TODAY'S TILT... the Mariners wrap up a 6-game homestand today with the last of 3 games against the New York Yankees (1-1)... Seattle also hosted the Toronto Blue Jays (0-3) on the homestand... following an off day Thursday, the Mariners embark on a 10-game road trip against the San Diego Padres (3 G, 5/16-5/18), Chicago White Sox (3 G, 5/19-5/21) and the Houston Astros (4 G, 5/22-5/25)... today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, with **Sarah Merrifield** serving as field reporter... the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzs**, **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

<u>ODDS AND ENDS</u>...the Mariners won last night's game by a 2-1 score in 11 innings, their 2nd walk-off victory of the season...Seattle is still 9-6 over its last 15 games, 11-7 over its last 18 games, 13-8 over its last 21 games, 15-9 over its last 24 games and 19-10 over its last 29 games.

- Series-ly Solid The Mariners own a 9-3-1 series record, 4-2-1 at home and 5-1 on the road...since Dan Wilson took the helm on Aug. 23, 2024, Seattle owns a 16-5-3 series record.
- Hold The Line Seattle is 15-0 when leading after 6, 16-0 when leading after 7, and 18-0 when leading after 8 innings this season.
- Joy Division The Mariners are 13-5 (.722) against AL West Division opponents, and 10-13 (.435) outside the division.
- High Five Seattle is 15-4 (.789) when scoring 5+ runs in a game this season.
- The Fireman is Back Since his return, Matt Brash has made 4 scoreless appearances spanning 3.2 innings with 3 hits, 2 walks and 5 strikeouts.
- No Homer, No Problem Seattle won their second game of the season without homering last night (also: 4/24 at BOS)...the Mariners are 21-11 (.656) when they hit a home run.

THE CARDIAC KIDS ARE BACK...the Mariners won their 3rd extra-innings game of the season, improving to 3-3 in said contests this season and improving to 9-4 in 1-run games...their 6 extra-innings contests are tied for the most in the AL (also: Red Sox) and trailing only Philadelphia (7 G) in MLB...dating back to the 2021 season, Seattle is 42-37 (.532) in extra-inning affairs...their 79 extra-inning games are the most in the Majors during that span, ahead of the Twins (74) and Yankees (71)...the Mariners have also played 227 one-run games since 2021, going 128-99 (.564) in one-run contests, the best record in the Majors ahead of the Brewers (.558/110-87) and Cardinals (.539/104-89).

THE BEST CATCHER IN ALL THE LAND....catcher Cal Raleigh was 1-for-4 with a double and an RBI last night...Cal's 13 homers are 4th-most in the Majors trailing Corbin Carroll-ARI (14), Aaron Judge-NYY (14 HR) and Kyle Schwarber-PHI (14)...in 41 games, Cal has a .922 OPS, hitting .242 (36x149) with 27 runs, 8 doubles, 13 homers, 28 RBI, 27 walks and 4 stolen bases, getting on base at a .365 clip and slugging .557...among MLB catchers, Raleigh ranks 1st in home runs (13), T-1st in RBI (28), 1st in runs scored (27), 1st in extra-base hits (21), 1st in slugging percentage (.557), 1st in OPS (.922), 1st in fWAR (2.3) and 1st in bWAR (2.0).

REMEMBER THAT?...today's starter Luis Castillo is making his 2nd career start against the New York Yankees at T-Mobile Park...the last time he faced the Yankees in Seattle was on Aug. 9, 2022, his first home start with the Mariners and 2nd after being acquired at the 2022 trade deadline..."La Piedra" tossed 8.0 scoreless innings with 7 strikeouts opposite Yankees starter Gerrit Cole, who tossed 7.0 scoreless...the Mariners won the game 1-0 in the 13th inning on a Luis Torrens walk-off single.

<u>IT HAS LEGS</u>...right-handed reliever **Casey Legumina** improved to 3-1 after tossing a scoreless 11th inning...overall, he holds a 2.08 ERA (3 ER, 13.0 IP) with 8 walks (2 intentional), 11 strikeouts and a 1.15 WHIP while holding opponents to a .159 (7x44) average.

<u>A TOP RANKED OFFENSE</u>...Seattle batters <u>lead the Majors</u> in walk rate (10.4%), ranking 2nd in the Majors in walks (166), trailing only the Yankees (171)...across the Majors, the Mariners rank 10th in on-base percentage (.328), 5th in OPS+ (117), 12th in OPS (.732), 7th in runs-per-game (4.85), T-6th in home runs (56), 8th in stolen bases (43) and 4th in hit-by-pitches (22) this season.

<u>JULIO'S LAST BAKER'S DOZEN</u>...over his last 13 contests (4/29-c), **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .296 (16x54) with 10 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs, 5 RBI and 2 walks with a .481 slugging percentage and .814 OPS...he has hit safely in 10 of those 13 contests.

