## CHICAGO CUBS (22-16) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (17-21) May 10, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME \#39/HOME \#19 RHP JAVIER ASSAD ( $3-0,1.66$ ERA) vs. RHP JARED JONES ( $2-3,2.63$ ERA)

THE PIRATES:...were off yesterday....Dropped the deciding game of their three-game series against the Angels on Wednesday...Began the year 9-2 before losing 17 of 22 games between $4 / 9$ and $5 / 3$...Have gone $14-2$ when scoring at least four runs in a game this season (their only losses came on April 25 against Milwaukee and Wednesday vs. the Angels).

ROOKIE RANKINGS: Jared Jones will make his eighth start of the season in the opener of this series against the Cubs...Jones comes into today ranked first among all rookies in MLB in strikeouts (52), second in WHIP (0.78), fourth in batting average against (.184) and seventh in ERA (2.63).

LAST TIME OUT: Jared Jones retired 20 of the 21 batters he faced in 7.0 scoreless innings, struck out 10 batters, and had a no-decision in his last start on May 4 against the Rockies... It was Jones' second career 10-plus strikeout game along with his Major League debut on March 30 at Miami...Jones joined Jose DeLeon as the only two pitchers in Pirates history to record multiple double-digit strikeout games within his first seven career games (DeLeon did so in his third and seventh game).

AND THE WHIFF: Jared Jones has four outings with seven-plus strikeouts and no walks...That's the most ever by a Major League pitcher in their first seven career games...The previous mark was held by Stephen Strasburg, who had three such outings in his first seven games in 2010...Jones also has 122 swings and misses this season...That's the most by a pitcher in his first seven career starts in the pitch-tracking era (2008)...The previous record was held by Masahiro Tanaka (113)... Special thanks to Sarah Langs and Jason Benard.

CASHING IN AT PNC: Jared Jones has thrown at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer runs in each of his first three MLB home games...The last Pirates pitcher with such a streak to begin his MLB career was Jon Lieber in 1994 (also first three home games)...The only Pittsburgh player in the modern era to do this in their first four home games was Tim Wakefield in 1992.

PAUL GETS THE CALL: Tomorrow afternoon Paul Skenes is scheduled to make his big league debut after being selected №. 1 overall in the draft by the Pirates in 2023...Skenes comes into today rated as the No. 1 pitching prospect (and No. 3 overall) by MLB Pipeline...Coming into today, the 21-year-old Skenes ranked first in the International League in ERA ( 0.99 ) and WHIP (0.91) and third in strikeouts (45).

A PROMOTION IS IN ORDER: The Pirates recalled infielder Nick Gonzales from Triple-A Indianapolis today...The 24 -year-old Gonzales was selected seventh overall by the Pirates in the 2020 First-Year Player Draft...He was also rated as the No. 1 prospect among all second basemen in 2022 by MLB Pipeline...Infielder Alika Williams has been optioned to Triple-A to make room for Gonzales on the 26-man active roster.

CENTRAL PARKED: Tonight the Pirates begin a stretch of 10 straight games against teams from the National League Central... The Pirates and Cubs will face each other seven times during this 10-game stretch...The other three games will come against the Brewers beginning Monday night at American Family Field.

BITS ON BRYAN: Bryan Reynolds is one of three players this season to lead their team outright in hits, walks and RBI, along with Riley Greene and Ryan McMahon...According to StatsPerform, this would be Reynolds' third season leading the Pirates in all three categories (2021, 2022), tied for the most in franchise history (since RBI became official in 1920) along with Ralph Kiner (1949, 1950, 1952).

MICHAEL'S MILESTONE: The next game for Michael A. Taylor will be his 1000th in the big leagues...Since the beginning of the 2021 season, Taylor has the second-most Defensive Runs Saved (53) among all players in MLB regardless of position according to the Fielding Bible...The only player with more Defensive Runs Saved in that time is current teammate Ke'Bryan Hayes (65).

CRUZING ALONG: Oneil Cruz is hitting at a 327 clip (16-for-49) with three doubles, two home runs and nine RBI in his last 15 games dating back to April 22...Cruz' . 327 average since April 22 ranks 10th among all National League players.

May 10, 1960: Vernon Law tossed a complete game and improved to $5-1$ on the season as the Bucs won 3-2 at Los Angeles. All three Pirates

PAUL SKENES: The 21-year-old righthander is scheduled to make his big league debut tomorrow afternoon against the Cubs...Entered this season rated as the No. 1 pitching prospect (and third-best prospect overall) by MLB Pipeline...Struck out 42.9 percent of the batters he faced this year at Triple-A Indianapolis, where he went $0-0$ with an 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/3er), 45 strikeouts, . 175 batting average against and 0.91 WHIP in seven starts.. Will make his Major League debut just 307 days after being selected No. 1 overall in the 2023 draft, making him the quickest top pick to reach the Majors in 35 years (RHP Ben McDonald of the Orioles made it to the Majors in 1989 in the same year he was drafted)...Won the College World Series Most Outstanding Player after he led the LSU Tigers to a national championship in 2023...Was rated as having the "Best Fastball", "Best Breaking Ball" third in "Best Control" and fifth in "Best Changeup" in the 2023 college class by Baseball America (Baseball America also rated him as the "Best Athlete" among the 2023 class).
