RAY REPORT—The Rays open a nine-game, 10-day road trip against the Rockies (three to play), Mariners (three to play), and Athletics (three to play) tonight at Coors Field...have won nine of their last 13 games on the heels of a season-high five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...are currently 9-8 on a stretch of 20 games in 20 days to begin the second half (July 17-Aug. 5)...lead the AL with a 65-46 record, fourth in the majors...have spent 78 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 37 consecutive days in first (June 27-pres.), surpassing a 35-day stretch from May 9-June 12...the 78 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (125), Braves (123), Guardians (95), and Brewers (93)...have held the best record in the AL outright for 76 of those days, already third most in team history behind 2023 (106) and 2021 (81) per Stats Perform...have held a lead between 1.5-3.5 games over the second-place Yankees at the conclusion of each day since the All-Star break (currently 2.5)...entered August in first place for the third time (excl. 2020), joining 2021 (63-42) and 2010 (64-39).

- ★ The Rays dropped their rubber game against the White Sox yesterday, 9-1...marked their fourth series defeat at home in 2026 and their first since being swept by the Tigers (0-3) from June 1-3, snapping an eight-series streak without a defeat at Tropicana Field (6-0-2).
- ★ Despite the loss yesterday, the Rays are still an MLB-best 22-11 (.667) against left-handed starters, winning 16 of 18 such games at home.
- ★ This nine-game road trip is tied for their longest this season with their season-opening, nine game trip (March 26-April 5) against the Cardinals (1-2), Brewers (1-2), and Twins (2-1)...it marks their longest road trip of the second half, ahead of an eight-game trip against the Red Sox (0-4) and Blue Jays (3-1) to open the post-All-Star-break schedule (July 17-23).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Over the last two days, the Rays have made the following transactions:

- ★ Yesterday, the Rays acquired **RHP Freddy Peralta** from the Mets for **OF Aidan Smith** [TB No. 15], **RHP Gary Gill Hill** [TB No. 26] and **INF Emilien Pitre** [TB No. 27].
- ★ Today, the Rays acquired **C Liam Hicks** from the Marlins for **INF Brayden Taylor** [TB No. 16], **RHP Jacob Kisting** [TB No. 26], and **INF Adrian Santana** [TB No. 27].
- ★ The Rays also acquired **RHP Tyler Wells** from the Orioles for **RHP Michael Forret** [TB No. 8].
- ★ They acquired **OF Jack Suwinski** and international bonus pool money from the Dodgers for **C Hunter Feduccia** and **RHP Jacob Kmatz** [TB No. 27].
- ★ Additionally, the club activated Peralta, recalled **RHP Michael Grove** and selected **C Kenny Piper** from Triple-A Durham, designated **RHP Craig Kimbrel** for assignment, and optioned **RHP Alex Cook** to Durham.

GRAB YOUR NAME TAG—In 22 starts with the Mets, **Freddy Peralta** went 5-9 with a 4.99 ERA (113.2IP, 63ER), 113 strikeouts, four quality starts...he was traded to the Mets from the Brewers on Jan. 21, 2026 alongside **RHP Tobias Myers** in exchange for **RHP Brandon Sproat** and **SS Jett Williams**...in eight seasons (2018-25) with the Brewers, he went 70-42 in 211 appearances (162 starts) with a 3.59 ERA (931.0IP, 371ER), a .203 opp. average (694-for-3,415) and a 1.13 WHIP...over his time with the Brewers, his 3.59 ERA was the fifth best in the NL (min. 900.0IP).

HI MYNAMEIS—**Liam Hicks** appeared in 101 games for the Marlins this season, slashing .282/.363/.432 (100-for-354) with 9 2B, 1 3B, 14 HR, 62 RBI, and a .795 OPS...he owns the majors' fourth-lowest whiff rate (10.9%) and fourth-lowest strikeout rate (9.5%)...Hicks is one of seven qualified major league hitters with more walks (40) than strikeouts (39).

