METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off on Monday...On Sunday, the Mets defeated the Rangers, 5-2, in walk-off fashion...The Mets are in a stretch of 16 games in 17 days (2-8)...The Mets are in the midst of their final homestand of the regular season, a 10-day, nine-game (1-2) stand against the Rangers (1-2), Padres (three games) and Nationals (three games).

ROBERTO CLEMENTE DAY: Yesterday, Major League Baseball announced 2025 plans to celebrate the humanitarian legacy of Hall of Famer Roberto Clemente, centered around the annual Roberto Clemente Day and baseball's most prestigious individual honor, the Roberto Clemente Award...Francisco Lindor has been selected as the New York Mets nominee in 2025...Both Francisco Lindor and Edwin Díaz will wear #21 during tonight's games.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: On Sunday, Pete Alonso lined a walk-off three-run homer in the 10th...Marked his fifth career walk-off home run, the most in franchise history breaking a tie with Mike Piazza, Cleon Jones, Wilmer Flores, Chris Jones and Kevin McReynolds...He is tied with Mike Yastrzemski and Will Smith for the most in the majors since 2019...Alonso is batting .306/.399/.650 (49-160) with 14 home runs, 13 RBI and 82 RBI with runners in scoring position this season...His 82 RBI and 27 extra-base hits are the most in the majors.

LIGHTENING MCLEAN: On Sunday, Nolan McLean threw 6.0 scoreless innings in his sixth career Major League start...He has not allowed a run in each of his first three career starts at Citi Field and is the first Met pitcher to not allow a run in their first three career starts at home and is the eighth pitcher in Major League history to not allow a run in each of their first three home starts (min. 15.0 IP)...He lowered his ERA to 1.19, the lowest mark by a Mets pitcher through their first six career Major League starts...The previous lowest mark was Terry Leach's 1.73 ERA... His 40 strikeouts are tied with Dwight Gooden for the third-most in franchise history through six Major League games trailing only Matt Harvey (43) and Nolan Ryan (42)

**40/30:** Juan Soto became the first player in franchise history to hit 40 or more home runs and steal at least 30 bases in the same season, and he is just one of 13 players in Major League History to accomplish the feat...It is his second career 40 home run season and he is just one of nine active players to have multiple 40 homer seasons...Howard Johnson (36 HR/32 SB) and Darryl Strawberry (39 HR/36 SB) in 1987 are the only pair of Mets teammates to have a 30/30 season... Along with the 1987 Mets, the 1996 Rockies are the only other team that featured  $\,$ two players with a 30/30 season - Dante Bichette (31 HR/31 SB) and Ellis Burks (40 HR/32 SB).

MOVING ON UP: Francisco Lindor picked up his 30th stolen base of the season in the first inning of Sunday's game...This marks his second career season with 30+ stolen bases (also: 2023)...Lindor has 116 stolen bases as a member of the Mets, tied with Lenny Dykstra for the seventh-most in franchise history.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stolen 134 bases this season, which ranks fifth in the majors and third in the National League...The team's 88.7 stolen base percentage is the best in The Show and the highest in franchise history...The team's 134 steals is their most since 2008 when the team swiped 138 bases

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty has recorded a career-high 16 home runs this season...In 46 games following the All-Star break, the Texan has hit .296/.361/.472 with four doubles, seven home runs, 15 RBI, 15 walks and four steals...This compares to a .226/.282/.403 mark with nine homers and 30 RBI in 75 games prior to the break.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are in the middle of their final homestand of the 2025 regular season...The Mets are 43-29 at home this season...Their .613 winning percentage at home is tied for the eighth-best in the majors and tied for the fifth-best in the NL.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Suffered the loss on September 10 at Philadelphia...Allowed four runs over 4.0+ innings, surrendered six hits, issued three walks, struck out five and hit two batters...Marked his second consecutive start of less than 5.0 innings.

**THE GAME OF RISP:** Over his last 12 starts, opposing batters are 18-62 with four doubles and 28 RBI against Holmes with runners in scoring position...In his first 17 starts of the season, Holmes held opposing batters to a .111 (7-63) average with runners in scoring position...Overall, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .200 (25-125) average with runners in scoring position, the third-best mark in the NL and the eighth-best mark in the majors (min. 125 batters faced w/RISP)...Additionally, Holmes is one of six pitchers to allow one or zero home runs with runners in scoring position (min. 125 batters faced w/RISP).

**STAYING GROUNDED:** Since 2019, Holmes' 63.3% groundball rate is the fourth-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 65.2% clip, Andre Pallante's 64.2% rate and Jhoan Duran's 63.4% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season)...This season, Holmes ranks sixth in the majors with a 56.0% groundball rate (min. 500 batters faced).

