MIAMI MARLINS (35-36) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (36-35)

June 14, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 12:15 EDT - Game #72/Home #39

RHP Max Meyer (6-0, 2.85 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (6-5, 2.84 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won two of the first five games on this six-game homestand vs. Los Angeles-NL (1-2, June 9-11) and Miami (1-1, Friday-Sunday)...Will host the Marlins for one more game (today) before departing for a six-game, seven-day road trip against the Athletics (Monday-Wednesday) and Colorado (June 19-21)...Have the fifth-most runs scored (357) in Major League Baseball, behind Los Angeles-NL (382), Washington (382), Milwaukee (366) and Atlanta (358)...Have struck out the fourth-most batters (644) in MLB, trailing Milwaukee (669), Cleveland (658) and Philadelphia (655).

HEADING WEST: Pittsburgh will travel to Sutter Health Park for a three-game series at the Athletics (Monday-Wednesday), marking its first-ever trip to West Sacramento (the Pirates won two of three games vs. the A's last year from September 19-21 at PNC Park)...The Pirates will then have the day off on Thursday in Denver before a three-game series at Colorado's Coors Field (June 19-21)...Pittsburgh has gone 45-27 (.625) against the Rockies since the start of the 2014 season (it has won or split 10 of the 11 season series in that span)...The Pirates took two of three games from Colorado earlier this season from May 12-14 at PNC Park.

FISH FRY: Pittsburgh has gone 11-5 (.688) against Miami since the beginning of the 2024 season, including taking two of three contests here at PNC Park in the last series from June 9-11, 2025...The Pirates are 47-30 (.610) all-time against the Marlins at PNC Park (since 2001)...They are looking to win three straight home series against Miami (they also swept a three-game series here from September 9-11, 2024) for the first time since winning four consecutive home series against the Marlins from 2012-15.

INDISPENCEABLE: Spencer Horwitz went 1-for-3 with an RBI, two hit-by-pitches and two runs scored in Pittsburgh's 3-2 win on Saturday vs. Miami (he brought home the game-winning run when he was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the eighth inning)...It was his third career game-winning RBI in the eighth inning or later (also last year on July 13 at Minnesota and on September 24 at Cincinnati)...He became just the seventh Pirate (since RBI became an official stat in 1920) with a hit, an RBI, two hit-by-pitches and two runs scored in a game...Horwitz joined Lloyd Waner (October 6, 1929 at Chicago), Ralph Kiner (May 26, 1952 vs. Cincinnati), Eddie Pellagrini (August 8 [G1], 1954 vs. St. Louis), Barry Bonds (May 21, 1991 vs. St. Louis), Craig Wilson (May 29, 2004 vs. Chicago-NL) and Jung Ho Kang (August 9, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...He has reached base safely in 43 of his last 48 contests (since April 17 vs. Tampa Bay), going 51-for-167 (.305) with seven doubles, eight home runs, 28 RBI, 25 walks, a .902 OPS and 22 runs during that stretch.

TIMES TWO: The Pirates have scored at least two runs in each of their last 24 games (since May 19 at St. Louis)...That is tied with another 24-game streak from May 28-June 23, 2019 for their third-longest such streak in the 21st century, trailing a 28-game streak from July 31-August 28 (G2), 2007 and a 25-game streak from August 6-September 2, 2003...That is also tied with Baltimore (March 29-April 24) for the longest streak in MLB this season.

THE YO SHOW: Yohan Ramirez earned his fourth win after pitching a scoreless eighth inning on Saturday vs. Miami (he allowed a single and a walk before striking out three straight batters)...He is holding opposing hitters to a .184 batting average against (14-for-76) with runners on base...His 23 strikeouts with runners on rank tied for sixth among Major League relievers.

