STREAKING

Since their 3-22 start, the Reds are 41-43... went 6-1-1 in their last 8 completed series while winning 6 of their last 10 games (.600) and 16 of their last 27 games (.593)...the 2022 Reds are 1 of just 3 teams in modern Major League history to begin a season with as few as 3 wins over the first 25 games (1988 Orioles, 2-23 & 2003 Tigers, 3-22).

IN THE STANDINGS

The Reds enter today's games tied for third place...from 4/13-7/30 were in fifth place for 106 of 109 days, including a season-high streak of 64 straight days in fifth snapped on 6/16 (T4th).

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (0-2) of a 3-game series vs Sasha Hirschheimer's Mets and Game 9 (4-4) of an 11-day, 10-game, 4-city road trip that concludes with tomorrow's Field of Dreams Game in Dyersville, Iowa vs Cubs (2-1 at Mia, 2-1 at Mil, 0-2 at NYM, 1g vs Chi)...the Redlegs will be the "home" team in Iowa...following this road trip and Fri's off day will return to Great American Ball Park to finish the series vs the Cubs, followed by a 3-game series vs the Phillies before hitting the road again for another 10-day road trip (3g at Pit, 4g at Phi, 3g at Wash)...after playing 21 home games in July (12-9), their most in a month since August 1984 (21 home games), in August the Reds will play just 8 games at Great American Ball Park...also played just 8 home games in April...prior to this 2022 season, the Reds last played 8 home games or fewer in a calendar month of at least 20 games in April 1992 (8 of 21g)...courtesy @EliasSports.

TRANSACTIONS:

- Today the Reds selected from Louisville the contract of RHP T.J. Zeuch (#67, pronounced Zoik) and optioned to Louisville RHP Ryan Hendrix.
- Yesterday, the Reds placed on the 10-day injured list IF Mike Moustakas (left calf strain), recalled from Louisville IF/OF Alejo Lopez (#35) and transferred from Louisville to Dayton the rehabilitation assignment of RHP Art Warren (right flexor pronator strain).

SERIES NOTES: This afternoon the Mets are looking for their first series sweep of the Redlegs since 9/5-9/7, 2016 and their first series sweep here since 4/25-4/27, 2016...beginning 9/24/13, the Reds are 15-37 vs NYM, including a 14-game losing streak from 9/7/14 - 9/7/16 that ranks as Cin's longest ever vs the Mets and its longest vs any team since a 16-game skid vs Ari from 5/8/01 - 8/13/03...dating back to 1962, the 7-0 series win by the Mets in 2015 was the first season series sweep by either team, followed by NYM's 6-0 series win in 2016.

BIG CITI LIGHTS: From 7/30-8/1, 2021 the Reds went 2-1 vs NYM for their first series win at Citi Field from 5/20-5/22, 2013...are 1-5-1 in their last 7 completed series and 7-18 in their last 25 games at Citi Field (0-1 in August 2022, 2-1 in July 2021, 2-2 in April/May 2019, 1-2 in August 2018, 1-3 in September 2017, 0-3 in April 2016, 0-3 in June 2015, 1-2 in April 2014).

CUBS UP NEXT: The Cubs lead the season series, 4-3...last year the Reds went 11-8 vs Cubs, including a Fourth of July weekend sweep at GABP...was the Reds' first series sweep of the Cubs (3g) since a 4-game sweep from 6/21-6/24, 2018, also at GABP...career against the Cubs, Joey Votto ranks second among all active players with 48 HR, trailing only Albert Pujols (57hr), and is tied with Pujols for the most RBI vs Cubs (146)...Votto's 48 HR are the second-most by a Reds batter vs the Cubs (Frank Robinson, 53).

