METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action and fell to the Phillies, 2-1, in 10-innings last night...The Mets are 9-2 in extra-innings this year...The Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (12-3)...The Mets are 57-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 26-6-3 in 35 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-game homestand (7-2), their longest of the year, against the Braves (4-1), Reds (3-0) and Phillies (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets head out on a 10-game, nine-day road trip to Atlanta (four games), Philadelphia (four games) and New York-AL (two games).

I GET KNOCKED DOWN, BUT I GET UP AGAIN: The Mets are 30-9 (.769) following a loss this year...The .769 winning percentage is the best in the majors

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, THERE IS SUCH A THING: Happy Birthday to Taijuan Walker, who celebrates his 30th birthday today...Walker has recorded his second season with double-digit victories this year...The righty is 10-3 with a 3.43 ERA with 31 walks and 85 strikeouts in 20 starts in 2022.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 73 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their .642 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 73-40 record through the team's first 113 games...Only the 1986 (76-37) team posted a better record through the first 113 games of the season.

HOMESTAND BY ME: The Mets are batting .289/.371/.443 during their current homestand...They have recorded 36 extra-base hits and 33 walks...New York is 30-95 (.316) with a .376 OBP with RISP during the current stand...The Mets have posted a 2.96 ERA (27 earned runs/82.0 innings) with 17 walks and 97 strikeouts during the hometand... The Mets have outscored their opponents 53-29 in the nine games.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets are 10-2 in their last 12 games in Queens...Overall, the Mets are 38-19 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .667 winning percentage at home...The team's .667 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 (55-26, .679) and 1986 (55-26, .679) teams had a better record at home...The Mets have posted a 3.23 ERA with 162 walks and 558 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 15-5 in the second-half...The team's 15 wins are the second-most in the majors, as is their .750 winning percentage...The team is batting .293/.363/.472 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and OBP and are tied for second in runs and third in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 108-65 following the break.

deCITI OF BROTHERLY SHOVE: Jacob deGrom has a 2.29 career ERA against the Phillies with further success at home vs. Philadelphia, posting a 2.07 ERA (15 earned runs/65.1 innings) with 74 strikeouts against 13 walks in 10 starts...He is unbeaten in his last eight starts vs. Philadelphia with a 1.57 ERA (8 earned runs/46.0 innings) in those outings...He has not allowed more than two runs in his last four home starts against the Phillies and has allowed more than three runs twice in 19 starts against the club overall... The Mets are 15-4 when deGrom starts against the Phils in his career.

(ALMOST) UNHITTABLE SLIDER: Jacob deGrom hrew 33 sliders in his last start that generated 18 swings and misses on 20 swings at the pitch overall...That 90 percent whiff rate was the highest against a single pitch type in an outing since pitches began being tracked in 2008 (min. 20 swings)...Braves hitters swung and missed on their first 18 tries before Michael Harris II made contact (foul ball).

MILESTONE ALERT: DeGrom has not allowed more than two earned runs in his last 21 home starts, tied with Andrew Cashner (2013-2015) for the longest streak all-time...This streak is part of a 33-start stretch at Citi Field in which deGrom has allowed more than three earned runs only once, posting a 1.64 ERA (38 earned runs/208.2 innings) at home since May 1, 2019...He had a 1.20 ERA (8 earned runs/60.0 innings) in 2021...His 2.11 career home ERA is the best among active pitchers (min. 500.0 innings) and the fifthlowest since ER became an official stat in 1913...The four pitchers with a better home ERA all had their careers end before 1930.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East, the only division with three 60-win clubs thus far...Overall, the Mets are 37-15 against the East this year...Their .711 division winning percentage is the best in baseball...They have not lost a series in the division all season long...According to ESPN Stats & Info, New York has either won or tied each of their 15 series this season against the East...That is the third-longest streak by a team to start a season since the MLB implemented divisions in 1969...It's the longest since the Braves went 16 straight to start the 1999 season...Since May 27, the team has gone 24-8 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.11 ERA against the East, while hitting .263/.340/.420...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 266-170. opponents, 266-170.

