BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals and division-rival Chicago Cubs begin a four-game series at Busch Stadium tonight as the Redbirds continue their eight-game homestand against the Diamondbacks (0-1), Reds (1-2), and Cubs ... St. Louis is 3-7 through its first 10 of 20 consecutive games before their next open date on August 6, longest since the Cardinals played 20 straight from April 19-May 8, 2022 (11-9 record) ... St. Louis has gone 6-12 since taking two-of-three from the Cubs at Wrigley Field over Independence Day weekend (July 6-present).

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters play today in 4th place in the National League Central, 13.0 games behind 1st place Milwaukee ... The Cardinals are 6th in the NL Wild Card race, sitting 1.5 games behind Arizona for the final spot ... According to *Elias*, St. Louis has played MLB's 2nd-hardest strength of schedule (.511) this season behind only the Pirates (.512) ... The Cardinals (-1), Diamondbacks (-5), Phillies (-11), Rangers (-25), and Guardians (-18) are the five MLB teams with winning records, but negative run differentials.

ARCH RIVALS: Today marks the Cardinals first four-game weekday series vs. the Cubbies in St. Louis since Sept. 25-28, 2017 ... St. Louis is combined 14-7 this season against Chicago (4-2), Pittsburgh (5-2), and Cincinnati (5-3), but just 2-8 vs. Milwaukee.

CARDS COMBOS: **Alec Burleson** (116 hits) and **Jordan Walker** (114 hits) are the first pair of Cardinals with 114+ hits by team game 105 since the 2013 trio of **Allen Craig** (124), **Yadier Molina** (119), and **Matt Carpenter** (126) ... Burleson (70 RBI) and Walker (77 RBI) are the first Cardinals duo with 70+ RBI in the first 105 games of a season since **Matt Holliday** (75) and newest Hall of Famer **Carlos Beltrán** (76 RBI) in 2012 ... The Cardinals have not had a left-right combo with 100 RBI since the 2004 MV3 of 1B **Albert Pujols** (123), 3B **Scott Rolen** (124), and OF **Jim Edmonds** (111).

SOME LIKE IT HOT: Tonight's first pitch temperature is scheduled to be the hottest Cardinals-Cub game in St. Louis since 99° exactly three years ago on July 27, 2023 ... The hottest Cards-Cubs game in St. Louis on record is 104° on Sept. 5, 1954.

START ME UP: Since the All-Star break (July 17-present), the Cardinals starting rotation ranks among MLB leaders in innings pitched (59.1, 1st), quality starts (6, T-1st), and ERA (3.34, 5th).

BASH AND DASH: **Jordan Walker** has driven in **JJ Wetherholt** 20 times this season, accounting for MLB's highest run-scoring combo ... Since the Wild Card Era began in 1994, the best run-scoring Cards duos have been **Scott Rolen** > **Albert Pujols** (32 in 2004) and **Matt Holliday** > **Matt Carpenter** (32 in 2014). - *Elias*

MILESTONE WATCH: **JJ Wetherholt** is one hit away from reaching 100 ... **Jordan Walker** is two hits away from matching his career-high 116 from his 2023 rookie season ... **Alec Burleson's** next double passes his career-high 26 from last season ... **Riley O'Brien's** next appearance (43) is a career-high, while his next strikeout is his 45th, matching his career-high.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (July 27, 2023): After catcher **Willson Contreras** is removed from the game after suffering a scalp laceration from being struck in the back of the head on a **Ian Happ** backswing in the top of the first inning, starting pitcher **Miles Mikolas** beans Happ two pitches later and is ejected from the game along with manager **Oliver Marmol** ... It marked the first time in the Expansion Era (since 1961) in which a Cardinals starting battery did not complete the first inning of a game ... The Cardinals lost 10-3 in front of a sellout crowd coinciding with the Cubs first visit to St. Louis of the season.

CHICAGO CUBS CONNECTIONS

Iván Herrera tallied his first MLB hit vs. the Cubs with a single (June 26, 2022)...**José Fermín** notched his first career MLB hit at the Cubs (July 21, 2023) with a bunt single...**Pedro Pagés** swatted his first MLB homer (June 14, 2024) at the Cubs.

JoJo Romero recorded his first MLB save on July 30, 2023 vs. the Cubs.

