TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Kevin Collins' Rockies** and the second game of Cin's longest road trip of the 2026 season, a 10-day/9-game journey that includes upcoming series at **Sea** (Mon-Wed) and **StL** (Fri-Sun).

- The Reds return home to **Great American Ball Park** on 7/27 to begin an 11-day/10-game homestand against the **Guardians** (7/27-7/29), **Pirates** (7/30-8/2), and **Athletics** (8/4-8/6).

FEEL THE BURN(S): Cincinnati Reds President of Baseball Operations **Nick Krall** today announced that the club has agreed to terms with **RHP Chase Burns** on a new 7-year, \$105-million contract extension through the 2033 season.

- Burns**, 23, earned his first career All-Star nod after posting an 11-1 record with a 2.54 ERA and 118 strikeouts in his first 18 starts this season.
- Selected by Cin with the 2nd-overall pick of the 2024 MLB Draft, **Burns** became the second Red to ever earn an All-Star nod within 2 years of being drafted (also: **Scott Williamson**, drafted in 1997 and AS in '99).
- The Reds own a 14-4 record in his 18 starts this season, including team wins in each of his last 6 appearances and in 10 of his last 11.

SMART STEERING: In Fri's 7-2 win at **Col**, **INF/OF Spencer Steer** capped off his fifth career multi-homer game (last: 6/2 vs **KC**) with an inside-the-park homer off **Jeff Criswell** in the 8th inning.

- Marked his first career inside-the-park home run and the first by a **Reds** batter since **Noelvi Marte** on 9/24/25 vs **Pit**.
- Steer** on Fri became the fifth **Red** in the expansion era (since 1961) to hit an inside-the-park homer as part of a multi-HR game (see chart below).
- The first of **Steer's** 2 homers, a 2-run shot in the 6th inning, marked his 200th career extra-base hit...also reached 300 career RBI on the HR.

GOING THE EXTRA MILE: **INF Elly De La Cruz** and **INF/OF Spencer Steer** both recorded their 200th career extra-base hit in Fri's 7-2 win at **Col**...became the first pair of Major League teammates since 1900 to each collect the 200th extra-base hit of their respective careers in the same game.

- At 24 years, 187 days old, **De La Cruz** became the fourth-youngest **Red** to reach 200 career extra-base hits since 1900, behind **Vada Pinson** (23y/13d), **Johnny Bench** (23y/126d), & **Frank Robinson** (23y/234d).
- De La Cruz**, who had a career-high-tying 4 hits on Fri at **Col**, also became the second Major Leaguer since 1900 with 200+ XBH and 150+ SB within his first 4 career seasons (also: **Juan Samuel**, 1983-86 w/**Phi**).

GENO MACHINO: **DH Eugenio Suárez** has homered in at least 3 straight games for the 10th time in his career (last: 7/19-7/21, 2025 w/**Diamondbacks**).

- Hit his 201st career homer as a member of the **Reds** on Fri at **Col**...is 2 HR shy of tying **Eric Davis** for 10th place on the club's all-time list.
- Has reached safely in a season-high 17 straight G, the third-longest active run in MLB (**Phi's** **Kyle Schwarber** & **StL's** **Jordan Walker**, 19g each).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are 126-117 all-time vs the **Rockies** (52-70 in **Colorado**)...Cin took 2 of 3 at **Great American Ball Park** from 4/28-4/30.

- From 4/25-4/27, 2025 the Redlegs swept the **Rockies** at **Coors Field** for the second consecutive season...have won 7 straight games and 8 of their last 9 in the **Mile High City**.
- Since 6/19/23 Cin has won 17 of 20 overall vs **Col**, including 10 of 13 at **Great American Ball Park**.
- The 7/12/25 game was the first in the Reds/**Rockies** all-time series to feature a walkoff win since Cin's 3-2 victory on 9/2/22...the Reds are 15-6 all-time in walkoff games vs **Col**.
- Cin's 4-2 win at **GABP** on 7/13/25 marked **Terry Francona's** 2,000th career victory as a Major League manager.

STAR-STUDDER: **RHP Chase Burns** and **INF Sal Stewart** represented the Reds as National League All-Stars at the 2026 MLB All-Star Game in Philadelphia.

