**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Dodgers, 5-0, last night... It was the team's second shutout loss of the season...With a win, the Mets would earn their fifth series victory of the season...With another victory, the Mets would secure at least a .500 road trip...The Mets continue their second road trip of the season an 11-day, 10-game trip (4-1) against the Athletics (3-0), Dodgers (1-1) and Giants (four games).

**HELLO OLD FRIEND:** Noah Syndergaard will make his first career start against the Mets today...The right-handed pitcher spent six years with the Mets where he went 47-31 with a 3.32 ERA, 166 walks and 777 strikeouts...Syndergaard was acquired by the Mets in a deal that sent RHP R.A. Dickey to the Toronto Blue Jays in December of 2012.

**L.A. MAX:** Max Scherzer is 5-5 in his career with a 2.59 ERA (27 ER/93.2 IP) against Los Angeles-NL...He spent the second half of the 2021 season pitching for the Dodgers (L.A. won all 11 of his regular-season starts to end the year)...He is 7-3 with a 2.63 ERA (26 ER/89.0 IP) at Dodger Stadium...He has pitched his team to victory in eight of his last nine starts at this ballpark.

**DAY MAN!:** The Mets are 8-3 in day games this year...Their eight wins in the sunshine are tied for the most in baseball...The team's .727 winning percentage is fifth in the majors...New York has posted a 3.86 ERA (42 ER/98.0 IP) with 53 walks and 94 strikeouts in day baseball...In 2022, the Mets went 39-19 in day games.

**BROTHERS IN ARMS:** Together, Adam Ottavino and David Robertson have combined to post a 0.59 ERA (1 ER/15.1 IP) with three walks and 17 strikeouts...They have converted six of seven save opportunities... They are one of three pairs of teammates who have each recorded multiple saves this season (also, Devin Williams and Bryse Wilson of the Brewers, Carlos Estévez and José Quijada of the Angels).

**OTTAMATIC:** Adam Ottavino has allowed only one run this season, a solo home run in a loss to Milwaukee on April 5...In eight games this year, Ottavino has posted a 1.29 ERA (1 ER/7.0 IP) with three walks and eight strikeouts...Left-handed hitters are batting .091 (1-11) against him.

**DOCTOR ROBERT-SON:** David Robertson has appeared in eight games and has yet to allow a run...He allowed only four hits with nine strikeouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .143 (2-14) batting average this season...He has converted all four save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 161 saves in his career... That is the seventh-most among active players.

**INVADER NIM:** Overall, in 17 games this season, Brandon Nimmo is batting .293 with 10 runs, five doubles, eight RBI, 15 walks and a .447 OBP...His .447 OBP ranks seventh in the majors and fifth in the Senior Circuit...The left-handed hitter has drawn 338 walks in his career, which places him tied for 17th in franchise history with John Milner... Dave Magadan is 16th with 347 free passes...Nimmo has posted a .387 OBP, which is the third-highest in franchise history (min. 2,000 PA)... Only John Olerud (.425) and Dave Magadan (.391) had higher OBP.

**I LOVE L.A.:** Alonso is a lifetime .356 (21-59) with 12 runs, three doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 17 RBI with a .387 OBP and a .797 SLG in 14 games at Dodger Stadium...All seven of his homers against the Dodgers have come on the road...His .897 SLG at the park is the highest all-time (min. 50 PA)...Brandon Nimmo has hit .346 (18-52) with eight runs, three doubles, two home runs, four RBI, four walks with a .414 OBP and a .519 SLG in 17 career games at Dodger Stadium.

**DODGERS-METS NOTES:** Last year, the Mets claimed their first season series from the Dodgers since 2015.

**HOP ON THE TROLLEY:** In 32 career games against the Dodgers, Nimmo has slashed .312/.402/.462 with 16 runs, four doubles, two triples, two home runs, seven RBI and nine walks...In 23 games, Alonso has hit .267/.320/.567 with 14 runs, four doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 17 RBI and four walks...Francisco Lindor has slashed .273/.333/.409 with six runs, three doubles, a home run, four RBI and two walks.