ANDRÉS THE GIANT...right-hander Andrés Muñoz leads the American League with 13 saves...in 19 appearances this season, the reigning American League Reliever of the Month is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 19.0 IP) with 7 hits allowed, 1 run allowed (unearned), 8 walks (2 intentional) and 26 strikeouts, sporting a 0.79 WHIP and 12.3 strikeouts-per-9 innings rate...Muñoz has limited opponents to a .113 batting average (7x62)...Muñoz has compiled 1.8 bWAR, leading MLB relief pitchers.

<u>DILLY BAR</u>...Dylan Moore went 1-for-2 with a walk in yesterday's game...in 29 games this season, Moore is batting .289 (26x90) with 18 runs, 2 doubles, 7 homers, 13RBI, 8 walks and 7 stolen bases, getting on base at a .340 clip and slugging .544 (.884 OPS)...he has appeared defensively at first base (5 G), second base (12 G), shortstop (1 G), third base (9 G) and right field (6 G) this season.

ALL STREAKS MUST COME TO AN END ...outfielder Randy Arozarena's career-high 34-game on-base streak (3/31-5/12) came to a close last night...it marked the longest on-base streak by a Mariners player since Robinson Canó's 34-game on-base streak from April 30-June 5, 2016...during the 34-game streak, Arozarena got on-base at a .393 clip with an .847 OPS, hitting .262 (32x122) with 16 runs, 10 doubles, 4 homers, 19 RBI, 24 walks, 5 hit-by-pitches and is 8-for-8 in stolen bases.

YEDDER CUP ON DECK... following the current series with the Yankees, the Mariners will travel to San Diego for the first official installment of the "**Vedder Cup**"...it was announced on March 14 that the two clubs would play annually for the Vedder Cup in their rivalry series, beginning this season...the winner of the series will take home the Vedder Cup Trophy, featuring a guitar provided by **Eddie Vedder...** as part of the series, both the Padres and Mariners are making annual donations to the EB Research Partnership.

THE SERIES WIN STREAK....Seattle won 9 consecutive series from April 7-May 7: vs. Houston (2-1), vs. Texas (3-0), at Cincinnati (2-1), at Toronto (2-1), at Boston (2-1), vs. Miami (2-1), vs. Los Angeles-AL (2-0), at Texas (2-1) and at the Athletics (2-1)...the 9 consecutive series victories marked their longest string of consecutive series wins since they won a franchise-record 14 (or 15) consecutive series from July 27-Sept. 20, 2001...one of those 15 series was a win in 1 game at Anaheim on Sept. 10, 2001.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...J.P. Crawford supplied the walk-off hit in last night's 11-inning victory, his 6th-career walk-off plate appearance (5th hit), but...<u>DID YOU KNOW?</u>...that his 6 walk-offs are tied for the 3rd-most in Mariners history?...he trails only Mitch Haniger (8) and Jim Presley (7) in Seattle's history.

ABOUT CASTILLO.

- The 32-year-old right-hander is set to make his 9th start of the season and his 1st against the Yankees...he is also making his 220th Major League start and his 7th career start against the Yankees
- Has been named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on 12/23/11.
- Made MLB debut on 6/23/17 vs. Washington (w/ Cincinnati).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022

LAST TIME OUT...L#3 on 5/9 vs. TOR, Castillo threw 5.0 innings, giving up 7 hits on 5 runs with 2 walks and 3 strikeouts...Castillo has thrown 5.0+ innings in 7 of his first 8 starts this season.

FAMILIAR FACE...with his start against the Cincinnati Reds (4/15), Castillo has recorded a start against 29 of 30 MLB teams (ex: SEA).

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND ... in 6 careers starts against the Yankees, he has thrown 5.0+ innings in each start...Castillo made his first 2 career starts with the Mariners against the Yankees (8/3/22 at NYY and 8/9/22 vs. NYY)...in those starts the Mariners went 2-0, as he threw 14.2 combined innings for a 1.84 ERA and a 0.886 WHIP, with 15 SO and 5 walks.

STRETCHING IT OUT...in a Mariners uniform, Castillo has gone 5.0+ innings in 78 of his 82 starts, 6.0+ innings in 52 of 82, and 7.0+ innings in 17 of 82.

HOME COOKIN'...in 44 starts at T-Mobile Park, Castillo is 19-12 with a 2.89 ERA (84 ER, 261.2 IP), with 302 strikeouts, 64 walks and a 1.01 WHIP...he ranks 1st in SO, 3rd in ERA, and 4th in wins in a pitcher's first 44 home games in franchise history (min. 150.0 IP).