FOR STARTERS: Since Scherzer returned from the IL on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 2.22 ERA (49 earned runs/199.0 innings) in the team's last 33 games with 213 strikeouts and 48 walks...The Dodgers are second in that period with a 2.74 ERA, followed by the Phillies with a 3.03 ERA...New Yorks' 213 strikeouts in that span also lead the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.49 in that span...The Mets rank fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.49 ERA from their starters.

WHAT A RELIEF: The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.55 ERA (151 earned runs/383.1 innings) this season...That places them third in the National League...Their 440 strikeouts are third in the Senior Circuit and tied for fifth in the majors. PHILS-METS NOTES: The Mets have outscored the Phillies 67-46 in 13 games this season...The Mets have won six of their last eight games against the Phillies.

fWAR WHAT IS IT GOOD fOR?: Francisco Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 5.0 fWAR...He is on a 19-game on-base streak...It is the second-longest on-base streak in his career...He owned a career-best 29-game streak from July 16-August 17, 2017...Since July 23, he is batting .400 (28-70) with 20 runs, five doubles, four home runs, 15 RBI, 11 walks with a .482 OBP and a .643 SLG...In 37 games since the start of July, Lindor is batting .329/.409/.552 with 29 runs, six doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 25 RBI, 18 walks and a .961 OPS...He ranks tied for second in the majors with 21 ne obend PU habind teamments Put Alexae (20). with 21 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (30).

JUST SHORT: Francisco Lindor has hit 20 home runs this season (19 as a shortstop)... Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016... He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...He has recorded 81 RBI in 112 games this season (79 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He is sixth the majors and fourth in the NL with 81 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with at least 75 RBI this year.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs...Alonso is second in the majors and leads the National League with 96 RBI...He is ninth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a .540 SLG.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Tomás Nido has hit .289 (13-45) with six runs, five doubles, four RBI, four walks with a .347 OBP and a .400 SLG in 15 games since the All-Star break...He is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .333 (7-21) with three runs, two RBI with an .840 OPS in that span.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 93 strikeouts...That is 22 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out 53.1% of batters faced (93/175), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 46appearances of a season in MLB history...His 18.06 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 26 saves, a 1.36 ERA (seven earned runs/46.1 innings), allowing 27 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 40-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 19 outings dating back to June 22, covering 19.0 innings, establishing a new career-high scoreless streak...39 of Díaz last 53 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.35 ERA (one earned runs/25.2 innings) with 11 hits, two walks and 55 strikeouts...He has converted all 15 saves in that period.

A CENTURY: Díaz has struck out 93 batters in 46 games this season...He is seeking to become the seventh reliever in franchise history to strike out 100 batters in a season... The last player to do that was Seth Lugo in 2019...His career-high best is 124 strikeouts in 73 games in 2018...His record with the Mets is 99 strikeouts in 66 games in 2019...Díaz is eighth on the Mets all-time strikeouts list for relievers...The late Pedro Feliciano is seventh with 350 strikeouts with the Mets.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 78 times this year...lt's tied for their third-highest total in franchise history...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...The Mets were plunked 94 times last year...Mark Canha (14), Brandon Nimmo (13) and Pete Alonso (10) all rank in the top 10 in hit by pitches this season.

