## CHICAGO CUBS (18-13) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (12-19)

May 1, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 12:35 EDT - Game #32/Home #16

RHP Colin Rea (1-0, 0.96 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (3-2, 2.39 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** snapped their three-game losing streak with a 4-3, come-from-behind win vs. the Cubs on Wednesday...Will wrap up their three-game series with Chicago this afternoon before welcoming San Diego to PNC Park for a three-game set this weekend...Returned to Pittsburgh following a 3-3 road trip to Anaheim (2-1) and Los Angeles (1-2).

**GUIDING THE SHIP:** Pittsburgh bench coach Don Kelly will serve as the team's manager in today's series finale against the Cubs... Manager Derek Shelton will be in Florida, attending the college graduation of his son, Jackson, from Florida Atlantic University.

**CUTCH IS CLUTCH:** In the seventh inning of Wednesday's win over the Cubs, Andrew McCutchen gave Pittsburgh the lead with a two-run double that brought home Isiah Kiner-Falefa and Bryan Reynolds...It marked McCutchen's first go-ahead RBI in the seventh inning or later of a game since his go-ahead solo home run off Jorge López in the eighth inning of a 5-3 win at Wrigley Field on September 2, 2024...McCutchen has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games (since April 18 vs. Cleveland), going 13-for-40 (.325) with four doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, five walks and five runs during that stretch.

**THE RENEGADE:** David Bednar secured his third save of the season with a scoreless ninth inning (one hit, one strikeout) in Wednesday's win over the Cubs...The save was the 87th of Bednar's career, putting him in sole possession of fifth place on the franchise's all-time saves leaderboard...In six appearances since being recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis on April 19, Bednar has a 1.50 ERA (6.0ip/1er) with two saves and eight strikeouts (one walk).

**CUE COUNTRY ROADS:** Paul Skenes will get the start for the Pirates in this afternoon's series finale against the Cubs...Skenes enters today with the lowest WHIP (0.80) among all qualified National League pitchers (third in MLB), while he also ranks fourth in the NL in batting average against (.190), seventh in ERA (2.39) and eighth in innings (37.2).

**ONEIL, OH YEAH:** Oneil Cruz doubled in the first inning on Wednesday (also walked in the third inning), extending his on-base streak to eight straight games (since April 22 at Los Angeles-AL)...He's hit safely in 10 of his last 13 games (since April 16 vs. Washington), going 15-for-49 (.306) with two doubles, six home runs, 11 RBI, eight walks, four steals and 11 runs during that stretch...Cruz' .381 average in the first inning of games this season ranks ninth in all of MLB among players with at least 20 at-bats.

**KE'S TO THE GAME:** Ke'Bryan Hayes had two hits in Wednesday's win against the Cubs, extending his hitting streak to a season-high 10 consecutive games (since April 19 vs. Cleveland)...He is one game shy of tying his career-high 11-game hitting streak from April 1-June 14, 2021...Hayes is batting .333 (13-for-39) with a double and five RBI during the streak...He's a .315 (46-for-146) career hitter against the Cubs, having hit safely in 10 of his last 12 games vs. Chicago, dating back to June 19, 2023 (batting .360 with seven multi-hit games in that span).

**MAKE IT A DOUBLE:** Pittsburgh's top four hitters (Oneil Cruz, Bryan Reynolds, Andrew McCutchen, Joey Bart) each had a double in Wednesday's victory over the Cubs...The four doubles were the Pirates' most in a game since September 18, 2024 at St. Louis and most in a win since July 14, 2024 at Chicago (AL).

**A BOOST FROM THE BULLPEN:** Pittsburgh's bullpen combined to pitch 5.0 innings (Ryan Borucki 1.0, Chase Shugart 1.2, Caleb Ferguson 1.1, David Bednar 1.0) in Wednesday's come-from-behind victory over the Cubs...It was Pittsburgh's second non-extra inning win this season where relievers combined to pitch 5.0-plus innings (also April 22 at Los Angeles-AL), tied for the fourth-most wins of that kind in Major League Baseball...Only Los Angeles-NL (nine), Minnesota (three) and San Francisco (three) have more victories.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

May 1, 2019: The Pirates used a four-run fourth inning to beat the Rangers, 7-5, completing a brief two-game sweep in Arlington. Bryan Reynolds led the way offensively with a double and three RBI, while also extending his hitting streak to begin his career to nine games. Jameson Taillon earned his second win of the season, striking out five Texas batters over his 6.1 innings of work.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

**STARTING OFF:** The 22-year-old righthander will make his seventh of the season in this afternoon’s series finale vs. Chicago...Took home BBWAA National League Rookie of the Year honors in 2024 after making his Major League debut on May 11 vs. the Cubs...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft from Louisiana State University.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Skenes won a 3-0 decision on April 25 at Dodger Stadium, allowing five hits and striking out nine batters (zero walks issued) over 6.1 innings while also throwing a career-high 108 pitches...Skenes became one of only six Pittsburgh starters since 1992 to throw 6.1-plus scoreless innings while issuing zero walks and striking out nine-plus batters in an outing.

