RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final road trip of the season against the Tigers (0-1, 2 to play) and Red Sox (3 to play) tonight in Detroit...have won five of seven and seven of their last 11 games...are 24-27 since the July 30 trade deadline and 30-31 since the All-Star break...spent 94 consecutive days in fourth place of the AL East from June 20 (entering play) through Sept. 20...with five games remaining, they are 5.0 games behind the Royals for the AL's third and final Wild Card spot...have spent the entire season no more than five games below or three games above .500.

Yesterday, LHP Mason Montgomery (2.0IP, 6SO) became the first reliever in franchise history to throw 2.0 innings and strike out all six batters he faced...he is the first reliever in MLB to accomplish the feat since MIA Anthony Bender (July 2, 2021 at ATL) and became one of 15 relievers in the majors to do so since 1901.

The Rays did not record an at-bat with a runner in scoring position for the fourth time this season (last: July 22 at NYY)...it marked the first of 179 games in franchise history against Detroit that Tampa Bay had zero at-bats with RISP.

Tampa Bay suffered its third loss this season when surrendering three hits or fewer (July 26 vs. CIN - 2H & Aug. 14 vs. HOU - 2H)...the three such losses are tied for the single-season franchise record, joining the 2014 and 2012 Rays.

Following a 49-minute rain delay, yesterday's game was completed in 1 hour and 59 minutes, the Rays second-shortest road game of the season (by time), trailing their one-hour, 54-minute victory on Aug. 20 at Oakland (1-0)...it marked the Rays shortest game at Comerica Park in franchise history (88G total), surpassing a two-hour, nine-minute affair on May 2, 2003 (W, 2-0).

LIGHTS-OUT LITTELL—RHP Zack Littell carries a 20.0 scoreless inning streak into tonight's start, the fourth-longest active streak in MLB...he has thrown 18.0 scoreless frames over his last three starts, going 3-0 with 16 SO against 1 BB and a 0.39 WHIP while limiting opponents to an .098/.113/.148 (6-for-61) line...he has allowed three hits or fewer in four of his last five starts (since Aug. 14) after having two such starts across his first 23 outings (May 21 vs. BOS - 3H & July 27 vs. CIN - 3H).

PITCH PERFECT—Tampa Bay has yielded three runs or fewer in eight straight games for the first time since another eight-game stretch from Aug. 18-25, 2022...the Rays last did so in nine straight from May 22-30, 2019 (9G)...if the Rays allow three runs or fewer tonight, they will match the Dodgers (May 1-11) for the longest streak by any MLB club this year.

The Rays have held the opposition to three runs or fewer in 15 of their last 17 contests since Sept. 6, ranking fourth in the majors with a 2.33 ERA (146.2IP, 38ER) in that span...excluding games on Sept. 10 at PHI (8) and Sept. 14 at CLE (6) in which they yielded a combined 14 ER, the Rays have turned in a 1.65 ERA (130.2IP, 24ER) in the other 15 games...they have allowed three runs or fewer 36 times since the All-Star break, tied for second most in the majors behind the Mets (39).

Rays starters own a 1.74 ERA (47.2IP, 7ER) and 0.69 WHIP in their last 12 games, holding opponents to a .164/228/.244 (35-for-213) line with 65 SO and 15 walks.

The bullpen's 2.74 ERA (249.2IP, 76ER) since the Midsummer Classic ranks second in the majors behind the Guardians (2.57).

UNTOUCHABLE—Kevin Kelly (22.1IP) and Zack Littell (20.0IP) own two of the four longest active scoreless inning streaks in the majors...according to STATS LLC, it. marks the third time in franchise history two Rays have had concurrent scoreless streaks of 20.0+ innings...the last instance involved Pete Fairbanks (29.2) and Yonny Chirinos (21.2) on April 29, 2023, when Chirinos extended his streak beyond the 20-inning mark, but saw it snapped in the same game vs. the White Sox...the other occurrence came on Aug. 7, 2012, when Fernando Rodney (22.0) and J.P. Howell (20.0) had active streaks.

Kelly has not permitted an earned run in 24 straight outings, the longest active streak in the majors and tied with Fernando Rodney (2012) for the third-longest streak in club history behind Pete Fairbanks (30, 2022-23) and J.P. Howell (24, 2012).