BACH IN A NEW YORK GROOVE: Daniel Vogelbach is the first Met to reach base in at least 13 straight starts to begin his Mets tenure since Norichika Aoki (15 starts) in 2017...Since he made his Mets debut on July 24, the Mets are first in MLB in each of the triple-slash categories (.303/.375/.498), tied for first in winning percentage (.833) and second in runs per game (5.89) and extra-base hits (71)...He is batting .333 (15-45) with six runs, four doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, 10 walks with a .464 OBP and a .556 SLG in 16 games with the Mets.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets are tied for the lead in the majors with 1,079 strikeouts this season...It's a franchise record for most strikeouts through 113 games in a season...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 58 times this year, the most in MLB...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 852 times this season...That is the fourth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

deGROM NEWS & NOTES

WELCOME HOME: deGrom's 2022 home debut marked his 200th career start and his first at Citi Field since July 7, 2021...Took a perfect game into the sixth inning before allowing a two-out walk...Lost the no-hit bid and shutout on the following batter when Dansby Swanson homered...He threw 76 pitches over 5.2 innings, earning his first win of the season as the Mets defeated the Braves, 5-2...He allowed two runs on one hit with 12 strikeouts against one walk...His 12 strikeouts marked the most by a Mets pitcher this season...Additionally, he picked up his 54th career game with 10 or more strikeouts, the third-most in the majors since 2014...Has 19 games with 12 or more strikeouts, the fourthmost in the majors since 2014.

MILESTONE ALERT: Has not allowed more than two earned runs in his last 21 home starts, tied with Andrew Cashner (2013-2015) for the longest streak all-time...Shohei Ohtani also had a 20-start streak that ended in May of this year.

200 CLUB: On August 7, 2022 against Atlanta, deGrom set the MLB record for most strikeouts through a pitcher's first 200 career starts with 1,523...He surpassed the previous record set by Yu Darvish with 1,517...Through his first 200 games, deGrom recorded a 2.50 ERA...Only five pitchers have had a lower ERA through 200 career games (min. 1,000 IP): Dutch Leonard (2.09), Carl Mays (2.23), Reb Russell (2.28), and Baseball Hall of Famers Red Faber (2.41) and Tom Seaver (2.42).

IN deCITI: Has allowed more than three earned runs only once in his last 33 starts in Queens, posting a 1.64 ERA (38 ER/208.2 IP) at home since May 1, 2019...He had a 1.20 ERA (8 ER/60.0 IP) in 2021...His 2.11 career home ERA is the best among active pitchers (min. 500.0 innings) and the fifth-lowest since ER became an official stat in 1913...The four pitchers with a better home ERA all had their careers end before 1930.

VS. OVERPOWERING HEATER: DeGrom used his fastball 57.4 percent of the time last season...Even giving hitters a better than 50-50 chance of guessing what was coming, the pitch has been nearly untouchable, with batters going 28-182 (.154) with 66 strikeouts in at bats ending on the fastball since the start of last year...He's averaged 99.2 mph on the offering, the highest ever by a starting pitcher over a full season.

THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE: Since 2018, deGrom owns a 1.95 ERA in 93 starts... That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 400.0 IP)...Justin Verlander is second with a 2.39 ERA, while teammate Max Scherzer has posted a 2.63 ERA since 2018...Since 1920, only three other starting pitchers have held an ERA of 1.95 or lower over a span this long: Sandy Koufax, Greg Maddux and Clayton Kershaw.

WHEN deLIGHTS GO DOWN: Ranks second among all active pitchers in the Majors with at least 50 career starts in night games with a career 2.80 ERA...Clayton Kershaw is the only active player with a better mark, posting a 2.53 ERA in night games...Additionally, deGrom has a 2.25 career ERA (112 ER/448.1 IP) in 69 starts in night games at Citi Field. JACOB deGROM'S RECORD-SETTING 2021 SEASON (MIN. 90.0 IP)

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (9–7, 3.39)

LAST OUTING: Recorded his second consecutive win against Cincinnati, tying a season-high 8.0 innnings pitched in a 5-1 victory on August 8 at Citi Field...Allowed just one run on eight hits with one walk against eight strikeouts...Marked first time in his career with multiple starts of 8.0 or more innings in a season...Earned his ninth win of the season.

MORE LIKE BASSIX: Bassitt has completed 6.0 innings or more in 17 of his 21 starts this season, including each of his last nine...That is the longest streak of his career, surpassing a seven-start streak from July 11-August 21, 2015.
