2009 - In the Astros 6-2 loss at MIL, **2B Kazuo Matsui** singles for his 2,000th combined hit between his career in Japan and his six years in the Majors...with 2,000 hits, Matsui is automatically inducted into Japan's Meikyukai, similar to the Major League Baseball Hall of Fame.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The first-place Astros, who own a 3.0-game lead in the AL West, will play the middle game of their three-game series against the division rival Mariners tonight at Daikin Park...**RHP Hayden Wesneski** (2-0) will make his fourth Major League start of the season tonight, this time opposite the M's and **RHP Emerson Hancock** (6-7).

BIG WES: After missing 14 months with injury, **RHP Hayden Wesneski** has returned to the Astros rotation by posting a 2-0 record with a 3.86 ERA (8ER/18.2IP) in three starts...he's worked two straight quality starts, including tossing 7.0 innings of three-run ball in his last outing on Monday at SF...this solid start to the season has continued a strong run for Wesneski, who was great in his rehab appearances, posting a 2.25 (5ER/20IP) combined ERA in five minor league rehab starts.

ABOUT THE RECORD: At 63-60 and three games over .500, the Astros have matched their high-water mark for the season, also reached with 60-57, 59-56, 58-55, 6-3, and 5-2 records...the Astros 3.0-game lead in the AL West is their largest division lead of the season.

THE TURNAROUND: After a slow start to the season, the Astros are 43-29 since May 22, which is the best record in the AL in that span...on that date, the Astros were 20-31, 11 games under, which is their low water mark for the season.

LAST NIGHT'S WALKOFF: The Astros came back from two different two-run deficits last night and scored five runs in the 10th inning en route to a 10-7 series-opening win over the visiting Mariners...**1B Christian Walker** was the hero, as he connected for his third-career walkoff homer, a three-run shot in the 10th...**RHP Peter Lambert** (2ER/5IP) started for the Astros and recorded his eighth straight start of allowing two-or-fewer earned runs.

ELIAS SAYS: The Astros posted a five-run 10th inning last night, marking just their ninth time in franchise history to score five-plus runs in an extra inning and their first time to do so since they scored five runs in the top of the 11th on June 30, 2024 at NYM...last night marked the first time in franchise history for the Astros to score five-plus runs in an extra-inning as the home team.

HALL OF FAME INDUCTIONS: The Astros are celebrating **Hall of Fame Weekend** at Daikin Park, which will include the induction of Astros legends **Alan Ashby** and the late **Phil Garner** into the Astros Hall of Fame in a pregame ceremony today...prior to the ceremony, Ashby and members of Garner's family will be available to the media in the press conference room at 4:30 p.m. today.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: Among American League teams, the Astros rank first in slugging (.412), first in total bases (1710), second in OPS (.731), second in home runs (164), and third in runs scored (569)...in the Majors, the Astros rank tied for third in homers, trailing only the Nationals (177) and Yankees (170), and tied with the Braves (164).

MVP-CALIBER: **Yordan Alvarez** holds the lead in all AL Triple Crown categories, ranking first in average (.323), first in homers (36) and first in RBI (88)...additionally, he leads MLB in OPS (1.063), OBP (.437), SLG (.626), and TB (275)...in the AL, he ranks first in hits (142) and XBH (61), and second in runs (81) and walks (85)...AL leaders below:

YOR-GONE!: **DH Yordan Alvarez** connected for his 36th home run of the season last night, which gave him the outright lead in home runs in the AL...he's now just one homer shy of matching his career high in homers (37 HR in 2022) and is 11 homers shy of matching the franchise record for a single season, set by **1B Jeff Bagwell** in 2000 (47 HR).

WHAM BAM CAM: **RF Cam Smith** has a triple, three homers and seven RBI in his last six games...Smith is batting .375 (18x48) with one triple, three home runs, nine RBI and a 1.087 OPS in his last 13 games dating back to July 29.

HADERADE: **LHP Josh Hader** has been stellar since returning from injury in early June, going 4-1 with a 0.93 ERA (3ER/29IP), 40 strikeouts, a .121 opponent batting average (12x99) and a 0.76 WHIP, while also converting all 17 of his save opportunities, through 30 appearances.

VS. THE M'S: Prior to last night, it had been three months since the Astros last played the Mariners, last seeing them in a four-game series in Houston from May 11-14...the Astros have gone 2-7 against Seattle this season with four games left to play.

ON THE MEND: **RHP Mike Burrows** (rt. elbow neuritis) made his first affiliate rehab start since his injury last night, working 4.1 scoreless inning for Triple A Sugar Land in their game at Round Rock...he allowed three hits and one walk with three strikeouts while tossing 67 pitches (43 strikes).

LAST START, AUGUST 10 at SF: Matched his career high by tossing 7.0 innings Monday at SF, allowing 3 runs on 5 hits with 2 walks and 4 strikeouts...matched his career high of 7.0 innings for the 4th time, last doing so on April 7, 2025 at SEA, as a member of the Cubs, prior to Monday's start...tossed just 83 pitches (51 strikes) through his 7.0 innings of work.

RETURN OF THE WEZ: Has been strong in his return from Tommy John surgery, posting a 3.86 ERA (8ER/18.2IP), 1.18 WHIP and .242 opponent batting average through his first 3 starts of the year...the Astros have won all 3 of his starts and he's tossed back-to-back quality starts (Aug. 10 at SF; Aug. 4 vs. TOR)...he recorded a winning decision in back-to-back starts to open the year (Aug. 4 vs. TOR; July 29 at LAA).

