METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the A's, 17-6, last night...The Mets are on their second road trip of the season an 11-day, 10-game trip against the Athletics (1-0), Dodgers (three games) and Giants (four games).

JACKIE ROBINSON DAY: The Mets, along with the rest of Major League Baseball, will celebrate the life and legacy of Jackie Robinson...Every major league manager, coach and player will \#42 today to commemorate the Anniversary of Hall of Famer Jackie Robinson breaking baseball's color barrier in 1947...MLB retired Robinson's number throughout the Majors in 1997 in ceremony at Shea Stadium and every player and all on-field personnel has worn his Number 42 during games scheduled on Jackie Robinson Day since 2009.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Francisco Lindor recorded seven RBI last night, which tied his career high...Also, July 2, 2018 with Cleveland at Kansas City...It's a single-game franchise record total by a shortstop... He is one of 13 Mets players to record seven or more RBI in a game...Over the last eight games, Lindor is batting . 323 (10-31) with 10 runs, four doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, four walks, a steal with a .417 OBP and a .742 SLG

GRANNIES ARE SICK: The Mets hit their first grand slam of the season last night...The team's last two grand slams have come in Oakland...Eduardo Escobar his a grand slam on September 23, 2022...The Mets have recorded 20 RBI with the bases loaded this season, which leads the National League and is second in the majors...Only the Tampa Bay Rays (21) have recorded more...The team has drawn a major league-leading six walks with the bases full...Last year, the team drew a total of 10 free passes with the bases loaded.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in six games, owning a . 533 OBP in that span...Overall, in 13 games this season, Nimmo is batting .268 with nine runs, three doubles, seven RBI, 14 walks and a . 466 OBP.... His . 466 OBP ranks fourth in the Senior Circuit...The left-handed hitter has drawn 337 walks in his career, which places him 18th in franchise history...John Milner is next with 338 walks....Nimmo has posted a 387 OBP, which is the third-highest in franchise history (min. 2,000 PA)...Only John Olerud (.425) and Dave Magadan (.391) had higher OBP.

WALK THE WALK: The Mets recorded 17 walks last night, setting a franchise record...The 17 walks in a nine-inning are tied for the third-most in the majors since 1901... Hat tip to Sarah Langs...The last time a team recorded at least 17 walks in a game was the Arizona Diamondbacks drew 18 free passes on August 24, 2013 at Philadelphia in a 12-7, 18-inning victory...The last time a team recorded 17 or more walks in a 9 -inning game was in game one of a doubleheader on September 11, 1949, when the Yankees drew 17 walks and defeated the Senators, 20-5 in The Bronx.

THE WALKMAN: The Mets lead the majors with 76 free passes this season... Brandon Nimmo leads the majors with 14 walks...Jeff McNeil and Pete Alonso have each recorded 10 free passes this season.

WHEN I WAS 17: The Mets scored 17 runs and drew 17 walks in last night's victory over the Athletics....According to Stats Inc., that is the first time a team has recorded $17+$ walks and $17+$ runs in a road game (since 1901)... Before last night, that total was only done twice before... See the chart below for all occurrences:

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets continue Interleague play tonight against the Athletics...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...In 2022, the Mets went 9-11 against the American League...Overall, New York owns a 236-227 record in Interleague play... The team's .510 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

A'S-METS NOTES: The Mets played a three-game set in Oakland from September 23-25 last season...Prior to that series, the Mets had not visited Oakland since 2014.

INTERSTELLAR: Jeff McNeil owns a $340 / .387 / .478$ slashline with 37 runs, 14 doubles, seven home runs and 34 RBI in 68 Interleague games, while Starling Marte has slashed .331/.392/.553 with 115 runs, 45 doubles, 11 triples, 27 home runs and 86 RBI in 171 Intearleague games...They rank first and second in average among active players in Interleague play (min. 250 PA)...McNeil's 340 clip is the highest all-time by a Met.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso batted .333/.410/.639 against AL opponents last season with 15 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 15 RBI and 10 walks... His six home runs were tied for the sixth-most in the majors... Alonso has hit 29 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season... His 29 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player in that time frame...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

OAK AGED: Pete Alonso is $.500(8-16)$ with seven runs, two doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and four walks in four games at the home of the Athletics...Brandon Nimmo is $.500(6-12)$ with seven runs, four RBI and three walks in four games there...Jeff McNeil is $6-18$ with four runs, a double, an RBI and two walks in four contests...In 20 games in Oakland, Francisco Lindor has hit . $370 / .391 / .580$ with 14 runs, eight doubles, three home runs, 16 RBI and four walks...Starling Marte played 33 games at the ballpark and slashed $.336 / .378 / .526$ with 12 doubles, a triple, four home runs and 25 RBI...Mark Canha appeared in 323 games at the ballpark and has slashed .243/.348/.433 with 52 doubles, six triples, 45 homers, 146 RBI and 128 walks.

