TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

March 28, 2024: The Yankees overcome a 4-0 deficit to defeat the Astros, 5-4, on Opening Day. It marked just the second time in franchise history the Yankees have trailed by at least 4R on Opening Day and won (were also down 9-0 on Opening Day in 1950 at Boston and won 15-10).

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

March 29, 2018: Giancarlo Stanton makes his Yankees debut, going 3-for-5 with 3R, 1 double, 2HR and 4RBI at Toronto. According to *Elias*, he becomes just the second Yankee to homer twice in his first game with the club, joining Roger Maris, who went 4-for-5 with 2R, 1 double, 2HR and 4RBI on 4/19/60 at Boston. He is also the seventh Yankee to hit 2HR on Opening Day.

March 29, 2025: The Yankees hit a franchise-record 9HR vs. Milwaukee. They become the third team in Major League history to hit 9HR in a game, joining the 1987 Toronto Blue Jays (10HR) and 1999 Cincinnati Reds (9HR). The club matches the franchise record with 9HR later in the season on August 19 at Tampa Bay.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the final game of their three-game set against the San Francisco Giants (2-0 thus far)... is part of a season-opening six-game road trip as the Yankees will also travel to Seattle from Mon.-Wed.

- ▶ Have won their first two games of a season for the sixth time in the last 21 years (since 2006)...the Yankees also won their first two games in 2011, '18, '22, '24 and '25...with a win today, it would mark the fifth time in the last 31 years (since 1996) the Yankees have won their first three games of a season (won their first five games in 2024, first four games in '03 and first three games in '01 and '25).
- ▶ Are opening the season on the road for just the third time in the last eight seasons (since 2019)...marks the fifth time the Yankees have begun the season on the road in the last 12 years (since 2015).
- ▶ Are opening the season against San Francisco for the second time in franchise history (also 2023).
- ▶ Are opening the season against a National League opponent for the fourth time in franchise history (also 2020 at Washington, 2023 vs. San Francisco and 2025 vs. Milwaukee).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Giants, 3-0, on Friday at Oracle Park...**Yankees pitchers** recorded their second consecutive shutout to begin the season, allowing just 1H...**RHP Cam Schlichter** (5.1IP, 1H, 0R, 0BB, 8K) earned the win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his first home run of the season with a go-ahead two-run homer in the sixth inning...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) recorded his first home run of the season with a solo shot in the sixth inning...**CF/LF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-3, 1BB) and **SS José Caballero** (2-for-4, 1SB) each reached base twice...**Yankees relievers** retired 11 of their 13BF...**RHP Fernando Cruz** (0.2IP, 1BB), **LHP Tim Hill** (1.0IP, 2K), **RHP Camilo Doval** (1.0IP, 3K) and **RHP David Bednar** (SV, 1.0IP, 1BB) were all scoreless in relief.

PITCH PERFECT: **Yankees pitchers** tossed their second consecutive shutout to begin the season on Friday (also a 7-0 win on Opening Day)...according to *Elias*, **marks the first time in franchise history the Yankees have shut out their opponent in each of the first two games of a season and just the 20th instance in Major League history**...with a shutout today, would be just the third team to do so in each of their first three games of a season, joining the 1963 St. Louis Cardinals and 2016 Los Angeles Dodgers.

- ▶ Have allowed just four hits total over their first two games of the season (3H on Wednesday and 1H on Friday), surpassing their previous record of seven hits total over the first two games of a season (7H in 1929 and 2018)...**are the third team since 1893 (the year the mound was placed at its current distance from home plate) to allow three-or-fewer hits over their first two games of a season**, joining Cleveland (3H over first 2G in 1940) and the Detroit Tigers (4H over first 2G in 1909) - credit: *Elias*.

