The Mariners and Cardinals meet for their only regular season series of 2024...Seattle last played at Busch Stadium during the 2013 season.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 10-game road trip tonight with the first of 3 games against the St. Louis Cardinals...Seattle began the road trip with a 3-game series at the Los Angeles Angels (1-2) and a 4-games series at the Oakland Athletics (2-2)...following the conclusion of the current series vs. St. Louis, the Mariners return home for an 9-game homestand vs. San Diego (2 G, Sept. 10-11), Texas (4 G, Sept. 12-15) and New York-AL (3 G, Sept. 17-19)...tonight's game in St. Louis will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners defeated the Athletics by a 6-4 score in yesterday's matinee, taking the 364th and final game at the Oakland Coliseum in franchise history...with 21 regular season games remaining, the Mariners are 4.5 games back of Houston for the AL West Division lead and 5.0 games back of Kansas City for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot.

- **A Forgotten Land** - This trip to St. Louis is only the fourth visit to the Cardinals in Mariners franchise history and the first visit to Busch Stadium since 2013...prior to this season, Seattle had visited every ballpark in the National League at least once since 2019.
- **Central Of The Universe** - In 4 career starts against NL Central opposition, RHP **Bryce Miller** is 3-0 with a 0.74 ERA (2 ER, 24.1 IP) and opposing hitters are batting .169 (14x83) against him.
- **Victor-y Shall Be His!** - OF **Victor Robles** is batting .426 (20x47) with 10 runs, 5 doubles, 1 home runs, 11 RBI and 6 SB with a 1.067 OPS over his last 14 games (8/17-c).
- **Take Five** - The Mariners are 46-4 (.920) when they score 5+ runs in a game, best such record in MLB...Seattle is 25-66 (.275) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs.
- **#BoneKnows** - Seattle has the 3rd-highest infield (1B/2B/3B/SS) fielding percentage (.985) in the AL.
- **+23** - The Mariners are 7-6 over their last 13 games (8/23-c), but with a +23 run differential (69 R, 46 RA).

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION...as a team, the Mariners have batted .346 (27x78) and scored 22 runs in their last 2 games...the bats tallied 11 hits in the 6-4 win over Oakland yesterday, and 16 hits in Wednesday's 16-3 win...16 runs was the highest total since June 2, 2016 at San Diego, a 16-13 win...it is the first time this season and the fifth time since 2020 that Seattle has tallied 27-or-more hits over a 2-game span...it is the 2nd time this season the Mariners have recorded 11+ hits and 6+ extra-base hits in back-to-back games (also: 7/26-27 at Chicago-AL).

THE TWO-WAY PROWESS OF CAL...Mariners catcher **Cal Raleigh** leads the Major Leagues in both **home runs** among catchers (29) and **catcher caught stealing** (23).

- **Don't Run On Cal!** - Since "catcher caught stealing" has been tracked (1974-c), only 2 catchers have led the Majors in **CCS** in back-to-back seasons: Jim Sundberg in 1975-76 (Sundberg tied for the Major League lead in '75) and Hall of Famer Gary Carter in 1982-83...Raleigh, who led the Majors in 2023 with 24 CCS, would become the 3rd catcher to do it if he can hold his current lead.
- **Most HR / Most Runners Thrown Out** - After leading the Majors in homers among catchers (30) and CCS (24) in 2023, **Cal Raleigh** is trying to lead in both categories again in 2024...if he can hold his current lead in both categories, he would become the first (since 1974) to lead MLB catchers in home runs and CCS **multiple times**...prior to Raleigh leading MLB in both categories last season, only Lance Parrish (1990) and Mike Piazza (1993) had done it.

BEST STAFF IN THE LAND...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Major Leagues in ERA (3.53)...Seattle is attempting to lead the American League in ERA in back-to-back seasons (3.74 ERA in 2023) and the Majors in ERA for the first time since 2001 (3.54 ERA)...this season, the Mariners pitching staff leads **MLB** in opponent batting average (.222), WHIP (1.09), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.32), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.46), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.82), opponent OPS (.656) and quality starts (83).

