'LA PIEDRA' TAKES THE MOUND...Luis Castillo is $14-8$ with a 3.20 ERA ( 69 ER, 194.1 IP) with 51 walks and 215 strikeouts in 32 starts this season...Castillo has gone $5.0+$ innings in all 32 of his outings, tied for most in the Majors with Zac Gallen-ARI and Logan Webb-SF...Castillo is 1 of 8 Mariners pitchers with 200+ strikeouts in a season and 1 of 3 right-handed pitchers, joining Erik Hanson (1990) and Félix Hernández ( $6 x, 2009-14$ )...among AL pitchers this season, Castillo ranks 5th in ERA, 5th in wins, 4th in strikeouts, 4th in innings pitched, 2nd in opponent batting average (.215) and T-4th in WHIP (1.06).

RALEIGH MAKING A CASE FOR BEST CATCHER...Cal Raleigh leads Major Leaque catchers in home runs (30) this season, and is set to do so in back-to-back seasons after leading catchers with 27 HR in 2022...Raleigh is the first catcher in Mariners history with a 30+ homer season...Cal also leads the Maiors in catcher caught stealings this season, nabbing 24 would-be base stealers...Raleigh could become the first catcher in 30 years to lead the Majors in both categories (HR \& CCS)...the last catcher to lead the big leagues in home runs as a catcher and catcher caught stealings in the same season was Hall of Famer Mike Piazza-LAD in 1993...Piazza led the way with 35 home runs and 58 catcher caught stealings.

RE-PETEDLY BLANK'D...the Mariners registered their 17th shutout win of the season, most shutouts in MLB, ranking ahead of San Diego (16)...it also extended a franchise record for most shutouts in a season (previous high: 15 in 2003)...it also marked the 2nd-most pitchers (6) Seattle contributed to a shutout in franchise history: Bryan Woo (3.2 IP), Tayler Saucedo (0.2), Trent Thornton (1.2), Isaiah Campbell (1.0), Eduard Bazardo (1.0) and Dominic Leone (1.0), trailing only the 7 pitchers they used on Sept. 19, 2018. QUALITY ASSURANCE...the Mariners have 3 pitchers with 18+ quality starts this season: George Kirby (19), today's starter Luis Castillo (18) and Logan Gilbert (18)...the trio makes up 3 of the 18 MLB pitchers to toss $18+$ quality starts in 2023 ...the Mariners are the only team with 3 pitchers to tally $18+$, while Toronto is the only other team with 2 (Chris Bassitt, 21 \& Kevin Gausman, 20)...it marks the first time Seattle has had $3+$ pitchers register 18+ quality starts in a season since 2011: Félix Hernández (22), Michael Pineda (19) and Jason Vargas (18).

GLOVE LIKE THIS...defensively, Cal Raleigh's 24 catcher caught stealings lead MLB, ranking ahead of Shea Langeliers-OAK (23) and Jonah Heim-TEX (22)...Julio Rodríguez's 12 Outs Above Average rank T-2nd among American League outfielders with Kevin Kiermaier-TOR, trailing only Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (13)...Eugenio Suárez' 11 OAA rank 2nd among AL third basemen, trailing only Maikel Garcia-KC (12).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...J.P. Crawford over his last 3 games has hit a leadoff home run (Sept. 27 vs. Houston), supplied a walk-off hit (double, Sept. 28 vs. Texas) and hit a grand slam (Sept. 29 vs. Texas), but...DID YOU KNOW?...that he is the first Mariners player to accomplish each of those 3 feats in a 3-game span in franchise history?...Crawford is just the 5th player in team history to accomplish those 3 feats in the same season, joining Omar Vizquel (1993), Mike Cameron (2000), Ichiro Suzuki (2009) and Austin Jackson (2015).
