RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a six-game, seven-day homestand against the Cubs (1-1, one to play) and Yankees (three to play) with tonight's rubber match at Tropicana Field...are off tomorrow before hosting New York this weekend (April 10-12)...have gone 3-1 in their last four games on the heels of a 2-5 start...three of four and five of their first eight series are against NL opponents...are tied with the Orioles for second in the AL East, 3.5 GB the first-place Yankees (8-2)...have spent three days in second, three in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- After **Drew Rasmussen** was scratched from his scheduled start, the Rays yielded nine runs on 16 hits in last night's 9-2 setback, both surpassing the staff's totals from the previous three games (6R, 10H)...it was their largest home loss since Aug. 19, 2025 vs. NYY (13-3) and was their third time this season falling by six runs or more, tied with the White Sox for most in the AL.
- The loss halted a streak of 10 consecutive games in which they led at any point, the second-longest season-opening streak in Rays history behind the club's modern era-record-tying 13-0 start in 2023...they were out-hit for only the second time in 11 games (also: April 1 at MIL).
- Over their last eight games, 46.6 pct. (14) of the Rays 30 runs have come via their 10 HR, including eight of 12 runs over their last three contests...their 11 HR are tied for third in the AL.
- The Rays are 84-64 (.568) in Interleague play since balanced schedules were introduced in 2023, the second-best record vs. the NL among AL clubs behind the Astros (81-61/.570).
- Joe Boyle** is slated for his Tropicana Field debut this evening...he has gone 5.0 IP or more with four hits or fewer and 2 ER or fewer in each of his first two starts—tonight, he looks to become the eighth Ray to open a season with three such starts (or more), first since Rasmussen's and **Ian Seymour's** club-record-tying four-start streaks to begin 2025...his 0.88 WHIP is ninth in the AL.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays placed RHP **Drew Rasmussen** on the paternity list and recalled RHP **Jesse Scholtens** from Triple-A Durham...Scholtens, who turned 32 two days ago (April 6), was claimed off waivers from the White Sox on Aug. 4, 2025...he was recalled from Triple-A Durham on Sept. 20 and made two relief appearances...in his second outing on Sept. 25 at BAL, he collected a career-high 9 SO over 5.1 IP of relief, generating a career-high 17 whiffs, most by a Rays reliever in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008)...he also tied **Ryan Yarbrough** (May 31, 2018 at OAK) for the most strikeouts by a reliever in franchise history...his 12 total SO marked the most in franchise history through a pitcher's first two relief appearances with the Rays, surpassing **Cooper Criswell** (10) in 2023.

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win tonight, the Rays would:

- Earn their first series win at Tropicana Field since Sept. 20-22, 2024 vs. TOR.
- Record back-to-back series wins for the first time since Aug. 29-Sept. 3 (at WSH, vs. SEA).
- Improve to 3-0-1 against the Cubs in series play at Tropicana Field.
- Win their first home series for the 12th time...improve to 7-0-1 in their first home series of the season dating back to 2019.
- Move to .500 for the third time (also: 2-2, 5-5).
- Paired with April 5 at MIN, win back-to-back rubber games for the first time since Aug. 6-24, 2025 (3G) on the heels of a five-game losing streak in series-deciding matchups.

WELCOME TO SPRINGFIELD—**Chandler Simpson** is the 11th player to reach base safely in each of the Rays first 11 games of a season, first since **Tommy Pham** (15G) in 2019...the franchise record of 20 games is shared by **Evan Longoria** (2013) and **Jorge Cantú** (2005)...only seven players have reached safely in the Rays first 12 games, and Pham, Longoria, and Cantú are the only Tampa Bay hitters with streaks of 15 games or more...Simpson has a 12-game on-base streak overall dating back to Sept. 27, 2025, second longest of his career (18G from June 25-July 19, 2025)...Simpson's seven multi-hit games are tied for the major league lead with LAD **Andy Pages** and match **Rocco Baldelli** (2003) for second in club history through the Rays first 11 games, trailing **Quinton McCracken** (8G) in 1998...McCracken's eight multi-hit efforts are also the most by a Ray through 12 team games.

- Simpson and **Yandy Díaz** share the AL lead with 17 hits apiece, tied for second in the majors to LAD **Andy Pages** (19)...they are the first pair of teammates to both record 17 hits or more through their club's first 11 games since LAD **Mookie Betts** and LAD **Will Smith** (both 17) in 2024...they also joined TOR **Bo Bichette** (18), TOR **Matt Chapman** (21), and TOR **Vladimir Guerrero Jr.** (18) as the only AL teammates over the last 10 seasons (2017-26) to turn the trick.
- His 11 hits off fastballs are tied with six others for the most in the majors...he leads MLB with eight infield hits, ahead of CHC **Pete Crow-Armstrong** (6).
- Simpson's 4.4 pct. strikeout rate is the best in baseball, and he has not struck out in his last 26 PA, the second-longest active streak in the majors to AZ **Geraldo Perdomo** (38)...his 7.5 pct. whiff rate ranks second to Perdomo (7.5%)...he has yet to swing and miss at an offspeed pitch (28 swings).
- Per Baseball Savant, Simpson leads all major league left fielders with two outs above average, and the only outfielder with more OAA is HOU **Cam Smith** (3)...he recorded -5 OAA last season.

