Ichiro Suzuki is set to become the third player inducted to the National Baseball Hall of Fame with the Seattle Mariners in **68 days** on July 27 in Cooperstown...he is also set to have his **#51** retired by the Mariners on Aug. 9 at T-Mobile Park.

The Mariners and White Sox face off for the first of two series this season...Seattle will host the White Sox from Aug. 5-7.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 10-game, 3-city road trip with the second of 3 games at the Chicago White Sox (1-0)...Seattle is coming off a series sweep against the Sand Diego Padres (3-0) to open up the road trip and will face the Houston Astros (4 G, 5/22-25) to close out the trip following their current series in the Windy City...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as sideline reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.**

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners beat the White Sox yesterday by a 5-1 final score, their 4th-consecutive victory...Seattle is 19-10 (.655) over its last 29 games and 23-11 (.676) over its last 34 games, the best record in MLB since April 9.

- **Best in the West** - The Mariners are in first place in the American League West, 2.5 games ahead of the Astros and 3.0 games ahead of the Rangers...Seattle also is tied for the 2nd-best record in the American League (also: Yankees), trailing only the Tigers (.646/31-17).
- **Series-ly Solid** - The Mariners own a 10-4-1 series record, 4-3-1 at home and 6-1 on the road...the Mariners won 9 consecutive series from April 7-May 7, the second-longest series winning streak in club history...since **Dan Wilson** took the helm on Aug. 23, 2024, Seattle owns a 17-6-3 series record.
- **Home Runs Are Good** - Seattle is 25-11 (.694) in games with at least one home run...they are 2-8 (.200) in games when they do not homer.
- **Rook to 3H** - **Ben Williamson** registered his 2nd-career 3-hit game yesterday, becoming the 3rd Mariners rookie since the 2021 season to record multiple 3-hit games within his first 30 career games, joining **Ryan Bliss** (2 in 2024) and **Julio Rodríguez** (2 in 2022).
- **In Our Arozarena Era** - **Randy Arozarena** has a .786 OPS and a 135 OPS+ in 44 games this season, batting .236 (37x157), 21 runs, 10 doubles, 6 home runs, 21 RBI, 9 stolen bases and 27 walks...Arozarena has reached base safely in 38 of his last 40 games since March 31, which included a career-high, 34-game on-base streak from March 31-May 12.

THE J-ROD SHOW IS GRAND... **Julio Rodríguez** clubbed an 8th-inning, grand slam to give the Mariners a 5-run cushion in last night's game...it marked Julio's 2nd-career grand slam and first since July 15, 2022 at Texas during his Rookie of the Year campaign...in 16 May games, J-Rod is batting .288 (19x66) with 1 double, 4 home runs, 11 RBI and 2 walks with a .804 OPS, hitting safely in 13-of-16 games.

ROSTER MOVES...today the Mariners selected RHP **Casey Lawrence** and optioned LHP **Jhonathan Díaz** to Triple-A Tacoma...to clear a spot on the 40-man roster, INF Austin Shenton was designated for assignment...this marks Lawrence's fourth stint in the Majors with the Mariners so far this season.

THE BEST CATCHER IN BASEBALL...in 45 games this year, catcher **Cal Raleigh** has a .922 OPS, hitting .241 (40x166) with 31 runs, 8 doubles, 15 homers, 32 RBI, 30 walks and 5 stolen bases, getting on base at a .362 clip and slugging .560...among MLB catchers (min. 100 PA), Cal leads the Majors in home runs, runs, RBI, extra-base hits (23), times on base (72), bWAR (2.3) and fWAR (2.6), while ranking among the leaders in OBP (6th), SLG (2nd), OPS (3rd) and OPS+ (T-2nd, 171)...Raleigh also recently joined Ken Griffey Jr. (4x, 1994, '97-'99), Alex Rodriguez (2x, 1998, 2000), Jay Buhner (1996), Edgar Martinez (2000) and Nelson Cruz (2015) as Mariners to hit 15 HR in his team's first 44 games of a season.

THE BEST CLOSER IN BASEBALL...right-hander **Andrés Muñoz** recorded his 15th save of the season yesterday, tied for the most in the Majors (also: Robert Suarez-SD)...in 21 appearances this season, the reigning American League Reliever of the Month is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 20.2 IP) with 7 hits allowed, 2 runs allowed (0 earned runs), 8 walks (2 intentional) and 28 strikeouts, sporting a 0.73 WHIP, while limiting opponents to a .104 batting average (7x67)...Muñoz leads MLB relief pitchers with 1.9 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*).

