METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Padres, 7-4, last night...The Mets are in a stretch of 16 games in 17 days (3-9)...The Mets are in the midst of their final homestand of the regular season, a 10-day, nine-game (2-3) stand against the Rangers (1-2), Padres (1-1) and Nationals (three games).

**CONNECT FOUR:** The Mets have hit four home runs in consecutive games...lt marks the ninth time in franchise history the club has hit four or more homers in consecutive games and the second time this season (also: 8/29-30)...It is the third season in which the Mets have hit four or more homers in consecutive games on multiple occasions (also: 2005 and 2016)...Their 14 games with four or more homers are the third-most in the majors this season behind the Yankees' 17 such games and the Cubs' 15 such games.

DIRTY 30S: The Mets feature two players with 30 + homers - Pete Alonso and Juan Soto...They are one of six teams with two players who have socked 30 or more homers this season...The Mets have never featured three players with 30+ homers each...Francisco Lindor is three homers away from 30 this season... Howard Johnson (36 HR/32 SB) and Darryl Strawberry (39 HR/36 SB) in 1987 are the only pair of Mets teammates to have a 30/30 season...Along with the 1987 Mets, the 1996 Rockies are the only other team that featured two players with a 30/30 season - Dante Bichette (31 HR/31 SB) and Ellis Burks (40 HR/32 SB).

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets have posted a .311 (141-454) batting average with RISP in 55 games in the second-half...That is the highest mark in the NL and second-highest in MLB...Their .393 OBP and .524 SLG with RISP following the All-Star break is the best in the majors.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has homered in three straight games...Since he joined the league in 2019, Alonso has hit 262 home runs, the third-most in that span behind Aaron Judge (280) and Kyle Schwarber (265)...Alonso is batting .309/.400/.648 with 14 home runs and 82 RBI with runners in scoring position this season...His 82 RBI and 27 extra-base hits are the most in the majors.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed six earned runs on four hits and three walks in his third Major League start on September 12 vs. Texas...Has walked three or more in back-to-back appearances.

**STRIKE 'EM OUT TONIGHT:** He became just one of six Mets to throw at least 5.0 innings and strikeout at least six in each of their first two Major League appearances...This season, teammate Nolan McLean has accomplished it along with Christian Scott (2024), Kodai Senga (2023), Steven Matz (2015), and Matt Harvey (2012).

FIRST TIME SO GOOD: Allowed four runs, one earned over 5.0 innings and earned the win in his Major League debut on August 29 against Miami...Joined Jim McAndrew, Tyler Yates, Nino Espinosa and Jon Matlack as the only pitchers in franchise history to throw 5.0 or more innings and issue zero walks in their Major League debut...Tong's six strikeouts were the most among the group...Tong became the fifth-youngest Mets starter to earn the win in their Major League debut and the youngest since Julio Valera who earned the win in his Major League debut on September 1, 1990 at 21 years and 323 days...Joins Dwight Gooden as the only Mets pitchers age 22 or younger to throw at least 5.0 innings and allow one or zero earned runs in the Major League debut.

**GOT THE CALL:** Tong was ranked the number 44 prospect in baseball and the number four prospect in the Mets system when he was called up according to MLBPipeline.com...He became become the seventh player (sixth pitcher) to make his MLB debut with the Mets this season, joining Hayden Senger, Alex Carrillo, Justin Hagenman, Jonathan Pintaro, Blade Tidwell, and Nolan McLean.

**YOUNG MAN'S GAME:** At 22 years old and 71 days he became the youngest pitcher to start for the Mets since Jenrry Mejia (20 years old and 339 days) on September 15, 2010 and the youngest Mets starting pitcher to make their Major League debut since Jon Niese (21 years old and 311 days) made his debut on September 2, 2008...He is one of 12 pitchers in franchise history to make his Major League debut as a starter at age 22 and 71 days or younger...Was the third-youngest starter at the time of their debut in the Majors this season and will only be older than Chase Petty and Didier Fuentes were.

**THE GREAT TONG:** In 22 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse, he posted a 1.43 ERA (18 ER/113.2 IP) and recorded a Minor League-leading 179 strikeouts...His 1.43 ERA is the best among qualified full-season minor leaguers...He ranks first in batting average against (.148, 58-392) and third in WHIP (0.92) among qualified full-season minor leaguers...He has given up one or zero earned runs in 12 of his last 13 starts dating back to June 4 and he has a 0.90 ERA (7 ER/69.2 IP) with a 13.82 K/9 over that span.

