TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

D-BACKS LAUNCH INTERACTIVE APP: The D-backs launched a series of interactive games within the MLB Ballpark app that will allow fans to stay connected from home during the 60-game season and beyond...fans can download the Ballpark App for free and after navigating to the D-backs' homepage, click on Interactive Games to earn points during daily competitions, with the opportunity to win prizes each day throughout the season.

BEHIND HOME PLATE: Each series, the D-backs will highlight a charitable cause or team initiative with cardboard cut-outs in the Batter's Box:

- ◆ For the first series, members of the "D-backs for Change" council are joined by D-backs legend Luis Gonzalez and former D-backs pitcher Edwin Jackson.
- ◆ The group's goal is to help bring meaningful change and equality to our communities and includes the areas of diversity and inclusion.
- ◆ Jackson is a founding member of The Players Alliance, which is working with MLB and the MLB Players Association on these issues.

IN LEFT FIELD: At David Peralta's request, a group of teddy bears have been placed in the bleachers to help remind him of his fans and his family.

- ◆ As players are unable to visit Phoenix Children's Hospital and Banner Cardon Children's hospital due to the pandemic, smaller versions of these bears will be delivered throughout the season, courtesy of David and the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.
- ◆ The bears are wearing jerseys from the D-backs Youth Jersey Program, which outfits 121 Little Leagues and 65,000 players and coaches throughout Arizona.
- ◆ Mixed in with the bears are some favorite Disney characters of David's daughters, Sofia and Isabella.
- ◆ Several of the bears will be wearing train conductor hats in honor of David's "Freight Train" nickname.
- ◆ For every Chase Big Fly homer in the Teddy Bear section, the D-backs and Chase will add \$1,000 to the Play Ball Fund, which is devoted to youth sports in Arizona.

HERE'S THE STORY: Arizona is 7-4 in its last 11 home games vs. Los Angeles.

- ◆ The D-backs have hit 8 home runs off Clayton Kershaw in his last 5 starts against Arizona.
- ◆ **Ketel Marte** has reached base safely in 12 straight games dating back to 2019 (.378; 17-for-45).
- ◆ **Christian Walker** has hit safely in his last 5 games (.350; 7-for-20, 4 2B, 4 RBI).

TODAY ON TV: Today's D-backs/Dodgers game will be televised locally on FOX Sports Arizona Plus and to a national audience on MLB Network (not available in Arizona's TV market).

ON DECK - HOUSTON ASTROS: Following tomorrow's off day, the D-backs host the Astros for a 3-game series.

◆ Arizona is facing Houston for the first time since 2018... the D-backs went 3-6 (2-1 @ Chase Field).

NEXT STARTER: LHP MADISON BUMGARNER (0-1, 4.09)

◆ Did not factor in the decision in his last start on July 29 @ Rangers (2 ER in 5.1 IP)...lost his D-backs debut on Opening Day @ Padres (3 ER in 5.2 IP).

- ◆ Will be making his first start vs. Astros since Aug. 7, 2018.
- ◆ Is 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA (10 ER in 43.2 IP) and a 0.98 WHIP in 6 career starts.
- ◆ Has gone 4-0 with a 0.97 ERA (4 ER in 37.0 IP) in 5 starts after his first outing against Houston on Aug. 20, 2011 @ Astros.

AT A GLANCE: Is in his second season with the D-backs.

- Agreed to terms on a 2-year contract through 2020 (club options 2021, '22) on Dec. 4, 2018.
- Played 5 seasons in the Rays' organization (2010-14) then 4 seasons (2015-18) with the SK Wyverns in the KBO League.
- Rays' eighth-round pick in the 2010 draft.

VS. ASTROS: Earned the win on July 28 @ Rangers, allowing 1 run on 3 hits with 7 strikeouts in 7.2 innings.

- Set a career high with 6.1 hitless innings to start a game...no-hit bit was snapped in the seventh inning on Rounned Odor's solo homer.

VS. ASTROS: Is making his first career start.

AGAINST THE AL: Has allowed 1 run in 4 of his 6 starts.

FINISHING STRONG: Went 4-1 with a 2.18 ERA (8 ER in 33.0 IP) and a .202 opponent average over his last 5 starts.

- Posted a 16.2-inning scoreless streak that covered parts of his final 4 outings (Sept. 9-25, 2019).

2019 REVIEW: Went 13-14 with a 4.42 ERA (90 ER in 183.1 IP), .260 opponent average and 158 strikeouts in 32 starts in his first Major League season with Arizona.

- Led Major League rookies in strikeouts, ranked second in innings, was tied for second in wins and ranked fourth in ERA...was the second D-back rookie to lead the Majors in strikeouts (also: Brandon Webb in 2003).
- His 158 strikeouts were second all-time by a D-backs rookie, behind only Brandon Webb in 2003 (172).

ARIZONA PRIDE: Grew up in Scottsdale, Ariz., and attended Desert Mountain High School, Yavapai College and Arizona State University.

- Attended Arizona State University (2010) and helped the Sun Devils reach the College World Series in 2010.
