METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets collected a season-high 19 hits in a 9-3 win over the Marlins yesterday...The club continues a six-game trip (3-0) to Miami (3-0) and Washington (three games)...This Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (3-0), a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 49-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 23-6-3 in 32 series this year...Following this series, the Mets return home for an 11-game homestand against the Braves (five games), Reds (three games) and Phillies (three games).

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have won six-straight games and have won 10 of their last 13...The team's six game winning streak matches their longest of the season...The Mets won six straight from May 27-June 1...Their longest winning streak in 2021 was seven games, accomplished from May 5-12...The team is batting .324/.381/.560 in the six-game winning streak and has outscored opponents 36-17 in that span...The team has posted a 2.83 ERA (17 earned runs/54.0 innings) with 20 walks and 45 strikeouts in that span.

HECK OR HIGH-WATER MARK: The Mets are a season-high 27 games over .500...It's the most games over .500 since they were 32 games over with a record of 97-65 to end the 2006 season...New York has won 64 games this season, second-most in the National League...Their .634 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 64-37 record through the team's first 101 games...Only the 1986 (69-32) team posted a better record through the first 101 games of the season.

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets lead the major leagues with 129 infield hits this year...That is seven more than the second-place team, the Cleveland Guardians...Jeff McNeil (16) is tied for eighth in the NL, while Mark Canha, Starling Marte and Brandon Nimmo are tied for 10th in the National League with 15 infield hits.

BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER: Max Scherzer made five starts in July after being activated from the IL on July 5...He went 1-1 with a 1.39 ERA (5 ER/32.1 IP) while striking out 45 and walking just four...His 1.39 ERA in July ranked seventh in the majors and fourth in the NL, while his 45 punchouts were tied for third in MLB...His 11.25 K/BB ratio was the best in MLB last month...He is one of just eight pitchers ever to post an ERA under 1.50 in a calendar month while striking out at least 45 and walking fewer than five batters.

WASHINGTON D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME: Pete Alonso has hit .347 (42-121) with 20 runs, eight doubles, a triple, 10 home runs, 26 RBI, 13 walks with a .416 OBP and a .678 SLG in 32 career games at the ballpark...His .347 batting average ranks second all-time at the ballpark (min. 100 AB), while his .678 SLG is the best...Mark Canha has hit .526 (10-19) with five runs, a home run, five RBI and three walks in five career games at Nationals Park...Jeff McNeil has hit .309 (34-110) with 14 runs, three doubles, two triples, four home runs, 19 RBI, 12 walks with a .374 OBP in 30 games at Nationals Park.

DOUBLE O-70: Pete Alonso ranks second in the majors and tops the NL with 85 RBI, while, Francisco Lindor is tied for seventh in the majors and fifth with 70 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with 70 or more RBI this season.

LINDOR CITY OVER HERE: Francisco Lindor has safely hit in 18 of his last 19 games, batting .329 (27-78) in that span with 12 runs, five doubles, a triple, four home runs, 13 RBI with a .407 OBP, a .590 SLG and a .997 OPS in that span...He is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .481 (13-27) with six runs, four doubles, a home run, four RBI, four walks with a .548 OBP and a .741 SLG in that span...He ranks second in the majors with 20 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (24)...He ranks 14th in the majors and ninth in the National League with a 4.0 fWAR.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz, the NL Reliever of the Month for June, has posted a 1-0 record with 13 saves, a 0.39 ERA (one earned run/23.0 innings) with 11 hits, three walks and 50 strikeouts over his last 23 appearances since May 27...30 of his last 39 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He has recorded 23 saves this season, which places him fifth in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 84 strikeouts...That is 18 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...His 18.14 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...He has struck out 84 of the 160 batters he faced, good for 52.5%...He is 2-1 with 23 saves, a 1.51 ERA (seven earned runs/41.2 innings), allowing 26 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 37-5 when Diaz appears in a game this year...In July, Diaz tossed 11.1 scoreless innings, allowing two hits, one walk and 25 strikeouts.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets earned their second consecutive sweep and their fourth sweep of the season yesterday...On the other side, the Mets have yet to be swept in a series of three-or-more games this year...According to Elias, the Mets have gone 108 games since they were last swept in a series of three or more games...It's their longest stretch avoiding a sweep since they went 120 games spanning the 2018-2019 season...This includes the final 87 games of 2018 and first 33 games of 2019...The franchise record is 167 games avoiding a sweep, spanning the 1987 and 1988 seasons...The single season record is the final 134 games of 1987 season.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series against the Nationals in three of the last four years...The Mets have won four straight against the Nationals.