CATCH YOU LATER: In Sat's 7-5 win at Mil, Austin Romine became the sixth catcher to appear for a game for the Reds this season (Tyler Stephenson, Aramis Garcia, Mark Kolozsvary, Chris Okey, Michael Papierski)...for only the eighth time in their history, the Reds have employed at least 6 catchers in a season, most recently in 1992...the 1909 club holds the club for number of catchers used in a season with 8, followed by 7 Reds teams with 6 catchers...last season, for only the third time since 1882, the Reds finished a season using only 2 catchers (Tucker Barnhart, Stephenson)...they also did it in 1959 (Ed Bailey, Dutch Dotterer) and 1979 (Johnny Bench, Vic Correll).

YOUNG GUNS:

- In 43 combined starts this season, Reds rookie starting pitchers RHP Hunter Greene, LHP Nick Lodolo and RHP Graham Ashcraft are 12-17, 4.63 (225.2ip, 116er)...all 3 made their Major League debuts this season.
- 6 times this season the Reds started rookie pitchers in 3 straight games (last, 7/31-8/2, Lodolo, Greene, Ashcraft).
- In Sanmartin (Game 2), Greene (Game 4) and Lodolo (Game 6), the Reds used as many as 3 rookie starting pitchers in the first 6 games of a season for only the second time in their history...the 1902 Reds staff used 3 rookie starting pitchers in their first 5 games, and 4 of their first 6 games that season were started by rookie pitchers (Bob Ewing 2 starts, Len Swormstedt, Martin Glendon)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- This year's Reds became the fourth Major League team since 2000 to use 3 different starting rookie pitchers in the first 6 games of a season, joining the 2020 Royals (Brady Singer, Ronald Bolanos, Kyle Zimmer), 2018 Marlins (Caleb Smith, Dillon Peters, Trevor Richards) and 2009 Athletics (Trevor Cahill, Brett Anderson, Josh Outman).

RED HOTS:

- 33 Reds players have accounted for 45 apps on the injured list (list on Page 6)...today's injured list includes 14 players...on 7/16 & 7/17 the Reds had 18 players listed on the injured list, their single-day season high...every day from 5/1-8/1, between 13-18 players held a spot on the Reds' injured list.
- The Reds went 12-16-7 in 35 completed series (6-8-4 home, 6-8-3 road)...swept 2 series (2g at Cle, 5/17-5/19 & 3g vs TB, 7/8-7/10) and were swept 9 times (last, 2g at StL, 7/15-7/16).
- The Reds went 3-1-1 in their 5 series vs American League East teams (1-2 at Tor, 1-1 at Bos, 3-0 vs TB, 2-1 at NYY, 2-1 vs Bal)...have one more 2-game series vs the Red Sox in September at Great American Ball Park.
- Per @EliasSports, the Reds have played the second-toughest schedule in the Major Leagues...in games already played, their opponents have posted a winning percentage of .516...the winning percentage for the teams remaining on the Reds' schedule is .469, the third-easiest schedule in the majors.
- The 10-game losing streak at Great American Ball Park from 6/8-7/2 was the Reds' longest since at home an 11-game skid at Riverfront Stadium from 4/9-5/5, 1986...their 0-6 homestand from 6/17-6/23 (0-3 vs Mil, 0-3 vs LAD) was their first winless homestand of at least 6 games since 7/11-7/17, 1991 (0-4 vs Pit, 0-3 vs StL).
- The Reds' 11.5-game deficit on May 1 was their largest ever on that date.

ROSTER NOTES:

- Eight Reds players made Major League debuts this season, including RHP Daniel Duarte, RHP Alexis Diaz, RHP Hunter Greene (starter), LHP Nick Lodolo (starter), C Mark Kolozsvary, RHP Jared Solomon, RHP Graham Ashcraft (starter) and C Chris Okey.
- 14 rookies, including 9 pitchers, have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds.
- 56 players have appeared in at least 1 game for Reds, 1 shy of the club record for number of players in a season (57, 2003).

