METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed labor day off yesterday...On Sunday the team defeated the Seattle Mariners, 6-3, at Citi Field...The Mets finished a 10-day, nine-game homestand (4-5) against the Angels (1-2), Rangers (1-2) and Mariners (2-1)...Tonight, the Mets start a five-game, six-day, road trip against Washington (two games) and Minnesota (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Yesterday, Mike Piazza celebrated his 55th birthday... A seven-time Mets All-Star, he collected 220 home runs and 655 RBI during his Mets career...He ranks first in team history with a .542 slugging percentage... Piazza was elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2016 and became the fourth Met to have his number retired in 2016.

MINOR LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Congrats to Joander Suárez who was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week...In his first career Double-A start on August 31, Suárez hurled 6.0 no-hit innings, allowing one walk and striking out six as the Rumble Ponies defeated the Senators, 1-0...The 23-yearold appeared in 21 games (19 starts) with the Cyclones this year and struck out 118 in 90.1 innings.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 18-19 against the NL East this season...The team has posted a 4.69 ERA and are slashing .239/.324/.383.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets head out for their penultimate road trip of the season...New York has 11 road games remaining in the 2023 campaign...New York has posted a 28-41 record on the road with a 4.83 ERA.

47' BRAND: In 47 games following the All-Star break, Jeff McNeil is batting .299 (56-187) with 27 runs, nine doubles, two triples, four home runs, 23 RBI and eight walks with a .343 OBP...In 89 games before the break, McNeil slashed .253/.331/.328 with three home runs and 26 RBI...He has recorded a hit in 15 of his last 17 games, batting .347 (25-72) in the span with an .893 OPS.

MULTIPLICITY: On Sunday, Pete Alonso recorded his 19th career multi-homer game and the fifth of the season...His five multi-homer games are tied for the third-most in the majors and tied for the fourth-most by a Met in a single season...Dave Kingman (1976), Carlos Delgado (2008) and Lucas Duda (2015) recorded seven multi-homer games in a single-season...Frank Thomas (1962), Bobby Bonilla (1993) and Carlos Beltrán (2007) also recorded a season with five multi-homer games.

DINGERS!: The Mets have socked 180 home runs this season...That is the fifthmost in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The team's 180 home runs are the ninth-most in a single season in franchise history.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets now feature for players who have hit 20 or more home runs this season: Pete Alonso, Francisco Alvarez, Francisco Lindor and Brandon Nimmo...The 2023 Mets are one of five teams in franchise history to accomplish this feat...This includes the 2019 Mets who featured a franchisehigh five players who recorded at least 20 home runs.

GOT TO GO TO MO'S: Ronny Mauricio is batting .455 (5-11) with one run, one double and two steals in his first three career games...The last player to open his career with a four-game hitting streak is Pete Alonso who did so in 2019... The franchise record is seven straight games with a hit, accomplished by Daniel Murphy in 2009 and Keith Miller in 1987.

25/25: Francisco Lindor became the fifth player in franchise history to recorded 25 doubles, 25 homers and 25 steals in a single season...He joined Darryl Strawberry (1984, 1986, 1987, 1988), Howard Johnson (1989, 1991), David Wright (2007) and Carlos Beltrán (2008)...He joined Jimmy Rollins and Hanley Ramírez as the only shortstops in major league history with multiple seasons of 25 homers, 25 doubles and 25 stolen bases

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.2 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.1 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.9), Mookie Betts (18.1) and Trea Turner (16.3) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.1 fWAR since 2021 is sixth in the majors in that span.

LINSANITY: Over his last 66 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .289 (71-246) with 51 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 32 home runs, 37 RBI, 30 walks, 19 steals with a .375 OBP, a .512 SLG and an .887 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-high-tying 25 $\,$ bases in 133 games this season.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 16 games, DJ Stewart is batting .333 (19-57) with 10 runs, three doubles, nine home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.247 OPS... In 39 games this year, Stewart is batting .265 (26-98) with 13 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 21 RBI, 10 walks, a .348 OBP and a .622 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has hit a career-best 20 home runs this season...He joined Curtis Granderson (2015), Tommie Agee (1969, 1970) and Michael Conforto (2017) as the only Mets to have 20 or more HR in the leadoff spot...Nimmo Is the first Mets outfielder with 20 or more homers since 2019. He is batting .279 (48-172) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .344 OBP against left-handed pitchers this year.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 176 strikeouts...He moved into third all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie pitcher passing Noah Syndergaard (166), Jon Matlack (169) and Tom Seaver (170)...He is now three strikeouts shy of passing Jerry Koosman for second all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie...Last night marked the first time a Mets rookie pitcher recorded backto-back double-digit strikeout games since Noah Synderagaard did the trick from September 25 - October 3, 2015...Is the first Japanese-born rookie to accomplish the feat since Masahiro Tanaka did so from June 11 - 17, 2014... Courtesy of Elias.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1969. Tom Seaver tossed a complete game on the way to his 20th victory of the season as the Mets defeated the Phillies, 5-1, in game one of a twinbill at Shea Stadium...Seaver allowed one run on five hits with one walks and struck out seven...He became the first 20-game winner in franchise history, lowering his ERA to 2.48 in the process...Tom Terrific won the NL Cy Young that year, finishing 25-7 with a 2.21 ERA, striking out 208 in 273.1 innings.

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

RECENTLY: Quintana made his first start with the Mets on July 20 against his former team, the Chicago White Sox....Quintana signed a two-year contract with New York on December 9, 2022...The southpaw began the season on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage...Underwent surgery on March 17.

LAST TIME OUT: Quintana made his eighth start of the season on August 29 against the Rangers at Citi Field...He threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed five hits and three walks while striking out five batters...Was his first time allowing no runs this season...The lefty has recorded six quality starts through his first eight starts as a member of the Mets.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

NATIONAL TREASURE: Today, Quintana will make his fifth career start against the Nationals...Quintana last faced Washington on September 6, 2022 at Busch Stadium with the Cardinals and earned the win...In Quintana's lone start at Nationals Park, June 28, 2022 with Pittsburgh, the southpaw allowed one run over 6.0 innings.

HOT STREAK: Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12 at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+ homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias...Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September last year and is the lowest ERA in any month in his career.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022. Currently ranks fifth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,567) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,927), Chris Sale (2,165), Madison Bumgarner (2,070) and Patrick Corbin (1,575).

2022 SEASON: Quintana allowed two earned runs or fewer in 26 starts in the regular season...Posted a season-high 19.1-inning scoreless streak from September 11-28, the longest scoreless streak in by a Cardinals pitcher in 2022... NL Ranks 2022: ERA (2.93, 8th), Games Started (31, T10th), HR/9 IP (0.43, 1st), GIDP/9 IP (1.25, 1st), GIDP (25, T1st).
