homers for a second consecutive season (also: 211 in 2024), the first occurrence of back-to-back 200+--homer seasons in franchise history...their 214 homers were fourth in a season in franchise history, behind 2017 (220 HR), 2019 (220 HR) and 1999 (216 HR).

- The D-backs' 214 homers tied for eighth most in the Majors, behind the Yankees (274), Dodgers (244), Mariners (238), Angels (226), Mets (224), Cubs (223) and Athletics (219).

GRAND SLAMS: The D-backs' 9 grand slams tied for most in the Majors (also: Yankees) and tied for second most in franchise history (also: 2001), behind their 11 in 2024.

- The 9 grand slams were produced by 6 different D-back players: **Eugenio Suárez** (3), **Geraldo Perdomo** (2), **Josh Naylor** (1), **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** (1), **Gabriel Moreno** (1) and **Corbin Carroll** (1)
- **Eugenio Suárez's** 3 grand slams tied for the most by a D-back in a season with Paul Goldschmidt/2013.
- The D-backs' 20 grand slams since 2024 are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Yankees (15).
- The D-backs' 20 grand slams in 2024-25 tied for the sixth-most in a 2-season span in the Majors since 1998 with the 1998-99 Guardians, 2000-01 Athletics, 2023-24 Dodgers, behind 23 by the 1999-00 Guardians, 22 by the 1999-00 Athletics and 21 by the 1999-00 Mariners, 2011-12 Yankees and 2010-11 Yankees.
- May 8-9 vs. Dodgers was the second time in franchise history the D-backs hit a grand slam in consecutive games, both instances happening vs. Dodgers (last: Sept. 27-28, 2011 - Ryan Roberts / Cole Gillespie).
- The D-backs' became only the fourth team since 1920 to hit 6 grand slams thru the first 39 games (also: 2020 Padres, 2018 Red Sox and 1996 Expos).

LOUD CONTACT: Since 2015 (Statcast Era), the 2025 D-backs posted team season bests in hard-hit AVG (.210, prev. .196 in 2024), hard hits (1,163, prev. 1,093 in 2024), hard outs (448, prev. 388 in 2023) and barrel pct. (20.1, prev. 19.7 in 2016).

SHUT 'EM OUT: The D-backs collected 9 shutouts this season.

- Also marked the first time in franchise history where they recorded 5+ stolen bases thru the first 4.0 innings of a game...was the first time the D-backs reached 5+ stolen bases in a game since Aug. 6, 2023 @ Twins (8 SB).

HISTORICAL SLUGFEST @ WRIGLEY: April 18 @ Cubs featured a historic slugfest @ Wrigley Field in the D-backs' 13-11 loss:

- The combined 16-run eighth inning was a franchise record for most combined runs by the D-backs and their opponent in an inning.
 - It was the fifth occurrence in franchise history of 13+ combined runs in an inning (where each team scores at least a run) and first time since 2006.
- The D-backs' 10-run eighth inning marked the fifth occurrence in franchise history and second all-time on the road...last occurrence was March 20, 2024 vs. Rockies (14 runs in third inn.)...last occurrence on the road was June 21, 2017 @ Rockies (10 runs in fourth inn.).
- **Per @OptaSTATS:** It was the first MLB game with 6 homers, 2 grand slams, all 4 types of a hit (1B/2B/3B/HR), all 4 types of home run (solo/2-run/3-run/GS) and 3 half-innings of 5+ runs...and it all happened in 2.0 innings (seventh and eighth).
- **Per Cubs PR:** The 16 combined runs in the eighth inning set a Wrigley Field record for most combined runs in an inning, topping the 15 combined runs by the Cubs and Phillies on Aug. 25, 1922 in the fourth inning (*Wrigley Field opened in 1914 and became the Cubs' home in 1916*).
- **Per Elias Sports Bureau:** The last time 2 teams combined for 16+ runs in an inning was May 5, 2016 when the Rockies @ Giants combined for 17 runs in the fifth inning.
- **Per Cubs' Historian Ed Hartig:** The Cubs and D-backs combined 21 runs over 2.0 innings between the seventh and eighth tied the Cubs' record for most runs scored over 2.0 consecutive innings (also: Sept. 4, 1893, Cubs vs. Baltimore at the West Side Grounds in Chicago).

600 CLUB FOR LOVULLO: On **April 30** @ Mets, **Torey Lovullo** sealed his 600th career managerial win to become the 12th active skipper to reach the feat (124th all-time)...the last active manager to reach the feat was Aaron Boone/NYY on Sept. 22, 2024.

CARROLL'S APRIL HOMER SHOWERS: **Corbin Carroll's** career-high 9 homers in April tied for the most in MLB for the month (also: Mike Trout/LAA and Cal Raleigh/SEA).

- Became the sixth D-back all-time to hit 9+ homers in April, joining A.J. Pollock (9 in 2018), Kelly Johnson (9 in 2010), Richie Sexson (9 in 2004), Luis Gonzalez (13 in 2001) and Steve Finley (9 in 2000).

- First-ever Venezuelan-born player and second Latin American-born player to accomplish the feat (also: Carlos Delgado in 2003).
- At 33 years and 282 days old, became the oldest player to reach the feat, ahead of Chuck Klein (31 and 277) in 1936.
- Third player in MLB history to hit 4 homers in a game in April, joining Hall of Famers Willie Mays in 1961 and Mike Schmidt in 1976.
- Fifth player since 1998 to homer in 4 straight plate appearances in a game (also: Martinez/2017, Scooter Gennett/2017, Delgado/2003 and Mike Cameron/2002) and seventh player overall since 1998.

4-HOMER GAMES: On **April 26**, the D-backs (2x) became the fourth franchise with multiple individual 4-homer games, joining Phillies (3x), Braves (3x) and Dodgers (2x)...those 3 teams began playing before 1900 whereas the D-backs began in 1998.

- **Torey Lovullo** became the first manager in MLB history to have multiple players hit 4 home runs in a game (Eugenio Suárez in 2025 and J.D. Martinez in 2017).

SUÁREZ INCLUDED IN MLB HISTORY: **Eugenio Suárez** was the 19th player in MLB history and first of 3 players this season to hit 4 homers in a game, followed by Nick Kurtz/ATH (July 25) and Kyle Schwarber/PHI (Aug. 28)...it was the first-ever MLB season with multiple 4-homer performances.

BULLPEN PERFORMANCE: **May 31** marked the fourth time in franchise history where the D-backs bullpen tossed 9.0 innings and allowed 3 runs or fewer in a 9.0-inning game (last: April 30, 2024 vs. Dodgers).

- **Brandon Pfaadt** started the game (0.0 IP, 8 BF)...followed by relievers **Scott McGough** (3 ER in 1.0 IP), **Jeff Brigham** (0 ER in 2.0 IP), **Ryne Nelson** (0 ER in 4.0 IP), **Kendall Graveman** (0 ER in 1.0 IP) and **Shelby Miller** (0 ER in 1.0 IP).

MAY DEFENSE STREAK: The D-backs had a season-long 95.0-inning error-less streak (May 13 in seventh to May 26 in the eighth), the fifth longest in franchise history, behind 166.1 (July 14-Aug. 7, 2024), 123.1 (Aug. 22-Sept. 7, 2014), 114.0 (May 26-June 10, 2012) and 109.1 (April 20-May 3, 2013).

HISTORIC COMEBACK @ BRAVES: The comeback on **June 5** @ Braves was the D-backs first win all-time when trailing by 6+ runs entering the ninth inning (previously 0-418).