RED HOTS

- Last name is pronounced Zoik...graduated from Mason High School, north of Cincinnati...was the first player from Mason High to play in the Major Leagues...media guide bio is available under Supplemental Bios on the home page at redspresbox.com.
- Today was promoted to fill the spot in the rotation vacated by RHP Robert Dugger, who 3 days after Fri's 5-1 loss at Mil in his first start for the Reds went on the 15-day injured list with right shoulder pain.
- This afternoon is making his first Major League appearance since 6/17/21 for Tor vs NYY...will become the 57th player to appear in a game for the Reds, tying the 2003 single-season club record...will be his first career appearance vs the Mets...never has faced any of the Mets batters.
- Began this season with the Cardinals' Class AAA affiliate in Memphis...went 0-4, 11.64 in 5 starts before he was released on 5/26.
- On 6/2 was signed by the Reds and made 3 starts for their Arizona Complex League team before joining Class AAA Louisville...from 7/3-8/2 went 0-1, 3.63 in 5 starts for the Bats.
- From 2019-2021 made all 13 of his Major League apps, all for the Blue Jays...went 2-4, 4.59 in 7 starts and 6 relief apps.
- 27 years old...BR, TR...6-7, 235...was selected by the Blue Jays in the first round (21st overall) of the June 2016 draft...on 7/25/21 was traded to the Cardinals for cash...on 5/26/22 was released by the Cardinals...on 6/2 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract.

Tomorrow vs Cubs at Field of Dreams - #40 Nick Lodolo, LHP

RED HOTS

- Last name is pronounced luh-DOLE-oh.
- Tomorrow at the Field of Dreams will make his 10th career start, all this season, and his first career appearance vs the Cubs.
- In Sat's 7-5 win at Mil allowed all 3 runs on a pair of home runs, solo by Andrew McCutchen and 2-run by Keston Hiura.
- Will be his seventh start since a 69-day stint on the injured list (6gs, 2-1, 3.81, 28.1ip, 30h, 12er, 15bb, 39k, 4hr, .273baa).
- On 4/28 went on the 10-day injured list with a lower right back strain...on 6/21 was transferred to the 60-day IL...was reinstated from the IL on 7/5.
- In 4 rehabilitation apps for the ACL Reds & Louisville beginning 6/13 went 0-0, 2.84 (12.2ip, 16h, 4er, 3bb, 18k 1hbp, 1.50whip, .308baa).
- In consecutive starts on 4/24 and 7/5 opposed StL's Adam Wainwright (429g, 186-107, 3.36) and NYM's Max Scherzer (416g, 195-98, 3.14).
- Began the season on the Reds' Taxi Squad for their single-city road trip to Atlanta...was promoted on 4/13 to make his Major League debut in that afternoon's start vs the Guardians at Great American Ball Park.
- In the 7-3 loss on 4/13 vs Cle made his Major League debut at age 24 years, 67 days.
- Became the third Reds rookie pitcher to start in the team's first 6 games, joining LHP Reiver Sanmartin and RHP Hunter Greene...the apps by Greene and Lodolo were Major League debuts.
- The Reds used as many as 3 rookie starting pitchers in the first 6 games of a season for only the second time in their history...the 1902 Reds staff used 3 rookie starting pitchers in their first 5 games, and 4 of their first 6 games that season were started by rookies (Bob Ewing 2 starts, Len Swormsted, Martin Glendon)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- The 2022 Reds became the fourth team since 2000 to use 3 different starting rookie pitchers in the first 6 games of a season, joining the 2020 Royals (Brady Singer, Ronald Bolanos, Kyle Zimmer), 2018 Marlins (Caleb Smith, Dillon Peters, Trevor Richards) and 2009 Athletics (Trevor Cahill, Brett Anderson, Josh Outman)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- In the 4-1 win on 4/24 vs the Cardinals earned his first career victory in his third Major League start...beat Adam Wainwright, whose lifetime record in 429 career apps fell to 186-107...Lodolo was caught by Mark Kolozsvary, who also made his first career start.
- In the 4-1 loss on 4/18 at SD, became the first Reds pitcher to record at least 8 strikeouts in his first or second career start since Luis Castillo had 9 strikeouts in his second career start (6/28/17 vs Mil).
- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (7th overall) of the June 2019 first-year player draft...was signed by Paul Scott...was Texas Christian University's highest-ever baseball draft pick.

