SAN DIEGO PADRES (4-5) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (6-3) April 6, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #10/Home #4 RHP Germán Márquez (0-1, 12.00 ERA) vs. RHP Bubba Chandler (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

THE PIRATES: won their fifth consecutive game with Sunday's 8-2 win vs. Baltimore...Are looking to win at least seven of their first 10 games for the fourth time since 1994 (also 7-3 in 2003, 8-2 in 2018 and 8-2 in 2024)...Have hit 12 home runs through their first nine games, tied with 1986 and 2003 for their third-most home runs through nine games in any season during the Modern Era (since 1901), behind only the 1973 and 2006 seasons (13 home runs in each season).

HOME COOKING: Pittsburgh completed a three-game sweep of Baltimore with Sunday's 8-2 win at PNC Park...It marked the first time that the Pirates won each of their first three home games in a season since 2017, when they swept Atlanta in a three-game series from April 7-9...Pittsburgh has won at least each of its first four home games in a season seven times in team history, per the Elias Sports Bureau, coming in 1892 (four), 1910 (seven), 1911 (eight), 1923 (nine), 1938 (four), 1973 (four) and 1988 (five).

PRISTINE PITCHING: Braxton Ashcraft (6.0ip, 8k), Mason Montgomery (1.0ip, 3k) and José Urquidy (2.0ip, 3k) combined to strike out 14 batters without issuing a walk in Pittsburgh's 8-2 win at PNC Park on Sunday vs. Baltimore...It marked the fourth time in the Modern Era (since 1901) that Pirates pitchers struck out at least 14 batters without issuing a walk in a single game... That also happened on April 16, 1985 vs. New York (15k), July 21, 2016 vs. Milwaukee (14k) and May 14, 2023 at Baltimore (17k).

FOR STARTERS: Pittsburgh starting pitchers have pitched 43.0 innings without allowing a home run over the team's first nine games of the season...Per Sarah Langs, it is the longest streak (by games) by Pirates starters to begin a season since 1943 (17 games) and is the longest streak (by games) by any Major League starting rotation to begin a season since San Francisco (10 games) in 2018...Pittsburgh starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in eight straight games (since March 28 at New York-NL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Pirates starters have allowed two runs or fewer in at least nine straight games 11 times since at least 1893...It has happened five times in the last 50 years, coming from August 26-September 3, 1983 (nine games), May 23-June 3, 1984 (12 games), July 30-August 8, 1992 (nine games), July 2-9, 2004 (nine games) & May 18-28, 2011 (nine games).

IN DEEP THOUGHT: Pittsburgh has hit 12 home runs through its first nine games of the 2026 campaign, the fourth-most among all teams in Major League Baseball, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (16), Houston (14) and Atlanta (13)...The Pirates did not hit their 12th home run of the 2025 season until April 16 vs. Washington (the 19th game of the season).

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz had an RBI single in the second inning and also hit a two-run home run in the sixth inning of Pittsburgh's 8-2 win on Sunday vs. Baltimore...He became one of nine Pirates since RBI became official in 1920 with at least four home runs and 10 RBI through their first nine games of a season, along with Dino Restelli (1949), Wally Westlake (1950), Willie Stargell (1971), Jeff King (1996), Reggie Sanders (2003), Daryle Ward (2004), Pedro Alvarez (2014) and Bryan Reynolds (2023)...Cruz joined Restelli, Stargell and Reynolds as the only players on that list to also have nine runs.

CRAZY EIGHTS: Pittsburgh scored eight times on Sunday vs. Baltimore...It marked the Pirates' third game with at least eight runs in their first nine games (also March 31 and April 1 at Cincinnati)...Pittsburgh has had four games with at least eight runs in its first 10 games of a season five times in the Modern Era (since 1901), coming in 1903 (five), 1922 (four), 1973 (four), 1974 (four) and 2018 (four).

INSTANT IMPACT: Ryan O'Hearn had a career-high-tying four RBI after hitting a two-run home run and recording a two-run double on Sunday vs. Baltimore...He is the only Pirates player (since RBI became official in 1920) with at least 11 hits and 11 RBI through his first eight games with the team...O'Hearn, who played in 50 games with San Diego in 2025 after being acquired from the Orioles on July 31, has hit safely in seven of his first eight games with Pittsburgh and reached base safely multiple times in seven of his first eight games with the team...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he joined Ed Mensor (eight, 1912), Billy Southworth (seven, 1918), Possum Whitted (seven, 1919), Gus Suhr (eight, 1930), Dixie Walker Jr. (seven, 1948) and Brian Giles (seven, 1999) as the only Pirates since at least 1900 to reach base safely multiple times in at least seven of their first eight games with the team.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 6, 2016: Pittsburgh completed its season-opening, three-game sweep of St. Louis with a 5-1 win at PNC Park. Starter Juan Nicasio earned the win in his Pirates debut after allowing one run on just two hits (zero walks) and striking out seven Cardinals over 6.0 innings of work. John Jaso tripled, marking the team's third straight game with a triple to open the year, something it hadn't done since 1910.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the third round of the 2021 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Chandler had a no-decision after allowing an unearned run on zero hits and a career-high six walks (six strikeouts) over 4.1 innings in his season debut on March 31 at Cincinnati...Chandler, who left the game with a 6-1 lead, was the first Pirate with at least six strikeouts/six walks in a game since Quinn Priester (July 29, 2023 vs. Philadelphia).