DYNAMIC DUO: **RHP Cam Schlichter** (5.1 scoreless innings on Friday) and **LHP Max Fried** (6.1 scoreless innings on Wednesday) were both scoreless in the Yankees first two games of the season against San Francisco...**marks just the second time in franchise history Yankees starters were scoreless in each of the club's first two games of the season, joining Roger Clemens (6.0 scoreless innings on 3/31/03 at Toronto) and Andy Pettitte (7.0 scoreless innings on 4/1/03 at Toronto) in the first two games of the 2003 season.**

THE SKIPPER, TOO: The 2026 season marks **Manager Aaron Boone's** ninth season at the helm...Boone has compiled a career 699-497 (.584) managerial record and has led the Yankees to a postseason berth in seven of his first eight seasons at the helm (2018-22, '24-25)...excluding the abbreviated 60-game 2020 season, the Yankees have averaged 95 wins per year during Boone's tenure...**has 699 career regular season managerial wins and needs one win to reach 700**...his 699 wins rank seventh on the Yankees' all-time list, trailing only Joe McCarthy (1,460-867-21), Joe Torre (1,173-767-2), Casey Stengel (1,149-696-6), Miller Huggins (1,067-719-10), Ralph Houk (944-806-7) and Joe Girardi (910-710).

- ▶ *With his next managerial win*, would be just one of six active managers to reach the 700-managerial win mark, joining Terry Francona (2,033), A.J. Hinch (966), Dave Roberts (946), Kevin Cash (896) and Craig Counsell (882).

GOT YOUR NUMBER: **INF Ryan McMahon** has hit .313/.313/.875 (5-for-16) with 1 double, 1 triple and 2HR against San Francisco's RHP Tyler Mahle.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU: Today is **RHP Fernando Cruz's** 36th birthday (DOB: 3/28/90).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge hit his first home run of the season on Friday at San Francisco with a go-ahead two-run homer in the sixth inning...in 2025, 28 of his 53HR either tied the game (four) or gave the Yankees the lead (24)...his 24 go-ahead home runs last season were the most in the Majors.

- ▶ Has hit .400/.500/.875 (16-for-40) with 12R, 1 double, 6HR, 12RBI, 7BB, 1HP and 2SB in 11 career games vs. San Francisco...in five career games at Oracle Park, has hit .368/.455/1.000 (7-for-19) with 6R, 4HR, 8RBI, 3BB and 2SB.

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton hit his first home run of the season with a solo shot in the sixth inning on Friday at San Francisco...is 4-for-8 (.500) with 2R, 1HR and 2RBI in his first two games this season.

- ▶ **Has hit .327/.404/.733 (66-for-202) with 36R, 17 doubles, 1 triple, 21HR, 44RBI, 23BB and 4HP in 53 career games vs. San Francisco.**

- ▶ Has hit 9HR in his last 13G against the Giants (since 7/7/17).
- ▶ Has also batted .323/.384/.702 (40-for-124) with 18R, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 11HR, 24RBI, 11BB and 2HP in 31 games at Oracle Park.
- ▶ **His next RBI will mark his 500th RBI as a Yankee.**

NEW YORK GIANTS: OF Aaron Judge and DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton homered in the same game for the first time this season on Friday at San Francisco...including the postseason, Stanton and Judge have homered in the same game 60 times (54 times during the regular season and six times during the postseason), the second-most games by a pair of Yankees teammates in franchise history, trailing only Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth (75) - credit *Elias*...the Yankees are 53-7 in those games (49-5 during the regular season and 4-2 during the postseason)...their 54 instances during the regular season are the third-most by a pair of Yankees teammates, trailing only Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth (73), and Yogi Berra and Mickey Mantle (55).

GOOD WILL WARREN: RHP Will Warren will make his season debut today at San Francisco...in his first full Major League season in 2025, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR)...was tied for second in the Majors in starts (33, tied for first in AL)...also ranked eighth in the AL in K/9.0IP (9.48).

- ▶ Among Major League rookies last season, ranked first in strikeouts, starts and innings pitched, and was tied for fourth in wins (tied for third in AL).
- ▶ Was just the third Yankee rookie to make at least 33 starts in a season, joining Stan Bahnsen (34GS in 1968), and Russ Ford (33GS in 1910).

THE SAN FRANCISCO TREAT: The Yankees are 18-8 all-time vs. the Giants, winning seven of their nine series...**are 12-3 in their last 15 games against San Francisco** (since 7/24/16).

- ▶ **Are 9-2 against the Giants at Oracle Park...have won each of their last eight games at the venue (since 4/26/19).**
- ▶ Have scored at least 5R in 12 of their last 15 games against the Giants (since 7/24/16).

SCHLITZ'S CREEK: RHP Cam Schlichter made his season debut on Friday at San Francisco, earning the win after allowing just 1H over 5.1 scoreless innings (0BB, 8K)...**at 25 years, 50 days old, is only the second Yankee age 25-or-younger to start one of the club's first two games of a season since 1999**, joining Luis Severino (24 years, 37 days on Opening Day at Toronto in 2018).

