METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Brewers, 5-2, last night... New York is 6-17 over their last 23 games...Tonight, the Mets continue a seven-game homestand (1-2) against the Brewers (1-2) and Giants (three games)...Following this homestand, the Mets head out on the road one final time before the All-Star break...The team heads west to Arizona (three games) and San Diego (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Brooks Raley celebrates his 35th birthday today... The San Antonio, TX native has appeared in 34 games this season and has posted a 2.57 ERA (8 ER/28.0 IP) with 10 walks and 29 strikeouts.

WHAT A PERFORMANCE!: Congrats to Head Performance Coach Dustin Clarke who will manage the NL's strength and conditioning at the 2023 All-Star Game in Seattle, WA...Clark is in his ninth season as the head performance coach and his 13th season in the organization.

ABSENCE OF PROOF: The New York Mets are teaming up with the national non-alcoholic pop-up Absence of Proof to bring a fun non-alcoholic experience to Citi Field...Fans ages 21 and up can enjoy a ballgame at Citi Field while sipping on refreshing craft mocktails and other non-alcoholic beverages during this special experience...The event, presented by Cadillac and Dunkin', will run in the Piazza Club on the Excelsior level for four home games: Thursday, June 29 vs. the Milwaukee Brewers and June 30-July 2 vs. the San Francisco Giants.

HALFWAY HOME: The Mets are slated to play their 81st game of the season today, marking the halfway mark of the season...The 2022 Mets were 50-31 after 81 games.

MAX EFFORT: Max Scherzer is set to make his 14th start of the season tonight...He is 7-2 with a 3.95 ERA (31 ER/70.2 IP) with 16 walks and 76 strikeouts...He is 3-0 this month...Since May 14, Scherzer has gone 5-0 with a 3.19 ERA (17 ER/48.0 IP) with six walks and 56 strikeouts.

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just 22 punchouts separating the two...With 73 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham has safely hit in 16 of his last 19 games... Over the last 19 games, Pham is batting .315 (23-73) with 11 runs, seven doubles, three home runs, 15 RBI, six walks, four steals with an .897 OPS... Since May 17, Pham is batting .323 (32-99) with 15 runs, nine doubles, one triple, five home runs, 22 RBI, 10 walks, seven steals with a .968 OPS in 30 games.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 59-23 in the first inning this year...New York has posted a 6.08 ERA (54 ER/80.0 IP) in the first inning this season...That is the fifth-highest first inning ERA in the majors...Last year, the Mets posted a 4.39 ERA (79 ER/162.0 IP) in the first frame.

BACK IN THE CITI: The Mets are 18-17 at home this year and have posted a 4.04 ERA...The Mets went 28-15 at home before the All-Star break last season.

BREWERS-METS NOTES: Dating back to September 21, 2022, the Mets have lost six of their last seven games against the Crew.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stolen a franchise-record 34 consecutive bases without being caught...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)...The Mets are first in the major leagues with a 90.9% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 21 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 335 career stolen bases rank second among active players... Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

IN JUNE: New York is now 7-17 (.304) in June...The team has posted 4.51 ERA and has slashed .225/.298/394.

GIRL DAD POWER: Over the last 11 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .324 (11-34) with nine runs, two doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, even walks, three steals with a .432 OBP and a .735 SLG...Over the last 21 games, Lindor has posted a .965 OPS, batting .265 (18-68) with 14 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 14 RBI, 13 walks, five steals with a .376 OBP and a .588 SLG...He has posted a 2.4 fWAR this year, which ranks 14th in the National League...His 35 extra-base hits are tied for the 10th most in the National League.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has recorded four home runs over his last 11 games, posting an .871 OPS in that span...Nimmo is batting .323 (32-99) with 10 extra-base hits against left-handed pitchers this year... His .323 average is the fourth-highest mark by a southpaw against fellow southpaws this season...It is second in the National League behind Miamis Luis Arraez (.371).

