AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their nine-game road trip tonight with the second game of a three-game series at Houston (1-0 thus far)... are 4-0 on the road trip after sweeping the Red Sox and winning their series opener against the Astros... will also face the Rangers from Mon.-Wed.

- ▶ **Their 17-9 (.654) record is the best in the American League and tied for the third-best in the Majors.**
- ▶ **Have won a season-high seven straight games (since 4/17), their longest single-season winning streak since their eight-game winning streak from 9/20-28/25...** is the third-longest winning streak in the Majors this season, trailing only the Cubs' current 10-game streak since 4/14 and the Padres' eight-game streak from 4/8-16.
- ▶ **Have won eight of their last nine games (since 4/15) and nine of their last 11 games (since 4/13).**
- ▶ Have won or split six of their eight completed series this season (5-2-1)... have also won three of their four completed road series this year.
- ▶ **Are 10-1 in their last 11 games at Daikin Park (since 9/1/23).**
- ▶ The Yankees' +45 run differential this season is the best in the AL and tied for the third-best in the Majors.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Astros, 12-4, in their series opener on Friday at Daikin Park... **RHP Will Warren** (6.0IP, 7H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 6K, 0HR, 1BK, 1PO) started and earned his third win of the season... **2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (3-for-4, 3R, 1HR, 4RBI, 1BB) reached base a season-high four times and recorded a season-high 4RBI, hitting a two-run single in the first inning, a solo HR in the fourth inning and an RBI single in the seventh inning... **3B Ryan McMahon** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit a solo HR in the second inning... **DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-3, 1RBI) hit an RBI single in the sixth inning before leaving the game with right lower leg tightness... **SS José Caballero** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit an RBI single in the sixth inning and his second HR of the year with a solo shot in the seventh inning... **CF Trent Grisham** (0-for-2, 1R, 1RBI, 2BB, 1SF) reached base twice and drove in a run with a sac fly in the sixth inning... **1B Ben Rice** (2-for-5, 3R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI) drove in a run on a fielder's choice in the first inning and hit his ninth HR of the season with a solo shot in the seventh inning... **RF Aaron Judge** (0-for-2, 3BB/1IBB) walked three times.

▶ With Caballero, Chisholm Jr., McMahon and Rice each homering, **it marked only the third time in franchise history each of the Yankees' starting infielders homered in a single game** (also Canó/Núñez/Peña/Teixeira on 6/15/11 vs. Texas and Crosetti/Dahlgren/Gordon/Rolfe on 8/22/39 at Chicago-AL) - credit: *Elias*.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a **1.57 ERA (63.0IP, 11ER) over their seven-game winning streak (since 4/17)**... have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of those seven games.

- ▶ Have allowed only 89R this season, marking only the second time in the last 45 years (since 1982) the Yankees have allowed 89R-or-fewer through their first 26 games of a season (also 71R in 2022).
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers lead the Majors in ERA (3.11),** rank second in opponents' OBP (.286, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.341, first in AL), opponents' OPS (.626, first in AL), WHIP (1.12, first in AL), BB/9.0IP (2.64, second in AL), K/BB (3.38, second in AL), tied for fourth in pickoffs (five, tied for third in AL), sixth in opponents' BA (.222, first in AL) and seventh in HR/9.0IP (0.82, fifth in AL).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters scored 12R on Friday at Houston, marking their third game this season with double-digit runs... rank first in the Majors this season in PA/BB (8.01), second in home runs (39, first in AL) and walks (123, second in AL), tied for third in stolen bases (28, first in AL), fourth in stolen base percentage (84.8%, first in AL) and pitches per PA (4.02, third in AL), fifth in SLG (.422, second in AL) and OPS (.749, second in AL), tied for fifth in XBH (82, tied for second in AL), and sixth in runs scored (134, second in AL) and runs per game (5.15, second in AL).

DYNAMIC DUO: OF Aaron Judge (9HR) and C/INF Ben Rice (9HR) are only the fourth pair of Yankees teammates in franchise history to each hit at least 9HR in the club's first 26 games of a season... Judge (9HR) and Anthony Rizzo (9HR) accomplished the feat in 2022, Judge (9HR) and Luke Voit (11HR) did so in 2020, and Yogi Berra (10HR) and Mickey Mantle (12HR) also accomplished the feat in 1956.

▶ Judge and Rice have combined to hit 18HR this year, more than two Major League teams (Boston and San Francisco-15HR).

HIP HIP JOSÉ: INF/OF José Caballero recorded his second straight multi-hit game and drove in two runs on Friday at Houston, hitting an RBI single in the sixth inning and his second HR of the year with a solo shot in the seventh inning... is batting .354/.380/.563 (17-for-48) with 8R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 9RBI, 2BB and 4SB over his last 13 games (since 4/11).

