HURRICANE FIONA RELIEF: The Mets are saddened by the devastation in Puerto Rico after Hurricane Fiona...Families, children and homes are all without much needed necessities including power, clean water and a safe place to sleep...To show our support, the Amazin' Mets Foundation, along with Mets players and coaches, are partnering with Team Rubicon and Global Empowerment Mission to help those in need in Puerto Rico... METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 5-2, last night...The Mets are 78-15 when scoring first this season...New York is 35-10-4 in 49 series this year...The Mets continue their penultimate series of the season, a three-game weekend series against the Braves (0-1)...Following these three games, the Mets head back to New York for the final series of the regular season, a three-game set against the Nationals.

ABOVE AVERAGE: Jeff McNeil is second in the majors and in the National League with a 322 batting average...He is behind only Freddie Freeman (.327) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011...Over his last six games, McNeil is batting .462 (12-26) with six runs, a double, an RBI, two walks with a 1.000 OPS.

AGE IS JUST A NUMBER: In his age-37 season, Max Scherzer has posted a 2.13 ERA with 169 strikeouts entering his final regular season start of the year...Since the earned run became an official statistic in 1913, only two pitchers have posted an ERA that low with as many strikeouts at age 37 or older: Roger Clemens (1.87 ERA, 185 strikeouts at age 42 for the 2005 Astros) and Hall of Famer Dazzy Vance (2.09 ERA, 200 strikeouts at age 37 for the 1928 Brooklyn Dodgers)...Justin Verlander (1.80 ERA, 175 strikeouts at age 39) is also on track to accomplish this feat in 2022.

ALWAYS IMPROVING: Scherzer leads the majors with a 2.31 ERA over the last two seasons (min. 200.0 IP)...He set a career-best mark with a 2.46 ERA last season and currently owns what would be a career-best 2.13 ERA this year...No pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that at least twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).

JUST PEACHY: The Mets are 22-28 at Truist Park...Jeff McNeil is a .377 (29-77) hitter with 11 runs, nine doubles, a home run, five RBI and four walks in 21 career games at the ballpark...Mark Canha has hit .320 (8-25) with three runs, four doubles, two homers, three walks, four RBI and an .720 SLG in eight games at the yard...Tomás Nido has hit .303 (10-33) with six runs, a double, two home runs, four and two walks in 11 career

JEFF McHITS: McNeil had 33 hits in September, his third month this year with at least 33 hits (also, May and August)...The only other Mets with at least three 33+ hit months in one season are Daniel Murphy (2013), Jose Reyes (2006-08, 2011), David Wright (2007-08), John Olerud (1998), Lance Johnson (1996), Frank Taveras (1979), Felix Millan (1975) and Tommie Agee (1970).

HIT THE ESC KEY: Since Eduardo Escobar returned from the IL on August 27, he is batting .333 (36-108) with 16 runs, five doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 24 RBI, eight walks with a .381 OBP, a .620 SLG and 1.002 OPS in 30 games.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Buck Showalter owns a 1,649-1,576 (.511) career record as a manager...His 1,649 wins place him 20th all-time in major league history...Mike Scioscia manager...His 1,049 wins place nim 20th all-time in major league history...Mike Scioscia ranks 19th with 1,650 career wins...Showalter has now managed four teams to the Postseason...He is the fourth manager to accomplish that feat in major league history, joining Dusty Baker (five teams) and Billy Martin and Davey Johnson (four teams)...With three more victories, Showalter would be the first manager in Mets history to record 100 victories in his first season with the club...He also joins Yogi Berra as the only managers to guide the Mets and Yankees into the playoffs.

AW SNAP: Francisco Lindor has his hitting streak snapped at 13 games last night...He batted .333 (19-57) with 10 runs, three doubles, a triple, two home runs, 11 RBI, a walk, a steal with an .865 OPS over that span...He has hit 25 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 home runs in 2018 for the most by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .307/.369/.478 with 43 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 37 RBI, 23 walks with an .847 OPS in 64 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 6.7 fWAR

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets seeking their 48th road win...The team's 47 wins on the road are tied for the fourth-most all-time...Only the 1986 (53), 1999 (48) and 1969 (49) teams won more games on the road...Their 47 road wins are their highest total since they went 47-34 in 2007...Their .595 road winning percentage is the third-best in franchise history...Only the 1986 (.654) and 1969 (.600) teams had a better winning percentage on the road...Their .595 road winning percentage is third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...Overall they are 47-32 on the road this year.