**AGAINST THE CUBS:** Skenes will make his fifth career start against the Cubs...He made his Major League debut against Chicago last May 11 here at PNC Park, striking out seven batters over 4.0-plus innings...Per Baseball Reference, the only Pirates starter age 21 or younger with more strikeouts in his debut was Nick Maddox (11) in 1907...He also threw 6.0 no-hit innings with 11 strikeouts, including fanning the first seven hitters of the game, on May 17 at Wrigley Field en route to his first career win...He became the first Pirate to ever strike out seven-plus consecutive hitters to start a game...He allowed three runs (two earned) in 5.0 innings and left with a 10-3 lead on August 28, but had a no-decision...The Cubs then scored two runs in the seventh inning, three in the eighth inning, and six times in the ninth inning to rally to a 14-10 win...Skenes also tossed 5.0 innings (six strikeouts) while winning a 5-0 decision on September 3 at Wrigley Field.

**LIMITING THE HITS:** Skenes has allowed six hits or fewer in each of his first 29 starts to begin his Major League career...Per OptaStats, that’s the second-longest streak (excluding openers) to begin a career, trailing only Shohei Ohtani, who did it in 31 consecutive starts from 2018-21.

**CENTRAL PERK:** Skenes will be making his 13th career start against a team from the National League Central...He has gone 6-3 with a 1.78 ERA (70.2ip/14er) and 96 strikeouts (13 walks) in those 12 starts...All three of his losses against the NL Central have come against the Cardinals.

**OUR ACE:** Through the first 25 starts of his Major League career, Skenes had a 1.92 ERA (145.1ip/31er) with 183 strikeouts....According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he’s the only Major League pitcher since earned runs became an official stat (1912 in the N.L./1913 in the A.L.) to post a sub-2.00 ERA with 175-plus strikeouts in his first 25 Major League games...His 209 strikeouts since making his Major League debut on May 11, 2024 are sixth-most in MLB, behind Chris Sale (219), Zack Wheeler (218), Cole Ragans (215), Tarik Skubal (215) and Logan Gilbert (210).

**OPENING DAY HONORS:** Skenes allowed two runs in 5.1 innings but had a no-decision on Opening Day (March 27) in Miami against the Marlins...At 22 years and 302 days old, Skenes was the youngest Opening Day starter in club history dating back to 1893 (Frank Killen, 22 years and 148 days)...He was also the youngest Major League pitcher to make an Opening Day start since José Fernández, who did so in Miami for the Marlins on March 31, 2014, when he was 21 years and 243 days old...Skenes, who was the top pick in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft, also became the fastest No. 1 overall selection to make an Opening Day start...According to Major League Baseball, the previous quickest to do so were Mike Moore (top pick in 1981 and Opening Day starter in 1984) and Stephen Strasburg (top pick in 2009 and Opening Day starter in 2012).

**ROOKIE OF THE YEAR HONORS:** Last year, Skenes became the second player in Pirates history to take home BBWAA Rookie of the Year honors, along with Jason Bay in 2004...He became the first rookie pitcher to make at least 23 starts and post a sub-2.00 ERA in a single season since Scott Perry with the Philadelphia Athletics in 1918...He also became the 24th pitcher to win the N.L. Rookie of the Year Award and the first to do so since Devin Williams with Milwaukee in 2020.

**IN A LEAGUE OF HIS OWN:** Skenes recorded a 1.96 earned run average in 23 starts during his rookie season in 2024...His 1.96 ERA from the time of his big-league debut on May 11 through the end of the season was the lowest in all of MLB...His .198 batting average against was also the lowest by a Pirates starting pitcher in team history (minimum 16 starts)...His 1.96 ERA was the lowest by a Major League rookie pitcher (minimum 18 starts) in the Live-Ball era (since 1920).
