METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Nationals, 14-2, in the second game of their three-game series last night...Their 14 runs allowed were the most this season...They are 3-16 in their last 19 games dating back to April 8 and have been outscored 101-49 during that span...Have dropped five of their last seven contests against the Nationals dating back to August 20, 2025...Were 17-4 against Washington in their previous 21 contests...Today, the Mets conclude a 10-day, nine-game homestand (3-5) against the Twins (2-1), Rockies (0-3) and Nationals (1-1)...Following this homestand, the Mets head West to face the Angels (three games), Diamondbacks (three games) and Rockies (three games).

STRIKE THAT: Last Night, Mets pitchers combined for a season-high-tying 15 strikeouts for the third time this season (also: 4/21 vs. Minnesota and 4/24 vs. Colorado)...Join Toronto (5) and Milwaukee as the only teams in baseball with three or more 15+-strikeout games...Mets relief pitchers have combined for 122 strikeouts this season, third-most in the NL and sixth-most in the majors.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to today's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves - RHP Carl Edwards Jr. has been designated for assignment...RHP Austin Warren has been re-called from Triple-A Syracuse...OF Luis Robert, Jr. has been placed on the 10-Day Injured List, retroactive to April 27, with lumbar spine disc herniation...INF Eric Waganman has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse.

MOVING ON UP: Juan Soto slugged a solo homer in the third inning last night, his second in as many games...His 247 career home runs are tied with Miguel Cabrera for the 14th-most in Major League history prior to turning 28 (next: Andruw Jones, 250)...Has 69 career opposite field home runs, the second-most in the majors since 2018 (most: Aaron Judge, 97)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

LET'S GO STREAKING: Soto has reached base in all 15 games played this season, the longest on-base streak to begin any season of his career...Since his return from the IL on April 22, has a .433 OBP and a .583 SLG.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have gone 19-9 against the Nationals since 2024...New York has won 15 of their last 19 games against Washington at Citi Field.

READY FREDDY: Freddy Peralta is set to make his seventh start of the season today...He is 1-3 with a 3.90 ERA (14 ER/32.1 IP), 13 walks and 36 strikeouts...Peralta has tossed 5+ innings in five of his six starts this year...After allowing four earned runs in his first outing of the year, Peralta has not allowed more than three earned runs in each of his last five starts, posting a 3.29 ERA (10 ER/27.1 IP) in that span.

MY OH MYERS: Tobias Myers is now 0-1 with a 2.33 ERA (5 ER/19.2 IP), three walks and 16 strikeouts in nine games this year...He has not allowed an earned run over his last three appearances, tossing 6.1 scoreless innings and allowing three hits, two walks and seven strikeouts.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets are in the midst of their third homestand of the season...The team is 6-11 in New York this year...The team has posted a 4.59 ERA (80 ER/157.0 IP) at Citi Field in 2026...They are hitting .225/.290/.333 at Citi Field.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Elian Peña went a combined 3-7 with two runs, two doubles, one RBI and a walk in the St. Lucie Mets doubleheader yesterday...In 21 games this year, Peña is batting .346 (28-81) with 13 runs, eight doubles, one home run, 11 RBI, eight steals, 17 walks a .460 ONP, a .481 SLG and a .941 OPS...He is the eighth-best prospect in the Mets system according to MLB Pipeline.com.

WE REMEMBER: The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets earned their 11th straight win with an 8-1 victory over the Atlanta Braves...Doc Gooden allowed one run on six hits with two walks and struck out five over 8.0 innings...Darryl Strawberry recorded five hits, two runs, three RBI and a double in the win...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

BO KNOWS: Bo Bichette has recorded a hit in seven of his last eight games and he is hitting .290 (9-31) during that span with six runs, two doubles, one home run, five RBI, two walks and a steal...He has one leadoff home run this season and has hit seven in his career.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets start divisional action this series...The team is 1-1 against the East in 2026...Last year, the Mets went 25-27 against the NL East division...They posted a 4.35 ERA, while slashing .266/.338/.452...This compared to a 30-22 record against the division in 2024.