CREAM CITI: Brandon Nimmo has hit .320 (33-103) with 18 runs, seven doubles, five triples, four homers, five RBI, 10 walks with a .391 OBP and a .602 SLG in 30 career games against Milwaukee...Starling Marte has appeared in 121 games against the Crew and is a .288/.327/.458 hitter with 25 doubles, five triples, 16 home runs and 58 RBI...Daniel Vogelbach, who played for the Crew, is a .289/.393/.500 hitter with eight XBH and 14 RBI in 23 games vs. the Brewers.

KEEP THE CAR RUNNING: The Mets are 6-10 when both teams score six or more runs this year...They are 3-6 when both score seven or more runs and 2-3 when they both score 8 or more runs.

IF YOU START ME OFF: New York is 22-3 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are 8-1 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 23-9 (.719) when scoring first this season...The Mets are 13-35 (.271) when their opponent scores first.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson has posted a 2-1 record with 11 saves, and a 1.59 ERA (6 ER/34.0 IP) in 30 appearances this season... He has walked eight, while striking out 41...He ranks third in the NL and ninth in the majors in ERA among relievers...He is tied for 20th in the NL with 41 punchouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .169 (11-65) average this year.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Mike Vasil was named to the National League 2023 SiriusXM Futures Game roster...The 23-year-old has made 12 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse where he has combined to go 1-3 with a 4.37 ERA (28 ER/57.2 IP) with 13 walks and 66 strikeouts...He was selected by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virginia.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched 6.0 innings against Philadelphia at Citizens Bank Park on June 24... Allowed two runs on seven hits...Struck out eight and walked just one to earn the win in the Mets' 4-2 victory...Threw a season-high 107 pitches.

BREW CITY: Scherzer has made 12 appearances (11 starts) against the Brewers in his career... In those starts, he is 3-4 with a 2.63 ERA (20 ER/68.1 IP)...When facing the Brewers at home, Scherzer has pitched to a 1.88 ERA (5 ER/24.0 IP) in four starts, with a 1-2 record...His last win against the Brewers was on September 19, 2022, during which he threw 6.0 no-hit innings and struck out nine.

EIGHT IS GREAT: Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings for the first time this season on June 19 at Houston...The last time Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings or more was September 12, 2021 with the Los Angeles Dodgers...This was Scherzer's first time accomplishing this feat as a Met... Scherzer holds a career record of 47-3 and has a 1.25 ERA (66 ER/475.2 IP) in games where he pitches 8.0 innings or more.

TURNING THINGS AROUND: After pitching to a 5.56 ERA (14 ER/22.2 IP) in his first five starts this season, Scherzer has picked up five wins over his last eight starts (since May 14 at Washington) and has pitched to a 3.19 ERA (17 ER/48.0 IP) during that span...In that time frame, he has tallied 56 strikeouts compared to six walks, holding opponents to a .245 average and pitching to a 1.06 WHIP.

TERRIFIC TEN: Scherzer whiffed ten batters for the first time this season on June 7 at Atlanta...Marked his first double-digit strikeout game since striking out 11 on August 28, 2022 vs. Colorado...He did not record more than six strikeouts in any of his first eight starts of the season and dating back to his final start of the 2022 season...He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only one other time in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/Detroit).

DOUBLE THE FUN: With his start on June 13, Scherzer advanced to third place all-time with 111 double-digit strikeout games in his career, three more than Pedro Martinez...He broke a tie with Roger Clemens, who had 110 in his career...He'll need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field... Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)... Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (2-3, 6.19)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 4.0 innings against Philadelphia at Citizens Bank Park on June 25... Allowed two runs on five hits, walked two batters and recorded five strikeouts.

COOKIE'S COMEBACK: In his starts on May 25 and May 31 against Chicago-NL and Philadelphia, respectively, Carrasco allowed just two runs over 12.2 innings compared to 18 runs allowed across the 18.2 innings he threw in his first four starts of the season...In those 12.2 innings, Carrasco fanned eight batters, which equals the total strikeouts he tallied in his first three starts of the year.
