**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Cardinals, 8-7, yesterday at Citi Field...The Mets finished a six-day, five-game homestand (2-3) against the Yankees (1-1) and Cardinals (1-2)...Today, New York heads out on a seven-day, six-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Philadelphia (three games).

**HOUSTON WE HAVE A PROBLEM:** New York has dropped seven straight games to the Astros...The team's last victory against the Astros came on September 28, 2014 at Citi Field...The Mets has dropped eight straight in Houston...The team's last victory in Houston was on May 15, 2011.

**ASTRO, ASTRO, ASTROLAND:** Pete Alonso has played four career games against the Astros and is 4-11 with one homer, two RBI and two walks...In 16 career games, Tommy Pham has hit .356 (21-59) with nine runs, five doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, five walks with a .406 OBP and a .542 SLG...Mark Canha has posted a .341 OBP in 77 career games against the Astros.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets head out on the road again...The team has played 39 games on the road this year, tied for the fourth-most in the majors and tied for the second-most in the National League...New York is 16-23 away from Citi Field in 2023.

**IL PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** LHP Joey Lucchesi was named the International League Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 12-18... Lucchesi went 6.2 scoreless innings on June 13 at Buffalo...He allowed two hits, didn't walk a batter and struck out six...Lucchesi is 5-1 with a 2.33 ERA (12 ER/46.1 IP) with 45 strikeouts in eight starts for Syracuse.

**MAKE IT A DOZEN:** Brandon Nimmo has reached base safely in each of his last 12 games...He owns a .404 OBP in that span with a .914 OPS...He has safely hit in seven of his last nine games, batting .306 (11-36) with five runs, two doubles, three home runs, four walks, 11 RBI, a .419 OBP, a .611 SLG and a 1.030 OPS in that span...Nimmo is batting .341 (30-88) with nine doubles, one triple and a .404 OBP against southpaws this season.

**ROAD WARRIOR:** Nimmo is batting .329 (50-180) with 21 runs, eight doubles, three triples, three home runs, 22 RBI, 21 walks with a .413 OBP, a .480 SLG and an .894 OPS in 39 road games this year...That compares to a .233/.336/.388 slashline with nine extra-base hits and 10 RBI in 30 games at Citi Field in 2023.

**A CENTURY:** New York's pitching staff has allowed 100 home runs, the second-most in the NL and the fourth-most in the majors...The Mets allowed a total of 169 home runs in 2022...The bullpen has only eight blown saves, tied for the fifth-fewest in the majors.

**PHAM-TASTIC:** Tommy Pham has safely hit in nine of his last 10 games, batting .300 (12-40) with five runs, five doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI, one walk, one steal with an .885 OPS over that span...Since May 17, Pham is batting .318 (21-66) with nine runs, seven doubles, one triple, four home runs, 18 RBI, five walks, four steals with a .997 OPS in 21 games.

**WHEN YOU'RE IN SCORING POSITION, YOU'RE PHAMILY:** Tommy Pham leads the Mets with a .355 (11-31) average with runners in scoring position...Since May 18, Pham has nine hits in 15 at-bats with RISP...He leads the majors in average (.600), OBP (.632), slugging percentage (1.333) and OPS (1.965) with RISP over that timeframe.

**A STARLING IS BORN:** Over his last 35 games, Starling Marte is batting .291 (37-127) with 18 runs, two doubles, one triple, two home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, 10 steals with a .328 OBP...He has safely reached base in 15 of his last 18 games.

**IF YOU START ME OFF:** New York is 19-2 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are 7-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

**FIRST IS THE BEST:** The Mets are 20-8 (.714) when scoring first this season...On the other hand, the Mets are 13-30 (.302) when their opponent scores first.

**ASTROS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 20-28 since Minute Maid Park opened in 2000.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Despite missing 10 games, Pete Alonso's 22 home runs this year, leads the National League and rank second in the majors to Shohei Ohtani (24)...Alonso has 49 RBI, ranking third in the NL...Alonso has two homers in his last four games dating to June 4...He returned from the IL on Sunday.

**THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE:** The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 9-8 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 244-235 record in Interleague play...The team's .509 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

**INTERSTELLAR:** Jeff McNeil owns a .326/.376/.442 slashline with 41 runs, 15 doubles, seven home runs and 38 RBI in 84 Interleague games, while Starling Marte has slashed .325/.386/.541 with 121 runs, 46 doubles, 11 triples, 29 home runs and 90 RBI in 186 Interleague games...They rank second and third, respectively, in average among active players in Interleague play (min. 250 PA)...McNeil's .326 clip is the second-highest all-time by a Met.

**FIRST IS THE WORST:** The Mets have been outscored 52-21 in the first inning this year.

**STEAL THIS BASE:** The Mets have stole 25 consecutive bases without being caught...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)...The Mets are first in the major leagues with an 89.5% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 19 bags this year, tied for seventh in the majors and tied for second in the National League...His 333 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

**DR. ROBERTSON:** David Robertson has posted a 2-1 record with a 1.72 ERA (6 ER/31.1 IP) in 28 appearances this season...He has walked eight, while striking out 40...He ranks fifth in the NL in ERA among relievers and tied for 13th with 40 punchouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .161 (10-62) average this year.

**HIP, HIP, HOME RUN:** The Mets have homered in 26 of their last 29 games, socking 44 bombs in that span...The Mets are tied for fifth in the National League with 85 blasts this season.

**THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS:** Francisco Alvarez as hit 12 home runs this season...That is the third-most by a rookie in the majors and the second-most in the National League...10 of his home runs have come as a catcher...Only one other rookie catcher in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (12) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Alvarez's 12 homers in his first 44 games played in a season as a primary catcher at age 21 or younger are the most in the majors...Johnny Bench had 11 homers in 1969...Hit tip Sarah Langs.

**ABSENCE OF PROOF:** The New York Mets are teaming up with the national non-alcoholic pop-up Absence of Proof to bring a fun non-alcoholic experience to Citi Field...Fans ages 21 and up can enjoy a ballgame at Citi Field while sipping on refreshing craft mocktails and other non-alcoholic beverages during this special experience...The event, presented by Cadillac and Dunkin', will run in the Piazza Club on the Excelsior level for four home games: Thursday, June 29 vs. the Milwaukee Brewers and June 30-July 2 vs. the San Francisco Giants.

### SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Pitched 3.1 innings pitched against New York-AL at Citi Field on June 13... Allowed a season-high-tying six runs and surrendered seven hits...Did not allow any walks and struck out two in the Mets' 7-6 loss.

**H-TOWN:** Scherzer has faced eight times in his career, seven of which have been starts... In those outings, he is 4-1 with a 3.27 ERA (19 ER/52.1 IP)...When facing the Astros on the road, Scherzer has pitched to a 3.15 ERA (7 ER/20.0 IP) in three starts, with a 1-1 record...His last win against the Astros came on August 4, 2021 in his Dodgers debut, during which he threw 7.0 innings, allowed two earned runs on five hits and one walk while striking out ten.

**TURNING THINGS AROUND:** After pitching to a 5.56 ERA (14 ER/22.2 IP) in his first five starts this season, Scherzer has picked up three wins over his last six starts (since May 14 at Washington) and has pitched to a 3.71 ERA (14 ER/34.0 IP) during that span...In that time frame, he has tallied 40 strikeouts compared to four walks, holding opponents to a .256 average and pitching to a 1.12 WHIP.

**TERRIFIC TEN:** Scherzer whiffed ten batters for the first time this season on June 7 at Atlanta...Marked his first double-digit strikeout game since striking out 11 on August 28, 2022 vs. Colorado...He did not record more than six strikeouts in any of his first eight starts of the season and dating back to his final start of the 2022 season...He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only one other time in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/Detroit).

**DOUBLE THE FUN:** With his start on June 13, Scherzer advanced to third place all-time with 111 double-digit strikeout games in his career, three more than Pedro Martinez...He broke a tie with Roger Clemens, who had 110 in his career...He'll need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

**LEGENDARY:** Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just 16 punchouts separating the two...With 120 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

**OPENING UP:** Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

**2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:** Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field...Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)...Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

**ALWAYS IMPROVING:** Scherzer set a career-best mark with a 2.29 ERA last season after posting what was then a career-best 2.46 ERA in 2021...No other pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JUSTIN VERLANDER (2-3, 4.40)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 6.0 innings against the Yankees at Citi Field on June 14...Allowed one run on three hits, did not allow any walks and struck out six.

**HELLO OLD FRIENDS:** Tomorrow, Justin Verlander will face the Astros for the first time since signing with the Mets this past offseason...In 102 career regular season starts with Houston, Verlander went 61-19 with a 2.26 ERA (164 ER/652.0 IP)...While with Houston, Verlander took home the AL Cy Young award in 2019 and 2022...Verlander is one of four pitchers in Astros franchise history to win the award, joining Mike Scott (NL, 1986), Roger Clemens (NL, 2004) and Dallas Keuchel (AL, 2015).

- Leads the NL and ranks second in the majors with 22 home runs...Tied for ninth in the majors and is third in the NL with 49 RBI...Tied for 14th in the NL with 41 runs...Is ninth in the majors and seventh in the league in SLG (.536).
- Belted an opposite-field, game-tying grand slam on May 19 vs. Cleveland...Was his third career grand slam and the third game-tying slam in Mets history.
- Tied a Mets record with his fourth career walk-off blast on May 17 vs. Tampa Bay, a three-run shot to ice an 8-7, extra-inning victory...Five other hitters have hit four walk-off home runs with the Mets: Chris Jones, Kevin McReynolds, Cleon Jones, Mike Piazza and Wilmer Flores.
- His walk-off home run on May 17 was his fourth career extra-inning long ball...He is a .417 (10-24) hitter in extra innings with a 1.442 OPS in his career.
- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 168 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.
- Ranks 12th in franchise history with 429 career RBI...Up next: Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).

- Has four home runs and six RBI in his last nine games...Had his second multi-homer game of the season on June 8 at Atlanta...Only three other Mets have had more than one multi-homer game before turning 22: Darryl Strawberry (four), Ed Kranepool (three) and José Reyes (two)...Strawberry is the only other Met to have multiple in a single season (four in 1983).
- Leads all rookie catchers and ranks third among all rookies with 12 home runs...His 13 career homers before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993...Travis d'Arnaud (13) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher and Jason Phillips (11) is the only other to reach double digits.
- Had seven extra-base hits, 13 RBI and seven runs scored during a career-best eight-game hitting streak from May 17-28.
- Has three three-run home runs...Only five players have more this season...Hit a game-tying, three-run home run on May 27 at Coors Field.
