NL East

The Braves beat the Royals, 6-0, last night, while the Marlins topped the Rockies, 2-1. Coupled with wins by the Mets, Nationals and Phillies on Thursday, the entire NL East has started the season 1-0.

Per StatsPerform, the 2026 National League East is the first division in major league history to have all of its teams start 1-0. Major League Baseball officially moved to divisional play in 1969.

Four of the five teams in the AL East this season won their openers, while two teams in both the AL Central and NL Central did so. Just one team in both West divisions won their opening game.

Baldwin reached base twice last night, working a walk and lining a solo home run out to right.

Opening in Interleague

For the first time in franchise history, Atlanta will open its season with an interleague series as the Braves host the Kansas City Royals this weekend.

The Royals are opening with interleague play for just the second time, after hosting the Mets in 2016 in a World Series rematch from the previous autumn.

Atlanta will play 12 of its first 16 games against American League opponents to open the year, with just one of its first five series of the season against a fellow NL club. The Braves will host the Athletics (AL) to complete its opening homestand, before subsequent series against the D-backs (NL), Angels (AL) and Guardians (AL).

The Braves went 22-26 (.458) in interleague play last season, including wins in each of their final four such games. Since Major League Baseball introduced a balanced schedule for the 2023 season, Atlanta's 80-61 (.567) record in interleague play ranks eighth in all of baseball.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Royals continue the 2026 season tonight with the second of a three-game series...This weekend marks the only scheduled games between the two teams this year.

A Atlanta never trailed last night, scoring once in the first inning and adding on runs in the third, fourth and seventh to work to a win, 6-0.

A Atlanta dropped two-of-three against Kansas City last season at Kauffman Stadium in Missouri, its first series defeat to the Royals since 2019...The Braves won the opener before losing the next two games...Since MLB moved to a balanced schedule in 2023, meaning the two clubs now play every year, Atlanta is 7-3 (.700) vs. Kansas City.

A Last night's win moved Atlanta to 3-3 against Kansas City all-time here at Truist Park...The Braves dropped the first two games between the clubs here in 2019, but have since won 3-of-4... The Braves are 8-6 (.571) against the Royals all time in the city of Atlanta.

A Entering this weekend, Atlanta and Kansas City had played just 26 times since the advent of interleague play in 1997, with the Braves going 14-12 (.538) in these games...Atlanta's 26 games versus the Royals were its second-fewest against any team that was in the AL at the time interleague play was introduced (Cleveland - 24 games)...For comparison, Atlanta has played Boston 100 times in interleague play.

A RH Michael Wacha is set tonight to make his eighth career start and 10th total appearance against Atlanta, and his first since 2023 while with the Padres...The 6-foot-6, 215-pound native of Iowa City is 1-4 with a 4.42 ERA (19 ER/38.2 IP) in his career versus the Braves, but did earn his lone win in that 2023 start...He pitched 6.0 scoreless innings with 10 strikeouts and just two hits allowed in the victory here at Truist Park.

REYNALDO LÓPEZ: Makes his first start of the season in his third year with Atlanta...The 6-foot-1, 225-pound native of the Dominican Republic made just one start with the Braves last year before undergoing season-ending shoulder surgery.

A In five Grapefruit League starts this spring, he went 2-2 with a 4.15 ERA (8 ER/17.1 IP) and fanned 15...Opponents batted .246 against him on the spring.

A In his last full season in 2024, López went 8-5 with a 1.99 ERA (30 ER/135.2 IP) in 26 games, 25 starts...His 1.99 ERA was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 25 starts...He completed 135.2 innings on the season, 26.1 shy of qualifying for the ERA title.

A The right-hander has made more starts against Kansas City in his career than any other team in baseball, and his 27 total appearances against the Royals trail just his 30 games versus the Tigers... He is 5-5 with an even 5.00 ERA (52 ER/93.2 IP) in his career versus Kansas City,

OPENING DAY SHUTOUT: Atlanta pitchers Chris Sale, Dylan Lee, Robert Suarez & Tyler Kinley combined to allow just five hits and three walks in a shutout of Kansas City last night...The quartet fanned eight.

A Last night's victory was the first shutout on Opening Day for Atlanta since blanking Washington in 2011, and the ninth since the club moved to the city in 1966...The Braves have never pitched shutouts in each of their first two games to open a season.

A Atlanta was one of four teams to pitch a shutout on Opening Day this season, joining New York-AL, Boston and Los Angeles-AL...The Yankees have yet to allow a run in either of their two games this season.

