**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees will begin a seven-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game set at Milwaukee (through Sun.)...will play a four-game series at Baltimore from Mon.-Thurs....went 4-3 on their recent homestand after winning two-of-three games vs. Tampa Bay and splitting a four-game set vs. Oakland.

- ▶ Have won five of their last eight games (since 4/17).
- ▶ Their 17-9 record (.654) is the fifth-best record in the Majors, trailing only Atlanta (17-6, .739), Cleveland (18-7, .720), Baltimore (16-8, .667) and Milwaukee (16-8, .667)...their 17 wins are tied with Atlanta for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (18).
- ▶ Marks the fourth time in the last 13 years (since 2012) and the sixth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees have gone 17-9 or better to start a season (also 19-7 in 2022, 18-8 in 2010 and 17-9 in 2011, '17, '18).
- ▶ *With a win tonight*, it would mark just the fifth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees have gone 18-9 or better to start a season (went 19-8 in 2010 and '22 and 18-9 in 2017 and '18).
- ▶ The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without an off day (4/19-5/5)...marks their longest stretch of the season without an off-day...are 4-3 so far.
- ▶ Eight of the Yankees' 17 wins are come-from-behind wins.
- ▶ **Are 6-2 following a loss this year.**
- ▶ **Have won or split seven of their eight series (6-1-1) this season.**

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees fell to the Athletics, 3-1, on Thursday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Nestor Cortes** (7.0IP, 5H, 3R/ER, 0BB, 4K, 2HR) made his sixth start of the season and took the loss...**C Jose Trevino** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit his second HR of the year with a go-ahead solo HR in the second inning...**2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-4), **LF Alex Verdugo** (2-for-4) and **SS Anthony Volpe** (2-for-5) each picked up multi-hit games...**RHP Dennis Santana** (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K) tossed a scoreless eighth inning...**LHP Victor González** (1.0IP) tossed a scoreless ninth inning.

**FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers** have posted a 3.06 ERA (141.1IP, 48ER) in 26 starts this year, the fourth-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.05), Philadelphia (2.12) and Kansas City (3.03)...**have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 23 of their 26 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 16 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 11 starts**...have not allowed more than 4ER in any start this season.

- ▶ **Have posted a 2.25 ERA (48.0IP, 12ER) with 50K in their last eight starts (since 4/17).**
- ▶ The Yankees are one of only two teams in the Majors to have five pitchers who have made at least four starts this year and have an ERA below 3.60: Gil-2.75, Rodón-2.70, Stroman-2.93, Cortes-3.50 and Schmidt-3.55 (also the Phillies).

**PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a 2.95 ERA (234.2IP, 77ER) this year, the second-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.60)**...their 2.95 ERA is the second-lowest through the Yankees' first 26 games of a season in the last 43 years since 1982 (2.54 ERA in 2022).

- ▶ Have held opponents to 3R-or-fewer in 17 of 26 games this year (are 12-5 in those games)...are 15-5 this season when holding their opponent to 4R-or-fewer.
- ▶ Rank third in the Majors in opponents' BA (.219) and fourth in opponents' SLG (.345) and opponents' OPS (.646).

**BATTERS' EYE: Yankees batters** lead the Majors with a 4.13 pitches per plate appearance ratio.

- ▶ Lead the Majors with an 8.92 PA/BB ratio (981PA/110BB) and rank third with 110BB.
- GIL'N AND DEALING: RHP Luis Gil** will make his fifth start of the season tonight...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his four starts this year and 2R-or-fewer in three of those starts, posting a 2.75 ERA (19.2IP, 6ER) this season.
- ▶ Has recorded at least 6K in each of his four starts, posting a 13.27 K/9.0IP ratio (29K/19.2IP).
  - ▶ Has allowed 3H-or-fewer in each of his four starts this year, holding opponents to a .125 BA (8-for-64).

**NASTY NESTOR: LHP Nestor Cortes** allowed 3ER in 7.0IP on Thursday vs. Oakland...tossed at least 7.0IP in each of his last two starts and three of his last four starts (since 4/8)...has tossed at least 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts for the third time in his career (also 2GS from 5/26-6/2(G1)/22 and 5/9-15/22)...has recorded three of the Yankees' four starts of at least 7.0IP this year (also Carlos Rodón's 7.0IP on 4/22 vs. Oakland).

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU: OF Aaron Judge** turns 32 years old today (DOB: 4/26/92)...Judge has homered twice on his birthday: hit a two-run HR at Boston on his 25th birthday in 2017 and hit a solo HR vs. Baltimore on his 30th birthday in 2022...in five career games on his birthday, has hit .412/.545/.941 (7-for-17) with 5R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 7RBI and 5BB.

- ▶ In nine career games vs. Milwaukee, has hit .364/.512/.697 (12-for-33) with 7R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 5RBI, 9BB and 1HP.