**TONG 'EH':** He was born in Markham, ON and he is the 12th player born in Canada to play a game for the Mets...He is the eighth Canadian to pitch for the team in franchise history and the third this season (Jared Young 6/15 and Zach Pop 7/6)...He became the third Canadian to start a game for the Mets and the first since 1962 (also: Ray Daviault, 1962 and Ken MacKenzie, 1962)...He became the 22nd player born in Canada to play in the majors this season...He is the youngest Canadian-born player to make their Major League debut since Josh Naylor debuted at 21 years old and 336 days on May 24, 2019.

**SWING AND A LOT OF MISS:** Tong was the Minor League strikeout leader at time of his callup and through his two starts in Triple-A he has generated a 21.9% whiff rate...His whiff rate is tied for the eighth-most among Triple-A pitchers who have thrown at least 100 pitches...23 of his 39 swing and misses were generated by his fastball...This season he has a K/9 of 14.17 and for his career it sits at 13.70...His arnsenal contains a four-seam fastball, a changeup, a slider, a curveball, and a cutter.

**CAREER NOTES:** Tong was selected in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Amateur Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy in Statesboro, GA...Across three minor league seasons he has posted a 2.54 ERA (70 ER/247.2 IP) over 57 appearances (53 starts) and recorded 377 strikeouts...While with Double-A Binghamton this season he was named EAS Pitcher of the Week twice (week of 5/11 and the week of 5/17) and EAS Pitcher of the Month twice (May and June).

- Was recalled today for his fourth stint with the team this season...This season he has gone 5-2 with two saves, 12 holds and a 3.67 ERA (23 ER/56.1 IP) through 47 appearances (three as an opener), holding batters to a .231 average (46-199)...Right-handed hitters have batted .203 (24-118) against him compared to a .272 average against left-handers (22-81)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .170 average (17-100)...His 1.11 ERA through his first 24 games of the season was the eighth best in franchise history through as many games.
- In his last time out he threw 3.1 scoreless innings in relief on September 12 vs. Texas...Marked the second-longest scoreless outing of his career (longest: 3.2 IP, 6/8/24 MIA vs. CLE) and his longest appearance of the season...Has not allowed a run in nine outings (1 start) of 2.0 or more innings this season
- Has posted a 3-1 record with six holds and a 2.93 ERA (9 ER/27.2 IP) at Citi Field this season.
- Allowed one run over 1.0 inning and earned a hold on August 26 vs. Philadelphia (1.0 IP, 3 H, ER)...Has allowed at least three hits in two of his last four outings in the majors after only allowing three or more hits in three of his first 43 appearances.
- In 10 games with Syracuse he posted a 5.93 ERA (9 ER/13.2 IP) with 15 strikeouts...Seven of his 10 appearances were scoreless.
- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.
- Prior to his outing on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned run in each of his first 30 outings of the season...He allowed 14 earned runs over 13 appearances in the month of June (9.95 ERA) after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May (1.34 ERA)...Five of his last six appearances have been scoreless dating back to July 8.
- 14 of his appearances this season have been for four or more outs...13 of those appearances have been scoreless...Has posted 11 scoreless relief appearances of 1.2 innings or more which is tied for the 11th-most such outings among Major League relievers.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse before today's game for his sixth stint with the team this season...This season he has appeared in 12 games for the Mets (one start), has earned two holds and has a 2.30 ERA (4 ER/15.2 IP).
- His last appearance for the Mets came August 30 against Miami (3.0 IP, BB, 3 K)...Was his ninth career relief appearance of 3.0 or more scoreless innings and his first since April 5, 2017.
- Has appeared in 35 games (one start) for Triple-A Syracuse and he has a 3.35 ERA (14 ER/37.2 IP) with 32 strikeouts in those appearances...Is holding batters to a .273 batting average (39-143) in Triple-A this season.
- Made his eighth career start on July 6 vs. New York-AL and his first since August 13 (G2), 2019 at Chicago-AL while with the Astros...
   He tossed 2.0 scoreless innings and allowed one hit while striking out two.
- On June 22 at Philadelphia, tossed a hitless inning of relief (K)...Was his first time pitching on consecutive days since June 20-21, 2024 with Tampa...Tossed a perfect ninth inning on June 21 at Philadelphia...Made his first appearance vs. the Phillies and has now faced all 30 Major League teams at least once in his career.
- He made his Mets debut on April 30 vs. Arizona, allowing two earned runs over 2.0 innings in relief (2 H, BB, 2 K)...Was his longest Major League appearance since June 21, 2024 at Pittsburgh with Tampa Bay (also: 2.0 IP).
- In his Major League career, has held left-handed batters to a .209 average (157-751) compared to a .244 average (194-795) against right-handed hitters.