A Dating to the start of the 2020 season, the Braves' 72 total shutouts rank fourth in the majors behind just the Padres (80), Brewers (80) and Dodgers (75).

DEFENSE: Atlanta turned a pair of double plays and was credited with two defensive runs saved last night in the shutout of Kansas City...The Braves are one of just five teams in baseball this season with multiple defensive runs saved in their only game of the year.

A Eli White snagged a two-out liner from Salvador Perez to end last night's third inning with runners on first and second...The ball had a catch percentage of just 25% and qualified as a five-star catch...He is one of just two defenders in baseball this season with a five-star grab.

A Atlanta's defense last season committed just 54 errors in 162 games, fewest in the National League and more than just Texas (51) in all of baseball...The Braves ranked fifth in the majors with 45 defensive runs saved on the year...The 54 errors marked the fewest in a full, 162-game season in Atlanta franchise history (since 1966).

OZZIE ALBIES: Collected a pair of hits on Opening Day last night, including a first-inning homer down the left-field line...He made his ninth consecutive Opening Day start at second base for Atlanta last night, the most such season-opening starts at the position in franchise history.

A Albies also homered on Opening Day last season, and has three total season-opening homers in his career...Only Eddie Mathews (7) and Joe Torre (4) have more, while Freddie Freeman, Andruw Jones, Brian McCann, Fred McGriff and Dale Murphy also have three.

BETTER START THIS YEAR!: The Braves beat the Royals, 6-0, last night on Opening Day to go 1-0 to start the season...Atlanta dropped each of the seven games on its season-opening road trip to San Diego (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (0-3) last year.

A It was the Braves' longest season-opening losing streak since dropping each of their first nine games in 2016.

A The Braves moved to 27-34 (.443) all-time on Opening Day in Atlanta franchise history.

Today's Game

- Enters his third season with Atlanta and eighth full major league season.
- Is set to make his first start of the season and 124th career start...Has gone 33-42 with a 4.17 ERA in 122 previous career starts, and 14-12 with a 2.99 ERA in 146 outings out of the bullpen.
- Transitioned to the starting rotation after signing with Atlanta prior to the 2024 season...In 26 starts with the Braves in 2024, pitched to a 2.00 ERA (30 ER/134.2 IP) and was named to the NL All-Star team for the first time in his career.
- Made just one start in 2025 before being placed on the injured list on April 1 with right shoulder inflammation...Was transferred to the 60-day injured list on April 3 and underwent exploratory arthroscopic surgery on April 8.
- Went 2-2 with a 4.15 ERA in five Grapefruit League starts this spring, striking out 15 over 17.1 innings.
- Is 5-5 with a 5.00 ERA (52 ER/93.2 IP) in 27 career appearances (15 starts) against Kansas City.

Braves Recap

- Made just one start in 2025, April 1 at San Diego, allowing three earned runs and nine hits with one strikeout over 5.0 innings...Was placed on the 15-day injured list the following day with right shoulder inflammation...Was transferred to the 60-day injured list on April 3 and underwent arthroscopic right shoulder surgery on April 8...Missed the remainder of the season.
- In his first season with Atlanta in 2024, was named to the National League All-Star team, going 8-5 with a 1.99 ERA (30 ER/135.2 IP) in 26 games, 25 starts...His 2024 NL All-Star selection was the first of his career.
- His 1.99 ERA was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 25 starts in 2024.
- His 1.78 ERA at Truist Park was the lowest among qualifiers at home.
- His 2.00 ERA as a starter was the lowest in a player's first stint with the team in Braves franchise history dating to the Live Ball era (min. 25 starts).
- It was the fourth lowest ERA in baseball history (since 1920) for a player with at least 25 starts to begin a stint with a new franchise in a single season after making their debut with a different team...Only Hall-of-Famer Gaylord Perry (Cleveland, 1972) along with Roger Clemens (Toronto, '97), and Kevin Brown (Florida, '96) had lower ERAs in their first season with a new team.
- Did not allow more than two earned runs in 23 of his 26 outings in 2024.
- Recorded his first double-digit strikeout effort on August 20, 2024...It was the seventh of his career and first since September 5, 2019 at Cleveland.
- Missed 12 games in 2024 after being placed on the 15-day injured list on August 5 with right forearm inflammation...Missed 13 games later in the season with right shoulder inflammation.
- Pitched to a .090 opponent batting average with runners in scoring position in 2024; the lowest rate in the majors among starters with at least 10 outings.
- López's 1.57 ERA (13 ER/74.1 IP) was the lowest by a Brave through 13 starts since Hall-of-Famer Tom Glavine pitched to a 1.57 ERA and a 9-2 record in 2002...Glavine and fellow Hall-of-Famer Greg Maddux (1.41) are the only other starters in the Atlanta era (since 1966) with lower ERAs through 13 starts.