PREVIOUSLY ON: Suffered his third straight loss on April 24 vs. Colorado...Allowed two runs over 5.2 innings and surrendered a season-high seven hits...Issued a season-high-tying three walks for the third time in his last four starts and struck out a season-high eight batters...Eight of the 10 batters he allowed to reach base came in his final 2.2 innings.

THE GAME OF RISP: So far this season, opposing batters are 1-22 with runners in scoring position against Peralta...Peralta, Caleb Kilian, Chris Sale, Clayton Beeter and Martín Pérez are the only pitchers in the majors this season to face 20 or more batters with RISP and allow one or zero hits...Since 2021, Peralta has held opposing batters to a .202 (98-486) average with RISP, the best mark in the majors during that span (min 500 batters faced w/RISP).

NATIONAL TREASURE: In eight career games (six starts) against Washington, Peralta is 4-3 with a 5.82 ERA (25 ER/38.2 IP) and 51 strikeouts...In his last start against Washington, July 13, 2025, at American Family Field, Peralta allowed one run over 6.2 innings, gave up three hits, issued one walk and recorded seven strikeouts.

DAY AND NIGHT: Today, Freddy Peralta will make his sixth daytime start of the season...Peralta's only night start of the season was his previous outing, April 24 vs. Colorado...In 129 career night games (94 starts), Peralta is 43-26 with a 3.64 ERA (225 ER/556.2 IP)...In 88 career day games (74 starts), Peralta is 28-19 with a 3.54 ERA (160 ER/406.2 IP)...Peralta will be the only pitcher in the majors so far to have six daytime starts this season.

NEW FACE IN A NEW PLACE: On January 21, the Mets acquired Peralta from Milwaukee along with RHP Tobias Myers in exchange for RHP Brandon Sproat and INF Jett Williams...Peralta spent his first eight Big League seasons with Milwaukee and went 70-42 with a 3.59 ERA (371 ER/931.0 IP) and 1153 strikeouts across 211 games (162 starts)...In Brewers franchise history, Peralta ranks third in strikeouts, fifth in ERA, eighth in wins and 10th in starts (min. 500.0 IP)...Peralta made his Major League debut at age 21 on May 13, 2018 vs. Colorado...The right-hander struck out 13 over 5.2 innings and took a no-hitter into the sixth innings...His 13 strikeouts were tied with Cliff Melton (1937) for the fourth-most in Major League history in a season debut...Peralta finished his rookie season at 6-4 with a 4.25 ERA (37 ER/78.1 IP) and 96 strikeouts over 16 games (14 starts)...From 2019-2020, 45 of 54 of his appearances during that span came in relief...In 2021, Peralta was selected to his first career All-Star game after he went 10-5 with a 2.81 ERA (45 ER/144.1 IP) and 195 strikeouts across 28 games (27 starts)...In 2022, Peralta pitched to a 3.58 ERA (31 ER/78.0 IP) over 18 games (17 starts) in an injury-riddled season...Over the past three seasons, Peralta has pitched exclusively as a starter and has gone 40-25 with a 3.40 ERA (195 ER/516.0 IP) and 614 strikeouts over 95 starts...Since 2023, Peralta ranks tied for second in the majors in wins, third in strikeouts and opponents' batting average (.210), fourth in SO/9 IP (10.71) and tied for fifth in starts...A native of Moca, Dominican Republic, Peralta was originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Seattle Mariners on April 18, 2013...The right-hander was acquired by Milwaukee in a four-player trade on December 9, 2015.