REDS PITCHERS

Road Trip: 4-4, 3.52, .217baa

- Among Major League team leaders rank 29th in ERA (5.00; Wsh 30th, 5.32), second in walks allowed (410bb, 957ip) and sixth in highest opponents' batting average (.252).
- At 4.98 through Sun's game at Mil, the team's ERA was its best since the fourth game of the season (3.71 on 4/10).
- In the first 25 games of the season, through 5/5, went 3-22 with a season-high 6.86 ERA...in the last 84 games beginning 5/7 are 41-43, 4.48 (747ip, 372er, .243baa).

REDS STARTERS

Road Trip: 2-4, 3.89, .204baa

- Among National League team rotation leaders rank 13th in ERA (4.99), third in walks allowed (219bb, 559.2ip) and sixth in highest opponents' batting average (.253).
- At 4.94 through Wed's game at Mia, the starting staff's ERA was its best since Opening Day (0.00).
- After failing to complete 6.0 innings in any of the first 31 games of the season through 5/11 (3-21, 8.19), Reds starting pitchers threw at least 6.0 innings in 41 of the last 78 games beginning 5/12 (21-29, 4.06, 434.1ip, 196er, .237baa).
- The 31 games to begin a season in which the starting pitcher failed to pitch at least 6.0 innings are the most in the Major Leagues since 1893, when the mound was moved to its current distance...the second-longest streak belongs to the Pirates, who began this season with 21 games without a 6-inning stint by a starter until Mitch Keller threw 6.0 innings in a 5-2 loss on 5/1 vs SD...courtesy @EliasSports.
- In the 1-0 loss on 5/15 at Pit, Hunter Greene threw 7.1 of the staff's 8.0 no-hit innings (Art Warren, 0.2ip), the furthest a Reds pitcher ever has gone without allowing a hit before he was removed from the game...for only the sixth time in the modern era, a team allowed no hits and lost.

REDS RELIEVERS

Road Trip: 2-0-3, 2.88, .242baa

- Among Major League team bullpens rank last in ERA (5.05; Col 29th, 4.72), first in most walks allowed (191bb, 397.1ip) and fifth in highest opponents' BA (.251).
- 9 Reds pitchers have recorded at least 1 save (Ross Detwiler, Alexis Diaz, Buck Farmer, Joel Kuhnel, Dauri Moreta, Tony Santillan, Lucas Sims, Hunter Strickland, Art Warren)...in 2021, the Reds established a single-season franchise record when 10 Reds pitchers recorded at least 1 save.

85 LUIS CESSA, rhp

Road Trip: 4g, 3.2ip, 2h, 0r, 1bb, 2k

- Last name is pronounced SESS-uh.
- Didn't allow a run in any of his last 5 apps surrounding a 25-day stint on the 15-day injured list (4ip, 2h, 2bb, 2k, .154baa).
- Has made 4 apps, all on this road trip, since he was reinstated from the 15-day injured list on 8/2.
- Between games of the day/night doubleheader vs Pit on 7/7 went on the 15-day injured list with a left intercostalis muscle strain...missed 20 games (13-7) until he was reinstated on 8/2, after RHP Tyler Mahle was traded to the Twins.

 - Leads the team with 74 starts in CF...made 1 start at DH (6/6 vs Ari).
 - In Mon's 5-1 loss at NYM made his fourth career appearance at 3B after starter Mike Moustakas left the game with a calf injury in the fourth inning.

 - Made 4 spring training apps before he was sidelined with the hamstring injury, including 2 starts at 3B and 1 start at SS (4-10, .400, 2 2b, 1rbi, 1hbp, 1.055ops).
 - While with the Giants in 2020 won the National League's Silver Slugger Award for 2B.

