METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Dodgers, 4-2, last night at Citi Field...The Mets are in the midst of a 10-game homestand against the Dodgers (three games), Braves (three games) and Marlins (four games).

ROSTER MOVE: OF Juan Soto has been placed on the 10-Day IL with a left calf strain...INF Eric Wagaman has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse.

CONGRATS CARLOS! This weekend, Carlos Beltrán will be inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, NY... He announced he would wear a Mets cap on his plaque...Beltrán ranks in the Top 10 in team history in home runs, RBI, runs scored, on-base percentage, slugging percentage and OPS...The Manati, Puerto Rico, native provided the entire organization with optimism when he signed a seven-year contract in January 2005. He was a five-time All-Star, three-time Gold Glove winner and two-time Silver Slugger with the Amazin's. Beltrán was second in the National League in bWAR (8.2) in 2006 as he helped the Mets advance to the NLCS.

ROLLIN' NOLAN: Nolan McLean completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last six starts...He is the first Met with as many consecutive starts since David Peterson had six straight starts of at least 6.0 innings from July 3-August 6, 2025... Over his last nine starts, dating back to May 31, he has pitched to a 2.08 ERA (12 ER/52.0 IP) and has allowed two or fewer earned runs in eight of those nine starts...Over that span, he has the sixth-best ERA and the seventh-best opposing batting average (.189) among all qualifiers in the majors.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, McLean is 7-6 with a 3.34 ERA (42 ER/113.1 IP) with 135 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .202 batting average (83-411)...Among qualified NL pitchers, he ranks third in opposing batting average, fifth in strikeouts and seventh in WHIP (1.09)...Among all qualified rookies in the majors, he ranks first in strikeouts, second in batting average against, third in innings pitched, fourth in WHIP, and seventh in ERA.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 28 career starts, McLean is 12-7 with a 2.96 ERA (53 ER/161.1 IP) and 192 strikeouts...His 192 strikeouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 28 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 235, Matt Harvey's 211, Noah Syndergaard's 204 and Kodai Senga's 194...Per Elias.... He is one of six pitchers in Major League history to strike out 192+ batters and allow 53 or fewer earned runs through their first 28 appearances (also: Matt Harvey, Jacob Misiorowski, Paul Skenes, Stephen Strasburg and Kodai Senga).

IN THE CITI: The Mets have lost four straight at home and six of their last eight at Citi Field...They are now 21-29 at home this year... The team has posted a 4.35 ERA, while batting .235/.309/.387 at Citi Field.

BLAME IT ON THE BENGE: In 17 games in July, Carson Benge is batting .277 (18-65) with eight runs, three doubles, two homers, eight RBI, seven walks, five steals with a .342 OBP, a .415 SLG and a .758 OPS...Benge has recorded 16 steals this season, the second-most by any rookie this year...The record by a Mets rookie is 24 set by Mookie Wilson in 1981.

DODGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped five straight games to the Dodgers...They are 17-33 all-time against the Dodgers at Citi Field.

BRETT THE MET: In 16 games since June 30, Brett Baty is batting .283 (17-60) with 11 runs, four doubles, three homers, seven RBI, two walks, two steals with a .297 OBP, a .500 SLG and a .797 OPS...He has reached base safely in all but two of those contests.

FRANC-LY SPEAKING: In 18 games in July, Francisco Lindor is batting .254/.333/.433 with three doubles, three homers and a .766 OPS...He owns a .732 OPS against right-handed pitching this year.

A.J. IN STYLE: Over his last 15 games, A.J. Ewing is batting .292 (19-65) with eight runs, four doubles, three homers, six RBI, four walks, three steals, a .333 OBP, a .492 SLG and an .826 OPS...He has posted a .269/.340/.419 mark this year with 19 extra-base hits and 25 RBI in 64 games this season.

BO KNOWS: Over his last 42 games since June 3, Bo Bichette has a .313/.348/.427 slashline with 23 runs, nine doubles, one triple, five homers, 10 walks, 23 RBI with an .821 OPS.