2025 RECAP: Last season, Peralta went 17-6 with a 2.70 ERA (53 ER/176.2 IP), a 1.08 WHIP, a .193 opponents' batting average and 204 strikeouts across 33 starts...Peralta established career bests in wins, ERA, starts and innings...In the NL, Peralta ranked first in wins, second among qualifiers in opponents' batting average, fourth in ERA, fifth in WHIP, sixth in strikeouts and tied for 11th in innings...The righty earned his second career All-Star selection (also: 2021), finished fifth in the NL Cy Young vote and was an All-MLB Second Team selection...On May 8 at Cleveland, Peralta recorded his 1000th career strikeout...From June 13 - July 19, Peralta earned a win in seven straight starts, the longest such streak in the majors last season...In five August starts, Peralta went 4-0 with a 0.32 ERA (1 ER/28.0 IP) and 32 strikeouts...He earned NL Pitcher of the Month for August, his second career Pitcher of the Month honor (also: August, 2023)...From August 5 - September 10, Peralta tossed 30.0 consecutive scoreless innings, the second-longest scoreless streak in Brewers franchise history behind Teddy Higuera's 32.0-inning scoreless streak in 1987...In each of his five starts from August 12 - September 4, Peralta threw 5.0 or more scoreless innings, the longest such streak in the majors since Zac Gallen's six straight scoreless starts of 5.0 or more innings from August 8 - September 4, 2022...Peralta started three games for Milwaukee in the Postseason and went 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (8 ER/15.1 IP) and 19 strikeouts...He earned the win in Game 1 of the NLDS vs. Chicago-NL and suffered the loss in Game 4 of the NLDS at Chicago-NL and Game 2 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL.

OPENING DAY IN THE BIG APPLE PART THREE: On March 26 vs. Pittsburgh, Freddy Peralta made his third career Opening Day start...He allowed four runs over 5.0 innings and struck out seven...Peralta's first career Opening Day start came with Milwaukee on March 29, 2024 at Citi Field...That day, the right-hander threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball and fanned eight Mets batters...The lone hit he surrendered was a solo home run off the bat of Starling Marte in the second inning...Last season, Peralta was named the Brewers' Opening Day starter for the second consecutive season...The Brewers opened their 2025 regular season at Yankee Stadium, where Peralta allowed two runs over 5.0 innings and struck out eight batters...Peralta is the fifth different Mets pitcher to get the Opening Day nod in each of the last five seasons...The last Mets pitcher to start consecutive season openers for the Mets was Jacob deGrom, who started three consecutive Opening Days from 2019-2021.

KEEPIN' IT 200: In each of his last three seasons, Peralta has recorded 200 or more strikeouts...The only other pitcher in the majors to record 200+ strikeouts in each of the last three seasons is Dylan Cease...Additionally, Peralta's three seasons of 200+ strikeouts are tied with Mario Soto for the third-most by a Dominican-born pitcher...The only Dominican Republic natives with more such seasons are Hall of Famers Pedro Martínez (9) and Juan Marichal (6)...His highest single season strikeout total came in 2023 at 210.

REVERSE, REVERSE: For his career, Peralta has held left-handed batters to a .201 batting average, the fourth-best mark in the majors by a

right-handed pitcher since his debut season, 2018 (min. 1500 LHB faced)...In 2021, Peralta held lefties to a .157 batting average (43-274), the third-best mark in a single season by a right-handed pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961, min. 300 LHB faced)...Last season, left-handed batters hit .204 (66-323) off of Peralta, the fourth-lowest mark among right-handers in the NL and the 11th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 300 LHB faced).

EXPANDING HIS ARSENAL: In his first two seasons, Peralta threw his four-seam fastball 77.7% of the time as part of a three-pitch repertoire that also featured a curveball and changeup... In 2020, Peralta added a slider to his arsenal and was his second-most thrown pitch from 2021-2024 with his highest usage coming in 2021 at 26.5%...Last season, Peralta only threw his slider 10.2% of the time, his lowest-used pitch...Despite the low usage of his slider, Peralta held opposing batters to a .155 (9-58) average in at-bats ending with the pitch...With the addition of another pitch to arsenal, Peralta's fastball usage has decreased from his first two seasons, however, he has thrown the pitch at least 50% of the time in every season of his career...Peralta has increased his changeup usage from season to season and was his second-most used pitch in 2025 at a career-high 21.2%.