SPEEEEEEDIN'!...the Mariners are 119-for-145 (82.1%) in stolen base attempts this season, 2nd-best stolen base percentage in the American League, trailing Toronto (82.3%)...Seattle is on pace to set the franchise record in stolen base percentage, surpassing the 80.6% mark achieved by the 2001 team...**Dylan Moore** (29 SB) is 1 stolen base away from becoming the 16th individual in franchise history with a 30+ SB season (last: **Julio Rodríguez**, 37 SB, 2023)...**Victor Robles** is 19-for-19 in SB with the Mariners, passing Henry Cotto (1988) for most successful attempts without being caught to begin a Mariners career.

WEAR IT!...**Victor Robles** reach base twice yesterday via hit-by-pitch, his fifth and sixth hit-by-pitches this season...as a team in 2024, the Mariners are leading the Majors in hit-by-pitches with 97, ranking ahead of Minnesota (88)...Seattle also led the Majors in HBP in 2023 after being plunked a franchise-record 111 times...the Mariners are looking to become the first team to lead the Majors in hit-by-pitch in back-to-back seasons since Cleveland (2008-09).

JULIOOOOOO...over his last 35 games (7/4-c), center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .296 (37x125) with 20 runs, 7 doubles, 7 homers, 20 RBI and 13 walks, getting on base at a .378 clip, slugging .520 with an .898 OPS...Julio has an active 8-game hitting streak (8/28-c), toting a .355 average (11x31) during it, tying Seattle's longest individual hitting streak this season (done 5x, including once by Julio from May 12-20).

TROY SPARTAN...right-hander **Troy Taylor** tossed a scoreless inning in relief yesterday, lowering his ERA to 0.87 on the year...the rookie has not allowed a run in 9 consecutive outings (8/17-c), spanning 9.0 innings...in 11 appearances to begin his Major League career, Taylor has a 0.87 ERA (1 ER, 10.1 IP) with 3 walks, 12 strikeouts and 0.68 WHIP, limiting opponents to a .111 batting average (4x36).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Luke Raley** tied single-game career-highs in hits, doubles and total bases (8) after going 3-for-5 with 2 2B, 1 HR, 2 RBI and 1 R in yesterday's contest...his 2 doubles and 8 total bases were also season-highs, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Raley has a 1.054 OPS over his last 24 games?...during that span (8/1-c) he has recorded 4 doubles, 7 home runs, 17 RBI and 11 walks with a .398 on-base percentage and .657 slugging percentage...since August 1, his 1.054 OPS is the 4th-best in the Majors (min. 80 AB)...he only trails Aaron Judge-NYY (1.233), Vladimir Guerrero Jr.-TOR (1.169) and Yordan Alvarez-HOU (1.143), and...**DID YOU ALSO KNOW?**...that with **Luis Urías'** 3 extra-base hit performance (2 doubles, 1 home run) on Wednesday night, it is the 8th time in franchise history that the Mariners have had a batter tally 3 extra base hits on back-to-back nights?...the last time this occurred was June 8-9, 2016 by Chris Iannetta and Robinson Canó vs. Cleveland...Álex Rodríguez is the only player in franchise history to have back-to-back days with 3 extra-base hits (4/19/98 at MIN and 4/20/98 vs. KC).

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 28th start of 2024 and his 1st against St. Louis... marks his 53rd career start and 1st against the Cardinals.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller.
- Spent 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21...also spent 2 seasons playing for Brazos Valley Bombers of the Texas Collegiate League in 2018 and 2020, and 1 season with the Falmouth Commodores of the Cape Cod League in 2019.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...L#8 on 9/1 at LAA...pitched 4.2 innings and allowed 3 runs on 4 hits (1 HR) and 3 walks with 4 strikeouts.

NATIONAL PAST TIME...in 2024, he is 5-1 against National League opponents with a 2.49 ERA (14 ER, 50.2 IP) and a .187 average against (34x182)...6 of the 9 outings have been quality starts with 7 of the 9 outings having 3-or-less runs allowed...in those outings he has also posted a 0.89 WHIP.