- 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b** **Road Trip: 6gs at 1B, 2gs at DH, 5-27, 1hr, 2rbi, 6bb, 2r**
- His career .430 on-base percentage and .974 OPS after the All-Star break are the highest among active players (minimum 1,000 plate apps).
 - Is hitless in 13 at bats since his most recent home run, a solo HR off Jake McGee on Sat at Mil.
 - At tomorrow's Field of Dreams game vs the Cubs, will be looking to homer in his 28th ballpark...has homered in every ballpark he's played in except Ballpark at Arlington (Tex), Shea Stadium (NYM), T-Mobile Park (Sea), Kauffman Stadium (KC), Fenway Park (Bos), Guaranteed Rate Field (WSox), Comerica Park (Det) and Estadio de Béisbol Monterrey...has not played in Globe Life Park (Tex)...his 24 HR at Wrigley Field are his most at any road ballpark.
 - On 8/3 at Mia became only the sixth Reds player with at least 7,000 AB (Pete Rose, Dave Concepcion, Bid McPhee, Barry Larkin, Johnny Bench).
 - His 1,736 career assists at 1B rank second all-time to Eddie Murray's 1,865 assists.
 - Is approaching 1,000 career apps at Great American Ball Park (994) and Hall of Famer Larry Walker's all-time record for Major League apps by a player born in Canada (1,988; Votto 1,985)...is projected to tie Walker's record on Sat vs Cubs and reach 1,000 games at GABP on 8/29 vs StL.
 - From 5/3-5/19 missed 15 games (8-7) while on the injured list.
 - From 7/5-7/10 missed 7 games with back tightness.
 - In May, led the Reds in on-base percentage (.395), slugging (.639) and OPS (1.034).
 - In June, led the Reds in apps (26), doubles (9) and walks (12).
 - Entering the 2022 season, was 1 of only 18 players in Major League history, over the course of at least 8,000 career plate apps, to hit at least .300 (.302) with an on-base percentage of .400 (.416) and a slugging percentage of .500 (.520)...only 24 players met that criteria with as few as 2,000 plate apps, including active players Mike Trout and Juan Soto...@EliasSports.
 - Entered the 2022 season ranked 17th all-time in career on-base percentage, a list that includes 15 Hall of Famers and Barry Bonds, and 23rd all-time in OPS, a list that includes 17 Hall of Famers...courtesy @EliasSports.
 - Is the National League's 2010 Most Valuable Player and Hank Aaron Award winner, a 6-time NL All-Star, a *Sporting News* NL All-Star, the only Reds first baseman ever to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award (2011) and Major League Baseball's 2017 Lou Gehrig Memorial Award winner for exemplary contributions to his community and philanthropy.
 - 5 times was a finalist for the prestigious Hank Aaron Award, presented to the most outstanding offensive performer in each league...won the award in 2010..
 - 3 times was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award for first basemen...won the award in 2011...was a finalist in 2017 and 2018.
 - 6 times was voted by the Cincinnati chapter of the BBWAA the Ernie Lombardi Award as the Reds' MVP (unanimously in 2016 and 2017).
 - Was named to MLB.com and ESPN.com's Team of the Decade for 2010-2019 and was Canadian Baseball Network's Hitter of the Decade.
 - In 2021, despite missing 28 games with a broken left thumb (5/7-6/7) produced 36 HR, 99 RBI and an OPS of .938...over the course of a 162-game season, those numbers project to 45 HR and 124 RBI.
 - Became only the ninth player in his age 37 or older season to produce at least a .266 BA, .375 OBP, .563 SLG, .938 OPS, 36 HR and 99 RBI...joined Babe Ruth (1932), Hank Sauer (1954), Hank Aaron (1971), Edgar Martinez (2000), Barry Bonds (2002, 2004), Rafael Palmeiro (2002), David Ortiz (2016) and Nelson Cruz (2019).