LOCK IT DOWN—The Rays have won 33 consecutive games when holding a lead through six innings, tied for the second-longest streak in club history (also Aug. 1, 2010–April 20, 2011), behind a 36-game run (April 14–July 12, 2019), according to STATS LLC...they are 53-4 when leading through six frames, tying the Yankees for the second-fewest such losses in MLB behind the Guardians (2)...the Rays also own the majors' second-highest wining pct. when leading through seven innings (59-2/967) behind the Guardians (76-2/974).

The Rays have had an MLB-best 13 players record at least 1+ save, outpacing the Brewers and Dodgers (both 12)...it marks the second-highest total in franchise history behind 2021 (14)...since saves became an official statistic in 1969, the Rays are the only major league club to have at least 13 different players tally at least one save in a season, accomplishing the feat twice.

Since Pete Fairbanks was placed on the 15-day IL (right lat strain) on Aug. 19, the Rays have converted 12 straight save opportunities, with six players earning saves in that span, led by Edwin Uceta (4) and Garrett Cleavinger (3).

Under the direction of Kevin Cash (since 2015), 60 different players have recorded a save for the Rays, the most in MLB, ahead of the Cubs (57) and Dodgers (52).

STUCK IN NEUTRAL—Tampa Bay is one of six teams all-time to have held a .500 record at least 33 times, joining the 2011 Blue Jays (33), 2010 Athletics (33), 1993 Cubs (33), 2009 Twins (34) and 1959 Cubs (35)...the Rays were last above .500 entering play on Aug. 25 (65-64).

The Rays were 48-48 before the All-Star break and have gone 30-31 since the break...since the first Midsummer Classic in 1933, only five teams have finished at exactly .500 both before and after the All-Star break: the 2022 White Sox, 2015 Orioles, 1969 Astros, 1958 Tigers and 1953 Senators/Twins (Elias).

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays own the AL's best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (53-33, 616), trailing only the Padres (39-24, 619)...their 85 such games lead MLB and are third most in a season in club history (2015-94G & 2003-90G)...their 29-21 (.580) mark in one-run games is tied for fourth in MLB, while the 29 wins are tied for the most... of the Rays 22 games in September, 16 have been decided by two runs or fewer.

RACE TO THE FINISH—The Rays need to go at least 3-2 over their final five games to finish with a .500+ record for a seventh consecutive season...they were last under the mark in 2017 (80-82)...it would surpass 2008-2013 (6) for the longest streak in franchise history...the Rays are one of four teams to post a .500+ record each season from 2018-23, joining the Braves, Dodgers and Yankees.

Since becoming the Rays in 2008, the club has finished with a winning record in 12 of 16 seasons, second most in MLB behind the Yankees (16) and Dodgers (15).

FARM REPORT—Last night, Double-A Montgomery saw its season come to an end, falling to Birmingham (CWS), 2-1 (10 inn.), in Game 2 of the Southern League Championship Series...,vesterday, Milb named five Biscuits to the Southern League All-Star Team: DH Dominic Keegan, RHP Evan Reifert, LHP Ian Seymour, OF Chandler Simpson and SS Carson Williams...Williams was also named the Top MLB Prospect in the SL, while first-year skipper Kevin Boles was awarded SL Manager of the Year... earlier today, MLB announced the 2024 Arizona Fall League rosters, with Tampa Bay having eight representatives: RHP Alexander Alberto, RHP Derrick Edington, LHP T.J. Fondtain, RHP Jack Hartman, INF Mac Horvath, INF Xavier Isaac, RHP Jackson Lancaster and OF Tre' Morgan.

TONIGHT'S START—The right-hander takes the ball for his team-leading 29th start, including his 14th on the road...has a career-high 20.0 scoreless inning streak...has held opponents to a 6-for-61 (.098) clip with a 0.39 WHIP in his last three starts...leads the AL (min. 40.0IP) with a 1.41 ERA in his last eight starts since July 27...leads the Rays in innings (151.2), wins (T1st, 8) and quality starts (10)...his 4.9 pct. walk rate ranks seventh in the AL/11th in MLB...was on the 15-day IL (right shoulder fatigue) from Aug. 17–Sept. 1.