- The D-backs entered the top of the ninth inning down 10-4 and scored 7 unanswered runs after sending 12 batters to the plate...with 1 out, they manufactured 4 runs on a **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** solo homer (1), **Tim Tawa** walk, **Alek Thomas** 2-run homer (2), **Jose Herrera** walk, **Corbin Carroll** double and **Ketel Marte** single (1)...with 2 outs, they scored 3 more on an **Ildemaro Vargas** single (1) followed by an **Eugenio Suárez** go-ahead double (2).
- It was their largest comeback win since July 29, 2024 vs. Nationals (6 runs, won 9-8 after trailing 8-2 in mid sixth) and tied their second-largest comeback win in franchise history (12th time).

July 18, 2001 @ Padres (suspended in Top 3 after a pair of electrical explosions knocked out the LF lights of Qualcomm Stadium), resumed July 19, 2001 - D-backs won 3-0: Randy Johnson, in his 10th career relief appearance, had 16 strikeouts with 1 hit allowed over 7.0 innings after he took over for Curt Schilling (0 ER in 2.0 IP).

JUNE OPS LEADERS: **Eugenio Suárez** (5th, 1.082) and **Ketel Marte** (6th, 1.064) finished among NL OPS leaders in June [min. 90 PA]...the D-backs were 1 of 3 NL clubs with multiple players in the top 10 June leaders (also: Braves and Cubs).

KETEL 115.0+ MPH EXIT VELO: On **Sept. 2**, **Ketel Marte** became the only MLB player this season to log multiple hits in the same game with an exit velocity of 115.0+ MPH (119.6 MPH double in first inning and 115.4 MPH homer in seventh inning)...first player to have multiple 115.0+ MPH hits in a game since Oneil Cruz/PIT (2 hits on May 21, 2024 vs. Giants and 3 hits on May 13, 2024 @ Brewers).

- Eugenio Suárez's 111.7 MPH home run exit velocity was the sixth-hardest hit homer on Opening Day under Statcast (since 2015), behind Giancarlo Stanton/NYY (116.3, 2022), Jorge Soler/KC (113.4, 2021), Tommy Edman/STL (112.6, 2022), Yordan Alvarez/HOU (111.9, 2023) and Vladimir Guerrero Jr./TOR (111.8, 2024)... it was also Suárez's third hardest hit homer under Statcast (since 2015) and his hardest-hit batted ball since 111.9 MPH (home run) on Sept. 24, 2021 [h/t @SlangsOnSports].
- Ketel Marte, with his 2 hits, has 11 total on Opening Days with Arizona, the most in franchise history, ahead of 8 by Steve Finley, Luis Gonzalez, A.J. Pollock, Christian Walker and Miguel Montero [source: Sportradar].

GALLEN WITH THE OPENING NOD: Zac Gallen became just the fifth D-back to start 3 consecutive season-openers to tie Madison Bumgarner (2020-22), Zack Greinke (2016-17, '19) and Ian Kennedy (2011-2013) for third most, behind Randy Johnson (6, 1999-2004) and Brandon Webb (4, 2006-09).

- Gallen became the first Arizona right-hander to start consecutive Opening Days since Greinke in 2016-17.

SECOND-LARGEST OPENING DAY ATTENDANCE @ CHASE FIELD: The 49,070 attendance marked the second-largest Opening Day attendance @ Chase Field, behind 2012 (49,130) [first game/Game No. 1 of the season - does not account for team starting the season on road then coming home for Home Opener].

- Jalen Beeks also made his Arizona debut out of the bullpen with 1.2 perfect innings with 1 strikeout (14 pitches - 10 strikes).

- OPENING DAY STARTS: Ketel Marte made his team-record sixth start at second base and franchise-record eighth straight Opening Day start (6 2B, 2 CF), ahead of Paul Goldschmidt (7 from 2012-18).
- Eugenio Suárez became 1 of 3 active third basemen to have 9 consecutive starts since 2016 (also: Nolan Arenado and Manny Machado).
 - Corbin Carroll and Gabriel Moreno made their third straight Opening Day starts while Geraldo Perdomo made his second straight.

- RETURN OF THE 'BACKS: Ketel Marte (9th season, since 2017), Zac Gallen (7th season, since 2019) and Merrill Kelly (7th season, since 2019) entered the season as the longest tenured D-backs on the roster.
- Marte became the fourth D-back to play 9+ seasons (also: Nick Ahmed (10, 2014-23), David Peralta (9, 2014-22) and Miguel Montero (9, 2006-14).
 - Gallen and Kelly became the fifth and sixth D-back pitchers to play 7+ seasons, along with Andrew Chafin (8, 2014-20, '23), Randy Johnson (8, 1999-2004, '07-08), Brad Ziegler (7, 2011-16, '18) and Brandon Webb (7, 2003-09).

MARCH 28 VS. CHC:
Won 8-1.

- Eugenio Suárez's 2-homer night brought him into the day with the most homers in the Majors (3), ahead of 8 others with 2, while Suárez's 5 RBI were second in the NL, behind Miguel Amaya/CHC (6)...his 12 total bases are second in the Majors, behind only Shohei Ohtani/LAD (13).
- Merrill Kelly (1-0), in his first start of the season, earned the win after allowing just 1 run on 3 hits over 5.1 innings.

- D-BACKS, PFAADT AGREE TO A 5-YEAR CONTRACT EXTENSION: The D-backs agreed with RHP Brandon Pfaadt to a 5-year contract extension through 2030 (beginning in 2026) with a club option for 2031 and mutual option for 2032.
- Ranked among 2024 NL starting pitchers in walk rate (T-4th, 5.5), K/BB ratio (5th, 4.40), starts (T-5th, 32), BB/9.0 IP (6th, 2.08), innings pitched (T-7th, 181.2), strikeouts (8th, 185) and K/9.0 IP (8th, 9.17).
 - Was 1 of 9 NL starters in 2024 to record 19+ bids of 6.0+ innings.

- In 2024, became the seventh D-back starting pitcher at age 25-or-younger all-time to collect 10+ wins in a season.
- Made his Major League debut in 2023.
- Named the D-backs' 2022 Minor League Pitcher of the Year.
- In 2 seasons with Arizona (2023-24), went 14-19 with a 5.06 ERA (156 ER in 277.2 IP), 68 walks and 279 strikeouts in 51 games (50 GS).

WE KNOW IT'S GENO: Eugenio Suárez's 3 home runs in 2 games tied Luis Gonzalez (2001) for most homers in the team's first 2 games of a season in franchise history...it was also the first time he met the feat in his career.

- Suárez became the first Major Leaguer with 3+ homers in the first 2 games of a season since Paul Goldschmidt/STL in 2019 (3)...it was the 25th instance since 1900 of a player having 3+ homers through 2 games.
- He was the fourth third baseman to reach the feat and first since Vinny Castilla/COL in 1998, which occurred during Opening Week-end in the first-ever series at Chase Field.

12 EXTRA-BASE HITS THROUGH THE FIRST 2 GAMES: The D-backs' 12 extra-base hits through their first 2 games marked a franchise high, ahead of 10 done 3 times (2019, '16, '01).

- Brandon Pfaadt (L, 0-1), in his first start of the season, took the loss after a quality start (3 ER in 6.0 IP, 6 H, 1 BB, 5 K).

