METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Cardinals, 13-2, last night...The Mets have won four straight and six of their last seven games...New York is earned their 15th series victory of the season...The Mets continue a seven-game road trip (3-0) to St. Louis (3-0) and Atlanta (three games).

BRING OUT THE BROOMS: The Mets are looking for their fifth sweep of the season today...New York is looking for their first four-game sweep of the Cardinals since April 24-27, 1986 in St. Louis...The last time the Mets swept the Cardinals in a three-game set was from April 1-4, 2007 in St. Louis...The Mets are batting .292/.351 in the current series, while posting a 1.67 ERA...New York has outscored St. Louis 24-5 in the first three games.

LET'S GO STREAKING: New York has won four straight games and six of their last seven...The Mets have recorded three winning streaks of at least five games this year...Their longest winning streak is six games, from July 1-7...The Mets are batting .288/.270/.548 and have posted a 2.00 ERA (8 ER/36.0 IP) during the streak...Over the last seven games, the Mets have outscored their opponents 50-23.

I GOT THE SIX: The Mets have hit multiple home runs in each of their last six games...That marks the fourth time in franchise history that they have hit multiple homers in at six straight games...The franchise record is eight straight games, done so from August 3-10, 2019...New York ranks fourth in the National League with 160 home runs...The Mets hit a total of 171 home runs last season

150: Kodai Senga recorded five strikeouts last night and now has 154 strikeouts on the season...He became the seventh pitcher in franchise history to record at least 150 strikeouts in their rookie season...Senga is tied with Gary Gentry for sixth place among rookie pitchers in team history (Gentry had 154 in 1969)...His is the fifth pitcher of Japanese origin to post at least 150 strikeouts as a rookie, joining Hideo Nomo (236 in 1995), Yu Darvish (221 in 2012), Daisuke Matsuzaka (201 in 2007), and Kenta Maeda (179 in 2016)... Courtesy of sportsradar.

LINSANITY: Lindor is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .423 (11-26) in that span with seven runs, three doubles, five RBI and a walk...Over his last 52 games, he is batting .308 (60-195) with 41 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 31 RBI, 26 walks, 15 steals with a .394 OBP, a .538 SLG and a .932 OPS...Lindor has stolen 21 bases in 122 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League in home runs...Alonso has recorded 40 or more home runs twice in his career...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs... Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)...Alonso's 183 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

CARDS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 24-30 at Busch Stadium since the ballpark opened in 2006.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is second in the majors and in the NL with 93 RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

SLIPPERY PETE: Alonso is hitting .286 (30-105) with 19 extra-base hits, 31 RBI, 20 runs, 14 walks and a 1.092 OPS in his last 29 games...He was hitting .132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a .549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18).

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks sixth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 4.9 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.0 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (17.8) and Mookie Betts (16.8) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.0 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil has safely hit in 13 of his last 15 games, batting .345 (20-58) with 11 runs, three doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI, and four walks with a .400 OBP in that span...In 34 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .286 (38-133) with 20 runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 20 RBI, seven walks with a .342 OBP...He has struck out only 11 times in 146 plate appearances following the All-Star break.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: Brandon Nimmo is batting .294 (45-153) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .364 OBP and a .418 SLG against left-handed pitchers this year...His .294 average is the ninth best in the majors by a left-handed hitter against fellow lefties.

YOU CAN FIND ME IN ST. LOUIS: Rafael Ortega is a lifetime .333 (18-54) hitter with four runs, two doubles, one triple, one home run, seven RBI and three walks with a .368 OBP and a .463 SLG in 16 career games at Busch Stadium...Pete Alonso has gone 15-45 (.333) with 12 runs, three doubles, two triples, two home runs, seven RBI and nine walks in 13 career games at the ballpark...Omar Narváez has appeared in 14 games at the yard and is 16-50 with three doubles, one triple and four RBI.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 27-38 on the road this year...They have posted a 4.77 ERA in away games...New York has played 65 games on the road this year...That is tied for the most in the majors.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .294 (70-238) with 35 runs, 11 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 30 RBI, 34 walks, a .384 OBP and a .454 SLG on the road this season...This compares to a .238/.345/.444 slashline with 21 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .276 (70-254) with 47 runs, 19 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs, 50 RBI, 24 walks, a .346 OBP, and a .520 SLG on the road in 2023...He is slashing .223/.322/.398 with 18 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 37-10 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 15-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1989, Howard Johnson reached the 30-30 plateau for the second time in his career...Johnson compiled a total of three seasons of 30-home runs and 30-stolen bases (1987, 1989 and 1991), the most in team history...He became the first switch-hitter to join the 30-30 club in major league history...He was a two-time All-Star (1989, 1991) and a two-time Silver Slugger (1989, 1991) and ranks in the top five in franchise history in home runs, doubles, RBI and stolen bases.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The sea was angry yesterday my friends as Jett Williams went 1-4 with one run, one homer, one RBI, one walk and a steal for the Brooklyn Pretty Boys as they defeated the Bubble Boys, 8-7, on Seinfeld Night...Williams is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .346 (9-26) with four runs, five doubles, one home run, one RBI, six walks and three steals in that span...In 17 games in Brooklyn this year, Williams has posted a .293/.446/.517 slashline with nine extra-base hits and seven steals.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Tossed 3.0 innings against the Pittsburgh Pirates on August 14 at Citi Field...Allowed two earned runs on four hits and three walks...Fanned five batters in a 7-2 Mets victory.

HOUSE OF CARD(INAL)S: Carrasco will face St. Louis for the second time this season and for the fifth time in his career...In his last start against the Cardinals on June 18 at Citi Field, he threw 3.0 innings, allowing six runs, five earned, on five hits and three walks while fanning four batters...Throughout his career against St. Louis, Carrasco has pitched to a 7.91 ERA (17 ER/19.1 IP) and holds an 0-2 record... Carrasco holds an 0-1 record with a 8.38 ERA (9 ER/9.2 IP) at home compared to an 0-1 record and a 7.45 ERA (8 ER/9.2 IP) when on the road...Carrasco is looking to earn his first career win against the Cards.

MILESTONES & MEMORIES: Carrasco made his 300th career appearance on August 8 against the Cubs at Citi Field...Made his 250th career start at Fenway on July 23, becoming the 21st active pitcher and seventh Venezuelan pitcher to reach that milestone...Became the 16th active pitcher to make 300 career appearances and 250 career starts...With 4.0 innings on June 30, Carrasco became the 21st active pitcher to reach the 1500.0 inning milestone...Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

COOKIE CRISP: In his start against the Giants on June 30, Carrasco tallied a season-high 18 whiffs and six whiffs on four-seam fastballs...According to Baseball Savant, Carrasco also currently stands in the 79th percentile in curve spin.

COOKIE'S COMEBACK: In his starts on May 25 and May 31 against Chicago-NL and Philadelphia, respectively, Carrasco allowed just two runs over 12.2 innings compared to 18 runs allowed across the 18.2 innings he threw in his first four starts of the season...In those 12.2 innings, Carrasco fanned eight batters, which equals the total strikeouts he tallied in his first three starts of the year.

WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 last season at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 18 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of eight Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,500.0 career innings pitched on July 6 vs. Arizona...Carrasco is currently ranked seventh among Venezuelan-born pitchers with 1513.2 career innings pitched.