- Signed by the Atlanta Braves to a three-year contract with a club option for 2027 on November 20, 2023.
- Has played for five teams over a 10-year career...Started his career in the rotation, before transitioning to the bullpen in 2021.
- Made his major league debut on July 19, 2016 with Washington...Suffered an 8-4 loss to Los Angeles (NL) after starting the game and going 4.2 innings.
- Acquired by the White Sox on December 7, 2016 in a four-player trade that sent Adam Eaton to Washington...López, Dane Dunning and Lucas Giolito went to Chicago.
- Claimed off waivers by Cleveland from Los Angeles (AL) on July 19, 2022.
- Traded by Chicago (AL) to Los Angeles (AL) on July 26, 2023 along with Lucas Giolito in exchange for Edgar Quero and Ky Bush.
- Traded by Washington to Chicago (AL) along with Lucas Giolito, and Dane Dunning for Adam Eaton.
- Signed by Washington as a minor league free agent on August 8, 2012.

Aaron Bummer • LHP • 6-3 • 215 • 32 yrs • #49

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 0/0 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Appeared in 42 games in his second season as a Brave, pitching to a 3-2 record and a 3.81 ERA (23 ER/54.1 IP) with 51 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP, his lowest since 2020...Was placed on the injured list on August 24 due to left shoulder inflammation and missed the remainder of the season.
- Ranked in the 99th percentile in baseball with a barrel rate of just 3.2% in 2025...He allowed just five barrels in 156 batted balls...His seven total barrels and 2.3% barrel rate allowed since joining the Braves in 2024 are both the best in the majors (min. 400 batters faced).
- Opponents hit ground balls off him 55.8% of the time last season (league average 42.4%)...That rate ranked in the 94th percentile for the season...Since his debut in 2017, Bummer's career ground ball rate of 64.2% is highest in the majors (min. 350 games).
- Tossed his curveball a career-high 35.1% of the time in 2025, the most of any major league pitcher with at least 900 total pitches last season...Utilized a curveball for the first time in 2024 at a 2.3% clip.

Didier Fuentes • RHP • 6-0 • 170 • 20 yrs • #72

- Currently ranks as the Braves' third best prospect according to *MLB Pipeline*.
- In four appearances this spring, two starts, Fuentes went 3-0 with a 0.66 ERA (1 ER/13.2 IP), allowing four total baserunners while striking out 18.
- Made four starts with Atlanta in 2025, his debut season, going 0-3 with a 13.85 ERA and 12 punchouts.
- Made his major league debut on June 20 against Miami at 20 years and three days old, becoming the youngest starter to make their MLB debut for Atlanta since Mike McQueen, October 2, 1969 (19 years, 33 days-old).
- Fanned six across 3.2 innings in his Truist Park debut on July 2 vs. Los Angeles-AL...Is the youngest pitcher and second-youngest player (Juan Soto, 19) to play at Truist.

Raisel Iglesias • RHP • 6-2 • 190 • 35 yrs • #26

- In his third full season with Atlanta, appeared in a career-high 70 games and went 29-for-34 in save opportunities...Pitched to a 3.21 ERA (24 ER/67.1 IP)...Ranked fourth in the NL and tied for ninth in the majors in saves.
- Among active pitchers with as many appearances since his Braves debut on August 5, 2022 (222 apps.), Iglesias owns the best WHIP (0.94) and second-best ERA (2.35, 57 ER/218.2 IP)...Houston's Bryan Abreu is the only pitcher with a better ERA (2.25).
- Ranks second among Braves pitchers in franchise history (min. 100 G) in WHIP and ERA+ (180), third in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.88), fourth in hits-per-nine-innings (6.5) and fifth in ERA and saves (97).
- Did not allow a run in 42 of 45 appearances from June 9 until the end of the season...Led major league pitchers in this span (min. 40.0 IP) in hits-per-nine-innings (4.15) and saves (21), tied for the most fWAR among relievers (1.5) and ranked second in ERA (1.25, 6 ER/43.1 IP) and WHIP (0.69).
- Racked up 13 or more consecutive scoreless appearances three times in 2025, the first Braves pitcher to record three such streaks in a season since Jonny Venters in 2011 (also three).
- Became the 40th pitcher in history, and fifth active, with 250 saves when he converted on September 16 versus Washington...Is tied with Edwin Diaz for the fourth-most saves (253) among active pitchers.
- Was named the NL Reliever of the Month for August for the third consecutive season after converting all 10 of his save opportunities and allowing a 0.69 ERA (1 ER/13.0 IP) in the month...Since his debut in 2015, Iglesias' 2.09 ERA (37 ER/159.1 IP) in August is the lowest among major league pitchers with at least 150.0 IP.