**CENTURY MARK:** Yesterday, **Art Schalllock**, the oldest living former Major League player, celebrated his 100th birthday...the former pitcher appeared in parts of five Major League seasons with the Yankees (1951-55) and Baltimore (1955), going 6-7 with a 4.02 ERA (170.1IP, 76ER) in 58 games (14 starts)...during his birthday celebration on Thursday, Schalllock was surprised with video messages from **Manager Aaron Boone**, **RHP Gerrit Cole**, **OF Aaron Judge** and **INF Anthony Rizzo**...he was also presented with a team-signed No. 100 jersey from Yankees Senior Vice President and Assistant General Manager **Jean Afterman**.

**VERDAWGO: OF Alex Verdugo** has hit .333/.444/.510 (17-for-51) with 10R, 6 doubles, 1HR, 5RBI, 10BB, 1HP, 1SB and 15F in his last 16 games (since 4/8)...has reached base multiple times in four of his last five games (since 4/21) and nine of his last 16 games.

- ▶ His 11.44 plate appearance per strikeout ratio (103PA/9K) is the second-best in the Majors this season (first in AL).

**ON A ROLL: C Jose Trevino** has hit safely in each of his last eight games (since 4/13), batting .423/.464/.654 (11-for-26) with 4R, 2HR, 7RBI and 2BB over that span.

**HIGH VOLPAGE: INF Anthony Volpe** has hit safely in each of his last four games (since 4/22), batting .353 (6-for-17) with 1R, 1 triple, 1RBI and 1HP in that span.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The Yankees have had 17 of their 26 games decided by 2R-or-fewer, going 11-6 in those games...their 17 such games are the most in the Majors...10 of their last 11 games, 11 of their last 13 games and 12 of their last 15 games have been decided by 2R-or-fewer.

- ▶ Are 8-2 in one-run games...their 10 one-run games are tied with Oakland and Detroit for the most in the Majors.
- ▶ The Yankees have had 20 of their 26 games decided by 3R-or-fewer, the most such games in the Majors.

**PEN PALS: Yankees relievers** have allowed just 1H over their last three games (9.1IP, 0R, 2BB, 8K)...the Yankees bullpen owns the sixth-lowest ERA (2.80) in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (1.87), Cleveland (2.31), Seattle (2.49), Minnesota (2.60) and Milwaukee (2.73).

- ▶ The Yankees are 10-0 this season when they lead after six innings, 14-0 when leading after seven innings and 14-0 when leading after eight innings.
- ▶ **RHP Ian Hamilton** has not allowed a run in eight of his 10 appearances this year.
- ▶ **RHP Clay Holmes** has not allowed an earned run in 12 appearances this season (12.0IP, 12H, 3R/OER, 1BB, 10K, 2HP)...his nine saves are tied for the most in the Majors and his 12.0IP are the third-most among Major League relievers who have not allowed an earned run this season (Chicago-NL's Mark Leiter Jr. and Cleveland's Hunter Gaddis - 12.1IP).
- ▶ **LHP Victor González** has not allowed a run in nine of 11 appearances this year.

**NOBODY BEATS THE RIZZ: INF Anthony Rizzo** has hit 29 career home runs against the Brewers, the third-most among active players, trailing only Joey Votto (43) and Andrew McCutchen (39).

- ▶ Has reached base in 21 of his 26 games this season.

**THE GREAT JUAN: OF Juan Soto** has reached base safely in 23 of his 26 games this season, hitting .316/.430/.561 (31-for-98) with 17R, 6 doubles, 6HR, 22RBI, 21BB, 1SB and 2SF...has reached base multiple times in 16 of those games.

- ▶ Is tied for first in the Majors in walks (21, tied for first in AL), is tied for second in times on base (52, first in AL), third in OBP (.430, first in AL), tied for third in WAR among position players (1.7 - FanGraphs, second in AL), tied for sixth in RBI (22, fifth in AL) and ninth in OPS (.991, fourth in AL).

**THREE'S COMPANY:** The Yankees are 17-2 (.895) this season when scoring at least 3R, the best such record in the Majors.

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 26, 2022:** In the Yankees' 12-8 win vs. Baltimore, Anthony Rizzo records his first career 3HR game, hitting a three-run HR in the third inning, a two-run HR in the fifth and a solo HR in the eighth. He becomes the 24th player in franchise history (33rd time) to hit 3HR in a game and the sixth first baseman (ninth time).

**April 26, 2005:** Alex Rodriguez hits three home runs (all off Bartolo Colon) and tallies 10RBI in a 12-4 win vs. the Angels. He becomes just the second Yankee to total 10 or more RBI in a game, behind current AL-record-holder Tony Lazzari, who had 11RBI on 5/24/36 in a 25-2 win at Philadelphia.