- It was the first career All-Star selection for both players...2026 marks the third straight year in which Cin had multiple All-Stars.
- Burns** did not pitch in the Midsummer Classic...**Stewart** entered as a defensive replacement at third base and went 0-for-1 with a walk.
- Burns** and **Stewart** are the third set of teammates in Reds history to each earn an All-Star selection at age 23 or younger in the same season (**Johnny Bench** and **Wayne Simpson** in 1970, **Frank Robinson** and **Vada Pinson** in 1959).

POWER SURGE: The Reds rank ninth in the majors with 123 homers...have scored 48.5% of their 402 runs via the HR (195), the second-highest rate in MLB.

- Lead MLB this season with 9 sets of back-to-back home runs.
- On Fri at **Col** hit at least 4 homers in a game for the seventh time this season (last: 7/8 vs **Phi**), tied for the most-such instances in MLB.
- Hit *back-to-back-to-back* HRs in the 4th inning on 7/8 vs **Phi** (**Elly De La Cruz**, **Sal Stewart**, **JJ Bleday**)...marked their 15th set of 3 straight home runs in the expansion era (since 1961).
- Are on pace to hit 207 homers this season, which would mark the 10th time in club history reaching 200 HR.
- Have hit a Major League-leading 27 homers to the opposite field this year, 6 more than the next closest team (**Phi**).
- Are 1 of 5 teams in the majors to boast 6 players with 10 or more HR (also: **NY Yankees**, **Sea**, **Pit**, and **LAD**).

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS: **SS Elly De La Cruz** (497 career games) on 7/12 vs **Chc** became the second player in MLB history to produce at least 75 HR and 150 SB within his first 500 career games, joining Reds Hall of Famer **Eric Davis**, who had 107 HR and 190 SB through his first 500 career games.

STRUGGLING AGAINST PEERS: The Reds are 6-22 (.214) vs their NL Central counterparts and 24-39 (.381) against all National League opponents.

- The Reds own the lowest winning pct (.214) of any Major League team within its own division.
- Conversely, Cin owns the majors' sixth-best record vs American League teams (20-13, .606).

RETURN TO THE ROTATION: Will make his first start since 6/30 at Mil...returns to the rotation as Nick Lodolo (15-day IL) recovers from a blister on his left index finger.

- BULLPEN APPEARANCES:** Made his previous 3 appearances in the bullpen after Hunter Greene returned from the injured list and re-entered the rotation on 7/4.
- Were his first 3 career relief apps after 19 straight starts to begin his Major League career.
 - Pitched 3.0 scoreless innings in the 8-5 loss vs Bal on 7/4.
 - Became the fifth Reds pitcher over the last 40 years with at least 3.0 scoreless innings in his first career relief app, the first since Reiver Sanmartin on 4/14/22 at LAD.
 - Yielded a run on 3 hits over 2.0 innings in the 11-5 win on 7/8 vs Phi (Obb, 2k)...allowed a 9th-inning HR to Kyle Schwarber.
 - Pitched 2.0 scoreless innings vs Chc on Sun, 7/12 (0h, 2bb, 1k, 30TP).

- JUNE 30 at MIL (LAST START):** Suffered the 7-2 loss at Mil on Tue, 6/30 (4.2ip, 11h, 6r/6er, 1bb, 8k, 1hr, 82TP).
- Allowed a career-high 11 hits coupled with a career-high 8 strikeouts.
 - 12 of his 26 batters reached.
 - Threw 26 of his 82 pitches in the 4th inning (7 baserunners, 6h, 4r/4er, 1bb, 1k).
 - Threw first-pitch strikes to 17 of his 26 batters.

- JUNE 24 vs MIL:** Suffered the 6-5 loss vs Mil on Wed, 6/24 (5.2ip, 8h, 3r/3er, 1bb, 6k, 2hr, 1hb, 100TP).
- Allowed 2 home runs for the second straight outing...it's the first time in his career that he's allowed multiple homers in back-to-back appearances.

- A STAR AT WAKE:** After his 2023 junior season at Wake Forest, was named ACC Male Athlete of the Year, ACC Pitcher of the Year for the second straight season, ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, *Baseball America* All-America first team, and Collegiate Baseball All-America first team...was a finalist for the National Pitcher of the Year and Dick Howser Trophy awards and a semifinalist for the Golden Spikes Award.
- He and teammate Chase Burns (2024) are the only pitchers from Wake Forest to win the ACC Pitcher of the Year Award.