LAST TIME OUT—Spun his third consecutive scoreless start in a 2-0 win over Boston on Sept. 19 at Tropicana Field, sitting down 21 of 22 batters faced (W, 7.0IP, H, 0R, 7SO)...the only hit he permitted was a two-out single by **Nick Sogard** in the 3rd frame...retired his final 13 batters after the hit...has earned the win in three straight outings for the first time in his career...became the fourth Ray to allow one or zero baserunners over 7.0+ IP (last: **Drew Rasmussen** on April 9, 2023 vs. OAK). MOTOR CITY MATCHUP—Littell is 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (16.0IP, 5ER) across six career appearances (2GS) against the Tigers, with all five earned runs coming in his last start against them on April 22...he has posted a 3.75 ERA (12.0IP, 5ER) across the two starts, striking out eight batters against one walk...this marks his second career start at Comerica Park, joining his six scoreless innings on Aug. 4, 2023 (W, 6.0IP, 3H, 0R, BB, SO).

Littell is 2-3 with a 3.32 ERA (38.0IP, 14ER) in seven starts against AL Central opponents this season.

ROAD WARRIOR—In three road starts since the beginning of August, Littell is 3-0 with a 0.54 ERA (16.2IP, 1ER), 12 strikeouts and two walks... he has an active 14.2 scoreless inning streak on the road dating back to the 3rd frame on Aug. 3 at HOU...he is the third Ray this season to record back-to-back scoreless road starts of 5.0+ IP, joining Taj Bradley (July 20-25) and Ryan Pepiot (April 7-29)...tonight, he looks to join Rolando Arrojo (3GS, April 19-May 6, 1998) as the only pitchers in franchise history to turn the trick in three consecutive road starts.

IT'S LIT—Littell has thrown three consecutive scoreless starts of 5.0+ IP, tying six other pitchers for the longest streak in Rays history: Taj Bradley (2024), Ryan Yarbrough (2019), Jake Odorizzi (2016), Alex Colomé (2014), Alex Cobb (2014) and Matt Moore (2012)...he is looking to join SD Yu Darvish (4GS, April 30-May 19) as the only MLB pitchers to turn the trick in four straight starts this season...the last AL pitcher to do so was HOU Cristian Javier (4GS) from Sept. 14–Oct. 1, 2022.

Littell's career-long 20.0 scoreless inning streak is the second-longest active streak among MLB starters behind NYM Jose Quintana (22.2).

Littell, Yarbrough (3GS, 2019) and Matt Moore (3GS, 2012) are the only Rays to record 5.0+ scoreless innings with three hits or fewer in three consecutive starts.

only Rays to record 5.0+ scoreless innings with three hits or rewer in three consecutive starts. Littell has recorded 6.0+ scoreless innings with two hits or fewer in back-to-back starts, becoming the fourth Ray to accomplish the feat along with Bradley (2024), **Drew Rasmussen** (2023) and **Chris Archer** (2015)...it is one shy of the longest such streak in MLB history (since 1901) shared by six pitchers, two of whom turned the trick in 2024 (CIN Greene - July 22-Aug. 3/SD Cease - July 13-25). Littell has retired 39 of 42 batters faced over his last two starts, balding opponents to a 3-for-42 (071) clin

holding opponents to a 3-for-42 (.071) clip.

ALLIDOIS WIN—Littell is the third Ray to earn a win in three consecutive starts this season, joining Tyler Alexander (July 23–Aug. 4) and Taj Bradley (July 12-25)...he is looking to become the first to accomplish the feat in four consecutive starts since Shane McClanahan's four-start, season-opening run in 2023 (March 30–April 16)...Littell is also looking for his fourth victory in as many starts on the road...the last Rays pitcher to turn the trick was McClanahan (4GS) from April 5–May 8, 2023.

SECOND-HALF SURGE—In nine starts since the All-Star break, Littell owns a 2.15 ERA (50.1IP, 12ER), fourth best in the AL (min. 50.0IP), while holding opponents to a .202/.255/.355 (37-for-183) line...this, compared to a 4.26 ERA (101.1IP, 48ER) and .290/.327/.452 (120-for-414) over 19 first-half starts.

FAST AND FURIOUS—Since the All-Star break, opposing hitters are 8-for-67 (.119) against his fastballs (four-seamer/sinker) and 29-for-116 (.250) vs. his breaking/offspeed offerings (slider/splitter/sweeper)...min. 50 AB, it marks the second-lowest opp. average on any MLB starter's fastball in that timeframe, trailing only SD Blake Snell (.113)...opponents are hitless (0-for-23) in at-bats ending with fastballs across Littell's last three starts...on the season, his 37.4 pct. fastball usage rate is second lowest in the majors (min. 2,000 pitches), higher than only BOS Tanner Houck (33.8%).
