**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners continue their final homestand of the regular season with the 3rd of 4 games against the Texas Rangers (2-0)...Seattle opened the homestand with a 3-game series against the Houston Astros (1-2)...today's game will be televised live on **FOX** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **John Smoltz** on the call, with **Ken Rosenthal** as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **Mariners.com** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims**.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners defeated the Rangers by an 8-0 score last night, winning each of their first 2 games of the series...the Mariners are 24-18 over their last 42 games, 32-21 over their last 53, 34-22 over their last 56, 37-23 over their last 60, 40-25 over their last 65 and 49-31 over their last 80 contests...the Mariners are 67-26 when scoring at least 4 runs and 20-47 when scoring 3-or-fewer...the Mariners are 44-35 at T-Mobile Park and 43-38 on the road this season...they are 28-27 in day games and 59-46 at night.

- **Programming Note** - Today's game (4:15 pm PT first pitch) will air exclusively on FOX with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **John Smoltz** on the call, with **Ken Rosenthal** as field reporter.
- **Series Record** - Seattle owns a 26-23-2 series record (14-10-1 at home) this season, with a chance to win its final series of the regular season with a win today vs. Texas.
- **Tiebreakers** - In a tiebreaking scenario at season's end, Seattle has the tiebreaker over both Houston (9-4 against HOU) and Toronto (3-3 against TOR...SEA is 32-18 vs. AL West; TOR is 21-29 vs. AL East).
- **Happy Birthday!** - Right-hander reliever **Trent Thornton** celebrates his 30th birthday today.

**POSTSEASON PICTURE**...the Mariners have 2 regular season games remaining, today and tomorrow vs. Texas...Seattle enters play today 2.0 games back of the Rangers for the AL West Division lead and just 1.0 game back of the Houston Astros for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot (2.0 GB of Toronto for the 2nd WC spot)...the Astros have 2 games remaining (2 at ARI) and Toronto also has 2 games remaining (2 vs. TB)...the Rays and Blue Jays play today at 12:07 pm PT, while the Astros and D'Backs square off tonight at 5:10 pm PT.

**'LA PIEDRA' TAKES THE MOUND**...**Luis Castillo** is 14-8 with a 3.20 ERA (69 ER, 194.1 IP) with 51 walks and 215 strikeouts in 32 starts this season...Castillo has gone 5.0+ innings in all 32 of his outings, tied for most in the Majors with Zac Gallen-ARI and Logan Webb-SF...Castillo is 1 of 8 Mariners pitchers with 200+ strikeouts in a season and 1 of 3 right-handed pitchers, joining Erik Hanson (1990) and Félix Hernández (6x, 2009-14)...among AL pitchers this season, Castillo ranks 5th in ERA, 5th in wins, 4th in strikeouts, 4th in innings pitched, 2nd in opponent batting average (.215) and T-4th in WHIP (1.06).

**THE J-ROD SHOW: AL MVP CANDIDATE**...**Julio Rodríguez** leads American League outfielders in fWAR (6.1), ranking ahead of Aaron Judge-NYY (5.2) and Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (5.0)...among AL outfielders with at least 400 plate appearances for the rate stats, Julio ranks 1st in hits (180), 2nd in stolen bases (37), T-8th in batting average (.278), 4th in home runs (32), 2nd in runs scored (102), 3rd in RBI (103), T-8th in slugging percentage (.490), 7th in OPS (.827), T-7th in wRC+ (128), T-2nd in doubles (37), 1st in total bases (317) and 2nd in extra-base hits (71)...in 2022, Julio won an AL Silver Slugger Award in his rookie season, alongside outfielders Aaron Judge-NYY and Mike Trout-LAA.

**OUR SHORTSTOP**...**J.P. Crawford** this season has already set career-highs in home runs (19), RBI (65) and walks (94) and is on pace to set additional highs in on-base percentage (.381), slugging percentage (.440) and OPS (.821)...J.P. leads the American League with 94 walks this season...no Mariners player has ever led the league in walks in franchise history (ties included)...Crawford's .381 OBP ranks 4th in the AL.