George Soriano's first cousin is former Cubs OF **Alfonso Soriano** (2007-13).

Carson Kelly was drafted by St. Louis in 2012 and played three seasons (2016-18) for the Cardinals.

Phil Maton pitched in 40 games as a reliever for the Cardinals in 2025 after he signed a one-year deal as a free agent in March 2025.

Brant Brown was the Cubs 3rd round draft pick in 1992 and played parts of four seasons (1996-98 & 2000) with the North Siders.

Cardinals.TV play-by-play announcer **Chip Caray** served as the Cubs play-by-play announcer for seven seasons (1998-2004) on WGN...his grandfather, **Harry Caray**, spent the final 16 years of his career broadcasting Cubs games (1982-97).

Lars Nootbaar and **Shota Imanaga** were teammates on Gold Medal winning Team Japan in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

Jon Jay played in 141 games for the Cubs in 2017 and was part of their playoff run to the NLCS.

Daniel Descalso played his final MLB season with the Cubs in 2019.

Nelson Velázquez played parts of two seasons with the Cubs (2022-23), where he made his MLB debut (May 30, 2022 vs. Milwaukee)...singled off Ethan Small in his first career plate appearance.

Cubs Scouting VP **Dan Kantrovitz** previously was Cardinals Scouting Director (2012-14)...2001 Cards 25th Rd. draft pick from Brown Univ...first MLB job was Cardinals Scouting Coordinator.

Stubby Clapp (June 18, 2001 at Busch II) made his MLB debut vs. the Cubs...was also a coach on Team Canada for the 2013 & 2026 WBC squads that featured **Jameson Taillon** on the pitching staff.

Cubs Staff Assistant **AJ Lewis** played college baseball at the University of Missouri in 2017 and John A. Logan College (Carterville, IL) in 2018.

Cubs Major League Assistant Strength & Conditioning Coach **Mark Weisman** was the Director of Performance at Southeast Missouri State University (Gape Girardeau, Mo.) in 2020.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played part of 2008 with the Cubs.

Cardinals VP & Sr. Advisor **Michael Girsch** is a Chicago native...graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Chicago.

Marquee Sports Network Analyst **Rick Sutcliffe** played for St. Louis in 1994.

Cardinals.TV Analyst **Mark Sweeney** made his MLB debut with St. Louis vs. the Cubs on Aug. 4, 1995 at Busch Stadium II.

Hall of Fame manager **Tony La Russa** played in one game for the Cubs in 1973.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Tom Herr** made his MLB debut vs. the Cubs on Aug. 13, 1979 at Busch Stadium II, and fellow Cards HOF **Jason Isringhausen** made his MLB debut on July 17, 1995 at the Cubs while pitching for the Mets.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- The 26-year-old Cardinals Opening Day starter makes his team-leading 21st start of the season tonight. It marks his 141st career Major League appearance and his 74th career start.
- Is making his 7th career start & 13th appearance against the Cubs, owning a 2-2 career mark with a 3.38 ERA; **he holds a 2-0 record with a 1.13 ERA in his 5 career games (3 starts) pitched against Chicago at Busch Stadium.**
- Since May 1, ranks 1st among Cardinals pitchers & 5th among NL southpaws with 76 strikeouts. He ranks 4th among NL qualifying LHP's with his 9.96 K/9 IP rate over that period among NL port-siders.
- Tied for 5th in the National League with three pick-offs; most by a Cardinals pitcher since **Lance Lynn** (4 in 2015) and by a southpaw since **Mark Mulder** (5 in 2005).
- Is the third Cardinals lefty with 21+ wins since 2000, joining **Jamie Garcia** (62-45) and **Mark Mulder** (22-18). His next win ties **Alex Jackson** (1966-67), **Jerry Reuss** (1969-71), **Ferdie Shupp** (1919-21), and **Mulder** (2005-08) for 34th all-time among Cardinals left-handed pitchers.
- According to *Baseball Savant*, Libby's curveball spin ranks in the 96th percentile. Opponents are hitting .186 (8-47) off his curveball this season. Boasts a 36.7% whiff on his curve (12th-best in MLB) and boasts an 51.1% K% on his curve - 2nd best in MLB (**McLean**-NYM, 60.8).
- Sports a 5-7 record, but the Cardinals are 12-8 in his 20 starts this season, including a 7-3 mark in starts at Busch Stadium
- The Cardinals are 19-16 in his 35 career starts at Busch Stadium, where he has gone 13-11 with a 4.02 ERA (176.2 IP/79 ER) with 11 quality starts (all 11 starts with 6.0 IP or more).