KINGS OF THE ROAD...the Mariners are 14-8 (.636) outside of T-Mobile Park, the best road record in the Majors, ranking ahead of the Diamondbacks (.591/13-9) and Cubs (.565/13-10)...Seattle has won 6 consecutive road series since dropping their first one at San Francisco from April 4-6...since then, the Mariners have captured series victories on the road at Cincinnati (2-1), Toronto (2-1), Boston (2-1), Texas (2-1), against the Athletics (2-1) and against the Padres (3-0)...the Mariners last won 6+ consecutive road series during the 2023 season, when they won 8 consecutive road series from July 3-Aug. 23.

GOING DOWN THE ONLY 'ROAD' I'VE EVER KNOWN...Mariners hitters are batting .263 (210x800) with 119 runs, 31 doubles, 33 home runs, 24 stolen bases, a .349 OBP, slugging .425 with a .774 OPS in 22 road games this season, averaging 5.4 runs-per-game...among MLB teams on the road, they rank 2nd in OBP, 5th in runs-per-game and 3rd in OPS.

BULLPEN BULLIES...Seattle relief pitchers are 2-1 with a 1.89 ERA (4 ER, 19.0 IP), 7 walks and 27 strikeouts since May 13...in 5 appearances this season, **Matt Brash** has tossed 4.2 scoreless innings with 6 strikeouts...**Casey Legumina**, who will make his first Major League start today, is 3-1 with a 1.84 ERA (3 ER, 14.2 IP) with 14 strikeouts in 15 appearances this year and **Gabe Speier** is 2-0 with a 2.50 ERA (5 ER, 18.0 IP), 4 walks, 25 strikeouts and a 0.94 WHIP in 21 games).

CALIFORNIA KIDS...**Rowdy Tellez** (Sacramento) and **J.P. Crawford** (Long Beach) were both born in California and were both part of the 2013 MLB draft class with J.P. going in the first round (16th overall) to the Phillies and Tellez going in the 30th round to the Blue Jays...since starting the season with a 1-for-20, Tellez has a .865 OPS, hitting .232 (19x82), slugging .573 with 14 runs, 4 doubles, 8 home runs and 21 RBI over his last 31 games...Crawford is batting .309 (38x123) with 16 runs, 5 doubles, 4 home runs, 19 RBI, 1 stolen base, a .397 OBP and a .447 slugging percentage (.844 OPS) over his last 32 games since April 9.

A DEEP LINEUP...the Mariners have 9 hitters with at least 50 PA and an OPS+ of 100 or better, tied for the most in the Majors: **Jorge Polanco** (185 OPS+), **Cal Raleigh** (171), **Dylan Moore** (150), **Leo Rivas** (136), **Randy Arozarena** (135), **J.P. Crawford** (130), **Julio Rodríguez** (114), **Rowdy Tellez** (112) and **Luke Raley** (102)...the Mariners have 6 players with a 130 OPS+ or better, the most in the Majors.

NEXT HOMESTAND...following the current 10-game road trip, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 9-game homestand where they will host the Washington Nationals (3 G, 5/27-5/29), Minnesota Twins (3 G, 5/30-6/1) and Baltimore Orioles (3 G, 6/3-6/5)...the homestand is highlighted by **Randy Arozarena Bobblehead 3-Day Giveaway** from May 27-29, **K-Pop Fireworks Night** on May 30, **Little League Day** on June 1, **Pride Night** on June 4 and a pair of **Mariners Value Games** on June 3 and June 5, with tickets starting at \$11.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners have won four consecutive games, allowing just 1 run in each contest, winning by 5-1, 4-1, 6-1 and 5-1 final scores, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that it marks the first time the Mariners have allowed no more than 1 run in at least 4 consecutive games since Oct. 2, 2012-April 2, 2013?...it is also tied for the fourth longest streak in franchise history with Seattle going 6-straight games with 1 or fewer runs in both the 2001 and 2010 seasons.

ABOUT CASEY LAWRENCE...

- The 37-year-old right-hander is set to make his 6th appearance of the season and 1st appearance against the White Sox...he is also making his 65th career appearance and 3rd career appearance against Chicago.
- Originally signed with Toronto as an undrafted free agent on June 15, 2010... signed a Minor League contract with Seattle on Nov. 15, 2024.
- Made MLB debut on April 8, 2017 vs. Tampa Bay with Toronto and his Mariners debut on May 18, 2017 vs. Chicago White Sox.
- Attended Albright College where he was named Freshman Athlete of the Year and was selected 1st-Team and 2nd Team All-Conference.
- Was born in McSherrytown, PA and attended Delone Catholic High School (PA).

LAST TIME OUT...allowed 3 runs on 6 hits with 1 strikeout and 1 hit-by-pitch across 2.0 innings in his last appearance with Toronto on 4/29 vs. BOS... in his last Major League start (4/27/17 vs. STL w/ TOR), he allowed 6 runs on 10 hits (1 HR) with 3 walks and 1 strikeout across 5.0 innings pitched.