**HOLMES SWEET HOLMES**: In 14 home starts this season, Holmes is 5-2 with a 3.82 ERA (32 ER/75.1 IP)...The righty has pitched 5.0 or more innings in 13 of his 14 home starts this season, while allowing three or fewer runs in nine of his home starts...In five home starts since the All-Star Break, Holmes is 1-1 with a 5.25 ERA (14 ER/24.0 IP)...In nine home starts prior the All-Star Break, Holmes went 4-1 with a 3.16 ERA (18 ER/51.1 IP).

**ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS:** Over his last 12 starts, Holmes has allowed just one home run...In his previous 10 starts from May 9 - July 2, the right-hander allowed 11 home runs after not allowing a home run in each of his first seven starts of the season...He became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes allowed two home runs in three of his four starts from May 14 - June 1 after he had never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career...Among qualifiers, Holmes ranks fifth in the NL and eighth in the majors with a 0.72 HR/9 rate.

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

**NEW ROLE WHO DIS:** In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established career highs in both innings (151.0), strikeouts (122) and wins (11)...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 12-10 with a 4.12 ERA (76 ER/166.0 IP) in 33 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30... Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)... Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances... Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

**REELIN' IN THE YEARS:** Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazeroski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazeroski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.

CEAN MANAEA'S LICUS

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed four earned runs on five hits with five strikeouts and one walk against the Phillies on September 9...Has 64 strikeouts over 50.0 IP this season which is good for a 11.52 K/9...He has allowed six or more hits in five of his last seven starts...Has failed to complete 6.0 innings in all 10 of his starts this season which marks his longest streak of consecutive starts shorter than 6.0 innings in the same season in his career.

VS. PADRES: Has pitched against San Diego 10 times in his career (eight starts) and he has a 4-1 record with a 3.43 ERA (17 ER/44.2 IP) in those games...Worked 5.0 innings, allowing one earned run on three hits with four strikeouts when facing San Diego earlier this season on July

**RIGHTY DOMINATION:** So far this season righties are batting .265 (40-151) against him...Last season he held right-handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right-handed hitters being at .251...It was the lowest batting average he's held right-handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games).

**HERE COMES THE HEAT:** So far this season, Manaea has thrown his four-seam fastball 59.8% of the time, and he has picked up 38 of his 64 strikeouts with his fastball...His fastball has generated a 23.1% whiff rate this season...He has thrown his fastball at the 17th-highest clip (59.8%) among all pitchers who have thrown their fastball at least 300 times this season.

**HOW SWEEP IT IS:** Manaea has thrown his sweeper 34.0% of the time and has generated a 35.2% whiff rate on the pitch...Has recorded 23 strikeouts with the sweeper and is holding opposing batters to a .194 batting average (12-62) on at-bats ending with the pitch...His 34.0% sweepers are the 18th-most in the majors among pitchers who have thrown their sweeper at least 200 times.

**REHAB STINT:** Was originally placed on the 15-day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 29...This season, he has made six rehab appearances (five starts) for Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Syracuse...Over those appearances, he allowed 13 earned runs over 18.2 IP and recorded 23 strikeouts...He made his final rehab start on July 8 with Syracuse, and he allowed three runs over 3.2 IP and struck out five...He threw 73 pitches, 48 for strikes.

**2024 A CAREER YEAR:** Recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL last season...The southpaw finished with the lowest full-season ERA of his career (3.47), and he was one of eight pitchers who made 32 or more starts and posted an ERA below 3.50...He held right-handed batters to a .190 average, tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...From July 1 until the end of the season, Manaea was first in the majors in innings (105.1), second in quality starts (12) as well as sixth in strikeouts (108) and WHIP (0.93)...Made four Postseason starts, going 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts...He earned wins in Game 3 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia and Game 2 of the NLCS at Los Angeles.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** Last season, Manaea completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts this season and that was tied for the sixthmost such outings in the National League...Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30/24 against Minnesota and 8/5/24 at St.Louis...Manaea joined Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors last season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea was the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He became the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)...The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts...He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

**SPECTACULAR DOWN THE STRETCH:** From July on last season, Manaea was second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)...Since June 14, Manaea had allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which was tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

**CAREER**: Over the course of 10 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has a 78-65 record, a 4.06 ERA (559ER/1234.IP), and 1173 strikeouts in 239 games and 208 starts...His 1173 career strikeouts are the 13th-most among active left-handers...He resigned with the Mets this offseason on a three-year contract in December 2024.