SCORELESS VS DC: The Mets have tossed 21.0 scoreless innings vs. Washington dating to May 30 including two shutout victories, 10-0 on May 31 and 5-0 on June 1...The last time the Mets had three straight shutouts vs. one opponent was May 25-27, 2010 vs. Philadelphia.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East and 22 of their next 25 games vs. their division...The Mets are 3-0 during the stretch...Overall, the Mets are 31-12 against the East this year...There .721 division winning percentage is the best in baseball...They have not lost a series in the division all season long...The team has not lost back-to-back games in a division series as well this year...Since May 27, the team has gone 18-5 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 2.95 ERA against the East, while hitting .257/.335/.413...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents 217-133 this season.

JUST ME AND THE OPEN ROAD: The Mets have won seven of their last eight road games and has gone 12-4 on the road since June 24...New York is 33-20 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .623 road winning percentage is the second-best in the majors...New York is batting .259/.326/.411 away from Citi Field...Their .259 road average ranks fourth in the majors and second in the NL...Jeff McNeil ranks second in the NL with a .323 (50-155) road batting average, while Brandon Nimmo is seventh with a .299 (61-204) mark.

WHAT A RELIEF: The Mets bullpen finished with a 2.61 ERA (23 earned runs/79.1 innings) with 24 walks and 93 strikeouts in July...Their 2.61 ERA was fourth in the majors and second in the National League...Their 3.45 ERA this season is third in the National League as are there 398 strikeouts.

C IS FOR COOKIE: Carlos Carrasco has thrown 18.2 scoreless innings to finish out the month of July...Overall, he went 3-0 with a 0.90 ERA (three earned runs/30.0 innings) with nine walks and 27 strikeouts...That is his lowest ERA for any month in his career...His 0.90 ERA in July is the fourth-lowest ERA for any single month (min. 30 innings)...He trails only Mets pitchers with a sub-1.00 ERA in a single month since 1990 (min. 30 IP): Frank Viola (April 1991 - 0.86 ERA), Al Leiter (April 2002 - 0.92 ERA), R.A. Dickey (June 2012 - 0.93 ERA) and Jacob deGrom (April 2021 - 0.51 ERA).

FOR STARTERS: Since Max Scherzer returned from the Injured List on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 1.97 ERA (28 earned runs/127.2 innings) in the team's last 21 games with 136 strikeouts and 35 walks...That is nearly a full run better than the next-best club, the Dodgers (2.68)...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.54 in that span...The Mets rank fifth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.54 ERA from their starters...The team's 960 strikeouts from starters are third in the NL.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: The Mets struck out 259 hitters in the seventh month of the year...That set a franchise record...The team's 259 strikeouts were second in the majors for the month and first in the NL...The Mets finished July going 17-8 with a .680 winning percentage in July...The team's 17 wins this month were the most in the month of July since 2008 when they went 18-8...The team's 17 wins in July were the third-most in the NL.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: New York finished July with a 2.48 team ERA (63 earned runs/228.1 innings), the best mark in the majors...Mets starters went 10-5 with 2.42 ERA (40 earned runs/149.0 innings) with 38 walks and 166 strikeouts in 24 games in July...Their 2.42 ERA was the best in The Show, while their 166 strikeouts from starters ranked second.