TAYLOR MADE: Since returning from the IL on June 28, Tyrone Taylor has appeared in 16 games, batting .367 (11-30) with eight runs, three doubles, four homers, four RBI, four walks with a .441 OBP, an .867 SLG and a 1.308 OPS...He owns a .281/.292/.547 slashline against left-handed pitchers this year.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets were rained out against the Braves today...The Mets recorded three hits in the loss...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions..The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70...The Mets are 9-14 since Green took the helm.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his seventh win of the season after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings with 10 strikeouts on July 19 at Philadelphia (6.0 IP, 2 H, 2 BB, 10 K)...Reached double-digit strikeouts for the second time this season (also: 4/21 vs. MIN) and the third time in his career...Has recorded seven or more strikeouts for the 11th time this season, which is tied for the sixth-most games in the NL this season...Was his second scoreless start of at least 6.0 innings this season (also: 6/30 at TOR) and the fourth in his career.

ROLLIN' NOLAN: Has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last six starts...He is the first Met with as many consecutive starts since David Peterson had six straight starts of at least 6.0 innings from July 3-August 6, 2025... Over his last nine starts, dating back to May 31, he has pitched to a 2.08 ERA (12 ER/52.0 IP) and has allowed two or fewer earned runs in eight of those nine starts...Over that span, he has the sixth-best ERA and the seventh-best opposing batting average (.189) among all qualifiers in the majors.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, he is 7-6 with a 3.34 ERA (42 ER/113.1 IP) with 135 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .202 batting average (83-411)...Among qualified NL pitchers, he ranks third in opposing batting average, fifth in strikeouts and seventh in WHIP (1.09)...Among all qualified rookies in the majors, he ranks first in strikeouts, second in batting average against, third in innings pitched, fourth in WHIP, and seventh in ERA.

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 13.4% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,341 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any qualified pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 39.0% whiff rate on his curveball...Batters are hitting just .118 (8-68) in at-bats ending with his curveball, which is the 11th-lowest opponents' batting average in at-bats ending with a curveball in the majors (min. 100 pitches)...Over his first 28 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .105 (10-95) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 44.5% whiff rate on the pitch.

SINK SINK BABY: McLean has thrown his sinker 33.7% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a 20-run value, which is the third-highest run value on any pitch in the majors this season and is the highest mark on any sinker this season...Batters are hitting just .164 (28-171) in at-bats ending with his sinker.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 28 career starts, McLean is 12-7 with a 2.96 ERA (53 ER/161.1 IP) and 192 strikeouts...His 192 strikeouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 28 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 235, Matt Harvey's 211, Noah Syndergaard's 204 and Kodai Senga's 194...Per *Elias*...He is one of six pitchers in Major League history to strike out 192+ batters and allow 53 or fewer earned runs through their first 28 appearances (also: Matt Harvey, Jacob Misorowski, Paul Skenes, Stephen Strasburg and Kodai Senga).

VS. LOS ANGELES-NL: Is set to make his second start of the season and of his career against the Dodgers...His only other start against Los Angeles-NL came on April 14 in Los Angeles and he allowed one run over 7.0 innings and recorded eight strikeouts (7.0 IP, 2 H, ER, 2 BB, 8 K).

IN THE CITI: Over 14 starts at Citi Field he has posted a 3.20 ERA (28 ER/78.2 IP)...He has struck out at least six batters in 13 of his 14 home starts...He became only the second player in Major League history to strike out at least six each of their first 10 career home starts (also: Kerry Wood, 6 K's in each of his first 11 career home starts in 1998 with CHC)...His first three career home starts were scoreless and he became the first Met pitcher to not allow a run in their first three career starts at home and the seventh pitcher in Major League history not to allow a run in each of their first three home starts (min. 15.0 IP)...His 19.1 inning scoreless streak at home is the longest to start a career since Robert Suarez didn't allow a run through all 24.0 innings he threw at home during the 2022 season...Per *Elias*.

PERFECT FIVE: He has retired each of his first 15 batters faced twice this season (4/21 vs. MIN and 4/3 at SF) ...He is the third pitcher in franchise history to be perfect through 5.0 innings multiple times in a season (also: Steve Trachsel, 2002 and Rick Reed, 1998)...His is the first pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to retire each of his first 15 batters multiple times in his first 13 career starts...*Per Elias*...When he was

perfect through 5.0 innings on April 3 he became the first Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced since Sean Manaea retired each of the first 17 batters he faced on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan, Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event....He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League debut on August 16, 2025 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.
