STREAKS ON THE DOCKET: The Detroit Tigers and Minnesota Twins tonight play the second game of their four-game series at Target Field ... following a 7-3 setback here last night, the Tigers have taken a streaky path to their 4-6 record through their first 10 games, as Detroit won its first two games of the season, lost its next four games and won its next two games before losing the last two games into tonight's affair.

- The Tigers will play 10 of their first 13 games on the road this season, their most road-heavy stretch to start a season since 2007 (also 10 of their first 13 on the road).
- After this series, the Tigers will return to interleague play this weekend when they welcome the Miami Marlins to Comerica Park on Friday to start a three-game set ... overall, four of Detroit's first five series will come against National League competition.

YOU CAN'T WIN THEM ALL: Tarik Skubal tonight makes his third start of the season on the heels of a pair of gems to start his campaign, including an Opening Day win in San Diego and a tough-luck, 1-0 setback last Wednesday in Arizona ... Skubal allowed only a first-inning solo homer but that proved to be enough for the Diamondbacks in handing our southpaw his first loss of the season.

- Last week's loss was only Skubal's 11th setback in 64 starts since the beginning of the 2024 campaign ... in those 11 losses, the Tigers have scored two runs or less seven times and three runs or less in all but one game.
- In the majors, 19 pitchers have made at least 64 starts since the 2024 campaign began ... Skubal, with only 11 losses, by far leads all of those big league pitchers with the fewest setbacks ... only one pitcher, Cristopher Sanchez, has 14 losses in that span while two other pitchers have 15 (Freddy Peralta and Max Fried) ... the other 15 pitchers have at least 18 losses, while the average number of losses for these 19 pitchers is 21 setbacks, 10 more than Skubal.
- Skubal last week took the loss in a 1-0 game for the first time in his big league career ... starting last August 25, the Tigers have lost four games in which Skubal allowed one earned run or less.

ENCORE, ENCORE: Tarik Skubal in 2025 became the first A.L. pitcher to win back-to-back Cy Young Awards since Pedro Martinez in 1999 and 2000 ... while not a unanimous win in 2025, Skubal last year outperformed his 2024 numbers (when he won unanimously) in many categories, including a 6.6 fWAR, a single-season franchise best 7.30 K/BB ratio, 241 strikeouts and a 0.891 WHIP, the lowest single-season mark in franchise history.

- Skubal is on a mission to become only the third pitcher in baseball history to win at least three-straight Cy Young awards, aiming to join fellow southpaw Randy Johnson (4, 1999-2002) and righty Greg Maddux (4, 1992-95), both of whom did so in the N.L.

SAVE ME! Kenley Jansen boasts 477 career saves, fourth-most in major league history and only one save shy of tying Lee Smith (478 saves) for third-most.

- The Tigers are the first team in major league history to have had three players on their opening day roster with 20 or more saves from the year prior: Kyle Finnegan (24 saves), Kenley Jansen (29 saves) and Will Vest (23 saves) ... thanks to Elias.

CENTRAL PERK: This week marks Detroit's first encounter with A.L. Central competition this year ... after opening this season with nine games against the National League, the Tigers starting this series will play seven of their next 10 games within their division through next Thursday, April 16 ... however, Detroit will say buh bye to intradivision play for the next 19 games after that through May 6, meaning the Tigers will only play seven of their first 38 games this year against A.L. Central foes.

- This week marks Detroit's first games vs. an A.L. opponent this season, as the Tigers opened up the season with three interleague series for the first time in franchise history ... they joined the Brewers as the lone clubs in baseball to start off with three interleague sets this year.

RIGHT ON: The Tigers tonight will square off against Minnesota right-handed starting pitcher Taj Bradley, Detroit's 11th-straight opposing righty starter to begin this season ... in fact, the Twins are scheduled to start four right-handed pitchers this week, which would raise Detroit's season-opening run of righties to 13 in a row out of the gate.