WELL, WELL, WELLS—**Tyler Wells** pitched in 43 games with the Orioles this season to a 2.67 ERA (54.0IP, 16ER), 0.96 WHIP, and .202 (9-for-193) opp. average...his 2.67 ERA is the best mark in a single season across his six-year big league career...he has appeared in 142 games, including 50 starts throughout his career to 3.79 ERA (370.1IP, 156ER)...at six-foot-eight, he would be tied for the fifth tallest pitcher to suit up for the Rays in franchise history.

PITCHER'S PARADISE—The Rays have won five of their last eight games despite being outscored by opponents, 21-14 over that span...during this stretch, the Rays tallied four shutouts during a seven-game span (July 25-Aug. 1), matching the most over any seven-game stretch in club history along with July 28-Aug. 3, 2012 (4 shutouts in 6G span)...their 10 shutout wins are tied with the Dodgers, Tigers, Marlins, and Red Sox for third most in the majors, trailing the Phillies (14) and Yankees (11)...the Rays entered the month of July with four shutout wins (T10th in AL/T18th in MLB), but have tallied an MLB-leading six shutouts in their last 29 games since the start of July, two more than any other club in that span (SEA/TOR/PHI/DET - 4).

- ★ Rays pitching has yielded three runs or fewer in 10 of 13 games during the club's 9-4 stretch (July 20-pres.)...among AL teams, only the Red Sox (60G) and Tigers (59) have permitted three runs or fewer more often than the Rays (58G) this season.
- ★ The starting rotation has yielded two earned runs or fewer in 12 of its last 13 outings, pitching to an MLB-best 2.10 ERA (64.1IP, 15ER) over that span.
- ★ The Rays bullpen ranks second in the AL with a 2.47 ERA (65.2IP, 18ER) since the All-Star break, trailing the Red Sox (1.59).

BAKER THE SAVE MAKER—**Bryan Baker** converted his 20th straight save opportunity Sat. vs. CWS to earn his 31st save, surpassing **CLE Cade Smith** (30) for the major league lead...the 20-save streak is the third longest in franchise history (see table on the right) and MLB's second-longest active streak behind **TOR Louis Varland** (24)...Baker has earned a save in each of the Rays last five wins and six of their last seven (July 22-pres.)...min. 25.0 IP, he leads the majors with a 0.36 ERA (25.0IP, 1ER) and .419 (10-for-84) opp. average since the 20-save streak began on May 17, and only **MIL Jacob Misiorowski** (0.62) has a better WHIP than Baker (0.68) in that time...he has worked a season-high-tying 12 straight scoreless outings (June 27-pres.), matching May 17-June 21...it ties the second-longest streak of his career behind a 15-appearance stretch from April 2-May 4, 2023 and ties the second longest by a Ray this season behind **Kevin Kelly's** 14-appearance span from April 22-May 22.

- ★ Baker is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47) as the only Rays pitchers to lead the majors in saves over a full season...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point from Aug. 1 on, joining Colomé, **Fernando Rodney** (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernandez** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform.
- ★ The Rays have won each of the last 18 games Baker has pitched in, tied with Rodney (2013) for the fourth-longest streak in a pitcher's outings in team history, trailing **Emilio Pagan** (25G, 2019), Soriano, (24G, 2010), and Percival (24G, 2008)...across the season, the Rays are 40-5 when he pitches.
- ★ Collectively, the Rays have recorded an MLB-leading 44 saves, tied for their most through 111 games in club history (also 2015)...that's good for a pace of 64 saves over a 162-game season, which would establish a team record and tie the third-highest total by any club since saves became an official statistic in 1969 (also: 1988 OAK & 1990 OAK), trailing the 1990 White Sox (68) and 2008 Angels (66).
- ★ The Rays own the majors' best winning pct. in games decided by three runs or fewer (.648/42-23).