CONNECT FOUR: New York is 54-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game...The team's 54 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .915 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors...The Mets have won 22 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 32-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more.

DAN IN REAL LIFE: The Mets acquired infielder Daniel Vogelbach from Pittsburgh on July 22...In six games with New York, the lefty has hit .375 (6-16) with two runs, two doubles, five walks with a 1.045 OPS...He has reached base safely in five of those contests and in all three of his starts...In 81 games this year, he has posted a .353 on-base percentage and a .435 slugging percentage...He has an .823 career OPS vs. righties and 55 of his 61 career home runs have come against right-handed pitchers.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo is batting .299/.392/.500 with 44 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 30 RBI and 25 walks in 52 road games this season...This compares to a .214/.273/.321 slashline with 18 runs, eight doubles, three triples, one home run and eight RBI in 41 games at Citi Field in 2022...Nimmo's .392 road OBP is third in the National League and places him ninth in the majors.

MARTE PARTY: Starling Marte is batting .377 (29-77) with nine runs, three doubles, four homers, 10 RBI, five walks with a .422 OBP and a .597 SLG in 19 games this month...He has recorded a hit 13 of those 15 games...He has hit in 16 of those 19 games...Marte leads the club and ranks sixth in the NL with a .301 average...He has recorded multiple hits in six of his last eight games...He has 13 multi-hit games over his last 23 games...Marte is batting .376 (35-93) during that span since June 25, the third-highest average in the majors.

- Hitting .414 (12-29) a .500 OBP since the All-Star break.
- Tied for fifth in the majors and third in the NL with 26 homers...Leads the NL and is second in the majors with 85 RBI...Ranks 20th in the NL with 56 runs scored.
- Ranks 10th in MLB and fourth in the NL with a .536 SLG...Is ninth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a .888 OPS...Is 18th in the NL in OBP (.352).
- Has four homers and 16 RBI in his last 17 games since he ended a career-high 10-game RBI drought and an 11-game home run dry spell on July 9 vs. Miami.
- Has three go-ahead RBI and two game-winning RBI during the Mets' current six-game winning streak...Has 16 game-winning RBI and 24 go-ahead RBI this season, most in MLB.
- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (eight) and is tied for third in games with multiple RBI (21) this season.
- Batting .344 (11-32) with a 1.104 OPS against lefties since June 25...Prior to that date, was hitting .190 (11-58) with a .716 OPS vs. southpaws.
- Has a 1.112 OPS with runners in scoring position, going 29-98 (.296/.408/.704) with seven doubles, 11 homers, 62 RBI and 21 walks.
- Is fourth in the majors with 15 road home runs...Ranks seventh in Mets history with 75 career road homers...Dave Kingman (81) is next on the list.
- Named an All-Star for the second time...Drew a walk in his lone plate appearance in the Midsummer Classic...Reached the semifinals of the Home Run Derby.
- Broke David Wright's franchise record for first-half RBI, driving in 78 before the break...Wright drove in 74 before the break in 2006.

- Is second in MLB behind Pete Alonso with 20 go-ahead RBI...Tied for 14th in the NL with 60 runs...Tied for seventh in MLB and fifth in the NL with 70 RBI.
- Has surpassed his season production from 2021 in RBI...Had 16 home runs and 66 RBI in 92 first-half games this season...Last year, had 11 home runs and 36 RBI in 87 first-half games and finished the year with 20 home runs and 63 RBI in 125 games.
- Became the first shortstop since Alex Rodriguez (2000) to reach 50 RBI in 66 games or fewer when he crossed that threshold on June 18.
- Has 51 RBI and 42 runs scored in his last 66 games...Had a 10-game RBI streak from May 22-June 1 and had 20 RBI overall in that span...It was the longest streak in the majors this season and tied for the second-longest in Mets history...The only Met with a longer RBI streak is Mike Piazza (15 games).
