**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The St. Louis Cardinals continue their Steel Corridor homestand with the opener of a three-game Interleague weekend series with the Cleveland Guardians tonight at Busch Stadium ... The Guardians return to St. Louis for the first time since June 9, 2021 when they were previously branded as the Indians, representing the 6th-longest active timespan between visits by any team to a current Major League venue (chart left) ... The Redbirds opened their final homestand of the season by taking three-of-four from the division-rival Pittsburgh Pirates.

**FLIGHT PATTERN:** St. Louis enters today in 3rd place in the National League Central and 8.0 games out of the 3rd and final Wild Card spot ... The Cardinals postseason elimination number stands at two with Arizona and one with the Mets ... Due to tiebreaker qualifiers, the Redbirds would need to win out while the Dbacks lose their remaining games.

**FOR THE LOU:** The Cardinals don their red City Connect uniforms tonight for the 12th and final time this season .... St. Louis has gone 7-4 during their debut season of City Connects.

**CHOK UP:** Rookie **Masyn Winn** has 74 hits with two strikes, 2nd-most in MLB this season to Cleveland's **José Ramirez** (85) and the 4th-highest single-season total by a Major League rookie since 1988, trailing **Steven Kwan** (76 in 2022), **Spencer Steer** (79 in 2023), and 2001 NL Rookie of the Year **Albert Pujols** (84).

**DONNY, YOU'RE OUT OF YOUR ELEMENT:** **Brendan Donovan** went 4-for-4 last night to compile his team-high 13th game with three or more hits this season (T-6th in NL), most by a Cardinals left-handed batter since **Matt Carpenter** (18 in 2013) ... Donovan has an extra-base hit in his last four games, MLB's longest active and one shy of his career best (July 14-19, 2023).

**HELLS BELLS:** **Ryan Helsley's** 45 saves rank 2nd in Major League Baseball behind Cleveland's **Emmanuel Clase** (46) and tied for 4th-most in Cardinals single-season history.

- The last Cardinal to lead all of Major League Baseball in saves was **Lee Smith** (47 in 1991).
- Helsley has combined to win or save 52 games this season, the 2nd-highest total in Cardinals history to 1991 **Lee Smith** (53; 47 saves & 6 wins).
- Helsley is 24-for-24 in saves at Busch Stadium this season ... His 24 saves are one shy of the Busch Stadium single-season record established by **Trevor Rosenthal** (25 in 2014).

**HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENT:** The Cardinals are wrapping up a stretch at home for 13 of 16 games from Sept. 6-22 (6-4 record) ... Sunday's home finale marks the earliest the Cardinals wrap up their home slate in St. Louis since Sept. 21, 2014 at Busch III and Sept. 21, 2003 at Busch II ... The Cardinals have clinched a winning record at Busch Stadium III (41-36, .532) for the 17th time in 19 seasons since the stadium was opened in 2006.

**PLUS-MINUS:** The Cardinals (-57) are the only MLB team this season with a winning record but a negative run differential ... Only four Cardinals teams in franchise history have finished at or above .500 with a negative run differential: 1911, 1917, 1966, and 1975 ... St. Louis sports an MLB-low +2.75 run differential per game in wins.

**CLOSE ENCOUNTERS:** St. Louis has played 101 games (66%) this season decided by three runs or fewer, 2nd-most in MLB behind Tampa Bay (102) ... The Guardians (58-42) and Cardinals (56-45) are the top two leaders in wins decided by three or fewer runs.

**SPRINGFIELD (AA) POSTSEASON:** The Double-A Springfield Cardinals look to advance to their first Texas League Championship series since 2012 when it faces off against Arkansas (AA-Mariners) tonight at 6:35 PM at Hammons Field ... RHP **Trent Baker** will start the deciding Game 3 of its best-of-three series.

#### CLEVELAND CONNECTIONS

**Sonny Gray** has been caught by **Stephen Vogt** (45 games) more than any other catcher in his career... were All-Star teammates in 2015 with Oakland.

**José Fermín** signed with Cleveland as an International Free Agent (July 2, 2015)...played six minor league seasons in the Guardians organization before purchased by St. Louis (Nov. 9, 2022).

**Turner Ward** played 54 games over parts of two seasons (1990-91) for Cleveland...made his MLB debut for the Indians (Sept. 10, 1990 at Cleveland Municipal Stadium)...traded by Cleveland w/ **Tom Candiotti** to the Blue Jays for **Denis Boucher**, **Glenallen Hill**, **Mark Whiten**, and cash (June 27, 1991).

**Julio Rangel** spent 11 years in the Cleveland system as a Cultural Development Coordinator (2007-08), Mental Skills Coordinator (2009-10), Lower Level Pitching Coordinator (2011-15), and Assistant Field Coordinator (2016-17).

Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** spent the 1991 season in Cleveland's minor league organization as a pitching coach and pitcher between Colorado Springs (AAA) and Canton-Akron (AA).

**Dean Kiekhefer** was originally selected by Cleveland in the 37th round of the 2007 MLB Draft out of Oldham High School (Ky.), but did not sign.

**Jordan Walker** was named Player of the Game at the 2019 MLB High School All-Star Game at Cleveland's Progressive Field.

**Lane Thomas** played in 84 games over parts of three seasons for the Cardinals (2019-21)...traded to Washington for **Jon Lester** (July 30, 2021).

Cleveland Sr. VP of Medical Services **Lonnie Soloff** attended St. Louis University...began his baseball career with the Cardinals in 1996 as part of the PBATS internship program.

Guardians Hitting VP **Alex Eckelman** played parts of five seasons in the Cardinals minor league organization (1997-2001).

