TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners open a 6 game homestand with the 1st of 3 games against the Kansas City Royals...Seattle will also host the Atlanta Braves (3 G, 5/4-6) on the homestand...the Mariners are coming off a 6 game road trip where they captured series wins at St. Louis (3-0) and at Minnesota (2-1)... tonight's game will be aired exclusively on **Apple TV** with **Wayne Randazzo** and **Dontrelle Willis** on the call with **Heidi Watney** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners completed a thrilling 9th-inning comeback on Wednesday, beating the Twins 5-3...Seattle is 6-1 over its last 7 games and 8-3 over its last 11 games...the Mariners are 5-2 over their last 7 series (4/10-c), including series sweeps against the Astros (4 G) and Cardinals (3 G) during that span.

- **Programming Note** - Following tonight's **Apple TV** broadcast, the Mariners will return to **Mariners TV** on Saturday and Sunday...additionally, Sunday's game will be broadcast on both **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **ESPN Radio**.
- **Length** - Seattle is 9-7 when its starter goes at least 6.0 innings this season, and 4-2 when its starter goes at least 7.0 innings in a game.
- **Bomb Canzone** - **Dominic Canzone** is batting .423 (11x27) with 3 doubles, 1 home run, 5 RBI and a 1.098 OPS over his last 10 games (4/17-c)

MARINERS TO RETIRE RANDY JOHNSON'S NUMBER 51...the Mariners are set to retire **Randy Johnson's #51** tomorrow...he will join fellow Hall of Famers **Ken Griffey Jr. (#24)**, **Edgar Martinez (#11)**, **Ichiro Suzuki (#51)** and Jackie Robinson (#42) as the only numbers retired by the Mariners...Johnson will be the 14th player in MLB history to have his number retired by multiple teams, and his and Ichiro's #51 will be the 8th number to be retired by the same team for multiple players (in addition to #42 which is retired across Major League Baseball).

COLD YOUNG...over his last 13 games (4/16-c), **Cole Young** is batting .383 (18x47) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 10 RBI, 3 walks, 2 stolen bases and an .912 OPS...Young has recorded an RBI in 6-consecutive games (4/24-c), the longest streak by a Mariners player since Eugenio Suarez's franchise record streak (10 G, July 25-Aug. 4, 2023)...the 22-year-old leads the Mariners, leads MLB second basemen and ranks 4th among all position players with 1.9 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*)...Young also has 9 defensive runs saved which leads second basemen and ranks 2nd in MLB overall.

PLAYING THE HITS...since April 10, the Mariners offense has come alive, averaging 4.95 runs per game while batting .268 (170x634) with 33 doubles, 2 triples, 23 home runs, 92 RBI and 76 walks, getting on base at a .352 clip and slugging .435...during that span, the Mariners rank 4th in MLB in batting average, 2nd in OBP, 5th in OPS (.788), 7th in slugging percentage and 2nd in wRC+ (127).

JUST JOSHING AROUND...over his last 10 games (4/17-c), first baseman **Josh Naylor** is batting .405 (15x37) with 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI, 4 stolen bases and 5 walks, slugging .622 with a 1.087 OPS...since Naylor made his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, he is 23-for-25 in stolen base attempts, ranking T-7th in the Majors and 5th in AL in stolen bases over that span.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 6 game homestand against the Royals (3 G, 5/1-3) and Braves (3 G, 5/4-6)...headlining the homestand is **Randy Johnson Number Retirement Night** on Saturday...additionally, the Mariners will celebrate **'80s Weekend (5/1-3)** with **Randy Johnson '80s Jersey Night (5/1)** and **'80s Pin Day (5/3)**...fans can also enjoy **Mariners Value Games** during each game of the Braves series (5/4-6)...visit Mariners.com/Tickets for more information.

RALEIGH RIGHT WHERE HE NEEDS TO BE...**Cal Raleigh** has hit 5 home runs over his last 9 games (4/20-c), tied for the most in MLB since April 20...in those 9 games (4/20-c), Cal is batting .270 (10x37) with 7 runs, 1 double, 5 homers, 7 RBI, and 4 walks, getting on base at a .333 clip, slugging .703 with a 1.036 OPS.