- **All Aboard** - Last night, Crawford hit his 3rd career grand slam and 2nd of the season (other: 4/26 at PHI)...J.P. is batting .688 (11x16) with 26 RBI in 17 plate appearances with the bases loaded this year, the 7th-best batting average with the bases loaded in a season in MLB history (min. 15 PA).

**RALEIGH MAKING A CASE FOR BEST CATCHER**...**Cal Raleigh** leads Major League catchers in home runs (30) this season, and is set to do so in back-to-back seasons after leading catchers with 27 HR in 2022...Raleigh is the first catcher in Mariners history with a 30+ homer season...Cal also leads the Majors in catcher caught stealings this season, nabbing 24 would-be base stealers...Raleigh could become the first catcher in 30 years to lead the Majors in both categories (HR & CCS)...the last catcher to lead the big leagues in home runs as a catcher and catcher caught stealings in the same season was Hall of Famer Mike Piazza-LAD in 1993...Piazza led the way with 35 home runs and 58 catcher caught stealings.

**ONE YEAR AGO TODAY**...on Sept. 30, 2022, the Mariners clinched a Postseason berth on a **Cal Raleigh** pinch-hit, walk-off home run vs. Oakland...it snapped a 20-year Postseason drought for Seattle and was the first pinch-hit, walk-off homer that sent a team to the Postseason in Major League history...Seattle swept Toronto 2-0 in the AL Wild Card Series before dropping the AL Division Series to Houston, 3-0.

**RE-PETEDLY BLANK'D**...the Mariners registered their 17th shutout win of the season, most shutouts in MLB, ranking ahead of San Diego (16)...it also extended a franchise record for most shutouts in a season (previous high: 15 in 2003)...it also marked the 2nd-most pitchers (6) Seattle contributed to a shutout in franchise history: **Bryan Woo** (3.2 IP), **Tayler Saucedo** (0.2), **Trent Thornton** (1.2), **Isaiah Campbell** (1.0), **Eduard Bazarido** (1.0) and **Dominic Leone** (1.0), trailing only the 7 pitchers they used on Sept. 19, 2018.

**QUALITY ASSURANCE**...the Mariners have 3 pitchers with 18+ quality starts this season: **George Kirby** (19), today's starter **Luis Castillo** (18) and **Logan Gilbert** (18)...the trio makes up 3 of the 18 MLB pitchers to toss 18+ quality starts in 2023...the Mariners are the only team with 3 pitchers to tally 18+, while Toronto is the only other team with 2 (Chris Bassitt, 21 & Kevin Gausman, 20)...it marks the first time Seattle has had 3+ pitchers register 18+ quality starts in a season since 2011: Félix Hernández (22), Michael Pineda (19) and Jason Vargas (18).

**GLOVE LIKE THIS**...defensively, **Cal Raleigh's** 24 catcher caught stealings lead MLB, ranking ahead of Shea Langeliers-OAK (23) and Jonah Heim-TEX (22)...**Julio Rodríguez's** 12 Outs Above Average rank T-2nd among American League outfielders with Kevin Kiermaier-TOR, trailing only Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (13)...**Eugenio Suárez'** 11 OAA rank 2nd among AL third basemen, trailing only Maikel García-KC (12).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**J.P. Crawford** over his last 3 games has hit a leadoff home run (Sept. 27 vs. Houston), supplied a walk-off hit (double, Sept. 28 vs. Texas) and hit a grand slam (Sept. 29 vs. Texas), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that he is the first Mariners player to accomplish each of those 3 feats in a 3-game span in franchise history?...Crawford is just the 5th player in team history to accomplish those 3 feats in the same season, joining Omar Vizquel (1993), Mike Cameron (2000), Ichiro Suzuki (2009) and Austin Jackson (2015).

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 30-year-old right-hander is set to make his 33rd start of the season, 3rd against the Rangers...he is also making his 181st Major League start and 3rd career start against Texas.
- Has been named an All-Star in 2019, 2022 and 2023.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on 12/23/11.
- Made MLB debut on 6/23/17 vs. Washington (w/ Cincinnati)
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.