Tyler Kinley • RHP • 6-4 • 220 • 35 yrs • #45

- Made 49 appearances with Colorado to the tune of a 5.66 ERA (30 ER/47.2 IP) in 2025 before being acquired by Atlanta on July 30...Pitched to a 5-0 record with a 0.72 ERA (2 ER/25.0 IP), a 0.68 WHIP and 22 strikeouts in 24 outings with Atlanta to conclude the season.
- Allowed a run in his third appearance with the Braves, August 5, and then allowed one additional tally over his final 21 games...Strung together a career-high scoreless streak of 19.1 innings between runs.
- From his Braves debut on July 31 until the end of the season, Kinley led major league pitchers (min. 25.0 IP) in ERA and ranked third in WHIP and opponent's batting average (.126).
- Among Braves pitchers with at least 24 appearances in a season, Kinley holds the second-best ERA, WHIP, hits-per-nine-innings (4.0) and ERA+ (583) marks in a single campaign.
- Held opposing righties to a .192 batting average in 2025, including a .091 clip while with Atlanta.
- Ranked in the 100th percentile in baseball by allowing a hard-hit percentage of 29.6 percent...Ranked in the 93rd percentile with an average exit velocity of 87.0 mph.

Dylan Lee • LHP • 6-3 • 214 • 31 yrs • #52

- Set a career high and led the team with 74 appearances, going 2-4 with a 3.29 ERA (25 ER/68.1 IP) and matching a career high with 76 punchouts...Collected the first two saves of his major league career.
- Did not allow a run in 31 of his first 38 appearances through June 29, tying for the sixth-lowest ERA (1.67, 7 ER/37.2 IP) among major league pitchers in that span (min. 35.0 IP).
- Ranked in the 90th percentile or better in baseball in expected ERA (91st, 2.91), walk percentage (92nd, 5.3%), hard-hit percentage (93rd, 33.5%), and whiff percentage (95th, 33.6%).
- Threw his slider 612 times and surrendered just 22 hits on it...Among pitchers that threw as many on the season, those 22 hits were the fewest in MLB...His slider carried a run value of 10, also ranking in the 95th percentile.
- Dating to his first full season in 2022, Lee's 2.76 ERA ranks fourth among all left-handed relievers in baseball to make at least 175 appearances...Among those pitchers, Lee's rate of 4.80 strikeouts-per-walk is best in the majors.

Joel Payamps • RHP • 6-3 • 214 • 31 yrs • #34

- Split 2025 between Milwaukee and Atlanta, combining to go 0-1 with a 6.84 ERA (20 ER/26.1 IP) in 30 total games between the two clubs.
- Was claimed off waivers by Atlanta on September 22 and allowed one run in 2.2 innings over a pair of appearances.
- Ten of the 20 earned runs he allowed on the season came in two of his first seven appearances on the year...Outside of those two games, pitched to a 3.60 ERA (10 ER/25.0 IP) in his other 28 appearances.

Robert Suarez • RHP • 6-2 • 227 • 35 yrs • #50

- Earned his second consecutive NL All Star appearance with San Diego in 2025, compiling a 4-6 record with a 2.97 ERA (23 ER/69.2 IP), and setting career highs in saves (40) and strikeouts (75) and appearances (70)...His 40 saves led the NL and trailed only Kansas City's Carlos Estevez (42) for the most in the majors.
- Earned NL Reliever of the Month, the second such honor of his career, for March/April after allowing one run and five hits while going 10-for-10 in save opportunities across 12 appearances.
- Ranked in the 97th percentile league-wide in fastball velocity (98.6 mph)...Opponents batted .155 against it with a 63.4% usage rate.
- Opponents batted .163 (26-for-160) against him with the bases empty.
- His 76 total saves since the beginning of the 2024 season are five more than any other pitcher in baseball.
- Since his debut in 2022, he owns the fifth-best WHIP (0.98) and seventh-best hits-per-nine-innings mark (6.1) among relievers with at least 200 appearances.