PRIZED PROSPECT: Chandler is currently rated by both MLB Pipeline (No. 9) and Baseball America (No. 15) as a top-15 prospect in all of baseball (Pittsburgh farmhand Konnor Griffin, who made his MLB debut on Friday, is rated by both outlets as the top prospect in the sport).

FINISHING STRONG: Chandler went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts (zero walks issued), a .123 batting average against (7-for-57) and a 0.42 WHIP over his final three starts of the 2025 season, including 5.2 innings of one-run ball in his final start on September 27 at Atlanta (he is a native of Lawrenceville, GA, located approximately 30 miles from Truist Park)...He was the first Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three straight starts with at one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Chandler also joined Milwaukee's Corbin Burnes (four) in 2021, Arizona's Zac Gallen (three) in 2023 and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (three) in 2025 as the only Major League pitchers during the Modern Era to make three consecutive starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and six or more strikeouts.

A BIT OF BOTH: Chandler went 2-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1ip/11er) in four starts and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in three relief appearances last season...Nine of the 11 runs he surrendered as a starting pitcher came during his first career start on Sept. 7 vs. Milwaukee.

RELIABLE ROOKIES: Chandler (starter) and Braxton Ashcraft (reliever) each struck out six batters while issuing zero walks in Pittsburgh's 2-0 win last season on September 20 vs. the Athletics...They became the first pair of Pirates teammates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to each strike out six batters without issuing a walk in the same game...They were the ninth pair of Pittsburgh pitchers since 1901 to both have six strikeouts in a game, the first since Chad Kuhl (eight) and Richard Rodriguez (six) did so on May 6, 2018 at Milwaukee.

YOU'VE GOT A FRIEND IN ME: Chandler was recognized as the organization's Bob Friend Pitcher of the Year during the 2025 Young Bucs Awards Week...His 121 strikeouts in his time with Triple-A Indianapolis ranked second among all Pittsburgh minor league pitchers.

DYNAMITE DEBUT: Chandler secured a 4.0-inning save in his Major League debut on August 22 vs. Colorado...He was the first Pirates pitcher to earn a save in his MLB debut (since the stat became official in 1969), and he was one of four Major Leaguers to earn a 4.0-inning save in his Major League debut, joining Boston's Bob Stanley (April 16, 1977 at Cleveland), St. Louis' Zack Thompson (June 3, 2022 at Chicago-NL) and San Francisco's Keaton Winn (June 13, 2023 at St. Louis)...Chandler was the only one to not surrender a run.

FOUR YOUR INFORMATION: Chandler became one of two Pirates relievers since at least 1900 to pitch at least 4.0 innings in each of his first three outings (last year on August 22 vs. Colorado, August 27 at St. Louis and September 2 vs. Los Angeles-NL), along with Carmen Hill in 1915 (the last Major League pitcher to do that prior to Chandler was Kansas City's Atlee Hammaker in 1981)...He also became one of three Major League pitchers since 1969 (when saves became an official statistic) to earn two wins and a save across his first three outings, along with Minnesota's Tom Johnson (1974) & Cincinnati's Hector Carrasco (1994).

WIN (AND SAVE) THE DAY: Chandler earned his first Major League win with 4.0 scoreless innings of relief last year on August 27 at St. Louis (second game)...He also earned his first Major League save with 4.0 scoreless innings of relief on August 22 vs. Colorado, making him one of five Major League pitchers (since saves became an official statistic in 1969) to earn both a win and a save in his first two games, joining Rick Waits (1973/1975), Bob Stanley (1977), Mardie Cornejo (1978) and Mickey Weston (1989)...He was one of four MLB relievers during the Modern Era (since 1901) to begin his career with two outings of at least 4.0 scoreless innings (Hugh Bedient in 1912, Von McDaniel in 1957, Eric King in 1986).

 Caught 8.0 shutout innings and went 1-for-3 at the plate in his 2026 debut on 3/28 at Citi Field (he singled off David Peterson in the third inning).
 Hit .306 (22-for-72) with an .891 OPS vs. lefties last season...Made 83 appearances and posted a .995 fielding percentage behind the plate in '25.

 Made his '26 debut as a defensive replacement in right field in the 10th inning of the loss on 3/28 in New York (did not have a plate appearance).

 Is 7-for-11 with three home runs and six RBI against left-handed pitchers after going 11-for-108 (.102) with one home run vs. southpaws in 2025.
 Has gone 6-for-12 with runners on base...Is hitting .429 (9-for-21) with four home runs, 10 RBI and seven runs during his five-game hitting streak.

 Delivered the game-winning RBI with his 10th-inning single in the 3/29 win at New York-NL (his second career game-winning RBI in extra innings).

 Was the first Pirate to debut in the team's Home Opener since Warren Morris, Jason Phillips and Scott Sauerbeck on 4/5/99 vs. Montréal (h/t Elias).
 Is rated by MLB Pipeline as baseball's top prospect...Was selected from Triple-A Indianapolis on Friday after hitting .438 (7-for-16) in five contests.