ANCHOR DOWN: Bryan Reynolds had an RBI double on Saturday vs. Miami, extending his on-base streak to 20 straight games (since May 23 at Toronto)...He is 23-for-72 (.319) with seven doubles, three home runs and a .967 OPS during the streak...It is the fourth-longest such streak of his career (within a single season), trailing only a 28-gamer (August 29-September 30, 2023), a 25-gamer (June 1-29, 2024) and a 24-gamer (May 16-June 9, 2019).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 14, 2015: Josh Harrison recorded the fourth walkoff RBI of his career with his two-out single that scored Neil Walker in the 11th inning of Pittsburgh's sweep-clinching, 1-0 victory over Philadelphia at PNC Park. A.J. Burnett started and allowed just five hits and one walk over his 9.0 scoreless innings, while Jared Hughes and Antonio Bastardo each pitched 1.0 scoreless inning of relief in the Bucs' win.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Skenes had a no-decision after allowing two runs over 6.0 innings (he had seven strikeouts) in Pittsburgh's 12-3 loss on June 9 vs. Los Angeles (NL)...He has struck out at least seven batters and thrown at least 100 pitches in each of his last three starts (also May 28 vs. Chicago-NL and June 3 at Houston), making him the first Pirate to do that since Gerrit Cole (August 10-21, 2017)...The only Pittsburgh pitchers to do that in at least four consecutive starts (since pitch tracking began in 1988) were Oliver Pérez (five, August 19-September 9 [G1], 2004) & A.J. Burnett (four, April 6-22, 2013).

AGAINST THE MARLINS: Skenes has a 2.38 ERA (11.1ip/3er) and 16 strikeouts in two career starts against Miami...He won a 3-2 decision after allowing one run and striking out nine batters in 6.0 innings on September 9, 2024...Skenes also had a no-decision after allowing two runs and striking out seven batters during his first career Opening Day start on March 27, 2025 at loanDepot park (the Bucs lost, 5-4, in walkoff fashion).

IN THE BEGINNING: Skenes has a 5.93 ERA (13.2ip/9er) in the first inning of games this year...He has pitched to a 2.17 ERA (62.1ip/15er) from the second inning onward.

BEST OF THE BEST: Skenes' 2.13 ERA (396.2ip/94er) through 69 Major League starts ranks second among all Major League pitchers through their first 69 starts during the Live Ball Era (since 1920), behind only New York (NL)'s Dwight Gooden (1.99, 1984-86).

DON'T WALK HERE: Skenes pitched 39.0 consecutive innings without issuing a walk (the streak began in the fourth inning on April 13 vs. Washington) before allowing a walk to Adolis García in the fifth inning on May 17 vs. Philadelphia...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that was the second-longest streak without a walk by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Bob Friend (46.1ip, May 28-June 22, 1963).

CRAZY EIGHTS: Skenes pitched 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts on May 6 at Arizona and May 12 vs. Colorado...He joined Bob Veale (Sept. 16-22, 1963) and Steve Blass (Sept. 15-20, 1968) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two or fewer hits in back-to-back starts...He also became just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1901 to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings while giving up two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts, along with Boston (AL)'s Cy Young (1905), Chicago (AL)'s Billy Pierce (1958) and San Diego's Mat Latos (2010).

NEAR PERFECTION: Skenes pitched 6.2 perfect innings before allowing a single to Jake Bauers on April 24 at Milwaukee (he went on to strike out seven batters and surrender just the one hit over his 7.0 innings)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he tied Nellie Briles (August 22, 1972 at San Francisco), Bert Blyleven (August 16, 1980 vs. Montréal) and Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) for the third-longest perfect game bid by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Ken Brett (8.0ip, May 27, 1974 vs. San Diego) and Jeff Karstens (7.2ip, August 6, 2008 at Arizona)...Skenes was the sixth Pittsburgh pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have a start of at least 7.0 scoreless innings with one or zero hits allowed, zero walks issued and at least seven strikeouts...Skenes joined Bob Friend (September 7, 1955 at Chicago), Woodie Fryman (July 1, 1966 at New York), A.J. Burnett (April 17, 2013 vs. St. Louis), Kingham (April 29, 2018) & Jared Jones (May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado).

WHAT'S UP, DOC: Skenes won the National League Cy Young Award in 2025, one year after being named the National League Rookie of the Year...He became the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award and the Cy Young Award in consecutive seasons, along with the Mets' Dwight Gooden (1984-85)...Skenes joined Vernon Law (1960) & Doug Drabek (1990) as the only Pirates to win the award.
