REDBIRD RUNDOWN: The defending 2019 NL Central Champion Cardinals continue their season-long 12-game homestand (3-1 vs. Reds; 2-1 vs. Royals; 2G-DH vs. Pirates; 3G vs. Indians) by welcoming division-rival Pittsburgh to Busch Std for a doubleheader today ... Originally a mutual off day for both clubs, today's twinbill makes up games from Aug. 10-11 at Busch Std ... St. Louis is in the midst of playing 53 games over the final 44 days of the season, which includes 11 doubleheaders (55 games in 45 days, if necessary) ... Winners nine of their last 15 since resuming play on Aug. 15, the Cardinals are currently in 2nd place in the NL Central, 2.0 games behind Chicago.

LET'S PLAY TWO: Today's doubleheader is the Cardinals' MLB-leading 4th of 11 scheduled for this season and the 12th all-time at Busch Stadium III (first seven-inning twinbill at home in franchise history) The last time St. Louis and Pittsburgh played a doubleheader was Sept. 30, 2015 at PNC Park, where the Cardinals took Game 2 of the split for their 100th win of the season that clinched the Central Division.

FIVE ALIVE: St. Louis (9-0) and Miami (7-0) are the only MLB teams to be undefeated when scoring 5+ runs ... Over the first 20 games to start any season in history, St. Louis' best starts when scoring 5+ are 10-0 (2008) and 9-0 (2020, 1977, 1963). (Orf)

WONG-OFF: Last night was **Kolten Wong's** sixth career walk-off RBI and second walk-off moment of the homestand (RBI single vs. Cincinnati on Aug. 20) ... 31 different MLB players have one walk-off RBI season, while Wong and Tampa Bay's **Kevin Kiermaier** lead MLB with two ... Both of Wong's RBI this season have been game-ending.

CARDIAC CARDS: Last night, the Cardinals trailed by three and were down to their last out before storming back to win. The last time St. Louis won a game after trailing by three or more runs with two outs in the 9th inning or later was August 8, 2016 vs. Cincinnati (trailed 4-0 w/ 2 outs in the 9th and won 5-4) (Elias)

MOLINA MILESTONES: **Yadier Molina** is three hits shy of tying **Red Schoendienst** (1,980) for 6th in Cardinals history and 23 hits shy of becoming the 11th primary catcher in MLB history to reach 2,000 career hits ... last night he tied **Joe "Ducky" Medwick** (923 career RBI) for 8th in Cardinals history.

FREE RIDES: The Cardinals have drawn five or more walks in seven straight games (August 20-present), their longest streak since setting the franchise record of eight games (May 9-18, 1909). This is currently the longest streak in the Majors and longest since 2016 when the Toronto Blue Jays earned five free passes in eight games (Sept. 18-26, 2016). The Major League record is 12 games by the San Francisco Giants (June 3-15, 2004).

GOLDYWALKS: **Paul Goldschmidt** enters today ranking 1st in MLB in OBP (.482) and T4th in batting (.333, 21-63)... Goldschmidt has reached base safely in 19 of 20 games this season (on-base safely 40 times in 83 PA) and drawn a walk in a career-high and MLB-best 11 consecutive games (Aug. 17-present) ... The last Cardinal to draw walk in 11 or more straight games was **Jack Clark** (16, July 18-Aug. 10, 1987), who holds the franchise record.

BIRD BYTES: Happy 59th birthday to Cardinals Pitching Coach **Mike Maddux** ... Over the first 20 games of the season, the Cardinals are 7-7 nine-inning games and 4-2 in seven-inning games ... **Tommy Edman** (.329/.402/.616, 24-73) has reached base safely in 20 consecutive home games (Sept. 4, 2019-present), the 8th-longest active home streak in MLB and longest by a Cardinal since **Dexter Fowler** (25 home games from July 31-Sept. 18, 2019) ... The Cardinals have scored 37 of 87 runs (42.5%) with two outs ... St. Louis pitching lead MLB in average against (.182) and rank 2nd in WHIP (1.07) and 3rd in ERA (3.46), while opposing batting averages by the starting rotation (.190) and bullpen (.171) are both tops in MLB ... The Cardinals are tied for the Major League lead with a .400 on-base percentage in the 9th inning. Of the ways to reach base, the Cardinals have as many hits (6) as walks (6), while the four hit by pitch are tied for the most in MLB in the final scheduled frame of a regulation game.

PITTSBURGH CONNECTIONS

Paul DeJong was originally selected by the Pirates in the 38th round of the 2014 MLB Draft, but did not sign.

Yadier Molina (June 3, 2004), **Austin Gomber** (June 2, 2018) and **Junior Fernandez** (August 11, 2019) made their Major League debuts against Pittsburgh.

Harrison Bader previously committed to play at the University of Pittsburgh and University of Maryland before receiving a partial scholarship from Florida.

Miles Mikolas spent one month as a Pirate during the 2013 offseason...traded by San Diego with infielder **Jaff Decker** to Pittsburgh for outfielder **Alex Dickerson** (Nov. 25, 2013), then traded by Pittsburgh to Texas in exchange for infielder **Chris McGuiness** (Dec. 30, 2013).