BECAUSE HE GETS ON BASE—**Yandy Díaz** has reached base safely 24 times (17H, 4BB, 3HBP), third in the majors behind HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (28) and HOU **Jose Altuve** (26), who have both played one more game than Díaz, and tied with Akinori Iwamura (2007) and **Carlos Peña** (2012) for most in franchise history through the Rays first 11 games...Iwamura holds the record through 12 games (27 TOB).

- He is 26 hits shy of reaching 1,000 for his career, which would make him the 20th Cuban-born player in major league history to reach mark...with 899 hits as a Ray, he needs 11 more to tie **B.J. Upton** (910) for fourth on the club's all-time list...he also has 172 doubles in his Tampa Bay career, tied for fifth in franchise history (see table to the right).

GO, JONNY GO—**Jonathan Aranda** has driven in 5 RBI over his last four games, adding 2 2B and 1 HR in that span...his 10 RBI are tied for the club lead with **Yandy Díaz** and tied for third in the AL...the two join HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (10) and HOU **Christian Walker** (13) as the only pairs of AL teammates that have both recorded 10 RBI or more...this marks the fourth instance of multiple Rays reaching the mark through the team's first 11 games, joining 2023 (Arozarena, Franco, B. Lowe, Paredes), 2010, and 2009 (Longoria & Peña in both years).

- Aranda leads the AL with 22 hard-hit balls (95 mph EV or higher), second in the majors to LAD **Freddie Freeman**, and his 95.0 mph average exit velocity ranks sixth in MLB...he has also whiffed only 16 times on 96 swings (16.7%), good for the ninth-best whiff-rate among AL hitters.

SCORING CHANGES—Earlier today, MLB announced a pair of scoring changes from the Rays 10-3 loss on April 3 at MIN...in the bottom of the 7th inning, **Luke Keaschall** reached on what was originally ruled a base hit—this has been changed to an error on **Junior Caminero**...three batters later, **Ryan Jeffers** reached on a fielder's choice and error by Caminero, which has been ruled a base hit.

REHAB UPDATES—RHP **Edwin Uceta** (right shoulder impingement) began his rehab assignment with Double-A Montgomery last night vs. Columbus, yielding one hit with one strikeout over a scoreless 7th inning on 15 pitches (nine strikes)...INF **Gavin Lux** (right shoulder impingement) has completed four rehab games with Triple-A Durham, going 1-for-14 with 1 RBI and 3 BB...he is scheduled to start at second base tonight at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

ON DECK—The Rays host the Yankees this weekend (April 10-12) for the second half of their first homestand back at Tropicana Field, commencing a 13-game season series...the Rays went 4-9 against the Pinstripes last year and are looking to snap a five-game losing streak against them, their longest since May 19-July 5, 2019 (6G)...they were out-homered by New York, 29-7, in 2025, with the 29 HR accounting for 42 of the Yankees 69 runs (60.7%) in the matchup...meanwhile, only 23.4 pct. (11) of the Rays 47 runs vs. New York came via their 7 HR...the Rays have lost back-to-back season series and three of the last four (2022-25), going 26-32 in that span, but their 45-42 (.517) mark against the Yankees since 2020 is the best by any AL club.

TONIGHT'S START—Joe Boyle will make his third start of the campaign today, his first career start against the Cubs...he was acquired from the Athletics along with INF Will Simpson, RHP Jacob Watters, and a Competitive Balance Round A selection (OF Brendan Summerhill) for LHP Jeffrey Springs and LHP Jacob Lopez, Dec. 14, 2024.

- ✦ Made his second career Opening Day roster (2024 w/ OAK) and his first with the Rays...he is one of 16 Rays to have made their first Opening Day roster with the organization in 2026.
- ✦ At 6'8", he is tied for the fifth tallest pitcher in Rays history, behind only Paul Gervase (6'10"), Aaron Slegers (6'10"), Mark Hendrickson (6'9"), and Jeff Niemann (6'9").

LAST TIME OUT—Boyle allowed three runs (2ER) over 5.1 innings on four hits and three walks with a career-high-tying nine strikeouts against the Twins on April 3 at Target Field...tossed 104 pitches in the outing, tying his career high (also: Aug. 24, 2024 vs. MIL and Aug. 19, 2024 vs. TB)...did not allow a hit across the first 3.0 innings with two walks and five strikeouts...was tagged for all three runs in the 4th inning after a Josh Bell RBI-double, Royce Lewis plating a run on a fielder's choice, and a Tristan Gray sacrifice fly.

- ✦ He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in four of his last five starts (Sept. 15, 2025—pres.)...over that time, he has posted a 3.04 ERA (26.2IP, 9ER) with 32 strikeouts, 10 walks, and a .208 (20-for-96) opp. average.