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS GIL (1-1, 2.75 ERA)

**RHP Luis Gil** will make his fifth start of the season in tonight's series opener at Milwaukee...the 25-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay and earned his first win this season after allowing 1R/0ER in 5.2IP (2H, 3BB, 9K, 0HR, 2BK)...his 9K were a career high and matched the most by a Yankees starter this year (also Nestor Cortes' 9K on 4/20 vs. Tampa Bay and Marcus Stroman's 9K on 4/23 vs. Oakland)...has held opponents to a .125 BA (8-for-64) this year...among Major League pitchers this season with at least 75 batters faced, ranks first in K/9.0IP (13.27), second in opponents' SLG (.188, second in AL), third in opponents' BA (second in AL) and 10th in opponents' OPS (.501, fourth in AL)...has allowed the fewest hits (eight) among Major League pitchers (min. 75BF)...**has struck out at least six batters in nine of his first 11 career starts, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (10) for the most such games in a pitcher's first 11 career games in franchise history...***if he records six-or-more strikeouts tonight, would match Tanaka (10) for the most games with at least six strikeouts in a pitcher's first 12 career games in franchise history...is also just the fifth pitcher in the last 26 seasons (since 1999) to record six-or-more strikeouts in at least nine of their first 11 career games,* joining Hunter Greene (10 in 2022), Ian Anderson (nine from 2020-21), Masahiro Tanaka (10 in 2014) and Stephen Strasburg (nine in 2010)...**has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in nine of his first 11 career starts, including all four of his starts this season...**spent the entire 2023 season on the 60-day injured list recovering from right elbow surgery...underwent right elbow UCL reconstruction surgery on 5/24/22...the surgery was performed by Dr. Christopher Ahmad at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital in New York, N.Y....made his first career Opening Day roster in 2024...was added to the Yankees' 40-man roster on 11/20/19...was acquired by the Yankees from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for OF Jake Cave on 3/16/18...was originally signed by Minnesota as a non-drafted free agent on 2/13/15...last name is pronounced "HEEL."

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned his first win of the season on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay after allowing 1R/0ER over 5.2IP (2H, 3BB, 9K, 0HR, 2BK)...surrendered his only run in the third inning after he balked with a runner on third, allowing Richie Palacios to score...marked his first Major League win since his big league debut on 8/3/21 vs. Baltimore...his 9K were a career high and matched the most by a Yankees starter this year (also Nestor Cortes' 9K on 4/20 vs. Tampa Bay and Marcus Stroman's 9K on 4/23 vs. Oakland).

**VS. MILWAUKEE/INTERLEAGUE:** Will be making his first career start against Milwaukee.

- ✦ Made his first career Interleague start earlier this season in the Yankees' 5-2 win at Arizona on 4/1 (ND, 4.2IP, 1H, 1ER, 3BB, 6K).

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** Will be making his fourth career start on the road at Milwaukee tonight...in his three career road starts, has gone 0-1 with a 5.27 ERA (13.2IP, 9H, 8ER, 12BB, 17K, 0HR).

- ✦ Has made two starts on the road this season: at Arizona on 4/1 (ND, 4.2IP, 1H, 1ER, 3BB, 6K, 0HR) and at Toronto on 4/15 (L, 5.0IP, 3H, 3ER, 7BB, 6K, 0HR).

**GILIN' AND DEALIN':** Has posted a .087 opponents' BA (2-for-23) vs. left-handed batters this season...has struck out 12 of his 31 batters faced...his .087 average against left-handed batters is tied for sixth-lowest in the Majors (tied for sixth in AL).

**2024:** Is 1-1 with a 2.75 ERA this season (19.2IP, 8H, 7R/6ER, 17BB, 29K, 0HR)...has struck out six-or-more batters and allowed 3ER-or-fewer in all four starts this season...has held opponents to a .125 BA (8-for-64)...among Major League pitchers this season with at least 75 batters faced, ranks first in K/9.0IP (13.27), second in opponents' SLG (.188, second in AL), third in opponents' BA (second in AL) and 10th in opponents' OPS (.501, fourth in AL)...has allowed the fewest hits (eight) among Major League pitchers (min. 75BF).

- ✦ His 29 strikeouts rank third among Major League rookies this season (first in AL).
- ✦ In his previous start on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay, earned his first win of the season after allowing 1R/0ER over 5.2IP (2H, 3BB, 9K, 0HR, 2BK)...surrendered his only run in the third inning after he balked with a runner on third, allowing Richie Palacios to score...marked his first Major League win since his big league debut on 8/3/21 vs. Baltimore...his 9K were a career high and matched the most by a Yankees starter this year (also Nestor Cortes' 9K on 4/20 vs. Tampa Bay and Marcus Stroman's 9K on 4/23 vs. Oakland).
- ✦ On 4/15 at Toronto, recording his first loss of the season after allowing 3ER in a season-high 5.0IP (3H, 7BB, 6K, 0HR, 1WP)...his 7BB matched his career high (also 7BB on 9/8/21 vs. Toronto).
- ✦ On 4/7 vs. Toronto, did not record a decision after allowing 2ER in 4.1IP (2H, 4BB, 8K, 0HR, 1HP)...retired eight of his first nine batters faced (1BB).
- ✦ Made his season debut on 4/1 at Arizona (ND, 4.2IP, 1H, 1ER, 3BB, K, 0HR)...retired all eight right-handed batters faced (4K)...marked his first Major League appearance since 5/12/22 at Chicago-AL.