EAST VS LUIS ... against AL-East opponents, in 23 career starts Castillo is 8-9 with a 3.71 ERA (55 ER, 133.1 IP), holding a .238 AVG against, with 127 SO and 52 BB...in 15 career starts with the Mariners against AL-East opponents he is 6-5, throwing 6.0+ innings in 7 of 15 starts, and has 2-or-less walks in 11 of 15 starts...in 6 home starts in T-Mobile Park, he has a 3.10 ERA (13 ER, 37.2 IP), with 36 SO and 10 BB, and a 5-1 Mariners record.

EFFICIENT OUTINGS ... Castillo is 1 of 3 pitchers (Dylan Cease-CHW/SDP, and Nick Pivetta-BOS/SDP) to have 4 starts of 6.0+ scoreless innings pitched,

giving up 1-or-less hits and 2-or-less walks since his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY)...in those starts, Castillo is 3-0 with 27 SO and 5 BB. AGAINST THE AL...in 85 career starts against the American League, Castillo is 27-31, with a 3.68 ERA (201 ER, 491.0 IP), 1.19 WHIP, recording 508 strikeouts and 147 walks...since his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), against the American League, he has logged 64 starts, with a 23-22 record, and holds a 3.63 ERA (152 ER, 376.2 IP), 381 strikeouts and 107 walks.

STEERING THE SHIP...since his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), Castillo has led the team in SO/9, (10.6 in 2022, and 10.0 in 2023), ERA (3.17 in 2022), innings pitched (197.0 in 2023), and games started (33 in 2023)...since his Mariners debut, he is 1st in SO (504), and 6th in ERA (3.48) for a pitcher's first 82 games in franchise history (min. 250.0 IP).

FOR CLUB & COUNTRY...ranks among the Dominican Republic-born All-Time leaders (min. 1,100.0 IP) in SO/9 (2nd, 9.64), SO/BB (3rd, 3.21) WHIP (3rd, 1.18), Opp. AVG (4th, .228), H/9 (4th, 7.60), ERA (6th, 3.57)...trails only Hall of Famer Pedro Martinez in SO/9 (10.04)...Castillo was born in Bani, Dominican Republic).

TOP CHARTS...since his MLB debut (6/23/17 vs. WSH), Castillo ranks 5th in QS (120), 6th in innings pitched (1273.1 IP), SO (1364), AVG against (.225), 7th in ERA (3.57), 8th in WAR (24.4), WHIP (1.18), 9th in K/9 (9.64), K/BB% (17.8) among starting pitchers (min. 1,000 IP).

TOP OF CLASS...currently holds a 3.95 ERA and recorded his 6th consecutive season with a sub-4.00 ERA in 2024, including 5 qualified seasons (2019-21, 2023-24)...his 5 qualified seasons since 2019 is tied the most in the Majors during that span (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU/NYY and Zack Wheeler-PHI).

LUIS, LUIS...since making his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), Castillo is 32-26 with a 3.48 ERA (186 ER, 481.0 IP), 138 walks, 504 strikeouts, and a 1.15 WHIP while holding opponents to a .228 AVG against...among qualified pitchers during that span, he ranks 8th in QS (46), 8th in SO (504), 9th in wins (32), runs allowed (199), and 10th in ERA (3.48), WHIP (1.15), and K/9 (9.43).

THE CASTILLO-10...in his last 10 starts (9/3-c), Castillo is 3-3, with 4 QS and holding a 3.88 ERA (20 ER, 54.0 IP,) with 41 SO and 20 BB...he has thrown 5.0+ innings in 8 of his last 10, and has walked 2-or-less hitters in 9 of his last 10 starts.

CAREER...will be making his 220th career start and will be the 1 of 27 active pitchers to have 220-or-more carer starts in the MLB...has pitched in parts of 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2017-22) and Seattle (2022-c)...has been named an All-Star 3 times (2019, 2022 w/CIN and 2023 w/SEA)...finished 5th in 2023 AL Cy Young Award voting...has made 4 Opening Day starts in his career: 2019 and 2021 with Cincinnati and 2023-24 with Seattle.

POSTSEASON PEDIGREE...has made 3 career postseason starts, going 1-2 with a 1.83 ERA (4 ER, 19.2 IP), 19 strikeouts and 1 walk (intentional)...earned the win in Game 1 of the 2022 AL Wild Card Series at Toronto...tossed 7.1 scoreless innings with 5 strikeouts, setting a franchise record for most innings pitched in a scoreless postseason start...was tagged with the loss on 10/13/22 at HOU in G2 of the ALDS...allowed 3 runs on 5 hits (2 HR) with 7 strikeouts.

FIELDING HIS POSITION...has only committed 3 errors in 219 games, and has the 3rd best fielding percentage (.986) among active pitchers. around the league since his MLB debut.