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 games (since 4/11), hitting .311/.392/.489 (14-for-45) with 8R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 8RBI, 6BB and 1SB.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a **Major League-best 2.61 ERA (152.0IP, 44ER) and 155K in 26 starts this season... have allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of their last seven starts (since 4/17), posting a 0.92 ERA (48.2IP, 5ER) over that span.**

- ▶ Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 23 of their 26 starts, matching their third-most through their first 26 games of a season since ER became an official stat in 1913, trailing only their 25 starts in 2022 and 24 starts in 1919 (also had 23 in 1972 and 2024).
- ▶ Have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in 13 starts this season, tied for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (16) and Chicago-NL (15)... **their 13 starts of 1ER-or-fewer are tied for their second-most through their first 26 games of a season since ER became an official stat in 1913,** trailing only their 14 starts in 1958 (also had 13 in 1954).
- ▶ **Lead the Majors in ERA (2.61), strikeouts (155), opponents' OBP (.255), opponents' SLG (.313), opponents' OPS (.568), WHIP (0.97) and K/BB (4.19),** rank second in opponents' BA (.199, first in AL), BB/9.0IP (2.19, second in AL) and strikeout rate (25.9%, second in AL), and sixth in HR/9.0IP (0.77, third in AL) and K/9.0IP (9.18, fourth in AL).

WEATHERS REPORT: LHP Ryan Weathers will make his sixth start of the season tonight... has gone 1-2 with a 3.18 ERA (28.1IP, 10ER) and 36K in five starts this season... has allowed 3R-or-fewer in four of his five starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three starts... ranks fifth in the Majors in K/9.0IP (11.44, third in AL) and sixth in strikeout rate (31.0%, third in AL).

FOUR SCORE: Yankees batters have scored at least 4R in each of their last nine games (since 4/15) and 12 of their last 13 games (since 4/11)... their nine-game streak with at least 4R is their longest since a 12-game streak from 6/29-7/11/25... the Yankees are 15-4 this season when scoring at least 4R.

ALL THAT JAZZ: INF Jazz Chisholm Jr. recorded a **season-high 3H, reached base a season-high four times and recorded a season-high 4RBI on Friday at Houston,** hitting a two-run single in the first inning, a solo HR in the fourth inning and an RBI single in the seventh inning... has homered in back-to-back games after going homerless in his first 23 games of the season.

▶ Has recorded multiple hits in three of his last four games (since 4/21), batting .438/.471/.813 (7-for-16) with 5R, 2HR, 5RBI and 1BB.

GOOD WILL WARREN: RHP Will Warren earned his third win of the season on Friday at Houston after allowing only 2R/ER over 6.0IP (7H, 1BB, 6K, 0HR, 1BK, 1PO)... **has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his six starts this year, going 3-0 with a 2.59 ERA (31.1IP, 9ER) and 37K this season...** the Yankees are 5-1 in his starts this year.

▶ Since 2025, has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 28 of his 39 starts, the most in the AL and the third-most in the Majors over that span.

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice hit his ninth HR of the season with a solo shot in the seventh inning on Friday at Houston... **has hit 5HR in his last eight games (since 4/16).**

- ▶ Has hit .316/.450/.747 (25-for-79) with 24R, 7 doubles, 9HR, 20RBI, 19BB/2IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB in 25 games this season... has reached base safely in 19-of-21 starts.
- ▶ 16 of his 25H this season have gone for extra bases (7 doubles, 9HR).
- ▶ **Ranks second in the Majors in OBP (.450, second in AL), SLG (.747, second in AL) and OPS (1.197, second in AL),** tied for third in XBH (16, second in AL), fourth in runs scored (24, second in AL), tied for fourth in HR (nine, tied of third in AL), sixth in PA/BB (5.26, fourth in AL) and tied for eighth in walks (19, tied for sixth in AL).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Yankees batters scored 3R in the first inning on Friday at Houston... their 25R in the first inning this season are the most in the AL and the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Washington (30R)... their 7HR in the first inning are tied with Los Angeles-AL and Seattle for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (8HR).

- ▶ The Yankees are 8-4 this season when scoring in the first inning.
- ▶ **The Yankees are 14-3 this season when scoring first.**
- ▶ Have scored in the first inning in 12 of their games this season, the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Washington (13).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge walked three times on Friday at Houston... has reached base multiple times in each of his last four games and six of his last seven games (since 4/17)... has reached base in 19 of his last 20 games (since 4/3), batting .275/.432/.623 (19-for-69) with 19R, 3 doubles, 7HR, 14RBI, 18BB/11BB, 1HP and 5SB over that span.