JULIO! JULIO! JULIO!...over his last 18 games (4/11-c), **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .333 (23x72) with 9 runs, 6 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, 6 walks, 3 stolen bases, a .392 OBP and slugging .500 for an .892 OPS...additionally, since starting the season 2-for-26 over his first 7 games, he is batting .300 (30x100) with a .784 OPS over his last 25 games (4/3-c).

'PEN PALS...the Mariners bullpen ranks 3rd in MLB with a 3.31 ERA (38 ER, 103.1 IP)...the Mariners 'pen also ranks 9th in SO/BB (2.63) and 6th in BB% (8.6)...standout relievers in the Mariners bullpen in the early going include **Matt Brash** (0.00 ERA in 14 G), **Eduard Bazarzo** (1.29 ERA in 15 G), **José A. Ferrer** (1.84 ERA in 16 G), **Cooper Criswell** (2.51 ERA in 11 G) and **Andrés Muñoz** (6-for-7 in save opportunities).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Cole Young** provided the game tying hit in the 7th inning and the go-ahead hit in the 9th in Wednesday's game, and...**AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...he leads MLB with 5 game-tying or go-ahead hits in the 7th inning or later this season, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Seattle leads MLB as a team in game-tying or go-ahead hits in the 7th inning or later this season with 14?...they rank ahead of the Rays (12)...additionally, Seattle also leads MLB in game-tying or go-ahead hits after the 6th inning since 2021 with 255, ranking ahead of the Rays (237), with current Mariners first baseman **Josh Naylor** pacing MLB with 38 such hits since 2021.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 1

- **1984** - The Mariners staged their greatest comeback of the year, overcoming an 8-3 deficit by scoring 8 runs in the final three innings to beat Texas, 11-8...the Mariners 18-hit attack was the Mariners highest-ever Kingdome total.
- **1989** - Ken Griffey Jr. is named AL Player of the Week for April 24-30. Griffey hit .600 (12x20), including two doubles and a home run, while hitting safely in all six of his games...he also tied a club record with eight straight hits (with Harold Reynolds and Darnell Coles).
- **2001** - Kazuhiro Sasaki is named the American League Player of the Week.
- **2010** - Félix Hernández's streak of 18 consecutive quality starts was snapped with a 3-6 loss to Texas...he broke the previous club record of 14 consecutive starts set by Erik Hanson in the 1990 season followed into the 1991 season.
- **2022** - **Julio Rodríguez** clubs first career HR 450 feet out to left center in a 7-3 win at Miami.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 7th start of the season and his 77th career start...marks his 1st start of the year against Kansas City and 2nd career start against the Royals.
• Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of California Polytechnic State University...signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
• Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 31 appearances (6 starts) for the Mustangs. Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow surgery.
• Was selected to the 2025 American League All-Star team for the first time in his career.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on April 25 at St. Louis, tossing 3.0 innings and allowing 7 runs (7 ER) on 9 hits (4 HR), 0 walks and 1 strikeout...his 7 earned runs and 4 home runs allowed matched a career-high mark...marked the 3rd start in his career that he has tossed 3.0-or-fewer innings (also: 3.0 IP on 6/24/24 at TB and 2.0 IP on 6/3/23 at TEX).

WELCOME HOME...across his last 15 home starts (4/12/25-c), he is 10-2 with a 2.54 ERA (27 ER, 95.2 IP) and 110 strikeouts to just 16 walks allowed, tossing a quality start in 12 of those 15 starts and 7.0+ IP in 5 of those starts.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME...among Mariners starting pitchers through their first 33 home starts with the club, his 19 wins, 132 hits allowed and 2.63 ERA (57 ER, 195.1 IP) are each franchise-best marks...his 215 strikeouts are also second-most, trailing Luis Castillo (238 SO) and his 33 walks allowed are 3rd-fewest, trailing George Kirby (23 BB) and Logan Gilbert (31 BB).

MAY FLOWERS...May is historically his best performing month as he holds a 2.05 ERA (15 ER, 66.0 IP) with a 12.75 strikeout-to-walk ratio (51 SO, 4 BB) and a 0.788 WHIP across 11 career starts in the month of May...among pitchers with 10+ GS in May since 2023, he ranks 2nd in both WHIP and SO/BB ratio, trailing Tarik Skubal-DET in both categories (0.729 WHIP, 14.0 SO/BB)...has tossed 6.0+ IP in 9 of those 11 starts in May, including 8 quality starts.