GO OFF, GENO!: Eugenio Suárez matched a Major League record with home runs in each of a team's first 3 games of the season (last: Lourdes Gurriel Jr. from March 28-30, 2024).

- Suárez became the first D-back in franchise history to collect 4+ home runs in the team's first 3 games.
- He became the first player in the Majors since 2016 to homer 4+ times in the team's first 3 games (last: Robinson Canó/SEA and Trevor Story/COL) and 12th Major Leaguer to do so since 1935.
- Suárez joined Eddie Mathews (4 HR, '58 Milwaukee Braves) as the only third basemen in MLB history to reach 4+ homers in the team's first 3 games...no third baseman has ever hit 5+ homers in the team's first 4 games.

EXTRA-EXTRA!: The D-backs' 15 extra-base hits through their first 3 games set a franchise high, ahead of 14 in 2019.

- Lourdes Gurriel Jr. (2-for-5, HR, 2 RBI) evened the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with a 2-run home run before Josh Naylor (2-for-2, 2B, RBI, 3 BB) doubled to plate the go-ahead run.
- Reliever Ryne Nelson (PH, 1-1, H, RBI) became the second D-back pitcher all-time to record a pinch-hit RBI in a game (also: Micah Owings on April 30, 2008 vs. Astros) and first D-backs pitcher to record a hit and RBI in a game since Zac Gallen on Oct. 2, 2021.

D-BACKS ALUM CHRIS OWINGS DONATES TO LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL: Former D-backs utility player Chris Owings met with the South Mountain High School baseball program to donate bats, batting gloves, cleats and other equipment used during his 11-year Major League career and also presented a \$1,000 grant as part of the Play Ball Fund, presented by Arizona Complete Health.

SUÁREZ NABS FIRST CAREER NL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Eugenio Suárez was named NL Player of the Week for the first time in his career after hitting .286 (4-for-14)/.412 OBP/1.143 SLG/1.555 OPS with 4 homers, 7 RBI, 2 walks, 5 runs scored, 1 stolen base over 4 games.

- It marked the second consecutive season (and second occurrence all-time) a D-back was selected in the opening week of the season (also: Lourdes Gurriel Jr., March 28-31, 2024).

SUÁREZ JOINS ELITE LIST IN BASEBALL HISTORY: In the expansion era (since 1961), **Eugenio Suárez** became the fourth player in MLB history whose first 4+ hits within the player’s first 4 games of the season were all home runs, joining Willie Mays (1964/SF), Robinson Canó (2016/SEA) and Trevor Story (2016/COL).

- Won 7-5 after overcoming a 2-run deficit in the eighth inning.**

SMITH & NAYLOR BACK-TO-BACK FIRST-PITCH HOMERS: **Pavin Smith** and **Josh Naylor** became the second D-back duo all-time to hit back-to-back homers on the first pitch for their first long balls of the season, joining Jorge Fabregas and Brent Brede (fourth inning on April 8, 1998 @ Dodgers) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

APRIL 11 VS. MIL:

Lost 7-0.

- **Eduardo Rodriguez** (L; 2 ER in 6.1 IP) tossed his first quality bid.
- **Corbin Carroll** went for 1-for-4 on the night to extend his on-base streak.
- **Ryan Thompson** marked his fourth scoreless and hitless performance in 5 total outings this season.

Won 5-4 in walk-off fashion, overcoming a 4-0 deficit in the ninth inning.

- Was the D-backs' first walk-off victory in 2025.
- The D-backs were the only MLB team this season with 2 comeback wins after trailing by 4+ runs in the eighth inning or later (also: March 30 vs. Cubs)...the only other team with an occurrence was the Mariners (1).
- **Alek Thomas** delivered a 1-out triple to plate **Gabriel Moreno** (walk)...**Corbin Carroll** then doubled to plate both Thomas and **Garrett Hampson** (walk)...**Jake McCarthy** delivered the game-tying single to score Carroll and move **Geraldo Perdomo** (walk) to third...**Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** ended the game with a sacrifice fly to right field.

HISTORICAL WALK-OFF: Per @OptaSTATS, the D-backs became the first MLB team to have a 5+-run walk-off inning to snap a 17.0+ scoreless-inning drought since the Tigers did so against the Senators on August 22, 1941.

HISTORY ALMOST REPEATED VS. MILWAUKEE: The win marked the second occurrence vs. Brewers (third occurrence all-time) where the D-backs overcame a 4+-run deficit in the ninth inning (also: July 3, 2008 vs. Brewers, down 5-0 and scored 6 runs without recording an out).

- The only other occurrence was on July 29, 2024 vs. Nationals, down 8-4 and scored 5 to win 9-8.

JUST SHY OF A HOMER: Through this date, there were 14 hits tracked at a distance of 400+ feet with a 105+ exit velocity that DID NOT result in a home run (was only a double or triple), and the D-backs accounted for 4 of those instances, the most in MLB (the Rockies were only other team with multiple occurrences with 2)...under those same metrics, there were also 135 hits that DID result in a home run:

APRIL 13 VS. MIL:

Won 5-2 in comeback fashion after plating 5 unanswered runs from the fifth to the eighth inning to secure their second straight series win and third in their last 4.

- **Josh Naylor** delivered the go-ahead RBI base hit in the seventh before **Alek Thomas** extended the lead with a 2-run, 2-out single in the eighth.
- **Zac Gallen** (ND; 2 ER in 6.0 IP, 5 K) tossed his second quality start in his last 3 bids.
- **Corbin Carroll** (2-for-4, 2B, BB) logged his second straight multi-hit performance.

APRIL 15 @ MIA:

Won 10-4 for their then season-high-tying third straight win (also: March 30-April 2), with their second game with 3+ homers (also: 4 HR on April 9 vs. Orioles).

- **Corbin Carroll** (2-5, 2B, HR, 5 RBI) collected his third career grand slam in the top of the sixth inning and fell 1 RBI short of tying his career high...had a grand slam in each of the last 3 seasons.

- April 1 @ Yankees: trailed 4-0 into the eighth

CARROLL'S 50 TOTAL BASES: **Corbin Carroll** became the third D-back all-time to record 50+ total bases within the first 17 games to start a season, joining Luis Gonzalez (54, 2001) and Matt Williams (54,1999).

PERDOMO EARLY POWER: **Geraldo Perdomo** collected his third home run of the season (3-run in Top 2) to match his home run total from the 2024 season (3)...his career high is 6 (2023).

- At this point, he led all MLB shortstops in OPS (.948), ahead of Bobby Witt Jr./KC (.897) and Mookie Betts/LAD (.880).

PERDOMO'S STREAK WITHOUT A STRIKEOUT ENDS: **Geraldo Perdomo**’s streak of plate appearances without a strikeout [excluding pitchers] ended at 43 PA [since April 3], the longest by a D-back since Ender Inciarte (44 PA from Aug. 31-Sept. 11, 2015).

APRIL 16 @ MIA:

Won 6-2 for their season-high fourth straight win after a 4-homer night.

- **Tim Tawa** (first career HR), **Josh Naylor** (3), **Pavin Smith** (2) and **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** (3) homered...marked the D-backs' second 4+-homer game of the season (also: April 9 vs. Orioles: Carroll, Naylor, Smith and Perdomo) and second straight with 3+ homers.
- **Brandon Pfaadt** (W; 1 ER in 5.2 IP, 2 BB, 6 K) earned his third consecutive win.

