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THE TWINS: Enjoyed their final off-day of the season yesterday, after posting a 4-3 record on their final roadtrip of the season, going 2-2 in Anaheim and 2-1 in San Francisco, after winning Wednesday's series finale over the Giants, 4-2...today, Minnesota will play the three-game series opener against the Texas Rangers at Target Field, wrapping up the 2026 season with a weekend series.

Twins are 3-0 against the Rangers this season, sweeping them in three games in Texas from June 15-18...Twins have won four-straight against the Rangers and are 16-7 against Texas since the start of the 2023 season.

Twins are looking to snap a four-game losing streak at home on Fridays...their last home win on a Friday came on June 26, a 9-8, 10-inning walk-off victory over Colorado...also looking to snap a six-game skid in series openers; Twins' last win in a series opener was an 11-1 victory on August 31 vs. Detroit.

PRIELIPP PUTS A CHEESE-PRINTED BOW ON IT: The Twins beat the Giants Wednesday afternoon at Oracle Park by a score of 4-2, winning the series 2-1, while improving to 26-25 in series finales and 14-13 in rubber games this season...also marked the club's 36th come-from-behind win of the year...Connor Prielipp was the starter but had no part in the decision, allowing two runs on four hits, with two walks and three strikeouts in 5.1 innings of work...Luke Keaschall got the Twins on the board with his 10th jimmy jack, a solo shot in the third and tied the game at 2-2 with a sac fly in the fifth...Walker Jenkins drove in the game-winning run on a pinch-hit RBI single in the seventh, extending his career-best hit streak to seven games...Yoendrys Gómez earned the win in relief, working 1.2 perfect innings with two strikeouts.

RANGER THINGS: The Twins and Rangers are playing the fourth of six games in 2026...Twins completed a three-game sweep of the Rangers from June 15-18 at Globe Life Field...Minnesota out-scored Texas 25-7 in that series.

The Twins are 16-7 against the Rangers since the start of 2023, including a record of 6-4 at home.

Joe Ryan is 2-1 with a 1.61 ERA (22.1 IP, 4 ER), seven walks, 27 strikeouts and a .171 (13-for-76) opponent batting average in four career starts vs. Texas...earned the win in his last start against the Rangers on June 18 at Globe Life Field, working 5.0 scoreless innings (3 H, 2 BB, 7 K).

In 22 career games against the Rangers, Victor Garatini is hitting .343 (24-for-70) with nine walks, three doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI and a .939 OPS.

In 21 career games vs. Texas, Josh Bell is hitting .321 (26-for-81) with nine doubles, one triple, two home runs, 15 RBI, 11 walks and a .929 OPS...this includes 6-for-12 with one double, one home run, six RBI, two walks, three runs scored and a 1.405 OPS in three games against the Rangers this season, with two hits in each game.

Luke Keaschall is 4-for-10 with one double, one RBI, four walks, two runs scored and a 1.071 OPS in four career games against Texas.

Since the start of 2021, 26 of 36 games between these two have been decided by three-or-fewer runs, while 14 games have been decided by one run.

WALK THE WALK: Walker Jenkins drove in the game-winning run with a pinch-hit RBI single in the seventh inning on Wednesday at San Francisco...the knock extended his career-best hitting streak to seven games, tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the American League...Jenkins also enters tonight with 27-straight plate appearances without a strikeout, the second-longest active streak in the majors; his last strikeout was in the second inning on September 17...below are his first 16 career games (August 28-September 16), compared to his last seven games:

TOUCH 'EM ALL: Minnesota hitters have homered in a season-high-tying eight-straight games, since September 16 (9 HR in span); the streak is the second-longest active streak in baseball, behind Arizona's 10-game run...Twins also homered in eight-straight games from June 12-20, a span that encompassed the last time they played the Rangers...Minnesota's 184 longballs overall this season rank sixth in the American League; the club is also third in the AL in runs scored (721).

Kody Clemens leads the Twins with 26 homers this season, which is tied for 13th in the American League.

PEN IS MIGHTY: Over its last eight games since September 16, the Twins' bullpen is 2-2-4 with a 2.12 ERA (29.2 IP, 7 ER), 15 walks, 38 strikeouts, 11 holds and a .215 (23-for-107) opponent batting average...pen combined for 3.2 scoreless innings with one hit allowed, one walk and four strikeouts in Wednesday's series finale at San Francisco.

Andrew Morris earned his fifth save on Wednesday and has a 1.80 ERA (5.0 IP, 1 ER) with three walks, six strikeouts and a .118 (2-for-17) opponent batting average in his last five outings.

Jeff Hoffman's save on Tuesday at San Francisco marked the 15th different Twins pitcher to record a save this season, extending the club record...15 different pitchers with a save is tied with Washington for the most in the majors this season and two short of the American League/National League record of 17, set by Arizona in 2025...Tommy Nance is the only pitcher currently in the Twins' 'pen who does not have a save this season.

'Pen is 1-0-1 with a 2.61 ERA (10.1 IP, 3 ER), two walks, 12 strikeouts, two holds and a .231 (9-for-39) opponent batting average in three games against the Rangers this season.

THE BOOK ON BROOKS: Brooks Lee is hitting .419 (13-for-31) with one double, one home run, four RBI, two walks, seven runs scored and a .990 OPS during his active eight-game hitting streak, since September 16...the streak is tied for his longest this season (also hit safely in eight-straight games from June 23-July 1) and the second longest of his career, behind his 19-game streak in 2025.

CHALLENGE ACCEPTED: Twins enter today with the most ABS challenges among all clubs with 442, ahead of Chicago-AL (436)...Twins have won 243 challenges, also the most in baseball, with a 55% success rate (6th in AL)...they have won 89 of 178 (50% success rate) on the hitting side and 154 of 264 (58% success rate) on the pitching/catching side.