WOOOOO...has tossed 7.0+ innings in 3 of his 6 starts this season (last: 4/19 vs. TEX)...threw 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just 1 hit on April 3 at Los Angeles-AL, his 3rd career start tossing 7.0+ IP with 1-or-fewer hits...tied for the most such games in MLB since the start of last season (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD).

THE FOUR-SEAMER...his 4-seam fastball has been his most used pitch over his career (50.3% usage in 2026)...among right-handed pitchers since 2023, his 1,527 four-seam fastballs thrown are 8th-most in MLB (teammate Luis Castillo ranks 5th with 1,611)...has registered 245 swings and misses with his four-seamer since 2025, tied with Joe Ryan-MIN for most in MLB among RHP...has also recorded 107 strikeouts with his four-seamer, 4th-most among RHP since 2025.

WATCH ME WHIP.....his 0.987 career WHIP is the lowest in franchise history (min. 400 IP) and is the 3rd-best mark in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, trailing Tarik Skubal-DET (0.91) and Paul Skenes-PIT (0.93)...has thrown 6.0+ IP with 4-or-fewer hits in 16 games since 2025, tied for 3rd-most such games in MLB across that span.

QUALITY STUFF...has tossed a quality start in 4 of his 6 starts this season (last: 4/19 vs. TEX)...threw a quality start in 21 of his 30 starts last season, tied for 4th-most in the Majors that season, trailing only Logan Webb-SF (22), Cristopher Sánchez-PHI (22) and Garrett Crochet-BOS (22)...his 25 quality starts since 2025 are tied for 2nd-most in MLB.

GOING THE DISTANCE...across his career, the Mariners are 28-20 when he tosses 6.0+ IP and 9-4 when he tosses 7.0+ IP compared to 15-13 when he tosses fewer than 6.0 innings...has tossed 6.0+ IP in 31 of his 36 starts since 2025 with the team going 17-14 in those games.

FIRST HALF WARRIOR...is 13-8 with a 2.76 ERA (76 ER, 228.1 IP), 208 strikeouts and a 0.964 WHIP across 40 career starts pre All-Star Break...his 0.964 WHIP in the first half ranks 3rd-best in MLB since 2023 (min. 200 IP), trailing Tarik Skubal-DET (0.857) and Paul Skenes (0.897)...he threw 6.0+ innings in all 18 starts before last year's All-Star break, while posting a 2.75 ERA (35 ER, 114.2 IP) with 109 strikeouts and 21 walks...his 2.75 ERA last year was the 6th-best by a starting pitcher in the first half (min. 15 GS) in franchise history, while his 0.93 WHIP ranked 3rd-best (1st: Logan Gilbert, 0.87 in 2024).

THROUGH 75...made his 75th career start on April 19 vs. Texas...among Mariners through their first 75 starts with the club, his 330 hits allowed are the fewest, his 3.14 ERA ranks 2nd-best, trailing only Hisashi Iwakuma (2.93), his 86 walks allowed are 2nd-fewest, trailing only George Kirby (52 BB), and his 418 strikeouts are 4th-most...his 39 total quality starts are T-6th in franchise history across a starter's first 75 career starts, alongside Dave Fleming, Félix Hernández, and Hisashi Iwakuma.

400...recorded his 400th career strikeout on March 28 vs. Cleveland, becoming the 2nd fastest starter to reach 400 strikeouts in franchise history (71 GS), behind only Felix Hernández (70 GS, 405 SO).

2025 TOTALS...went 15-7 with a 2.94 ERA (61 ER, 186.2 IP), 36 walks, 198 strikeouts and a 0.93 WHIP in 30 starts...held opponents to a .200/.243/.353 slashline last season...finished 5th in 2025 BBWAA Cy Young Award voting.

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY...is 1-of-3 pitchers to have finished in the top-10 in the AL in K/BB multiple times in the last 3 years (2024, '25), joining teammate Logan Gilbert (2023, '25) and Tarik Skubal-DET ('24, '25).

- **2025 Totals** - Went 1-3 with 4 saves, a 2.47 ERA (13 ER, 47.1 IP), 18 walks, 58 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP in 53 relief appearances...held opponents to a .236 average while recording 21 holds.
- **Postseason Stalwart** - Made 8 appearances during Mariners run to the American League Championship Series, going 1-0 with a 2.00 ERA (2 ER, 9.0 IP), 5 walks and 10 strikeouts.