▶ **Is tied for fourth in the Majors with 9HR this year.**

ON A ROLL: OF Randal Grichuk has hit .333/.316/.556 (6-for-18) with 4R, 4 doubles, 2RBI and 1SF over his last 7G (since 4/14).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 25, 1999: In front of a sold-out Yankee Stadium and many of Joe DiMaggio's former teammates, a monument in honor of the Yankee Clipper is unveiled in Monument Park. Paul Simon sings "Mrs. Robinson" while standing in center field. DiMaggio had passed away prior to the season on March 8.

April 25, 1967: Whitey Ford records his 236th and final career victory, an 11-2 win over the White Sox at Yankee Stadium. He remains atop the all-time Yankees wins list.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 26, 2022: In the Yankees' 12-8 win vs. Baltimore, Anthony Rizzo records his first career 3HR game, hitting a three-run HR in the third inning, a two-run HR in the fifth and a solo HR in the eighth. He becomes the 24th player in franchise history (33rd time) in franchise history to hit 3HR in a game and the sixth first baseman (ninth time).

April 26, 2005: Alex Rodriguez hits three home runs (all off Bartolo Colón) and tallies 10RBI in a 12-4 win vs. the Angels. He becomes just the second Yankee to total 10-or-more RBI in a game, behind current AL-record-holder Tony Lazzari, who had 11RBI on 5/24/36 in a 25-2 win at Philadelphia-AL.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP RYAN WEATHERS (1-2, 3.18 ERA)

LHP Ryan Weathers will make his sixth start of the season tonight at Houston...is expected to be reinstated from the paternity list prior to tonight's game...the 26-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...made his fifth start of the season on Sunday vs. Kansas City, earning his first win as a Yankee after tossing 7.1 scoreless innings (5H, 1BB, 8K)...in five starts this season, has gone 1-2 with a 3.18 ERA (28.1IP, 27H, 10R/ER, 8BB, 36K, 4HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in four of his five starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three starts...has recorded at least 7K in four of his starts...went 2-2 with a 3.99 ERA (38.1IP, 37H, 20R/17ER, 12BB, 37K, 7HR) in eight starts with the Miami Marlins in 2025...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his eight starts and 1ER-or-fewer in four of his starts...missed the majority of the season due to two injured list stints (3/24-5/14, 6/9-9/11)...over the last three seasons (2024-26), has gone 8-10 with a 3.64 ERA (153.1IP, 142H, 69R/62ER, 44BB, 153K, 22HR) in 29 starts...during that stretch, has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 23 of those 29 starts...since 2021, his 17 pickoffs are tied for the fourth-most in the Majors...has pitched in over parts of six Major League seasons with the San Diego Padres (2021-23), Miami Marlins (2023-25) and the Yankees (2026)...has made four career Opening Day rosters (2021 and '23 with San Diego, '24 with Miami and '26 with the Yankees)...began the 2025 season on the injured list...is the son of David Weathers, who pitched in parts of 19 seasons in the Majors (1991-2009), including two seasons with the Yankees from 1996-97, where he won the World Series with the club in '96...became the fifth father/son duo in Yankees history to both play for the club, joining Clay Bellinger and Cody Bellinger, Mark Leiter and Mark Leiter Jr., Ron Davis and Ike Davis, and Yogi Berra and Dale Berra...was originally selected by the San Diego Padres in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Miami from San Diego in exchange for INF Garrett Cooper, RHP Sean Reynolds and cash considerations on 8/1/23...was acquired by the Yankees from Miami in exchange for OF Dillon Lewis, OF Brendan Jones, INF Dylan Jasso and INF Juan Matheus on 1/13/26.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his fifth start of the season on Sunday vs. Kansas City, earning his first win as a Yankee after tossing 7.1 scoreless innings (5H, 1BB, 8K)...retired 15 of his first 17BF (1H, 1BB).

- ✦ Recorded his first scoreless start of the season and first scoreless start since 9/11/25 vs. Washington with Miami (5.0IP).
- ✦ Marked the second-longest scoreless start of his career, trailing only his career-high-tying 8.0 scoreless innings on 5/14/24 at Detroit with Miami.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Will make his second road start of the season tonight...Made his first road start on 3/30 at Seattle, allowing only 1R/ER over 4.1IP without recording a decision (4H, 2BB, 7K, 0HR).