HITTING THE ROAD: New York is batting .265/.335/.426 away from Citi Field...Their .265 road average is the best in the NL and second in the majors, while their .335 OBP leads The Show...They rank fourth in MLB with a.427 SLG...Brandon Nimmo (.405), Jeff McNeil (.394) and Mark Canha (.382) rank three through five in road OBP in the National League...Jeff McNeil is battling .349 (91-261) with 33 runs, 23 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 25 RBI, 16 walks with a .394 OBP and a .479 SLG in 68 road games this year... His .349 road batting average leads the major leagues.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets need to win one of its two remaining games against Atlanta to lock up the season series...It would be New York's first season series victory since 2017.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,516 batters this season, which places them a top the majors...The team's 1,516 strikeouts are already the second-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.78 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06... More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.2 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

ROAD STRIKE: The Mets have struck out 719 batters on the road this year...That is a franchise record, surpassing the previous total of 686 set last season...The team's 719 strikeouts on the road are the most in the majors.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 47-24 against the East this year...They have lost only two series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18 and Washington, September 2-4) and have already clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win one of its two remaining games against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes (last accomplished by the Mets in 2015)...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.42 ERA against the East, while hitting .260/.335/.420...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 354-259.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 98 games...The team's 98 wins are tied for the fourth-most in franchise history...That is tied for the third-most in the major leagues... The last time the team recorded more than 98 wins was in 1988 when they won 100.. The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets are 98-59 through 157 games...That is the second-best mark in Mets history...Only the 1986 team (103-54) posted a better record.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .625 winning percentage (40-24) following the All-Star break. The team's 40 wins are the sixth-most in the majors since the break... The Mets are batting .266/.343/.428 with 70 home runs in 65 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets lead the majors in OBP, are second in average and are fifth in SLG following the break.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 116 strikeouts...That is 21 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)... Díaz has posted a 0.69 ERA (three earned runs/39.1 innings) with 18 hits, eight walks and 78 strikeouts in 38 appearances since the start of June.

THIS IS 40: Pete Alonso has hit 40 home runs this season...He is the first player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs...Only two players this season have recorded 40 or more home runs - Aaron Judge and Kyle Schwarber...Alonso's 40 home runs are tied for fourth-most in a single season in Mets history...Alonso owns the franchise record with 53 in 2019...Carlos Beltrán (2006) and Todd Hundley (1996) each recorded 41 home runs

CLEANUP ON AISLE 4: Alonso has hit all 40 of his home runs this season in the fourth spot in the batting order...127 of his 131 RBI have come as the Mets cleanup hitter... Alonso is one of only six players to tally 40 homers and 125 RBI as the No. 4 hitter in a single season since 2000, joining Alex Rodriguez (2007), Carlos Delgado (2000, 2003), Ryan Howard (2007-2009), Prince Fielder (2009) and Andruw Jones (2006).

ONLY A FEW CAN COM-PETE: Pete Alonso has set a new franchise single-season RBI record with 131 this season...His 131 RBI tops the majors...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He has 27 game-winning RBI this season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI are tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

LAST TIME OUT: Facing Oakland for the first time since May 27, 2014, Scherzer allowed just one earned run on four hits through 6.0 innings...He recorded seven strikeouts and no walks as the Mets defeated the Athletics, 13-4.

VS. ATLANTA: Scherzer has won all three of his starts against the Braves this season, posting a 2.21 ERA (5 ER/20.1 IP) with 28 strikeouts and three walks...He has not allowed more than four hits in any of those three outings and has at least eight strikeouts in each of those starts.

QUITE THE DEBUT: Scherzer's 2.13 ERA (33 ER/139.2 IP) is the best all-time mark by a Mets pitcher through their first 22 games with the franchise (min. 100.0 IP)...His 0.881 WHIP is the second-best by a Mets pitcher through 22 games (min. 100.0 IP)...Pedro Martinez had a 0.879 WHIP in his first 22 games with the Mets...The only pitcher in Mets history with more strikeouts through 22 games is Dwight Gooden (171), who had two more than Scherzer does.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...Roger Clemens also had 110 in his career...Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two.

THE 7.0 LINE: Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings eight times in 22 starts this season...Each time Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings this season, he has finished his outing with one or no runs allowed...Despite missing a total of nine weeks on the Injured List, those eight outings of 7.0+ innings while allowing one or no runs are still tied for the fourth-most in the majors.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He was passed by Justin Verlander while on the IL and the two veterans have been swapping places on the leaderboard since...He now ranks 13th all-time, one ahead of Verlander...Scherzer is still within striking distance of Fergie Jenkins as well this season...He is needs four strikeouts to pass Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time.

200: Scherzer reached 200 career wins in his last start, joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (243) and Zack Greinke (223) are the only other active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career...He is 200-101 in his career...He reached 200 career wins with a career record 99 games over .500...*Elias* says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came with fewer losses on their résumé: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96)...Randy Johnson was also 99 games over .500 at the time of his 200th career victory.

MORE 200: Scherzer's 200th win came in his 428th career game...He is the 30th pitcher to win 200 of his first 428 career appearances...The other 29 pitchers include 23 Hall of Famers as well as Roger Clemens, Andy Pettitte, CC Sabathia, Justin Verlander, Tim Hudson and George Mullin.