LAST 10...over his last 10 starts (7/4-c) he holds a 4-1 record with a 2.33 ERA (15 ER, 58.0 IP), 6 home run and 6 walks allowed with 56 strikeouts...during this span his 2.33 ERA ranks 2nd in the American League among pitchers with at least 8 starts.

LEFTY VS. RIGHTY...left-handed batters are slashing .214/.273/.416 (66x308) with 25 walks, 74 strikeouts, 15 doubles and 15 home runs in 2024 compared to right-handed batters slashing .202/.241/.293 (53x263) with 11 walks, 73 strikeouts, 9 doubles and 5 home runs.

RUN LIMITER...leads the AL with starts of at least 6.0 IP and 0 ER with 8 starts...ahead of, Logan Gilbert-SEA (7), Tanner Houck-BOS (6), Hunter Brown-HOU (6), and Nestor Cortes-NYY (6).

IT WORKS 80% OF THE TIME, EVERYTIME...hitters this season are batting .198 (92x463) against his 4-seam fastball, splitter and sinker combined...76.9% of his pitches thrown this year have been one of those three...124 of his 147 strikeouts this season have come via a 4-seam fastball (57), splitter (45) or sinker (22) and he has allowed 16 doubles and 15 home runs on those pitches.

NO FREE BASES:...through his first 27 starts allowed the fewest amount of base runners in Mariners history with 158 and is the only Mariners pitcher to allow less than 160 baserunners through their first 27 starts in a season.

HAVING SUPPORT...this season, when Miller receives 3 runs of run support while he is still in the game, he is 7-0 in 10 such outings...in those 10 outings this season, the Mariners are 8-2.

YOU GOTTA EARN IT...has given up 2 ER or fewer in 18 of 27 games this season behind only George Kirby (19) for the most by a Mariner starter and tied for 5th most in the AL.

SOME QUALITY TIME...has tossed 23 quality starts (6.0+ IP, 3 ER or less) in 53 career outings...in games where he tosses a quality start the Mariners are 19-4.

HOME SWEET HOME...in his last 13 starts at home (4/12-c), he has a 6-2 record, a 1.70 ERA (15 ER, 79.1 IP), 90 strikeouts and 16 walks...in 12 of the 13 starts he has allowed 2-or-fewer runs and has quality starts in 10 of the 13 starts...his 2.03 ERA (19 ER, 84.1 IP) across all home starts this season is the 2nd lowest on the Mariners pitching staff, behind Bryan Woo with a 1.50 ERA (7 ER, 42.0 IP).

SUMMER SHOWOUT...since June 29, he holds a 2.43 ERA (17 ER, 63.0 IP) with 4 wins, 5 quality starts and an opponent batting average of .214 (50x246)...during this span he has the 2nd lowest ERA, 2nd fewest walks (9), and 3rd fewest baserunners allowed (62) in the AL min. 10 starts.

YOU SHALL NOT SCORE...tossed 16.0 consecutive scoreless innings starting in the 1st inning of his start vs. New York-NL (8/9) and ending in his start vs. Los Angeles-NL (8/20) in the 4th.

250 AND COUNTING...recorded his 250th career strikeout in his start against Los Angeles-NL on 8/21 after striking out Teoscar Hernandez-LAD in the 1st inning...through his first 50 career starts, he tallied 252 strikeouts, the 7th-most in franchise history through 50 starts.

MAKING MARINERS HISTORY...over his first 50 starts Miller is tied with James Paxton for the least amount of total bases allowed (406)...Bryce is also 8th in franchise history with 252 strikeouts, 2nd in walks with 59 and, 8th with a 3.80 ERA.

AMONG THE BEST OF THEM...finished in the top-10 among rookies with a minimum of 100.0 innings pitched in various pitching categories in 2023, including BB/9 (1st, 1.78), SO/BB (1st, 4.58), WHIP (3rd, 1.14), GS (4th, 25), wins (T-6th, 8), IP (7th, 131.1) and ERA (9th, 4.32).