**LAST TIME OUT**...L#8 in last start on 9/25 vs. TEX...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed 5 runs on 8 hits (2 HR) and 1 walk with 8 strikeouts...Castillo has now recorded 8 strikeouts in 4 consecutive outings.

**FAMILIAR FOES**...in 11 games started against an AL West opponent this season Castillo owns a 3.54 ERA (27 ER, 68.2 IP) with 15 walks and 77 strikeouts...his 11 starts against the AL West this season are the most on the team...his last 4 starts of the season were against division rivals.

**OFF TO A GOOD START**...his 268 strikeouts through his first 40 Mariners starts are the most in Mariners history through a pitchers first 40 starts...he ranks ahead of Félix Hernández (233).

**INNINGS EATER**...has made 10 starts this season where he has pitched at least 7.0 innings...his 10 starts of 7.0+ innings pitched are the most in a season in his career...he currently is tied for the 7th most 7.0+ innings pitched games in the majors this season and has the 2nd most on the Mariners...he ranks behind **George Kirby** (11).

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR**...was named to his third All-Star team on July 2 (also: 2019, 2022)...he was joined by teammates **George Kirby** and **Julio Rodríguez**.

**MAKING THEM EARN IT**...has allowed 69 earned runs through 32 starts this season which is the 5th fewest in the Major Leagues (min. 32 GS)...his 3.20 ERA (69 ER, 194.1 IP) ranks tied 8th in the Major Leagues among qualified pitchers...he is tied with Jordan Montgomery-TEX.

**KEEPING THE BASES CLEAN**...has allowed 217 runners to reach base safely through 32 starts this season which is tied for the 2nd fewest in the Major Leagues (min. 32 GS) with Gerrit Cole-NYY...he also ranks among American League leaders (min. 100.0 IP) in opponents average (T-6th, .215/155x722) and WHIP (6th, 1.060).

**SEASON-HIGH PUNCHIES**...set a new season-high in strikeouts with 11 against the Twins on July 19....this marked the 3rd time this season and the 18th time in Castillo's career that he has recorded 10+ strikeouts in a game (last: 6/6 vs. LAA)...his career-high in strikeouts in a single game is 13 which he achieved on 8/5/19 vs. LAA.

**1,000 AND COUNTING**...recorded his 1,000th career strikeout in his outing on 5/22 against Oakland after striking out Shea Langeliers to begin the 5th inning...Castillo finished the night with 8 strikeouts.

**DOMINATE THE ZONE**...recorded 32 strikeouts in August which is just 7 away from matching his career high for the month...his career-high in strikeouts in a single month is 50 which he achieved in March/April 2019...Castillo has now recorded at least 30 strikeouts in each month this season...this marks the second time in his career where he has recorded 30+ strikeouts in each month he has pitched in a season (also: 2019).

**KEEPING THEM IN THE YARD**...gave up his first home run of the season on 4/28, breaking a 5-game span of allowing no home runs...this was his longest span of games to start a season without giving up a home run in his career.

**NEARLY PERFECT**...carried a perfect game into the 7th inning in his start against Colorado on 4/16...earned his second win of the season after pitching 7.0 scoreless innings and allowing only 2 hits while striking out 9 batters...the last Mariners pitcher to throw a perfect game was Félix Hernández on 8/15/12.

**HOT START**...did not allow a run in either of his first 2 starts to begin the season, becoming just the third Mariners pitcher to do that, joining Félix Hernández (2007) and James Paxton (2017).

**PREVIOUSLY ON OPENING DAY**...became just the 3rd Mariners starter to hold the opponent scoreless in an Opening Day start, joining Félix Hernández (2007, 2013 & 2018) and Randy Johnson (1995)...he is the **first player in franchise history** to toss 6.0+ scoreless innings while allowing 1-or-fewer hits on Opening Day...his game score of 76 was the highest of any Opening Day starter this season.