- ▶ Became the first pitcher in franchise history to record at least 8K and allow 1H-or-fewer in their first game of the season.
- ▶ Marked his fourth career scoreless start...is just the sixth Yankee pitcher to record at least four scoreless starts in their first 15 career games, joining Russ Ford (5), Luis Gil (5), Hippo Vaughn (4), Vito Tamulis (4) and Tiny Bonham (4).

HOW THEY WERE BUILT: Of the 26 players on the Yankees' 2026 Opening Day active roster, 10 were signed as free agents (Bellinger, Blackburn, Escarra, Fried, Goldschmidt, Grichuk, Hill, Judge*, Rosario and Yarbrough), 10 were acquired by trade (Bednar, Bird, Caballero, Chisholm Jr., Cruz, Doval, Grisham, McMahon, Stanton and Weathers), five were originally drafted and signed by the Yankees (Judge*, Rice, Schlichter, Warren and Wells), one was claimed off waivers (Headrick) and one was selected in the Rule 5 Draft (Winquest).

- ▶ Of the 26 players on the Yankees' 2026 Opening Day active roster, 12 were not on the club's 2025 Opening Day active roster — **P (7):** Bednar, Bird, Blackburn, Doval, Schlichter, Weathers, Winquest; **INF (1):** McMahon; **OF (2):** Grichuk, Stanton; **UTIL (2):** Caballero, Rosario.
- ▶ The Yankees' Opening Day active roster included players from the Bahamas, Dominican Republic, Panama, Puerto Rico and U.S.
- ▶ Schlichter and Winquest made their first career Opening Day active roster...Winquest is the only rookie and only player in line to make his Major League debut...two players are in line to make their Yankees debuts (Weathers and Winquest)... Grichuk made his Yankees debut on Friday.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP WILL WARREN (9-8, 4.44 ERA in 2025)

RHP Will Warren will make his season debut in today's series finale at San Francisco...the 26-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest...made his final spring start on Sunday vs. Philadelphia, recording the win after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings (1H, 6K)...went 2-1 with a 1.42 ERA (25.1IP, 13H, 5R/4ER, 3BB, 22K, 1HR) in six spring starts...among Grapefruit League pitchers, ranked first in innings pitched, opponents' BA (.148) and WHIP (0.63), was tied for first in starts, second in ERA and fourth in strikeouts...last season, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR) in 33 starts, allowing 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...**according to Elias, his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season**, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25GS in 1968)...**according to Elias, his 171K were tied with Luis Gil (171K in 2024) for the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (209K in 1910)...went 2-4 with a 5.52 ERA (75.0IP, 87H, 54R/46ER, 31BB, 75K, 10HR) in 17 starts on the road...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of his 17 road starts...saw his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2024, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)... was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Southeastern Louisiana University.

SPRING FLING: Went 2-1 with a 1.42 ERA (25.1IP 13H, 5R/4ER, 3BB, 22K, 1HR) in six spring starts...among Grapefruit League pitchers, ranked first in innings pitched, opponents' BA (.148) and WHIP (0.63), was tied for first in starts, second in ERA and fourth in strikeouts.

ROAD TRIPPIN': Went 2-4 with a 5.52 ERA (75.0IP, 87H, 54R/46ER, 31BB, 75K, 10HR) in 17 road starts last season...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of those starts, including five of his final six road starts from 8/15-9/19.

✦ Went 1-0 with a 1.37 ERA (19.2IP, 3ER) and 15K over four road starts from 8/5-9/3.

VS. SAN FRANCISCO: Will make his second career start vs. the Giants today.

✦ Earned his first Major League win on 4/12/25 vs. San Francisco at Yankee Stadium after allowing only 2R/ER in 5.0IP (2H, 2BB, 6K, 1HR)...after allowing a two-run HR to Wilmer Flores in the second inning, retired his next 10BF and 11 of his final 12BF (1BB).

2025: In his first full Major League season, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR)...opponents batted .250/.320/.418 (158-for-631, 22HR); LH .266/.350/.436 (91-for-342, 12HR); RH .232/.283/.398 (67-for-289, 10HR).