**Matt Valaika**, younger brother of Cleveland Hitting Coach **Chris Valaika**, was selected by St. Louis in the 34th round of the 2010 MLB Draft.

The Cardinals and Cleveland played in MLB's inaugural Civil Rights Game on March 31, 2007 at AutoZone Park in Memphis, Tenn.

Guardians Replay Coord. **Gunnar Wilhelmy** attended the Univ. of Missouri, earning two undergraduate degrees (2016) and a Master's of Statistics (2018)...worked for the Mizzou Baseball team for five and a half years as Student Mgr., Graduate Asst., and Mgr. of Advanced Technologies.

Cleveland AGM **Eric Binder** pitched part of the 2011 season in the Cardinals minor league organization.

**Bill Veck** was a former owner of both Cleveland (1946-49) and the St. Louis Browns (1951-53).

Cardinals Baseball Info. & Media Serv. Mgr. **Chris Tunno** graduated from Canfield (Ohio) High School.

The Cardinals & Indians played an exhibition at Cleveland's League Park during the 1936 All-Star break, a game where 17-year-old **Bob Feller** made his unofficial debut with 8 strikeouts in 3.0 innings.

The Cleveland Spiders were rivals of the St. Louis Browns in the American Association (1888-89) and National League (1892-99)...before the 1899 season, Spiders owners **Stanley** and **Frank DeHass Robison**, who also owned the St. Louis franchise, transferred Cleveland's best players (future Hall of Famers **Cy Young**, **Bobby Wallace**, & **Jesse Burkett**) to St. Louis and formed the Perfectos...the Spiders endured the worst season in pro baseball history (20-134) and were disbanded as the NL contracted to eight teams.

The Cardinals won their 10,000th regular season game as a member of the National League with a 4-0 victory over Cleveland at Busch Stadium (June 25, 2018).

- Making 29th start of the season and as a member of the Cardinals (323rd career start).
- Pitching on 6 days rest for the third-straight start. Has allowed just two earned runs on 12 hits over his past three starts (1-1, 0.95 ERA, 19.0 IP, 16 K).
- Will be making his 4th-straight start against an American League team, having faced the NY Yankees, Seattle, Toronto and now Cleveland dating back to 8/31. Last appearance against an NL foe was 8/26 vs. the Padres.
- Is seeking his 1st win at Busch Stadium since May 17 vs. Boston.
- Is 4-3 with a 3.30 ERA in 12 day starts this season as opposed to 4-4 with a 4.77 ERA in 16 night starts. Home/Road splits are 2-4, 4.78 at Busch and 6-3, 3.52 on the road.
- Earned the Cardinals first ever regular season road win against the Yankees on 8/31 and the team's first road win overall against the New York Yankees dating back to Bob Gibson's win in Game 5 of the 1964 World Series (Oct. 12).
- Durable starting pitcher has now logged 10 seasons of 20 or more starts since 2014, tied with teammate **Sonny Gray** for most in MLB (2014-19, 2021-24).
- Needs one more win to tie **Stephen Strasburg** (113) for the most wins of any pitcher from the MLB 2009 draft class.
- Limited his opposition to two earned runs or fewer in 16-of-28 starts, 3rd among Cardinals starters behind **Sonny Gray** (16) behind **Erick Fedde** (19).
- Boasts a 41.4% Whiff Pct. on Sweepers, 2nd-highest for the Sweeper (**Sonny Gray**, STL, 44.4%) among MLB starting pitchers.
- Fanned Josh Rojas (SEA) for his 1,500th career strikeout on 9/ to become the 19th active pitcher to hit that mark. Has had 100+ K's in each of his 10 full seasons played.
- Five of his starts have been delayed by rain (5 hr. 14 min. total) and he was scratched from his scheduled start on 6/19 at MIA during warm-ups due to back tightness.
- Has started four doubleheader games this season (April 30-1 at Detroit; June 26-1 vs. Atlanta; June 13-2 vs. Chicago Cubs; July 20-1 at Atlanta), most by a Cardinal since **Daniel Ponce de Leon** (4 in 2020) and most in a non-COVID-19 affected season since **Bob Forsch** (4 in 1983). - *Elias*
- St. Louis area resident and Univ. of Missouri Baseball alum signed with the Cardinals as a free agent last November. Is one of three free-agent starters (**Sonny Gray & Lance Lynn**) that the Cardinals signed last off-season. Pitching for his fifth MLB team: Twins (2013-19), Rangers (2020-21), Phillies (2021-22), Orioles (2023) and Cardinals (2024).

**LAST TIME OUT**

- Had his 4-game win streak at the Rogers Centre snapped in a 7-2 defeat last Sat. (9/14) when the Jays scored 4 runs in their 6th, two of which were unearned. The Cardinals managed just three hits in the defeat - Kyle's 1st loss in Canada since 8/6/15.

- Is making his 24th career appearance and 23rd start against Cleveland. It's his 1st meeting with the Guardians as a member of the Cardinals.
- Was 2-0 in his two starts vs. Cleveland last season while pitching for Baltimore. Has faced Cleveland as a member of the Twins and Orioles. Didn't pitch against Cleveland from 2020-22.
- Is 5-10 career vs. Cleveland that included a stretch from 2016-19 when he was just 1-8 in 14 starts with the lone win coming on 6/15/18 at Progressive Field.
- His 10 career losses vs. CLE are one fewer than his 11 vs. DET for the most in career.
- In 11 career home starts against Cleveland, Kyle is 1-7 with a 6.39 ERA, posting his 1st and only home win on May 30 last season at Baltimore's Camden Yards.
- Is facing an American League Central team for 2nd time (4/30 at Detroit) this season. Is 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA in his eight interleague starts this season, facing DET, BOS, BAL, HOU, TB, NYY, SEA & TOR.