WELCOME BACK!...this will be Lawrence's 4th stint in the Majors with Seattle this season...he was selected from Triple-A Tacoma on April 9 and recorded the win in his 1st regular season appearance in a Mariners uniform since 2018....he was selected from Tacoma again on April 18 and made back-to-back relief appearances on April 18-19 at Toronto...he was selected a 3rd time on April 23, tossing 5.0 innings in relief on April 25 vs. Miami. He was claimed off waivers by the Toronto Blue Jays on April 28 and made 1 appearance with Toronto on April 29, before signing a minor league contract with the Mariners on May 7.

JOURNEYMAN...is set to become the 58th Mariners player with multiple stints and the 6th in club history to have 3 separate stints with the club, joining Mike Blowers, Raúl Ibáñez, Norm Charlton, Roenis Elías and Jeff Nelson...Lawrence has appeared in 5 Major League seasons with Toronto (2017, '22, '25), Seattle (2017-18, '25) and St. Louis (2023).

“He’s just a tremendous person to do what he has done and he’s been back and forth so much, he’s just the ultimate team guy...It’s a tough role no doubt about it, but he’s handled it so well. We’ve known that about him but when you’re going back and forth as much as he is and to have the attitude that he does, the willingness to do it, the openness, you can’t thank him enough for that.”

CHICAGO & THE WINDY CITY...Lawrence's appearance tonight will mark his first time playing in Chicago against either the White Sox or the Chicago Cubs...having never pitched against the Cubs, he has faced the White Sox twice so far in his career...both those appearances against the White Sox were as a reliever in 2017 and he made his debut in a Mariners jersey on May 18, 2017, tossing 2.0 innings of relief with 2 runs on 4 hits (1 HR) and 2 SO...his 2nd appearance against the White Sox was on May 21, 2017, holding Chicago hitless across 1.1 innings while striking out 1...Lawrence holds a 5.40 ERA (2 ER, 3.1 IP) against the White Sox across his 2 career appearances.

INNINGS EATER...has tossed 3.0+ innings in 16 career appearances, 4.0+ innings in 10 appearances, 5.0+ innings in 5 appearances (3x in 2017, 1x in 2022, and most recently on 4/25 vs. MIA), and 6.0+ innings just once in his first ever Major League start on April 22, 2017 vs. LAA w/ TOR.

MLB CAREER STARTS...has only made two Major League starts in his career...both came in back-to-back appearances on April 22 and 27, 2017, while playing for Toronto in his first season in MLB...threw 90+ pitches in each start (97 pitches on 4/22 and 95 pitches on 4/27)...has also thrown 90+ pitches in a relief appearance on 8/21/2023 against PIT w/ STL, throwing 92 pitches across 4.1 innings.

MINOR LEAGUE STARTS...has made 274 career starts in 304 games across 14 seasons in the minor leagues...among those, he has tossed 112 quality starts (last: 9/4/24 vs. ABQ w/ TAC), 12 complete games (last: 4/7/24 vs. SL w/ TAC) and 4 shutouts (last: 6/4/22 vs. ROC w/ BUF)... he has made 3 starts in Triple-A this season, posting a 3.65 ERA (5 ER, 12.1 IP) with 3 walks, 9 strikeouts, 14 hits and 1 home run allowed... he made 29 starts with Tacoma in 2024 with 11 of those being quality starts.

CAREER HIGH MARKS...Lawrence has tossed a career-high 9 strikeouts in a relief appearance on 6/01/17 vs. COL w/ SEA...his 6.1 innings pitched in his first ever Major League start (4/22/17 vs. LAA w/ TOR) is the most he has pitched in a game...his 5.0 innings of relief on April 25 vs. Miami was the most innings he had pitched since July 2, 2022 when he pitched 5.2 innings vs. Tampa Bay with Toronto.

YEAR 37...is 1 of 20 active Major League pitchers age 37 or older and of that list, Lawrence is the only pitcher to make an appearance with two different teams this season...became the 23rd pitcher and 18th reliever in Mariners history to make an appearance at the age 37 or older...the last Mariners reliever to do so was Sergio Romo in 2022.

ALBRIGHT ALUMNI...is the 10th player to reach the Major Leagues after attending Albright College in Reading, PA and the first since Keith Hughes...7 of the 10 players made pitching appearances and Lawrence's 102 strikeouts are the 3rd most behind Allen Sothoron (576 SO) and Roy Sherid (149 SO).

AWARDED...was named an MiLB.com Organization All-Star in 2021 and 2022 with the Blue Jays...was named International League Pitcher of
