**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners play the third of a 4-game series against the Houston Astros (2-0)...following the current series, the Mariners will travel to San Diego for a 3-game set against the Padres before returning to T-Mobile Park for a 6 game homestand against the Texas Rangers (3 G, 4/17-4/19) and Athletics (3 G, 4/20-4/22)...today's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call, with **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners defeated the Astros in walk-off fashion last night, 8-7, capturing each of the first 2 games of the series and extending their win streak against Houston to 5 games, dating back to last year...last night marked Seattle's second walk-off win of 2026 (also: **Cal Raleigh**, single, 3/30 vs. NYY).

- **Division Foes** - Since 2023, the Mariners are 27-14 (.659) against the Houston Astros, going 13-8 (.619) at T-Mobile Park during that stretch...Seattle's next win over HOU will mark its 100th all-time.
- **Making Them Count** - **Cal Raleigh** paces the club with 10 runs batted in, and is "on pace" for 108 RBI over a 162-game season.
- **Long Division** - The Mariners today play their ninth of 10 consecutive divisional games...from April 3-22, Seattle is playing an AL West Division opponent in 16 of 19 games.

**HELLLOOOO**...right-hander **Logan Gilbert** is set to make his 150th career start today...in 149 outings as a big leaguer, the 2024 AL All-Star is 47-38 with a 3.61 ERA (342 ER, 852.0 IP) with 902 strikeouts, 184 walks, a 1.062 WHIP, and 4.90 strikeout-to-walk ratio...among pitchers with at least 750 innings since Gilbert made his MLB debut (2021-c), the right-hander ranks 4th in WHIP (1.062), 2nd in fewest walks-per-9 innings (1.94), 4th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.90), 12th in strikeouts-per-9 innings (9.53), 10th in FIP (3.48), 7th in opponent batting average (.225), and 12th in ERA (3.61).

**DOWN FIVE? STILL ALIVE**...Seattle overcame a 7-2 deficit last night in the eventual 8-7 triumph...the Seattle bullpen was lights out, recording 5.2 scoreless innings with 6 strikeouts and 3 walks (1 intentional)...**Casey Legumina** (1.2 IP), **José A. Ferrer** (1.0), **Eduard Bazarzo** (1.0), **Matt Brash** (1.0) and **Andrés Muñoz** (W, 1.0) contributed...it marked the Mariners first 5+ run comeback win since May 7, 2025 at the Athletics, when they overcame a 5-0 deficit to win 6-5...it marked the Mariners first 5+ run comeback win at home since April 9, 2025, also vs. Houston, when they overcame a 5-0 deficit to win 7-6 on a walk-off walk from **Randy Arozarena** (also, like last night's walk-off, against Astros righty Bryan Abreu)...in both of the 5-run comeback wins against the Astros, **Julio Rodríguez** supplied the game-tying RBI.

**LIGHTS OUT IN THE 'PEN**...the Seattle bullpen owns a 2.19 ERA (12 ER, 49.1 IP) that ranks 2nd-best in the Majors this season...their 1.11 WHIP leads the American League and ranks 3rd in MLB...they also rank 3rd among Major League bullpens in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.33), 4th-lowest in walk rate (7.5%), and 10th in strikeout rate (25.1%)...**Matt Brash** is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 5.2 IP) and 0.71 WHIP...**Casey Legumina** has yet to allow in a run through 5 appearances (7.1 innings pitched).

**THE J-ROD SHOW**...center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** hit his first home run of 2026 in last night's win...the game-tying, 2-run homer in the 5th inning evened things, 7-7...since making his big league debut (2022-c), Julio's 15 game-tying homers are tied for 6th-most in the Majors, trailing Anthony Santander (23), Kyle Schwarber (18), Shohei Ohtani (17), Pete Alonso (16) and Bryce Harper (16).

**TERRIFIC AT T-MOBILE**...since 2023, Seattle owns a 150-102 record (.595) at T-Mobile Park, the best home record in the American League and 4th-best in MLB during that span...Seattle has drawn 327,266 fans so far this season, the 2nd-highest attendance total in the AL and 5th across MLB in 2026.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY, GABE**...Mariners left-handed reliever **Gabe Speier** celebrates his 31st birthday today...since joining the Mariners (2023-c), among 131 left-handed pitchers who have accumulated at least 100 innings pitched, Speier ranks 6th in WHIP (1.032), 6th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.00), and T-8th in strikeouts-per-9 innings (11.4).

**SUNDAY STEELHEADS**...every Sunday home game, the Mariners will honor the 1946 Seattle Negro League team by wearing the Seattle Steelheads uniforms...Seattle won 8-0 vs. Cleveland on March 29 when they made their 2026 Steelheads debut...the Mariners are committing \$500,000 to support local Black-led baseball and softball initiatives...for more information, visit [Mariners.com/Steelheads](http://Mariners.com/Steelheads).