TAWA POWA!: **Tim Tawa** became the 237th player to homer as a D-back...the last to do so for his first career homer was Adrian Del Castillo on Aug. 9, 2024 (walk-off HR in Bot 9 vs. PHI).

QUALITY BID STREAK ENDS: D-backs starting arms ended their consecutive quality bid streak at 6 (April 8-15), which was the longest streak of its kind in the Majors at the time and longest in MLB since the Mets' 8 from Sept. 11-19, 2024.

- It was the first time the D-backs accomplished the feat since Sept. 9-16, 2017 (8 straight).

APRIL 17 @ MIA:

Won 6-4 for their season-high fifth straight win and first series sweep of the season.

- **Corbin Carroll** became the first MLB player in 2025 to record 3+ stolen bases in a game...since 2023, his 4 occurrences of 3+ stolen bases in a game rank third in the Majors, behind C.J. Abrams/WSH (5) and Elly De La Cruz/CIN (5).
- 4 D-backs combined for 6 stolen bases: **Carroll** (3), **Tim Tawa** (1), **Geraldo Perdomo** (1) and **Pavin Smith** (1).
- **Josh Naylor** (4) homered in his third consecutive game (third career occurrence) while **Pavin Smith** (3) homered in his second straight game.
- **Eduardo Rodriguez** (W; 1 ER in 5.1 IP, 0 BB, 9 K) earned his first win of the season.

5 STRAIGHT W'S: The D-backs won a season-high fifth straight game to mark the first time with 5+ straight wins since Aug. 19-25, 2024 (6 straight, @ MIA and BOS).

7 STRAIGHT IN MIAMI: They D-backs had their seventh consecutive win in Miami since April 16, 2023.

SERIES SWEEP: The D-backs sealed their third straight series and fourth in their last 5, and their first series sweep of 2025 (last: Aug. 23-25, 2024 @ Boston) and second straight sweep in Miami (also: Aug. 19-21, 2024).

5 STOLEN BASES WITH 5 OR FEWER HITS: **This game (5 H, 6 SB) marked the first in franchise history where the D-backs tallied 5+ stolen bases with 5 or fewer hits.**

CREATING CHAOS: **Marked the first time in franchise history where Arizona recorded 5+ stolen bases thru the first 4.0 innings of a game...it was the first time the D-backs reached 5+ stolen bases in a game since Aug. 6, 2023 @ Twins (8 SB).**

9 HOMERS IN 3 GAMES: The D-backs collected 9 homers in their 3-game series @ Marlins from April 15-17, 1 shy of tying their franchise record for most in a series (10 from Sept. 2-4, 2016 @ Rockies).

APRIL 18 @ CHC:

Lost 13-11 after tallying a then season-high 15 hits (6 XBH, including 2 HR) to snap their season-high win streak (5 W).

HISTORICAL SLUGFEST: *Historic notables from the slugfest @ Wrigley Field:*

- The combined 16-run eighth inning was an Arizona franchise record for most combined runs by the D-backs and their opponent in a single inning...it was the fifth occurrence in franchise history of 13+ combined runs in an inning (where each team scores at least a run) and first time since 2006.
- The D-backs’ 10-run eighth inning marked the fifth occurrence in franchise history and second all-time on the road...last occurrence was March 20, 2024 vs. Rockies (14 runs in third inn.)...last occurrence on the road was June 21, 2017 @ Rockies (10 runs in fourth inn.).
- **Per @OptaSTATS:** It was the first time in MLB history where, in a single game, there were 6 homers, 2 grand slams, all 4 types of a hit (1B/2B/3B/HR), all 4 types of home run (solo/2-run/3-run/GS) and 3 half-innings of 5+ runs...and it all happened in 2.0 innings (seventh and eighth).
- **Per Cubs PR:** The 16 combined runs in the eighth inning set a Wrigley Field record for most combined runs in a single inning, topping the 15 combined runs by the Cubs and Phillies on Aug. 25, 1922 in the fourth inning (*Wrigley Field opened in 1914 and became the Cubs’ home in 1916*).

5+ RUNS IN 6 STRAIGHT: The D-backs collected 5+ runs in 6 consecutive games, tied for the longest streak in 2025 (also: Nationals/April 6-12 and Angels/March 31-April 6).

APRIL 19 @ CHC:

Lost 6-2.

- **Corbin Carroll** (3-for-4, HR, RBI, BB) logged his second 3+-hit game this season, including his first leadoff homer in 2025.
- **Tim Tawa** hit his second career homer in the ninth.

- **Zac Gallen** had his second straight quality start (1 R-0 ER in 6.0 IP, 5 H, 1 BB, 9 K).
- **Eugenio Suárez** had a game-tying, RBI double in the second in-ning, and **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** had the eventual game-winning RBI single in the third inning.
- **Josh Naylor** collected career RBI No. 400-401 on his 2-run homer in the fifth inning.

TRIPLE THREAT: **Corbin Carroll** became the first D-back with 10 triples within the team's first 100 games of a season (previous high: 9 by Ketel Marte/2018).

- Since 1998, was the Majors' 20th player with 10+ triples in their team's first 100 games of a season (last: 10 by Jarren Duran/BOS this season).

IN THE HISTORY BOOKS: **Corbin Carroll** became the second player in MLB history with 3 straight seasons of 10+ doubles, 10+ triples, 20+ homers, 40+ RBI and 10+ stolen bases along with Dick Allen/Philadelphia Phillies (1965-67).

- Carroll was 1 of 2 MLB players with 10+ doubles, 5+ triples, 20+ homers, 40+ RBI and 10+ stolen bases (also: Shohei Ohtani/LAD)...was 1 of 12 players since 1998 to reach those marks in his team's first 100 games:

JULY 8 @ SD:

Lost 1-0 to even the series 1-1.

- Fourth game all-time losing 1-0 resulting from 1 solo homer with 4 or fewer hits by each team (also: May 12, 2004 vs. Mets, July 20, 2001 @ Giants and April 13, 1998 @ Padres).
- **Merrill Kelly** had a quality start (7.0 IP, 1 R, 4 H, 0 BB, 4 K, 77 pitches-)...it was just the second time in the Majors this season a starting pitcher worked 7.0+ innings with 77 or fewer pitches (also: José So-riano/LAA on March 29 @ White Sox, 7.0 IP, 73 pitches).
- It was just the fourth such start by a D-backs starter since 2003 (also: Brandon Webb on Sept. 12, 2007 @ Giants; Zack Greinke on June 13, 2019 @ Nationals; Ryne Nelson on June 20, 2024 @ Nationals) and 12th such start in franchise history (8 other times between 1998-2002).
- **Corbin Carroll** (1B, BB) and **Ketel Marte** (2 BB) each reached base twice.

JULY 9 @ SD:

Won 8-2, improving their record to 18-4 when scoring 8+ runs.

- **Brandon Pfaadt** worked a then career-high 8.0 innings (99 pitches), allowing 2 runs on 4 hits with 4 strikeouts.
 - Pfaadt's line of 8.0+ innings, 2 or fewer runs, 4 or fewer hits, 0 walks, 4 or fewer strikeouts and 99 or fewer pitches was third occurrence by a D-back along with **Omar Daal** on April 19, 1999 vs. Phillies (8.1 IP, 2 R, 4 H, 0 BB, 4 K, 97 P) and **Josh Collmenter** on Sept. 28, 2014 vs. Cardinals (8.0 IP, 1 R, 3 H, 0 BB, 3 K, 88 P).
 - D-backs' first start this season and fifth instance since 2021 of a starter working 8.0+ innings with 99 or fewer pitches and 0 walks (also: Merrill Kelly on July 18, 2021 vs. Cubs; Madison Bumgarner on July 23, 2022 vs. Nationals; Merrill Kelly on July 25, 2022 vs. Giants; Zac Gallen on Sept. 22, 2022 @ Dodgers).
- **James McCann** (third inning), **Eugenio Suárez** (fourth inning) and **Corbin Carroll** (ninth inning) each hit solo roundtrippers.
- **Geraldo Perdomo** hit his third career grand slam, second of the season (also: June 7, 2022 @ Reds; April 3, 2024 @ Yankees).