CURTAINS FROM CURTISS: John Curtiss hasn't allowed a run in his last five games, tossing 5.1 scoreless innings with six strikeouts...Overall, he has yielded one run overall in 7.1 innings ( 1.23 ERA) in six outings.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets have posted a 3.75 ERA with 19 walks and 54 punchouts from their bullpen this season...The 3.75 ERA places them fourth in the National League...Over the last six games, the pen has pitched to a 2.35 ERA ( 6 ER/23.0 IP) with 10 walks and 27 strikeouts.

OUCH: The Mets once again own the major league lead with 12 HBP....Mark Canha has been hit by 46 pitches at RingCentral Coliseum, the most in the history of the ballpark....Only five active players have been hit by more pitches in a single ballpark during their career...Courtesy Sportradar.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed only two errors in 14 games this season...The team's .996 fielding percentage is the best in the majors.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets have stolen 15 bases this season, which is fifth in the majors and third in the National League... Starling Marte is fourth in the NL with five steals...Brandon Nimmo, who is tied for seventh in the NL, has stolen three bases in 13 games this year.. Nimmo stole a total of three bases in 151 games last season.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has collected a hit in seven of his last eight games, batting . 367 (11-30) in that span with eight runs, five home runs, 10 RBI, five walks with a .457 OBP and an .867 SLG in that span...Alonso has hit six home runs this season, which is for the major league lead.

CARRASCO NEWS \& NOTES
LAST TIME OUT: Went 4.2 innings in his first start at Citi Field this season on April 9 against Miami...Allowed six runs on three walks and six hits, including two home runs...Marked his second career loss against the Marlins.

EARNING AN A: Carrasco has made eight appearances and seven starts against the A's in his career, holding a 4-2 record with a 3.14 ERA ( 18 ER/51.2 IP)...When in Oakland, Carrasco has pitched to a $2.31 \mathrm{ERA}(6 \mathrm{ER} / 23.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in three starts, all of which took place while he was playing for Cleveland...In Carrasco's last appearance at Oakland Coliseum on July 14, 2017, he suffered the loss after allowing five runs on six hits in 6.1 innings.... His last win against the A's came on July 6, 2018, as Carrasco threw 5.1 innings and allowed three runs on seven hits in a 10-4 victory in Cleveland...Has held A's hitters to a .219 average in his career.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded a 3.97 ERA (67 ER/152.0 IP) in his first full season with the Mets...Ended the season ranked tied fifth in the National League in wins with 15 and 11th in win percentage with . 628 ...According to Baseball Savant, excelled in chase rate in the 94th percentile for MLB...Locked it down in July with a 0.90 ERA ( $3 \mathrm{ER} / 30.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in five starts that month, tallying three wins and 27 strikeouts...The slider and changeup were effective pitches for Carrasco in 2022, with a 35.5 and 31.6 whiff percentage and 26.2 and 21.8 put away percentage, respectively.

CLUTCH COOKIE: Did not allow a run in 22.2 straight innings from July 14-August 4, surpassing his previous career-long scoreless streak of 22.0 innings from July 30-August 11, 2015... He threw three straight scoreless starts for the first time in his career from July 14-30...He had three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018 (also, 12.2 innings from April 27-May 10 \& 10.2 innings from April 10-21)...Allowed three earned runs or fewer in a career-high 12 consecutive starts from July 3-September 20, posting a 2.42 ERA ( 17 earned runs/ 63.1 innings) in that span...Marked his best ERA in a 12 -start span since July 27 -September 30, 2018 ( 2.30 ERA).

WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts... His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15 -win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more $15+$ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

MILESTONES \& MORE: At this point in the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1456.2 ...Is also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 285 and 238 , respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of $150+$ strikeouts since 2015.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelanborn pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 16 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse $1,400.0$ career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.

SPRING IN HIS STEP: Made four starts in spring exhibition play, three of which were at home...Posted a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/ 13.0 IP) with 14 strikeouts over those four starts...Carrasco's best appearance of Spring Training was his last on March 17 against the Marlins, in which he tallied seven punchouts in his lone Grapefruit League win...Ended exhibition play with a 1.08 WHIP and a .240 opponent's batting average.