**POWER STATION:** Pete Alonso is tied for the major league lead with eight home runs...He is tied for fifth in the NL with 15 RBI, ranks sixth in the league with a .638 SLG and ninth with a 1.005 OPS...Alonso has safely hit in 10 of his last 12 games, batting .340 (16-47) with 11 runs, seven home runs, 13 RBI, six walks with a .415 OBP and an .787 SLG.

**ROAD WARRIOR:** Alonso has hit 88 home runs on the road in his career...That places him tied for sixth place in franchise history with Carlos Beltran...Beltran recorded 88 homers in 434 road games...Next up is Howard Jonson who socked 102 in 580 away games.

**THE WALKMAN:** The Mets lead the majors with 88 free passes this season...Brandon Nimmo is tied for third in the majors and second in the NL with 15 walks...Jeff McNeil has recorded 11 walks, while Pete Alonso and Francisco Lindor have 10 free passes each this season.

**WHEN YOU WISH UPON A STARLING:** Starling Marte is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in the NL with seven steals...He ranks third among active players with 321 career SB...Only Elvis Andrus (337) and Billy Hamilton (324) have more.

**ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US:** The Mets have stolen 20 bases this season, which is fifth in the majors and is tied for second in the National League...Brandon Nimmo, who is tied for 11th in the NL, has stolen three bases in 17 games this year...Nimmo stole a total of three bases in 151 games last season.

**D-FENCE:** The Mets recorded two errors last night, doubling their season total...Despite that, the team has committed just four errors in 18 games this season, the fewest in the majors...The team's .994 fielding percentage is the best in the majors...Francisco Lindor has recorded five DRS (defensive runs saved) according to the Fielding Bible...That is tied for the most in the majors.

**HITTING THE ROAD:** New York is 7-5 on the road his year...The team finished the 2022 season going 47-34 on the road...Their .580 road winning percentage placed them third in the majors and second in the NL...It was tied for the fourth-best road record in team history and the highest road-winning percentage since 2007.

**THE SMITH:** Drew Smith has 11 strikeouts in 6.2 innings this season...His 14.85 K/per nine among relievers is sixth in the NL (minimum 5.0 innings)...He is 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (2 ER/6.2 IP) in eight games this year.

## SCHERZER NEWS &amp; NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 5.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit on April 10 vs. San Diego as he earned his second win of the season...He walked three and struck out six...It was the 10th time in his career he pitched at least 5.0 innings and allowed one or no hits in a start... Only 18 other pitchers in major league history have done that 10 or more times.

**VS. DODGERS:** Scherzer is 5-5 in his career with a 2.59 ERA (27 ER/93.2 IP) against Los Angeles-NL...He spent the second half of the 2021 season pitching for the Dodgers (L.A. won all 11 of his regular-season starts to end the year)...He is 7-3 with a 2.63 ERA (26 ER/89.0 IP) at Dodger Stadium...He has pitched his team to victory in eight of his last nine starts at this ballpark.

**DOUBLE THE FUN:** Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

**LEGENDARY:** Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just three punchouts separating the two...With 165 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

**OPENING UP:** Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

**QUITE THE DEBUT:** After signing a three-year deal with New York last offseason, Scherzer posted a 2.29 ERA (37 ER/145.1 IP) in his first season with the Mets...That is the lowest mark in a season in his career and the best all-time in a pitcher's first season with the Mets (min. 140.0 innings)...His 0.91 WHIP was not just the best mark by a Met in his first season with the club, it was the best by any Met in club history (min. 140.0 innings)...Scherzer did not allow more than four runs in any of his 23 regular-season starts last season.

**2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:** Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field...Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)...Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

**ALWAYS IMPROVING:** Scherzer set a career-best mark with a 2.29 ERA last season after posting what was then a career-best 2.46 ERA in 2021...No other pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP KODAI SENGA (2-0, 3.38)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Fell one out shy of winning his third straight start to begin his career... Threw 4.2 innings and allowed four runs on seven hits with four walks and seven strikeouts in the Mets 17-6 win at Oakland on April 14.

**PUTTING THE K IN FORK:** Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 16 of his 21 strikeouts through three starts...The pitch has a 62 percent whiff rate and a 36 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just one hit in 20 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .050 batting average.