ON THE CHASE: Has induced a 36.0-percent chase rate, which would mark a career high...his previous high was a 30.2-percent rate through 28 games (7 starts) with the Cubs in 2024...has logged a 40.2-percent chase rate with his sweeper, the highest of any of his pitches...his 40.2-percent chase percentage vs. his sweeper ranks 9th in the AL this season (min. 70 sweepers thrown).

VS. SEA: Tonight will mark his 3rd career start vs. the Mariners...in his 2nd start as an Astro (April 7, 2025), he matched his career high by tossing 7.0 innings vs. the Mariners at T-Mobile Park, allowing 2 runs on 3 hits with 5 strikeouts and no walks...allowed 7 runs (6ER) in 1.1 innings in his only other start vs. SEA, coming on April 11, 2023, as a member of the Cubs.

ON THE WAY BACK: Underwent Tommy John surgery on May 23, 2025...returned to the mound to begin his rehab appearances on June 30, 2026, with the FCL Astros (3IP)...advanced to Double A Corpus Christi for 1 start, then made 3 starts for Triple A Sugar Land...combined to post a 2.25 ERA (5ER/20IP) in his 5 rehab appearances...struck out 21 in his 20.0 innings, allowed a .211 opponent average, and posted a 1.00 WHIP...walked just 4 hitters across his 5 rehab starts.

WESNESKI IN 2025: Began last season in the Astros starting rotation and went on to make 6 starts, going 1-3 with a 4.50 ERA (16ER/32IP) prior to his injury...had a couple strong starts, tossing a career-high-tying 7.0 innings on April 7 at SEA, and fanning a career-high 10 hitters on April 13 vs. LAA.

TRADE WINDS: Acquired by the Astros from the Cubs on Dec. 13, 2024 as part of the return for All-Star **OF Kyle Tucker**...the Astros received Wesneski, **3B Isaac Paredes** and **RF Cam Smith** in that trade.

HOUSTON'S OWN: Wesneski was born in Houston, TX, and raised in Cypress, TX, which is about a 25-mile drive northwest of downtown Houston...grew up an Astros fan with **RHP Roy Oswalt** as his favorite player...he graduated from Cy Fair HS, then went on to nearby Sam Houston State, where he pitched for 3 seasons...was selected by the Yankees in the 6th round of the 2019 MLB draft...was traded twice after his selection, first by the Yankees to the Cubs, then by the Cubs to the Astros.

WHAT'S A BEARKAT ANYWAY?: Is one of the most-accomplished pitchers in Sam Houston State history...went 25-9 with a 3.56 ERA and 224 strikeouts (288.0 IP) in 3 years with the Bearkats (2017-19)...his 224 career strikeouts rank 4th all-time in program history...other notable Bearkats include Astros radio broadcaster **Steve Sparks** and Astros 2024 first-round pick **C Walker Janek**.

LAST APPEARANCE (8/14 vs. SEA): Snapped a 12-game scoreless streak by allowing 2 runs on 2 hits through 1.0 inning last night vs. SEA, also walking 2 batters...recorded his first blown save of the season...marked his first appearance with multiple walks since walking 2 batters on May 29 vs. MIL.

SCORELESS STREAK: His 12-game scoreless streak snapped last night spanned 12.0 innings from July 18-Aug. 12...he recorded 17 strikeouts, 4 walks, a 0.58 WHIP and a .077 opponent batting average throughout the streak...it is the second-longest streak by an Astros pitcher this season, behind only LHP Steven Okert's 14-game scoreless streak from May 23-June 24.

TURNING THE PAGE: Since May 3, he has gone 4-1-6 with a 2.34 ERA (9ER/34.2IP)...has also recorded 41 strikeouts, a 1.07 WHIP and a .171 opponent batting average during the stretch...prior to May 3, Abreu had a 12.54 ERA in his first 11 apps. of the season.

AT DAIKIN: Made his 180th career appearance at Daikin Park last night, surpassing RHP Ryan Pressly for the 3rd-most in the venue's history...his 264 strikeouts at Daikin Park trail only RHP Brad Lidge (287) for the most by a reliever in the venue's history...also has 193.2 IP in his career at Daikin Park, recently surpassing Octavio Dotel (190.1) for the 3rd-most innings pitched by a reliever in the venue's history.

MILESTONE MARKERS: On Aug. 5 vs. TOR, he struck out RF Nathan Lukes to begin his scoreless 8th inning, recording his 500th career strikeout...became just the 4th reliever in franchise history to record 500 strikeouts with the club, joining LHP Billy Wagner (694), RHP Brad Lidge (557) and RHP Dave Smith (529)...logged his 349th career appearance on July 1 vs. MIN, surpassing LHP Joe Sambito for the 5th-most relief appearances in Astros history.

LAST START (8/7 at SD): Made his 4th start of the season, allowed 3 runs on 4 hits and 3 walks with 1 strikeout in 4.2 innings...didn't factor into the decision but the Astros went on to defeat the Padres, 6-3.

BLANCO IS BACK: The 32-year-old Dominican righty is now in his 5th Major League season (2022-26)...started in his 1st four appearances of the season, but was available in the bullpen beginning on Wednesday at SF...has struck out 17 batters through 19.1 innings while holding opponents to a .221 average (15x68) through his first 4 starts of the year.