Crawford** recorded the bases-loaded, walk-off RBI single in the bottom of the 9th of last night's 8-7 win, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...J.P. is tied for the most walk-off plate appearances (8) in Mariners history?...Crawford tied his former teammate Mitch Haniger for the franchise lead...additionally, Crawford's 7 walk-off hits also tied a franchise record with Jim Presley.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- Gilbert, 28, is making his 4th start of the 2026 season and 1st against the Houston Astros...it is the 150th start of his career and 15th career start against the Astros.
• Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau on June 16, 2018.
• Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
• Named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.
• Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2024.

LAST TIME OUT...on April 4 vs. Rangers, recorded a quality start, allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 7 hits over 6.0 innings, while striking out 5 batters and walking none... he threw 95 pitches (54 strikes).

HOUSTON, WE HAVE A PROBLEM...tied for the 8th most strikeouts against Houston among active starting pitchers with Yusei Kikuchi (73)... ranks 14th among active starting pitchers in base runners per 9 innings against the Astros (9.68) among active starting pitchers (min. 20 IP), sitting just behind George Kirby's 9.66 base runners per 9...The Mariners have gone 3-2 over Gilbert's 5 starts against the Astros at home...in 5 home games, he owns a 2.12 ERA and has logged 3 quality starts and two 5+ inning shutouts.

HOME IS WHERE THE K IS...has recorded 7+ strikeouts in 11-of-15 home starts since the beginning of the 2025 season...his 11 games are tied for 2nd most over this span, trailing Dylan Cease-SD/TOR and Jesús Luzardo's-PHI 12 games...has thrown 7+ strikeouts in 34 home starts over his career to rank 4th in Mariners franchise history behind Randy Johnson (100), Félix Hernández (96), and Mark Langston (45).

SOMETHING ABOUT THE SUNSHINE...will make a start in his first day game of the season...owns a 21-13 record (.618) with a 3.36 ERA (119 ER, 533.2 IP) in day games compared to his 3.76 ERA (223 ER, 533.2 ERA) when pitching at night...ranks 8th in K/BB (5.00), T9 in WHIP (1.03), and 9th in base runners allowed during day games among active starting pitchers (min. 20 GS)...owns the 4th most strikeouts in day games (350) in Mariners history behind Félix Hernández (815), Randy Johnson (560), and Jamie Moyer (355).

IN COMMAND...is 1-of-4 starting pitchers in 2026 to record multiple starts with 5+ strikeouts and no walks allowed, done in his Opening Day start on March 26 and in his last start on April 6 (also: Kevin Gausman-TOR, Christopher Sanchez-PHI, and Cam Schlichter-NYY)...owns the 9th best strikeout-to-walk ratio in MLB in 2026 (6.000).

MOVING UP THE RANKS...with his last start on April 6 vs. Rangers, Gilbert recorded his 26th quality start with no walks to move up to join Tarik Skubal-DET at rank 5 in most such starts in MLB since 2021.

AMONG THE LEAGUE...his 902 strikeouts since 2021 lead the American League while his 852.0 innings pitched are 3rd most and his 149 starts are 2nd in the AL across that span.

BRING ON APRIL...April is Gilbert's highest performing month of the season with a career 2.48 ERA, a .199 opponent batting average, and a 0.93 WHIP...ranks 4 in WHIP, 3rd in base runners per 9 innings with 8.57, and 7th in K/BB with 5.78 among active starting pitchers during the month of April (min. 20 IP).

A LITTLE R&R...with the off day on April 9, Gilbert will be entering today's game on 5 days of rest... he owns a 3.24 ERA (150 ER, 416.1 IP), 5.41 K/BB, 1.021 WHIP, and .221 opponent batting average (345x1562) when pitching after 5 days compared to 4 days of rest where he has a 4.50 ERA, 4.06 K/B, 1.191 WHIP and a .245 opponent batting average...in his April 6 start vs. Rangers made on 5 days of rest he threw 96 pitches, the most since April of last season, over 6.0 innings, allowing only 2 runs on 6 hits and no walks.

WHERE IT RANKS...his 11.9 SO/9 last season is the 4th-best mark among starters in a single season in Mariners history (trailing Randy Johnson's 1995, '97, '98 seasons) while his 9.528 career SO/9 ratio is 3rd-best in franchise history (min. 500 IP), trailing James Paxton's 9.545 and Randy Johnson's 10.585 career SO/9 mark.

AMONG THE GREATS...his 3.61 career ERA (342 ER, 852.0 IP) is 7th-best among starters in Mariners history (min. 500 IP), trailing Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA, Luis Castillo (3.45), and George Kirby (3.59)...his 902 career strikeouts are 6th-most in Mariners history.

2025 TOTALS...in 25 regular season starts, went 6-6 with a 3.44 ERA (50 ER, 131.0 IP) with 173 strikeouts and 31 walks, posting a 1.031 WHIP...led the Majors in strikeouts-per-nine innings (11.89), and ranked 2nd in strikeout rate (32.3%) during the regular season (min. 100.0 IP).