GOOD, BETTER, BEST—Has never pitched against the Cubs in his career...in 12 career games (11 starts) against the NL, he has posted a 5.76 ERA (45.1IP, 29ER) with 49 strikeouts, 29 walks, and a .228 (39-for-171) opp. average...he has made five starts against the NL as a member of the Rays, and has pitched 5.0 innings or more with two runs or fewer allowed in three of the five.

- ✦ His last outing against a NL opponent came on March 28 at STL...he retired the last 16 batters he faced in the contest after being tagged for two runs on three hits in the first frame.

TOP OF THE TROP—Is making his first career start at Tropicana Field tonight...in seven starts last season at Steinbrenner Field, he was 1-1 with a 2.15 ERA (29.1IP, 7ER), 31 strikeouts, a .198 (21-for-106) opp. average, and a .298 opp. OBP.

- ✦ As a starting pitcher, he has pitched in 13 career games at his home ballpark...he has allowed one run or fewer in nine of the 13 with seven of the nine being outings of 5.0 innings or more.

SUGAR YOU'RE GOIN' DOWN SWINGING—Since his major league debut on Sept. 17, 2023, he has recorded 10.06 strikeouts per 9.0 innings...he is one of 17 AL pitchers in that span to have a rate of 10.00 or higher (min. 10GS)...of his 142 career strikeouts, 113 have been swinging with 29 looking.

- ✦ In starts where Boyle records six strikeouts or more, his teams are 6-4... compared to 3-11 when he has five strikeouts or fewer.

ALRIGHT, ALRIGHT, ALRIGHT—Boyle has held righties to a .185 batting average (42-for-227) in his career, and .105 (2-for-19) this season...he has allowed just 13 extra-base hits, walked 31 batters, and struck out 71 right-handed batters over the course of his career...meanwhile, lefties have hit at a .240 clip (58-for-242) against him with 22 extra-base hits, 45 walks, and 71 strikeouts.

FIRST THINGS FIRST—Across his career, Boyle has a .182 (40-for-220) opp. average on his first time thru the order with 12 extra-base hits (7 2B, 5HR), a .611 OPS, and 75 strikeouts...his second time through the order he holds a .205 (38-for-185) opp. average, 15 extra-base hits (10 2B, 1 3B, 4HR), 51 strikeouts, and a .639 OPS.

- ✦ Last season opposing hitters went 18-for-98 (.184) the first time facing him with 5 2B, 2HR) and a .600 OPS.

A YEAR IN REVIEW—The right-hander split time between Tampa Bay and Triple-A Durham in 2025, making a combined 31 appearances (26 starts)...in the majors, he went 1-4 with a 4.67 ERA (52.0IP, 27ER) and a .221 (43-for-195) opp. average...in Durham, he spun a 8-4 record with a 1.88 ERA (86.0IP, 18ER), 114 strikeouts, and 1.01 WHIP...he allowed three runs or fewer in every minor league outing, with a total of five quality starts and nine scoreless outings.

- ✦ He was named a Baseball America Triple-A All-Star, International League Postseason All-Star in 2025 in addition to winning International League Pitcher of the Month and Rays Minor League Pitcher of the Month in June...additionally, he won the International League Pitcher of the Week on three occasions (April 20, May 18, June 8).
- ✦ He made five starts with one relief appearance in June to a 3-0 record, 1.80 ERA (30.0IP, 6ER), 49 strikeouts, and a 0.97 WHIP...his 49 strikeouts were the most at the Triple-A level in a single month since May 2019 (Zac Gallen, 50) and the fourth most since 2015.

FIRING FLAMES—In 2025, Boyle threw 28 pitches at 100.0 mph or more, eighth most in the AL among right-handers and 11th among all pitchers...his average fastball velocity a year ago was 98.5 mph, which ranked 23rd among all major league pitchers and seventh in the AL...his 98.5 mph average was a 0.8 mph improvement from 2024 (97.7mph).

FIRST IMPRESSIONS—Boyle's first start for the Rays came in a spot start on April 13, 2025 vs. ATL...he earned his first and only win of 2025 after tossing 5.0 hitless innings (2R, 0ER) with 2 BB, 1 HBP, and 7 SO...the right-hander retired 13 straight batters to open the game before allowing his first baserunner to reach via walk in the 5th inning...put out the next two batters before yielding a hit-by-pitch and a walk to end his outing.

- ✦ He became one of 22 players since 1901 to toss five hitless innings (or more) in his debut with a team and the second Ray to turn the trick (Nathan Eovaldi - 6.0IP on May 30, 2018 at OAK).

A SLIDING SCALE—Tossed a total of 58 strikeouts in the majors in 2025, with 32 of those coming on sliders...his 32 strikeouts via slider were the most on the Rays last season and tied for the eighth most by a Ray since 2020.

FINISH HIM—In two strike counts last season, he held opposing hitters to a .117 (13-for-111) average with 58 strikeouts in 126 plate appearances...in such situations, he held opponents to a .402 OPS with five extra-base hits (4 2B, HR).