**2023:** Made just two rehab starts with Single-A Tampa, posting an 11.25 ERA (4.0IP, 6H, 5ER, 3BB, 6K, 0HR)...spent the entire season on the 60-day injured list recovering from right elbow surgery.

**CAREER NOTES:** In 11 career Major League starts with the Yankees (four in 2024, one in 2022 and six in 2021), is 2-2 with a 3.40 ERA (53.0IP, 33H, 22R/20ER, 38BB, 72K, 4HR)...**has struck out at least six batters in nine of his first 11 career starts, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (10) for the most such games in a pitcher's first 11 career games in franchise history...is also just the fifth pitcher in the last 26 seasons (since 1999) to record six-or-more strikeouts in at least nine of their first 11 career games,** joining Hunter Greene (10 in 2022), Ian Anderson (nine from 2020-21), Masahiro Tanaka (10 in 2014) and Stephen Strasburg (nine in 2010)...**has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in nine of his first 11 career starts.**

- ✦ Made his first career Opening Day roster in 2024.
- ✦ Missed all of the 2023 Major League season on the 60-day injured list after undergoing right elbow UCL reconstruction surgery on 5/24/22...the surgery was performed by Dr. Christopher Ahmad at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital in New York, N.Y.
- ✦ Saw his first Major League action in 2021, going 1-1 with a 3.07 ERA (29.1IP, 20H, 11R/10ER, 19BB, 38K, 4HR) in six starts with the Yankees...**recorded at least 6K in five of his first six Major League starts in 2021, becoming just the fifth Yankee in franchise history to accomplish the feat...**joined Deivi García, Masahiro Tanaka, José Contreras and Al Leiter (also five games).
- ✦ Was added to the Yankees' 40-man roster on 11/20/19.
- ✦ Was acquired by the Yankees from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for OF Jake Cave on 3/16/18...was originally signed by Minnesota as a non-drafted free agent on 2/13/15.
- ✦ Last name is pronounced "HEEL."

**LHP Carlos Rodón** will make his sixth start of the season on Saturday at Milwaukee...the 31-year-old will make the start on regular four days' rest...made his fifth start of the season on Monday vs. Oakland, allowing just 1H over a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings without recording a decision (2BB, 4K, 2HP)...marked his first scoreless start as a Yankee and first since 9/29/22 vs. Colorado with San Francisco (OR in 6.0IP)...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his five starts this season, including 2R-or-fewer in four of those starts...**in his first season with the Yankees in 2023, went 3-8 with a 6.85 ERA (64.1IP, 65H, 51R/49ER, 28BB, 64K, 15HR) in 14 starts...missed 100 team games due to two injured list stints...has played in parts of 10 Major League seasons with the Chicago-AL (2015-21), San Francisco (2022) and Yankees (2023-24)...has finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting twice (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022)...is a two-time All-Star (2021 and 2022)...has made six Opening Day rosters (2016, '19-22, '24)...began the 2017, 2018 and 2023 seasons on the injured list...was originally selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 16th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play three seasons at North Carolina State University (2012-14)...was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the first round (third overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...signed a six-year Major League contract with the Yankees extending through the 2028 season on 12/21/22.

**#17 AARON BOONE—Manager****Career Managerial Record: 526-370 (8th-most wins by a Yankees Manager, next: Billy Martin, 556)**

- The 2024 season marks his seventh year at the helm for the Yankees (also 2018-23)...guided the Yankees to an 82-80 record in 2023, finishing fourth in the AL East...marked the Yankees 31st consecutive winning season and sixth such season under Boone...has led the Yankees to two division titles (2019 and 2022).
- According to *Elias*, was the first Manager in Baseball history to reach the postseason in each of his first five managerial seasons...was the third Manager to make the playoffs in his first five seasons with the Yankees (2018-22), joining Casey Stengel (first five from 1949-53) and Joe Torre (first 12 from 1996-2007).
- Was re-signed by the Yankees on 10/19/21 to a three-year contract through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...was named the 33rd Manager in club history on 12/4/17...is the 18th person to both play for, and manage, the Yankees... is one of eight active managers to have played for the franchise he currently manages, joining Kevin Cash (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (Boston), A.J.