LIVE BY THE LONG BALL—The Rays are an MLB-best 31-1 when out-homering their opponent, 19-10 when home runs are even, and 15-35 when being out-homered...per Stats Perform, the Rays are the seventh team in the modern era (since 1900) to win 31 of the first 32 games of a season in which they out-homered their opponent, first since the 2022 Yankees (31-1)...only the 2010 Padres (32-0) have won all 32 of those games...the Rays .969 winning pct. when out-homering opponents is on pace to be the second best in the modern era, trailing the undefeated 1903 New York Highlanders (16-0), and the best by any team with at least 30 such games, outpacing the 1994 Montreal Expos (34-27/947)...the Rays have won 18 consecutive games when out-homering the opposition since their lone loss on May 25 vs. BAL (13 inn.), dropping 22 of the 27 contests they were out-homered during that span, including 10 straight losses (July 5-pres.)...on the season, they have not lost a nine-inning game in which they tallied more home runs than their opponent (29-0)...after going without a long ball in five of six games from July 22-28, the Rays have plated seven of their nine runs over the last five games via 5 HR.

- ★ They are 26-5 in multi-homer games, including five straight wins (July 20-pres.), and 17-1 when recording multiple long balls at Tropicana Field, with the only loss coming on June 1 vs. DET (10-9).
- ★ Over their last 33 games since June 25, the Rays pace the AL in multi-homer efforts (16) and are tied with the Astros for the second-most total home runs (48) behind the Tigers (51).

PURPLE MOUNTAINS MAJESTY—The Rays and Rockies are set to play a three-game set at Coors Field this week, the seventh time in franchise history the Rays have visited the Mile High City...the clubs kicked off the 2025 season against each other at Steinbrenner Field, with the Rays taking two of three contests...dating back to 2013, the Rays have claimed six straight series over the Rockies, going 13-5 during that stretch...they are 7-3-0 all-time in sets against the Rockies, with their last series defeat coming between June 16-18, 2009 (1-2).

BACK ON THE FARM—Today, **INF Xavier Isaac** [TB No. 15] was named Southern League Player of the Week (July 27-Aug. 2)...in five games last week, Isaac slashed .529/.654/1.294 (9-for-17) with 1 2B, 4 HR, 11 RBI, 8 BB-1 IBB, 8 R, a 1.948 OPS, and 1 SB...it marks the second time this season the infielder has been named Southern League Player of the Week (also: April 20-26) and the third time he has been a Player of the Week in his minor league career (South Atlantic League; May 6-12, 2024).

TONIGHT'S START—**Ian Seymour** is scheduled to take the mound tonight for his eighth start and 37th appearance of the season...marks his 13th career start and 56th appearance...selected in the second round (57th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of Virginia Tech.

- ✦ In his last seven outings (four starts) since June 25, he ranks highly among AL southpaws (min. 30.0IP) in opp. average (2nd, .183), WHIP (2nd, 0.91), wins (T2nd, 4), and strikeouts per 9.0 IP (5th, 11.57).
- ✦ His out-of-zone swing pct. (33.1%) has increased 6.7 points from his mark last season (26.4%).
- ✦ He is 10 strikeouts away from recording his first 100-strikeout season (90SO)...would join **Drew Rasmussen** (122 SO) and **Griffin Jax** (100 SO) as Rays pitchers to reach the 100-strikeout mark this year...the Rays would be one of five teams with three pitchers or more owning 100 punchouts or more this season (also: Cleveland, Miami, Philadelphia, and Seattle).
- ✦ In night games this season, he is 5-0 with a 3.55 ERA (38.OIP, 15ER) and has limited opposing batters to a .178 (24-for-135) clip in 19 outings (four starts)... his opp. AVG ranks fourth among AL arms (min 30.0IP) in night games.
- ✦ Since transitioning to a starter/bulk relief role on June 8, Seymour has turned in a 3.80 ERA (47.1IP, 20ER), 0.97 WHIP, and .192 (33-for-172) opp. average compared to a 5.23 ERA (31.0IP, 18ER), 1.35 WHIP, and .239 (27-for-113) across his first 26 appearances of the year (March 26–June 2).

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his seventh win of the season after logging his second scoreless outing of 4.0 innings or more on July 29 vs. TEX (W, 4.2IP, 2H, OER, BB, 4SO)...entered the game in the 2nd inning after opener **Casey Legumina** worked 1.2 innings of one-hit ball (1.2IP, H, OER, 2BB, 2SO)...both hits allowed went for extra-bases, doubles by **Elias Díaz** and **Jake Burger** in the 3rd and 7th innings, respectively...cruised into the 7th inning, setting down 14 of 17 batters faced.