Andrew Knizner's uncle, **Matt Knizner**, was a quarterback at Penn State Univ. and was on the 1986 National Championship Nittany Lion squad.

Mike Maddux signed with the Pirates in April 1995 and pitched in eight games before being released in May.

Oliver Marmol was originally selected by the Pirates in the 31st round of the 2004 MLB draft, but did not sign.

Pirates Manager **Derek Shelton** was born in in Carbondale, Ill...caught four seasons (1989-92) at nearby Southern Illinois University.

Pirates Baseball Operations Special Assistant **David Eckstein** played three seasons at shortstop with St. Louis (2005-07), where he was a two-time NL All-Star (2005-06) and member of the 2006 World Series Champions.

Pirates Hitting Coach **Rick Eckstein** previously served as the 2007 hitting coach for the Memphis Redbirds (AAA).

Pirates Baseball Operations Senior Advisor **Nick Leyva** was drafted by St. Louis in the 24th round in 1975...played three minor league seasons in the Cardinals system (1975-77)...managed six minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization (1978-83)...served as St. Louis' First Base Coach (1984-85) and Third Base Coach (1986-88).

Cardinals Baseball Information & Media Services Administrator **Chris Tunno** graduated from nearby Canfield (Ohio) High School.

Pirates Manager of Business Communications & Social Media **Terry Rodgers** previously worked as a Public Relations Specialist in the Cardinals Communications department (2010-11).

- Is making his third career start, his second career start at home and his fourth career Major League appearance. Pitching against the Pirates for the second time.
- Will be making his 302nd career professional appearance today, with 298 coming in the Korea Baseball Organization (KBO).
- Was moved into the starting rotation following the injury to Miles Mikolas (right forearm strain) and Carlos Martínez placed on the Injured List.

LAST TIME OUT

- Made his second Major League start and first career start at home.
- Earned the first win of his Major League career.
- Established a new career-high in innings pitched with six scoreless innings, holding his opposition to three hits and zero walks.

2019 SEASON

- Named the Korea Baseball Organization “Best Pitcher” (equivalent to MLB’s Cy Young Award) with the SK Wyverns posting a 17-6 record with a 2.51 ERA in 30 starts (31 app.) and 180 strikeouts over 190.1 innings pitched.
- Led the KBO in quality starts (24) while ranking 2nd in wins (17); and 3rd in ERA (2.51) and innings pitched (190.1).
- Struck out a season-high 10 batters (5.0 IP) vs. Hanwha (5/9) and a season-high 8.0 innings vs. Kiwoom (8/8).
- Was 13-1 with a 2.30 ERA in 16 road appearances during the 2019 KBO season with SK Wyverns. Earned 13 of his 17 wins last season on the road.

CAREER

- Made his debut in 2007 as an 18-year old rookie with the SK Wyverns of the Korea Baseball Organization (KBO) and was 3-7 with a 3.62 in 20 appearances (13 starts).
- Named the 2008 KBO Most Valuable Player leading the league with 16 wins and 150 strikeouts in just his second professional season, beginning the season as a 19-year old.
- Pitched 12 professional seasons (2007-16, ‘18-19) over 13 years in the KBO, missing the 2017 season due to an injury requiring Tommy John surgery.
- Compiled a career record of 136-77 with a 3.29 ERA over 298 career appearances (276 starts) in the KBO.
- Four-time KBO Series Champion with the SK Wyverns (2007-08, 2010, 2018).
- Won the KBO Gold Glove at the pitching position in 2008.
- Led the KBO in wins twice (2008, 2010), ERA (2009), strikeouts (2008), winning pct (2008) and innings pitched (2010).
- Was a member of the South Korea team in the 2009 World Baseball Classic and was an Olympic Gold Medal winner with South Korea in the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Nickname is “KK”.
- His translator’s name is Yonsei “Craig” Choi.
- Has stayed in the United States during the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic and conditioned during the off time with Cardinals veteran pitcher, Adam Wainwright, at his home in St. Louis.
- His family (wife Sang Hee, daughter Minjoo, son Minjae) reside in Incheon, South Korea and have remained there since the outbreak.

2019 SEASON (MINORS)

- Pitched in Palm Beach (A) and Springfield (AA) combining for a 12-8 record with a 4.73 ERA over 29 appearances with 28 starts. Posted career highs in wins, starts, innings and strikeouts.
- Led all Cardinals minor league pitchers in strikeouts (163), wins (12) and games start- ed (28), while ranking in the Top 10 in opponent BA (.273, 10th), innings pitched (146.2, 5th) and winning percentage (.467, 7th).
- Named Cardinals Minor League Pitcher of the Month for April after posting a 5-0 record witha 1.60 ERA over five starts and six total appearances covering 33.2 innings with 35 strikeouts. Was leading the Florida State League in wins and strikeouts after the month of April.
- Struck out a career-high 11 batters over 7.0 innings vs. Corpus Christi (7/27).
- Made 10 starts of 6.0 innings or more; 10 were quality.
- Threw a season-high 7.1 scoreless innings vs. Frisco (8/28).