- ✦ Made five starts on the road with the Marlins in 2025, going 1-1 with a 4.84 ERA (22.1IP, 22H, 15R/12ER, 9BB, 22K, 5HR)...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in four starts and one-or-zero earned runs in two starts.
- ✦ **Over the last three seasons (2024-26), has gone 5-4 with a 2.82 ERA (79.2IP, 64H, 30R/25ER, 26BB, 64K, 9HR) in 15 starts on the road.**

2026: Has gone 1-2 with a 3.18 ERA (28.1IP, 27H, 10R/ER, 8BB, 36K, 4HR) in five starts this season...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in four of his five starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three starts...has recorded at least 7K in four of his starts.

- ✦ Among Major League pitchers this season, ranks fifth in K/9.0IP (11.44, third in AL) and sixth in strikeout rate (31.0%, third in AL)...also ranks eighth among AL pitchers in strikeouts (36).
- ✦ Made his Yankees debut on 3/30 at Seattle, allowing only 1R/ER over 4.1IP without recording a decision (4H, 2BB, 7K, 0HR).
- ✦ Made his second start of the season on 4/4 vs. Miami, allowing 3R/ER over 3.2IP without recording a decision (6H, 3BB, 4K, 0HR).
- ✦ Made his third start of the season on 4/9 vs. the Athletics, suffering his first loss of the year despite allowing 1R/ER in 8.0IP (7H, 1R/ER, 0BB, 7K, 0HR, 1WP)...set a career high with 101 pitches and tied his career high with 8.0IP (also 5/14/24 at Detroit with Miami)...became the first Yankee to toss at least 8.0 innings and not allow a walk in a regular season game since Clarke Schmidt on 5/16/24 at Minnesota (8.0IP).
- ✦ Made his fourth start of the season on 4/14 vs. Los Angeles-AL, taking the loss after allowing 5R/ER in 5.0IP (5H, 2BB, 10K, 4HR, 1WP)...recorded his third career double-digit strikeout game (also a career-high 11K on 6/1/24 vs. Texas with Miami and 10K on 4/16/24 vs. San Francisco with Miami)...marked the first double-digit strikeout game by a Yankee since Max Fried recorded 13K on 9/18/25 at Baltimore.

VS. HOUSTON: Will make his first career start vs. the Astros tonight.

2025: Went 2-2 with a 3.99 ERA (38.1IP, 37H, 20R/17ER, 12BB, 37K, 7HR) in eight starts with the Marlins...missed the majority of the season due to two injured list stints (3/24-5/14, 6/9-9/11)...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his eight starts and 1ER-or-fewer in four of his starts.

- ✦ Missed the first 41 games of the season on the injured list...was placed on the 15-day I.L. on 3/27 (retroactive to 3/24) with a left flexor muscle strain...combined to make three rehab starts with Single-A Jupiter and Triple-A Jacksonville, going 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (10.2IP, 4H, 2R/ER, 4BB, 13K, 0HR)...was reinstated from the I.L. on 5/14.
- ✦ Made his season debut on 5/14 at Chicago-NL and earned the win (5.0IP, 2H, 1R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HR).
- ✦ Went 1-0 with a 1.15 ERA (15.1IP, 2ER) and 15K over his first three starts (5/14-26).
- ✦ Was placed on the 60-day I.L. on 6/9 (left lat strain), missing 83 team games...made two rehab starts with Triple-A Jacksonville, posting a 2.45 ERA (7.1IP, 9H, 2R/ER, 3BB, 9K, 1HR)...was returned from rehab and reinstated on 9/11.

WEATHERS REPORT: Over the last three seasons (2024-26), has gone 8-10 with a 3.64 ERA (153.1IP, 142H, 69R/62ER, 44BB, 153K, 22HR) in 29 starts...during that stretch, has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 23 of those 29 starts.

- ✦ Has limited left-handed batters to a .225/.295/.342 (27-for-120) slash line over that stretch.
- ✦ Has posted a 44.9% groundball percentage over the last three seasons.

CAREER NOTES: Has pitched in parts of six Major League seasons with the San Diego Padres (2021-23), Miami Marlins (2023-25) and Yankees (2026), going 13-25 with one save and a 4.77 ERA (309.1IP, 317H, 174R/164ER, 107BB, 271K, 54HR) in 75 career appearances (60 starts)...made his MLB debut in the postseason in 2020 NLDS Game 1 at Los Angeles-NL.

- ✦ Since 2021, his 17 pickoffs are tied for the fourth-most in the Majors.
- ✦ Is the son of David Weathers, who pitched in parts of 19 seasons in the Majors (1991-2009), including two seasons with the Yankees from 1996-97, where he won the World Series with the club in '96 after going 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA (11.0IP, 1ER) in seven postseason games that year...became the fifth father/son duo in Yankees history to both play for the club, joining Clay Bellinger and Cody Bellinger, Mark Leiter and Mark Leiter Jr., Ron Davis and Ike Davis, and Yogi Berra and Dale Berra.