- ✦ In four outings following Legumina as a bulk reliever this year, Seymour is 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA (20.0IP, 4ER) and 16 strikeouts.
- ✦ His three wins in July (3-2) match the most he has collected in any month of his career (also: May 2026, 3-0).

HEADING OUT WEST—Seymour will be making his first career outing against the Rockies...is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (7.1IP, 2ER) and a .185 (5-for-27) opp. AVG in four career appearances (all relief) against NL West clubs...last took the mound against an NL West club on May 3 vs. SF, picking up the win in a 2-1 Rays victory (W, 1.0IP, OER).

- ✦ Coors Field would be the 17th ballpark in which he has pitched during his major league career.
- ✦ In Interleague play, Seymour is 2-1 with a 4.80 ERA (30.0IP, 16ER) and 35 strikeouts in 17 career appearances (three starts)...is 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA (7.OIP, 4ER) in two starts against the NL this season (May 15 vs. MIA/June 20 vs. WSH).
- ✦ The Rays are 7-5 in his appearances against NL clubs this season, going 1-1 with a 5.60 ERA (17.2IP, 11ER) and 16 strikeouts in 12 appearances (two starts).

ROADS UNTRAVELED—Seymour has appeared in 16 games (two starts) on the road this season...over his last 12 road appearances (two starts) as a visitor dating back to April 18 at PIT, he has gone 3-1 with a 3.81 ERA (28.1IP, 12ER), 36 strikeouts, and a .210 (22-for-105) opp. average, allowing three earned runs or fewer in each outing...the Rays have gone 8-4 in those games.

WHIFF WATCH—He boasts a 28.9 pct. whiff rate this season, ranking third among active AL southpaws (min. 1,000 pitches) to CLE **Joey Cantillo** (30.7%) and LAA **Reid Detmers** (29.0%)...72 of his 90 strikeouts this season have come on swings-and-misses, third most on the Rays behind **Drew Rasmussen** (102) and **Griffin Jax** (81).

THE SEYMOUR SHOW—On June 25 vs. KC, Seymour was utilized as a bulk reliever behind opener **Casey Legumina** and delivered 6.2 hitless innings with one walk and seven strikeouts...the pairing carried a perfect game through 5.1 innings and a no-hitter through the 8th inning before turning the ball over to **Craig Kimbrel**...it marked the 16th time in franchise history Rays pitchers have made it through 5.0 innings with no baserunners allowed (last: June 24, 2025 at KC).

- ✦ Became the third pitcher in the majors since 1980 to throw 6.2 hitless innings or more in relief, joining LAA **Félix Peña** (July 12, 2019 vs. SEA) and CLE **Jake Westbrook** (April 19, 2004 vs. DET)...was the sixth southpaw in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick alongside BAL **Tippy Martinez** (July 23, 1979 vs. OAK), STL **Al Brazle** (Aug. 1, 1951 vs. BSN), BOS **Herb Pennock** (Sept. 3, 1917 vs. NYY [G2]), CWS **Dave Danforth** (Aug. 29, 1917 vs. SLB [G2]), and BOS **Dutch Leonard** (July 20, 1914 vs. DET)....all six of these instances occurred at home...it was the most innings pitched by a Rays reliever since **Jalen Beeks** (6.2IP) on May 1, 2019 at KC.
- ✦ Seymour's seven strikeouts were the most by a Rays reliever since **Jesse Scholtens** struck out nine batters on Sept. 25, 2025 at BAL.
- ✦ He became the seventh southpaw in the modern era (since 1900) to pitch 6.0 hitless innings of relief or more and start his next outing (July 2 at KC), joining LAD **Eric Lauer** (June 22-29, 2026), DET **Ed Glynn** (Sept. 5-12, 1976), CAL **Clyde Wright** (Aug. 20-27, 1968), MLN **Juan Pizarro** (April 29–April 15, 1960), CWS **Dave Danforth** (Aug. 29–Sept. 1, 1917), and BOS **Dutch Leonard** (Sept. 20-25, 1914).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP FREDDY PERALTA [5-9, 4.99]