GRAND SLAMS: The D-backs' 9 grand slams were second most in team history, tied with 2001, behind 11 grand slams in 2024.

- The D-backs' 20 grand slams in 2024-25 tied for the sixth-most in a 2-season span in the Majors since 1998 with the 1998-99 Guardians, 2000-01 Athletics, 2023-24 Dodgers behind 23 GS by the 1999-00 Guardians...22 GS by the 1999-00 Athletics...and 21 GS by the 1999-00 Mariners, 2011-12 Yankees and 2010-11 Yankees (21).

LOTS A DINGERS: The D-backs' 4 home runs (27-14) marked their 41st multi-homer game, and second in the Majors at the time, behind the Dodgers (46 G, 36-10) and ahead of the Yankees (40 G, 26-14).

JULY 10 @ SD:

Lost 4-3 for their second 1-run loss in 3 games and fourth series split this season.

- **Geraldo Perdomo** had his fourth multi-hit performance of the month and third game this season with multiple doubles.
- **Ketel Marte** had his third straight game reaching multiple times (2 H) and doubled in consecutive games.
- **Alek Thomas** reached safely in his seventh straight road game with a 2-for-2 performance.
- Relievers **Juan Morillo** (1.0 IP) and **Jake Woodford** (3.0 IP) combined for 4.0 scoreless frames...was Woodford's first 3.0+-inning relief appearance since Aug. 30, 2022 (3.1 IP) while with the Cardinals.

JULY 11 @ LAA:

- Suárez became the sixth D-back with consecutive 30+-homer seasons along with: Christian Walker/2022-23, Paul Goldschmidt/2017-18, Mark Reynolds/2009-10, Luis Gonzalez/2000-01 and Steve Finley/1999-00.

Won 5-1.

- Combined for a 4-run fourth inning that sent 8 batters to the plate.
- **Geraldo Perdomo** was the first to reach in each scoring inning via a walk (leadoff in fourth; 1-out in fifth).
- **Blaze Alexander** went 2-for-4 with 1 double and his first RBI.
- **Merrill Kelly** earned his eighth win behind 5.0 innings of 1-hit, 1-run ball.
- Relievers **John Curtiss**, **Kevin Ginkel** and **Kendall Graveman** combined for 4.0 scoreless frames.

JULY 18 VS. STL:

Won 7-3 for their second straight win.

CORBIN BARRELS: Per @OptaSTATS, **Corbin Carroll** became the only player in MLB history to have a season with 4+ multi-homer games and a season with 3+ multi-triple games.

- Carroll was the first MLB player to have 3+ multi-triple games in a season since Jose Reyes/NYM in 2011 (3).

JULY 20 VS. STL:

Won 5-3 for their fourth sweep and won 4+ straight games for the first time since June 9-14 (5 wins)...outscored the Cardinals in the series 22-7.

- **The +15 run differential was the D-backs' second-largest in a 3-game series in 2025 and largest in a 3-game series at home since July 29-31, 2024 vs. Nationals (+19).**
- **Eugenio Suárez** had his second consecutive multi-homer game (first time in career), third in his last 5 games (also: July 19 vs. Cardinals, July 12 @ Angels) and sixth time overall...became the sixth D-back all-time with consecutive multi-homer games (last: Christian Walker, July 3-4, 2024).

6 HOMERS IN 5 GAMES: **Eugenio Suárez** was the sixth D-back (eighth time) all-time to hit 6+ homers in a 5-game span (last: Kole Calhoun, 6 HR from Sept. 15-19, 2020)...was the first MLB player to do so in 2025 and first since Lawrence Butler/OAK from Aug. 27-31, 2024 (6 HR).

- Only 2 D-back players all-time have hit 7+ homers in a 6-game span: J.D. Martinez (7 HR from Sept. 4-10, 2017) and Reggie Sanders (7 HR from April 17-23, 2001).
- The last MLB player with 7+ homers in a 6-game span was Aaron Judge/NYY (7 from Aug. 20-25, 2024).

GENO JOINS RARE COMPANY: **Eugenio Suárez** became the first MLB player since 2013 and seventh since 1998 to hit 35+ homers with 85+ RBI in the first 100 games of a season, joining Chris Davis/BAL (37 HR/97 RBI in 2013), Luis Gonzalez/AZ (40 HR/99 RBI in 2001), Sammy Sosa/CHC (2x - 38 HR/89 RBI in 1999 and 37 HR/93 RBI in 1998), Mark McGwire/STL (2x - 36 HR/86 RBI in 1999 and 43 HR/96 RBI in 1998), Ken Griffey Jr./SEA (40 HR/91 RBI in 1998) and Greg Vaughn/SD (35 HR/85 RBI in 1998).

CORBIN BARRELS: Since 1940, **Corbin Carroll** became the eighth MLB player to reach 39+ triples within their first 430 career games...last MLB player to do so was Dexter Fowler/COL in 2009.

- Carroll became the first D-back all-time to record 10+ triples within the team's first 100 games of a season...became the seventh MLB player (eighth time) since 1998 to record 13+ triples within the team's first 100 games of a season (last: Charlie Blackmon/COL in 2017).
- Carroll was the first MLB player to have 3+ multi-triple games in a season since Jose Reyes/NYM in 2011 (3).
- Per @OptaSTATS, Corbin Carroll became the only player in MLB history to have a season with 4+ multi-homer games and one with 3+ multi-triple games.

JULY 21 VS. HOU:

Lost 6-3 to snap their 4-game win streak.

- **Eugenio Suárez** homered (solo in third inning) in his third consecutive game...ninth time in his career with 3+-consecutive games with a homer (last: 4 straight from Sept. 29, 2024 [final game of season] - March 29, 2025 [first game of season]).
- **Zac Gallen** recorded his 1,000th career strikeout in the fourth inning (Brice Matthews)...became the second pitcher to debut in 2019 and reach 1,000+ strikeouts, joining Dylan Cease [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

- Relievers **Kendall Graveman, Andrew Saalfrank** and **Trevor Richards** combined for 3.0 scoreless innings.

7 HOMERS IN 6 GAMES: **Eugenio Suárez** became the third D-back all-time to hit 7+ homers in a 6-game span, joining J.D. Martinez (7 HR from Sept. 4-10, 2017) and Reggie Sanders (7 HR from April 17-23, 2001)...was the first MLB player with 7+ homers in a 6-game span since Aaron Judge/NYY (7 from Aug. 20-25, 2024).

- The only D-back with 8+ homers in a 7-game span was J.D. Martinez (8 HR from Sept. 2-10, 2017).
- The last MLB player with 8+ homers in a 7-game span was Joey Votto/CIN (8 HR from July 25-31, 2021).

JULY 22 VS. HOU:

Lost 3-1.