LAST TIME OUT (Tuesday, July 21 at LA Angels): L, 5-1; 5.1 IP, 9 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 2 BB, 7 SO, 1 HR - 95 pitches

- Making his 1st start following the All Star break, Libby was touched for 5 runs in the 1st inning, but then righted himself with 4.1 scoreless IP to close out his day in the 5-1 loss to the Angels.
- Struck out 7 of his final 17 batters faced despite allowing a season-high 9 hits.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

JUST PEACHY: Fanned 9 batters, one shy of his career high, in a 5-3 win at Truist Park to earn his 20th career win on 6/30 at ATL and the blanked the Braves over 6.0 IP two weeks later in a 4-1 win at Busch Stadium on 7/11.

SUNDAY FUNDAY: Had his deepest start (5.1 IP) since a 6.0 inning effort on 5/7 at SD and led the Cardinals to a series win over the Cubs on NBC Sunday Night Baseball in his 5-1 win vs Chicago on 5/31.

K-CLUB: Libby notched single-game career highs for strikeouts in consecutive starts when he fanned 9 on 5/19 vs. PIT and then he bettered that with 10 K's on Memorial Day (5/25) at MIL; He and Brewers starter Jacob Misorowski (12) combined for 22 strikeouts in the 5/25 game.

LIBBY & LEFTY: Recorded 38 strikeouts in May, the most by a Cardinals lefty in the month of May since Hall of Famer **Steve "Lefty" Carlton** fanned 52 in May, 1970.

FRIAR FRYER: Earned his 2nd straight win holding the Padres (5/7) to one run over 6.0 innings in a 2-1 come-from-behind win at Petco Park. Recorded his 300th career strikeout fanning Nick Castellanos in the 5th inning.

HR DERBY: Surrendered a career-high 3 HR's in 3.1 IP vs. SEA (4/25) as the two teams combined for 33 hits and 8 HR's in 11-9 Mariners win. Also allowed 3 HR's in his 6/13 start vs. the Twins at Target Field.

SPACE DUST: Worked a season high 6.0 IP, allowing just one run on three hits, taking a ND in the Cardinals 7-5 extra inning win on 4/19 at HOU to complete the series sweep of the Astros.

FIRST TO 100: Threw a career high 105 pitches in 9-3 loss vs. CLE on 4/13 in 5.0 IP; He was the first Cardinals pitcher to reach the 100 pitch plateau.

NO FOOLING: Held the Mets to one run in his second start on April Fools Day, a day after **Andre Pallante** and company shut out New York. Retired the first 12 Mets batters (first time a Cardinal vs. NYM since 1968) and carried a no-hitter through 4.2 innings, longest of his career.

LIBBY'S LID-LIFTER: Made his 1st career Opening Day start and received a no decision vs. TB (3/26) despite pitching 5.0 innings and allowing just one run. Cardinals rallied for a 9-7 win (he exited with game tied 1-1).

LEFTY LIFT-OFFS: Made his 1st career Opening Day start on 3/26 vs. TB, becoming the 1st Cardinals lefty to start on Opening Day since **Donovan Osborne** (4/5/99) vs. MIL - the same year that Libby was born. He became one of just 16 LHP's to make the Opening Day start for the Cardinals since 1901 (MLB).

CAREER:

- Chose to switch to uniform No. 32 prior to 2026 season in honor of Hall of Fame left-handed pitcher **Sandy Koufax**, whom he grew up admiring.
- Is a career 18-28 with a 4.96 ERA (352.0 IP) in his 73 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA (81.0 IP) in 67 career relief appearances.

- **Is 2-0 with a 1.23 ERA in his three career starts vs. the Cubs at Busch Stadium (14.2 IP/2 ER/0 HR) with the Cardinals a perfect 3-0 in those games.**
- His 13th career appearance vs. the Cubs tonight will be his most games pitched against any team.