- The Tigers are now expected to face at least 13-straight right-handed starting pitchers to begin a season for the first time since the club faced 18-straight right-handed starters to begin the 2019 campaign ... last year the Houston Astros also faced 13-straight right-handed starters to begin their season ... thanks to Elias.

AND FINALLY: Colt Keith last night extended his hitting streak to seven games, trailing only Kansas City's Kyle Isbel (eight games) for the longest active streak in the American League.

- Suffered the loss in his second start of the season (1-0 to Arizona) despite allowing just one earned run over 7.0 innings...it was only Skubal's 11th setback in 64 starts since the beginning of the 2024 campaign...in those 11 losses, the Tigers have scored two runs or less seven times and three runs or less in all but one game.
- Earned his first win of the season on Opening Day against San Diego, allowing no earned runs over 6.0 innings.
- The 29-year-old became Detroit's first starter to open the season in three consecutive years since his current rotation mate Justin Verlander made seven consecutive Opening Day starts for the Tigers from 2008-2014.
- With the start, the Tigers will have deployed a left-hander on Opening Day in seven consecutive seasons, marking the longest active stretch across the Majors.
- Posted a career-best 2.21 ERA (48ER/195.1IP) and 241 strikeouts last season...led the AL in ERA (second overall behind Paul Skenes), and second amongst all pitchers in strikeouts (Garret Crochet led with 251 K).
- Led all MLB pitchers with a career-best 0.89 WHIP last season and was the AL ERA leader for the second consecutive year.
- Won the American League Cy Young Award for a second consecutive season, receiving 26 out of 30 first place votes (four for Garrett Crochet)...became the first repeat AL Cy Young winner since Pedro Martinez in 1999 and 2000...joins Denny McLain as the only Tigers to win multiple Cy Youngs with Detroit...while he did not receive the Triple Crown title, his 6.5 bWAR was a career best that topped Crochet (6.3) and Hunter Brown (6.1). His 7.3 strikeout-to-walk ratio outpaced Crochet's at 5.54, and Skubal's 187 ERA+ was the best by an AL pitcher since Justin Verlander in 2022.
- The back-to-back reigning AL Cy Young winner, who became the 12th pitcher in MLB history to win consecutive Cy Young Awards, will become the ninth pitcher to start on Opening Day following consecutive award-winning seasons, joining Hall of Famer Jim Palmer (1976-77); Hall of Famer Greg Maddux (1993-96); Roger Clemens (1998-99); Hall of Famer Randy Johnson (2000-03); Hall of Famer Pedro Martinez (2000-01); Tim Lincecum (2009-10); Clayton Kershaw (2014-15); and Jacob deGrom (2019-20).
- Set an MLB Postseason record with seven consecutive strikeouts on Oct.10, 2025, against the Seattle Mariners...became MLB leader in single-postseason strikeouts per nine innings pitched, posting 15.677K/20.2 IP.

- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Re-signed with Detroit on a two-year deal as a free agent on Dec. 20, 2025...appeared in 16 games with the Tigers last season, posting a 3-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (3ER/18IP) with 23 strikeouts.
- Made his first post-season appearance with the Tigers in 2025, playing six games and striking out three in 7.1 innings of work.
- Landed on the injured list on Sept. 5 with a right adductor strain...activated Sept. 19 and allowed one run in three of the first four games since returning from the IL.
- Became the first MLB reliever to change teams at the deadline and immediately throw 14+ scoreless innings since Erik Goeddel in 2018...the first Tigers reliever to do so since Doug Blair in 1983.
- Recorded a four-out save on Aug. 2 at Philadelphia in his Tigers debut...started his Tigers career going 3-0 with a hold and four saves, allowing just three hits and three walks while striking out 19 over his first 14.1 innings (12 games).
- Acquired by Detroit on July 31 for minor league RHPs Josh Randall and R.J. Sales.
- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals this season prior to the trade, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.