- **Eduardo Rodriguez** (0 ER in 6.1 IP) had his second scoreless start (also: June 23 @ White Sox; 0 ER in 6.0 IP)...retired 8 of his first 10 batters.
- **Corbin Carroll**, with his first-inning double, hit safely in his fourth straight game at a .389 clip .389 (7-for-18) with 2 doubles, 3 triples, 2 RBI and 2 stolen bases.

- The D-backs have won their last 3 games on his birthday: 1-0 (11 inn.) @ Pirates in 2025, 3-1 vs. Cardinals in 2023 and 7-0 vs. Giants in 2022.
- Shares his birthday with D-backs' current Triple-A Pitching Coach, former Pirate and 1990 Cy Young Award winner **Doug Drabek** (1962) as well as **Shoeless Joe Jackson** (1887)...was born (July 25, 1965) exactly 1 year before **Barry Bonds** (July 24, 1964).

AUGUST 5 VS. SD:

Lost 10-5 to snap their 3-game win streak.

- **Ryne Nelson** went decisionless after allowing 2 runs on 6 hits and 2 walks in 5.2 innings with 8 strikeouts...his 16 swings-and-misses tied a career high (also: April 7, 2024 @ Braves).
- **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** had his eighth career multi-homer game (last: May 7, 2023 vs. Nationals)...his game-tying 2-run home run in the bottom of the eighth inning off a 103.9 mph fastball from Mason Miller was the hardest thrown pitch hit for a homer in the Majors since pitch tracking became available in 2008 (previous: Ian Happ/CHC off a 103.2 mph fastball off Miller on Sept. 17, 2024).

CARROLL'S HISTORIC HOME SLATE: **Corbin Carroll**, in his 10 home games (since July 19), had 4 doubles, 3 triples, 3 homers, 9 RBI, 2 walks and 2 stolen bases...became the first D-back all-time and fourth MLB player since 1941 to record 4+ doubles, 3+ triples, 3+ homers, 9+ RBI, 2+ walks and 2+ stolen bases in a 10-game span within a season at home, joining Carlos González (2013), Larry Walker/COL (1996) and Jeff Heath/CLE (1941).

- **Geraldo Perdomo** hit his 12th home run (2-run in third inning), doubling his previous career high (6 in 2023)...was his third straight multi-hit game.

- **Ketel Marte** hit his sixth career go-ahead homer in the seventh inning or later (last: June 2, 2024 @ Mets) and 22nd homer this season...reached base safely in 10 straight games since August 1 with 3 doubles, 2 homers, 8 RBI and 6 walks (4 K).
- **Blaze Alexander** hit his fourth homer (solo in third inning) and longest of his career (411 ft.)...homered in 3 of his last 5 games and hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games.

- Ketel Marte** had his second 4-hit performance and hit his second consecutive (seventh career) go-ahead homer (23) in the seventh inning or later (last: June 2, 2024 @ Mets)...reached base safely in 11 straight games since August 1 with 3 doubles, 3 homers, 12 RBI and 6 walks (4 K).

AUGUST 14 @ COL:
Won 8-2 for their third consecutive win.

- Eduardo Rodriguez** earned his fifth win after tossing a season-high 7.0 innings with 1 run on 6 hits, 1 walk and 6 strikeouts...was his first start of 7.0+ innings since Oct. 1, 2023 vs. Guardians with the Tigers.
- Ketel Marte** had his third straight game with a hit and RBI, 1 shy of his season high (4 games from June 3-6)...reached base safely in 12 straight games since August 1, hitting .354 (17-for-48)/1.071 OPS with 4 doubles, 3 homers, 14 RBI and 7 walks (4 K).
- Geraldo Perdomo** had his fourth multi-hit performance in his last 6 games...hit safely in 11 straight games, the third longest active streak in MLB and tied for fifth-longest among NL shortstops this season, hitting .419 (18-for-43)/.510 OBP/.651 SLG/1.161 OPS with 4 doubles, 2 homers, 4 RBI and 8 walks...had also reached base safely in a career-high-tying 15 straight games, tied for the second longest active streak in MLB and fourth longest among NL shortstops this season.
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** had his fifth multi-RBI game in August with his 15th homer (3-run in first inning).
- Jose Herrera** hit his career-high second homer (2-run in second inning).

ANOTHER 12-GAME HOMER STREAK: As a team, the D-backs homered in their 12th straight game (24 HR since Aug. 2), the longest active streak in the Majors at the time, tying their season high of consecutive games with a homer (also: 12 from June 23-July 5).

EARLY SCORING STREAK: The D-backs scored within the first 3.0 innings in 12 straight games, tied for second-longest streak in MLB, tying their season-high 12 from June 19-July 1.

AUGUST 15 @ COL:
Lost 4-3 to snap their 3-game win streak.

- Jake McCarthy** went 2-for-4 with 2 RBI, reached base safely in 8 consecutive starts since July 25 and recorded his first multi-RBI game since July 1 vs. Giants.
- Ketel Marte** collected a hit for his fourth straight game and for the seventh time in his last 8 games...reached base safely in 13 straight games since August 1, hitting .353 (18-for-51)/.450 OBP/.608 SLG/1.058 OPS with 4 doubles, 3 homers, 14 RBI and 8 walks (4 K).
- Brandon Pfaadt** recorded his 22nd start this season of 2 or fewer walks, tied for the second-most such starts in the NL at the time, behind only Nick Lodolo/CIN (23)...his 100 pitches matched his season high (also: April 27 vs. Atlanta).

Lost 10-7.

- Ketel Marte** recorded his fourth multi-double game of the season... hit safely for his fifth straight game and for the eighth time in his last 9 games...reached base safely in 14 straight games since August 1, hitting .357 (20-for-56)/.446 OBP/.625 SLG/1.071 OPS with 6 doubles, 3 homers, 14 RBI and 8 walks (5 K).
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** recorded 17 RBI over his last 13 games with a PA since Aug. 2...his 17 RBI in August tied with Christian Yelich/MIL for the second most in the NL in the month (Pete Alonso/NYM - 19).
- Ryne Nelson** allowed 4 runs on 8 hits with 4 strikeouts and 0 walks in 6.1 innings of work...had consecutive outings without issuing a walk for the second time this season (also June 30-July 5) and threw 6.0+ innings in 5 of his last 9 starts.

AUGUST 17 @ COL:
Lost 6-5.

- Corbin Carroll** hit a 474-foot home run (27, solo in sixth inning), the longest of his career, third longest in the Majors at the time in 2025 (Mike Trout/LAA – 484’, Byron Buxton/MIN – 479’), and fourth longest by a D-back since 2015 (Ketel Marte/2019 – 482’, Jake Lamb/2017 – 481’, Christian Walker/2018 – 479’).
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** recorded 18 RBI over his last 14 games with a PA since Aug. 2...his 18 RBI in August rank second in the NL, behind Pete Alonso/NYM - 19).
- Jake McCarthy** had his third multi-hit performance in his last 4 games, hitting .471 (8-for-17)/.471 OBP/.529 SLG/1.000 OPS with 1 double and 2 RBI.
- Nabil Crismatt**, in his season debut, allowed 1 run on 3 hits in 5.0 innings with 1 walk and 5 strikeouts.

STRANGE BUT TRUE: **Nabil Crismatt** was just the eighth different starting pitcher the D-backs had used in 2025...entering play, the only teams to use fewer starting pitchers this season were the Rays and Cardinals, who both had used 7.

