FLIGHT PATTERN: The St. Louis Cardinals and San Francisco Giants kick off a season-ending three-game series tonight at Oracle Park ... St. Louis concluded the first leg of its six-game road trip by taking two-of-three from the Rockies at Coors Field ... For only the second time in franchise history and first time since 1960, the Redbirds will start and finish their regular season on the West Coast. - Elias

- The Cardinals started the 1960 season at San Francisco, and the 1964, 1984, and 2024 seasons at the Los Angeles Dodgers.
- St. Louis ended regular seasons in San Francisco twice (1958 and 1960) and once in Los Angeles (1962).

BAKER REJOINS ST. LOUIS: Prior to tonight's series opener, the Cardinals reinstated first baseman **Luken Baker** from the Paternity List and optioned outfielder Victor Scott II to Memphis (AAA).

WINNING WAYS: St. Louis enters today tied with Chicago for 2nd place in the National League Central Division ... The Cardinals are looking for one more win to finish with a winning season for the 23rd time since 2000 and the 84th in franchise history.

At 81-78, the Cardinals extended their 65-year streak of avoiding backto-back losing campaigns in full seasons since 1958-59, 2nd-longest in major North American sports history behind the NHL's Montreal Canadiens (80 years between 1938-42 to 2021-23). (chart left)

COMEBACK CARDS: Since 1913, St. Louis has experienced six 90+ loss seasons (1913, 1916, 1976, 1978, 1990, 2023). With a win this series, the Cards will have finished above .500 every year following those: 81-72 in 1914; 82-70 in 1917; 83-79 in 1977; 86-76 in 1979 & 84-78 in 1991. - Elias

- After ending with a 71-91 record last season, St. Louis has improved by double-digit wins for the 33rd time in franchise history since 1892 (excluding 1981-82 and 2020-21). - Elias
- Through 160 games, their 12-win gain from last season is tied for MLB's 5th-best improvement.

PLUS-MINUS: St. Louis (-54) is the only MLB team with a winning record but a negative run differential, while the Giants (79-80, +1) and Reds (76-83, +6) are the only two with losing records and positive run differentials.

Only four Cardinals teams in franchise history have finished at or above .500 with a negative run differential: 1911, 1917, 1966, and 1975 ... St. Louis sports a +2.73 run differential per game in wins, 2nd-lowest to MLB to the Rays (2.70).

LAND OF THE GIANTS: According to Baseball Reference, RHP Chris Roycroft, LHP Lee Guetterman (1993), and RHP Mike Naymick (1944) are listed as the tallest pitchers in Cardinals franchise history at 6 feet, 8 inches tall. In addition, the Cardinals currently have 6-ft, 6-inch RHP Kyle Gibson and OF Jordan Walker on the team... Giants RHP Sean Hjelle (pronounced "JELL-ee") is the tallest Major Leaguer in 2024, listed as 6-foot-11...former STL pitchers Adam Wainwright and Andrew Miller were both 6-foot-7.

THE CITY BY THE BAY: St. Louis leads San Francisco by a slim 362-361 margin in the all-time series since the Giants moved from New York in 1958 ... One victory this series would give the Cardinals a winning season series over for the 9th time since 2013.

MASYN MILESTONES: Masyn Winn plays in his 147th game at shortstop tonight, tying Ed Holly (1907) for the Cardinals rookie record at shortstop ... 1978 San Diego Padre Ozzie Smith holds the Major League rookie record with 159 games at shortstop.

KID'S CLUB: The Cardinals lead MLB this season in combined games (999) by players age 25 or younger, 5th-most in franchise history behind 1937 (1,008 g), 1973 (1,042 g), 1977 (1,084 g), and 1974 (1,089 g) ... Over the last six seasons (2019-24) across MLB, only the Cleveland Guardians from 2023 (1,041 g) and 2022 (1,038 g) have had more.

CORNERSTONE COMBO: Paul Goldschmidt (32 HR, 113 RBI) and Nolan Arenado (33 HR, 112 RBI) are the top two active leaders in homers and RBI against the Giants ... The duo is attempting to continue where Hall of Famer Stan "The Man" Musial left off, the alltime MLB leader against the Giants in runs (272), hits (504), RBI (312), home runs (89) ... Arenado's 33 dingers and 112 RBI are both his most against any opponent, while no visiting player in Oracle Park history has gone yard here more than Goldy (15) & Nado (12).

SAN FRANCISCO CONNECTIONS

Paul Goldschmidt made his MLB debut at San Francisco (Aug. 1, 2011)...singled in first career PA off **Matt Cain** (Aug. 1, 2011)...homered off **Tim Lincecum** for first MLB home run (Aug. 2, 2011).

Jordan Hicks was selected by St. Louis in the 3rd Round of the 2015 MLB Draft...played parts of six seasons in St. Louis (2018-23).

Nolan Arenado's brother, Jonah Arenado, was selected by San Francisco in the 16th round of 2013 MLB Draft...played seven minor league seasons (2013-19) in the Giants organization.