- ✦ Was tied for second in the Majors in starts (33, tied for first in AL)...also ranked eighth in the AL in K/9.0IP (9.48).
- ✦ Was just the third Yankees rookie to make at least 33 starts in a season, joining Stan Bahnsen (34GS in 1968), and Russ Ford (33GS in 1910)...was also the first Major League rookie to make at least 33 starts in a single season since 2009 (Nick Blackburn, 33GS with Minnesota in 2008).
- ✦ Among Major League rookies, ranked first in strikeouts, starts and innings pitched, and was tied for fourth in wins (tied for third in AL).
- ✦ Went 5-5 with a 3.94 ERA (105.0IP, 46ER) over his final 20 starts (6/12-9/26) after going 4-3 with a 5.34 ERA (57.1IP, 34ER) over his first 13 starts of the season (4/1-6/6)...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 14 of his final 20 starts and one-or-zero ER in eight of those starts.
- ✦ Surrendered one-or-zero home runs in 29 of his 33 starts and did not allow a home run in 15 of those starts...his 29 starts of one-or-zero home runs allowed were tied for the fourth-most in the Majors (tied for first in AL).
- ✦ Allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of his 33 starts, including 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...according to *Elias*, his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25GS in 1968).
- ✦ According to *Elias*, his 171K were tied with Luis Gil (171K in 2024) for the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford (209K in 1910).
- ✦ Tossed five scoreless starts: 5.2IP on 5/20 vs. Texas, 6/12 at Kansas City and 7/8 vs. Seattle, and 5.0IP on 6/27 vs. the Athletics and 8/5 at Texas... according to *Elias*, his five scoreless starts were tied for the third-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's eight such starts in 1910 and Luis Gil's six such starts in 2024 (Hippo Vaughn also had five such starts in 1910).
- ✦ In 16 starts at Yankee Stadium, went 7-4 with a 3.50 ERA (87.1IP, 71H, 36R/34ER, 34BB, 96K, 12HR)... allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 13 of those starts, including 2ER-or-fewer in 11 starts.
- ✦ His 112K prior to the All-Star break were the third-most strikeouts by a rookie in franchise history (since the All-Star Game was established in 1933), trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (135K in 2014) and Luis Gil (118K in 2024).
- ✦ Recorded at least 7K in five of his six starts in May, posting a 13.82 K/9.0IP ratio during that stretch... recorded 7K in five straight starts (5/4-25), matching the second-longest such streak by a Yankees starter age 25-or-younger in franchise history...trailed only Luis Severino's six-game streak from 8/17-9/15/17...during the month of May, ranked second among all Major League pitchers in K/9.0IP ratio (13.82, first in AL), third in strikeout rate (33.9%, second in AL) and was tied for third in strikeouts (43, second in AL).
- ✦ Went 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA (26.2IP, 8ER) and 41K over a five-start span from 5/4-25...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in each of those five starts...allowed just 1HR to 113BF over that stretch.
- ✦ The Yankees went 13-6 in his 19 starts from 5/9-8/17...his 13 team wins over that span were tied with Boston's Lucas Giolito for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Detroit's Tarik Skubal (14 team wins).
- ✦ Recorded a career-high 11K on 6/17 vs. Los Angeles-AL (L, 6.0IP, 6H, 3R/ER, 0BB, 0HR)...became the third Yankees rookie in franchise history to record at least 11K in a game without surrendering a walk, joining Chad Green (11K and 0BB on 8/15/16 vs. Toronto) and Stan Bahnsen (12K and 0BB on 8/1/68 at Boston)...is one of only two Yankees rookies in the last nine years (since 2017) to record at least 11K in a game, joining Luis Gil (14K on 5/18/24 vs. Chicago-AL).
- ✦ Made his postseason debut in ALDS Game 2 at Toronto (4.2IP, 7H, 6R/ER, 1BB, 4K, 4HR, 1WP)...was on the Yankees' ALWCS roster but did not pitch.
- ✦ Following the season, was named to *Baseball America's* MLB All-Rookie Team.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Has made 39 career Major League appearances (38 starts), going 9-11 with a 5.16 ERA (185.0IP, 191H, 117R/106ER, 75BB, 200K, 27HR).

✦ His 200K over his first 39 career games (38 starts) are the fifth-most in franchise history, trailing Masahiro Tanaka (251K in 39G/GS), AI Downing (232K in 39G/32GS), Luis Gil (228K in 39G/GS) and Orlando Hernández (214K in 39G/GS).