- The D-backs 8 starting pitchers at this point tied for their third-fewest in franchise history...they used 6 in 1999 and 7 in 2002.
- Despite using just 8 starters this season, Crismatt was the 39th different player to pitch for the D-backs this season, at the time the second-most in baseball (Mets - 42) as well as the second-most in franchise history (41 in 2021).

AUGUST 18 VS. CLE:
Lost 3-1.

- Geraldo Perdomo** recorded his fifth multi-hit performance in his last 10 games and hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games.
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** hit safely in 5 straight games and reached in 7 straight...had recorded 18 RBI over his last 15 games with a PA since Aug. 2...his 18 RBI in August ranked second in the NL, behind Pete Alonso/NYM - 19).
- Corbin Carroll** reached base safely in 11 of his last 12 games (since Aug. 6).
- Ketel Marte** hit safely in 12 of his 16 August games.
- Zac Gallen** tossed his 10th quality start (L; 3 ER in 6.0 IP, 5 H, 0 BB, 3 K) and third quality start in his last 4...had 4 straight seasons since 10+ quality starts.

AUGUST 19 VS. CLE:

Won 6-5 to snap a 4-game skid.

- Had their first multi-triple inning (fifth inning) since June 11, 2024 vs. Angels (second inning).
- **Corbin Carroll tallied 2 triples for a career-high 16, the most by a D-back in a season in franchise history...he became the first MLB player to reach 16+ triples in a season since 2011 by José Reyes/NYM (16) and Shane Victorino/PHI (16)...the last to reach 17+ triples was Reyes in 2008 (19).**
 - His 4 multi-triple games tied for the most by a player in a season since 1901...also 5 others: Carl Crawford/TB in 2004, Barney McCosky/DET in 1940, Bill Terry/NYG in 1931, Owen Wilson/PIT in 1912 and Larry Doyle/NYG in 1911).
- **Jake McCarthy** hit his third homer (solo in third inning) and first since July 1 @ Giants...hit safely in 5 straight games, including 4 multi-hit efforts.
- **Geraldo Perdomo** recorded his second straight multi-hit performance sixth in his last 11 games...hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games.
- **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** hit safely in 6 straight games and reached safely in 8 straight...had recorded 21 RBI over his last 16 games with a PA since Aug. 2...his 21 RBI in August rank atop the Majors, ahead of Pete Alonso/NYM - 19).
- **Juan Burgos** earned his first Major League win.
- **Andrew Saalfrank** earned his second career save.

PERDOMO'S HOME STREAKS: **Geraldo Perdomo's** career-long 24-game on-base streak at home since from June 27-Aug. 19 tied for the fifth-longest home streak in the Majors (also: Corbin Carroll from Aug. 6-Sept. 24)...he was the only player in the Majors this season with multiple 20+-game home on-base streaks (also: 21 from March 27-May 9).

AUGUST 20 VS. CLE:

Won 3-2 in 10.0 innings for their fifth walk-off win.

- **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** hit a ninth-inning game-tying homer (17), his fourth of its kind in his career (last: May 6, 2023 vs. Nationals, solo in ninth inning)...was the D-backs' eighth game-tying or go-ahead homer in the ninth inning or later, the most in the Majors at the time, ahead of the Rangers (7).
- **Adrian Del Castillo**, as a pinch-hitter, had his second career walk-off hit (single to LF)...became the 14th different D-back to have a pinch-hit walk-off (last: Corbin Carroll on July 29, 2024 vs. Nationals - ninth-inning 2-run homer), and the second ever to do so on the first pitch of the at-bat (also: Rob Ryan on Sept. 13, 2000 - first-pitch, ninth-inning single).
- **Andrew Saalfrank** earned his first Major League win (0 ER in 0.2 IP, 1 K).
- **Brandon Pfaadt** made his ninth quality start, allowing 2 runs on 5 hits with 1 walk and 5 strikeouts over 7.0 innings.

AUGUST 22 VS. CIN:

Won 6-5 in 11.0 innings for their second consecutive walk-off win (sixth overall) and third straight victory...was their first time with consecutive walk-off wins since they had 3 straight from Aug. 12-14, 2013 vs. Orioles and sixth time in franchise history they recorded 2+ straight walk-off wins.

- **Lourdes Gurriel Jr. had his second walk-off hit this month (also: Aug. 9 vs. Rockies) and fourth in career...had 3 straight games with a go-ahead or game-tying RBI in the seventh inning or later...first time in his career with consecutive games reaching the feat and tied for the longest streak this season with Austin Riley (April 8-10) and Kyren Paris/LAA (March 30-April 1)...the last MLB player with 4 straight was Adley Rutschman/BAL from April 12-15, 2023.**

- Had their 19th 3+-homer game: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** (18; 2-run in third inning), **Geraldo Perdomo** (14; 2-run in fourth inning) and **Blaze Alexander** (5, solo in fifth inning).
- Had their 11th 7+-extra-base hit game, tied for the most in MLB with the Cubs.
- **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** had his fourth straight multi-RBI game, the longest active streak in the Majors at the time and tied for the third-longest MLB streak this season...the last with 5+ straight multi-RBI games was Vladimir Guerrero Jr./TOR (7 straight from June 23-29, 2024)...is the first D-back with 4 straight multi-RBI games since Jake McCarthy from Aug. 10-13, 2024.
- **Geraldo Perdomo, with 84 RBI, set the franchise record for the most RBI in a season by a shortstop (previous: 82 by Nick Ahmed in 2019).**
- **Corbin Carroll** hit safely in 10 consecutive games and had 5 extra-base hits in his last 6 games.
- **Jake Woodford** became the 15th different D-back pitcher to record a save this season, **setting a new MLB single-season record** (previous: 14, 2x; 2024 Dodgers and 2021 Rays).
- **Jalen Beeks** made his first start as a D-back (20th in career), tossing 1.0 perfect inning with 1 strikeout.

WIN LAST NIGHT & START TODAY: **Jalen Beeks was the second pitcher in franchise history to start a game after earning the win in relief the previous game...**Joe Mantiplay was the only other D-back and the last MLB pitcher to do so in 2024 (win in relief on June 30 vs. Athletics and started the game on July 2 @ Dodgers) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

AUGUST 24 VS. CIN:

Lost 6-1 to snap their 4-game win streak.

- **Corbin Carroll, with his 2 stolen bases, became the first player in franchise history with 3 consecutive 20-homer, 20-stolen base seasons...hit safely in 11 consecutive games and had 5 extra-base hits in his last 7 games.**
- **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** had his fifth straight game with a RBI, the second-longest active streak in the Majors, behind Vinnie Pasquantino/KC (7 G).
- **Geraldo Perdomo** hit his career-high-tying fourth triple (also: 4 in 2023) in the first inning...had 2 triples in his last 6 games.

Lost 7-5.

- **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** homered (19) in the sixth inning and had 3 home runs in his last 5 games...had his sixth straight game with a RBI, the longest active streak in the Majors...was the longest RBI streak by a D-back this season.
- **Corbin Carroll** hit safely in his 12th consecutive game for a second time this season (also: April 6-19)...is 1 game shy of tying the longest by a D-back this season (Josh Naylor, 13 games from June 9-25)...his career long is 14 games (Aug. 20-Sept. 4, 2024).
- **Geraldo Perdomo** reached base 2+ times in 4 straight games...since August 1, reached base 2+ in 17 games, tied for the most in the Majors with Jurickson Profar/ATL.