Willie McGee played four seasons (1991-95) with the Giants...was born in San Francisco...graduated from Harry Ells High School in Richmond..played college baseball at Diablo Valley College in Pleas-ant Hill...resides in Hercules...worked as an asst. coach for Contra Costa College in San Pablo, CA.

Hayden Birdsong was born in Mattoon, III...pitched at Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, III.

Nolan Arenado and Matt Chapman were high school teammates at El Toro High School in Lake Forest, CA...In 2009 as a senior shortstop, Arenado's backup was Chapman, who only played shortstop when Arenado pitched.

Cardinals Bullpen Coach Julio Rangel was the Giants Minor League Pitching Coordinator in 2018.

Cardinals Hall of Famer Keith Hernandez was born in San Francisco, CA...graduated from Capuchino High School in San Bruno, CA.

Late Hall of Famer Orlando Cepeda played parts of three seasons with St. Louis (1966-68)...in 1967, was NL All-Star, NL MVP and won the World Series...traded by the Cardinals to Atlanta for Joe Torre (March 17, 1969).

Daniel Descalso was born in Redwood City and resides in Danville, Calif...graduated from Saint Francis High School in Mountain View in 2004... played college baseball at UC-Davis (2005-07).

Giants Special Asst. Will Clark played in 51 games in his final season (2000) with St. Louis...slashed .345/.441/.621 in eight Postseason games.

Duane Kuiper is a graduate of Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, III.

Cardinals broadcaster Ricky Horton made his MLB debut at San Francisco (April 7, 1984).

Cardinals Hall of Famer Matt Morris pitched two seasons in San Francisco (2006-07).

Cardinals Hall of Famer Tommy Herr played 32 games for the Giants during his final season (1991).

Cardenales broadcaster **Bengie Molina** played parts of four seasons with the Giants (2007-10). Cardinals Video Coordinator Chad Blair is a native

of Santa Rosa, Calif. who also worked for Oakland. Athletic writer Katie Woo is a native of Vacaville, Calif...previously covered the Giants, 49ers, & Warriors for NBC Sports Bay Area & California.

- The Cardinals' Opening Day starter for 2024 makes his team-leading 32nd start of the season and his 182nd career (210th career appearance).
- Has the 4th-highest win pct. (.800, 4-1) vs. the Giants among active pitchers with five
- Earned his 2nd home win of the season in his last start vs. CLE (9/21) tossing a quality start in a 6-5 win. Previous home win was vs. SF (6/22).
- Has not issued a walk in the month of September. Only pitcher with 17.0 or more innings who has not given a free pass. Last walk came vs. SD (8/27) to Jake Cronenworth.
- Has made 32 or more starts in every season not interrupted by injury as a member of the Cardinals. His 171 career starts since 2018 entering tonight ranks 12th among MLB pitchers over that period.
- Has logged 5th season of 30+ starts since 2018, tying José Berríos, Gerrit Cole, Charlie Morton, Luis Castillo, Patrick Corbin & Aaron Nola for most in MLB in that time.
- Miles is the 23rd Cardinal in franchise history to make 30+ starts in three consecutive seasons (2022-24) and the first to do so since teammate Lance Lynn (2013-15).
- · Leads MLB in first-pitch strike pct. (71.7%) this season, while his 67.2% career firstpitch strike pct. is highest in MLB history among pitchers with 1,000 career IP
- Sports the lowest Walk Pct. (4.4%) among active MLB pitchers (min. 500 innings).
- Has extensive home and road splits: 2-6 with a 6.16 ERA in 15 home starts and 7-5 with a 4.59 ERA in 16 road starts.
- Seven (T-5th in NL) of his eight wins this season have come on the road. Since joining St. Louis in 2018, he has winning road record (34-29), but is just 25-28 at Busch Stadi um. Ran off a streak of eight straight quality starts on the road before it was snapped in his Aug. 4 start at Chicago Cubs, longest stretch of the season in MLB.
- Has thrown over 100 pitches in two of his 31 starts (101 at DET on 5/1 & 100 vs. LAD on 8/16) after ranking 7th in MLB with 12 such games in 2022.
- In his 171 starts with the Cardinals, St. Louis is 70-32 when Miles works 6.0+ IP (10-5 this season), while the Cardinals are 24-46 when he goes 5.2 innings or fewer.
- Mikolas is an amazing 49-7 (.875 win pct) as a Cardinal when receiving 3 or more runs in support (Cardinals are 65-16 in those 81 games, including 9-4 this season). He's just 12-53 (.185) when receiving 2 runs or fewer (Cardinals 29-61).
- . St. Louis is 94-78 (.547) in his 172 career outings (171 starts) since joining the organization (2018-present).

- Earned his first win since 7/21 at ATL and his first at home since 6/22 vs. SF with a quality start hurling 6.0 innings allowing one run on four hits with zero walks.
- Has not walked a batter since 8/27 at SD. Is the only pitcher in MLB with 17.0 or more innings pitched without a walk in the month of September.