GO, GO GURRI: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.’s** 32 RBI in August are the most in a month in his career, the most in MLB, ahead of Vinnie Pasquantino/KC (27) and the second most in any month this season by a player, behind Rafael Devers/BOS-SF (33 in May)...it is the second time in his career with 30+ RBI in a month (also: 30 RBI in 26 G in Sept./Oct 2021).

80+ RBI THRU 130 G: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** was the third D-back this season to reach 80+ RBI (also: Geraldo Perdomo and Eugenio Suárez)...the D-backs have had 3 consecutive seasons with 3 players reaching the feat (also: 2024-Suárez, Ketel Marte and Christian Walker; 2023-Gurriel, Marte, Walker).

- **It was the second time in franchise history where 3+ D-backs reached 80+ RBI within their first 130 games played (also: 1999-Steve Finley/82, Luis Gonzalez/93, Jay Bell/94 and Matt Williams/120).**

AUGUST 26 @ MIL:

Lost 9-8...trailed 6-0 thru 3.0 innings, then 8-3 after 6.0 innings, and tied the game at 8-8 with 5 runs between the seventh and eighth innings.

- **Gabriel Moreno** hit a 3-run homer (7) in the fourth inning to cut the deficit to 3 (6-3).
- **Corbin Carroll** hit safely in 13 consecutive games...had 2 12+-game hit streaks this season (also: 12 games from April 6-19)...reached base 2+ times in 10 of his last 13 games.

- **Corbin Carroll** reached base safely in 17 consecutive games since Aug. 13, the fifth-longest active streak in the Majors, behind Jackson Chourio/MIL (23), Wyatt Langford/TEX (19), Isaac Paredes/HOU (18) and Bobby Witt Jr./KC (18).

- **Ildemaro Vargas** belted his second homer of the season, a three-run shot in the ninth inning that traveled 423 feet...both of his homers this season at that point went for 420+ feet after having only 1 such home run in his previous 8 seasons combined.

AUGUST 31 @ LAD:

Lost 5-4...tied the game 4-4 in the eighth inning on Corbin Carroll's 3-run home run.

- The final pitch of the game was the only home run the D-backs surrendered during the 3-game set.
- **Corbin Carroll** reached base safely in 18 consecutive games since Aug. 13, tied with Isaac Paredes/HOU for the third-longest active streak in the Majors, behind Jackson Chourio/MIL (24), Wyatt Langford/TEX (20).
- **Ketel Marte** recorded 2 hits and reached safely in 6 consecutive games...reached base safely in 25 of his last 26 starts since Aug. 1, batting .310 (31-for-100)/.877 OPS.
- **Brandyn Garcia** notched career highs with 2.2 innings and 3 strikeouts in a scoreless relief outing.

WINNING IN AUGUST: The D-backs went 17-12 (.586) in August, their highest winning percentage of any month this season...their winning percentage last month ranked fourth in the Majors behind the Brewers (21-9, .700), Phillies (18-11, .621) and Red Sox (17-11, .607).

HOLLYWOOD LONG BALLS: The D-backs homered in their 12th straight game @ Dodger Stadium since May 20, 2024, tied for their second-longest streak in team history (also: July 30, 2012-May 8, 2013) behind the team-record 16-straight games from April 13, 2018-Aug. 9, 2019.

SEPTEMBER 1 VS. TEX:

Lost 7-5 in 10.0 innings...Ketel Marte and Geraldo Perdomo combined for the D-backs' fourth game in franchise history where they started off a game with 2+ consecutive homers, and marked the first time since Marte and Gabriel Moreno did so to leadoff the game on Aug. 5, 2024 @ Guardians.

- **Corbin Carroll** reached base safely in 19 consecutive games since Aug. 13, the third-longest active streak in the Majors, behind Jackson Chourio/MIL (25) and Wyatt Langford/TEX (21).
- **Ketel Marte** recorded his 12th career lead off homer, 1 shy of the franchise record held by Chris Young (13)...reached base safely in 7 consecutive games, as well as in 26 of his last 27 starts since Aug. 1, batting .305 (32-for-105)/.884 OPS.
- **Ryne Nelson** did not factor into the decision after allowing 3 runs on 4 hits with 7 strikeouts against 1 walk in 6.0 IP...over his last 15 starts since June 13, pitched to a 3.03 ERA (29 ER in 86.0 IP) and an opponent .218 AVG (70-for-321).

SCHEDULE ODDITY: The D-backs' and Rangers' second 3-game series of the season marked the eighth time in franchise history the D-backs played multiple 3-game series vs. AL opponents: 2021 vs. Mariners, 2020 vs. Astros, 2015 vs. Astros, 2007 vs. Orioles, 2005 vs. Tigers, 2000 vs. Rangers and 1999 vs. Rangers.

SEPTEMBER 2 VS. TEX:

Won 5-3 to even the 3-game set, 5-3...all 9 D-backs starters reached base safely at least once while Ketel Marte, Blaze Alexander and Jordan Lawlar each recorded multiple hits.

- **Corbin Carroll** reached base safely in 20 consecutive games since Aug. 13, the second-longest active streak in the Majors at the time, behind only Jackson Chourio/MIL (25)...the third-longest streak of his career, behind a 27-gamer from Sept. 23, 2024-April 19, 2025 and a 21-gamer from July 7-Aug. 4, 2024.
- **Ketel Marte** recorded the go-ahead, 3-run home run in the seventh inning, his third go-ahead homer in his last 4 games vs. Rangers (also: Aug. 12 in Top 9 and Aug. 13 in Top 9)...homered in 4 consecutive games vs. Rangers.
- **Nabil Crismatt** logged a career-best 6.1 innings pitched...limited the opposition to 2 or fewer earned runs in each of his 4 outings this season.

BIG GAME KETEL: Ketel Marte became the first MLB player this season to log multiple hits with an exit velocity of 115.0+ MPH (119.6 MPH double in first inning and 115.4 MPH homer in seventh inning)...he became the first player to have multiple 115.0+ MPH hits in a game since Oneil Cruz/PIT (2 hits on May 21, 2024 vs. Giants and 3 hits on May 13, 2024 @ Brewers)...coincidentally, Cruz and Marte share the same hometown of Nizao, Dominican Republic.

SEPTEMBER 3 VS. TEX:

Won 2-0 for their ninth shutout...it was their third win this season with 3 or fewer hits in a game (also: 3 hits on June 1 vs. Nationals and 3 hits on April 2 @ Yankees) and sixth win with at most 1 extra-base hit (Corbin Carroll double) in a game (last: Aug. 28 @ Brewers, Blaze Alexander double).

- **Zac Gallen** had his second straight scoreless outing, extending his scoreless-inning streak to 12.2 IP, and fourth straight quality start after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings with 4 hits, 1 walk and 5 strikeouts... **his 63rd win put him in third in franchise history, behind Randy Johnson (118) and Brandon Webb (87).**

SNAKE BITES: The D-backs’ 72-71 record was 1.0 game over .500 for the first time since July 1 when they were 43-42 after an 8-2 win vs. Giants

- Since August 1, the D-backs had a 21-13 (.618) record, the third-best record in the Majors, behind the Brewers (24-11, .686) and Phillies (22-12, .647), ahead of the Red Sox (19-14, .576).
- On August 1, the D-backs were a season-high 13.0 games back in the division and 10.0 games back in the NL Wild Card...entering this day, the D-backs were 6.5 back in the division and 4.5 back in the NL Wild Card.
