METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Wednesday, the team defeated the Marlins, 5-4, via walk-off in the 10th inning...The Mets are 78-14 when scoring first this season...New York is 35-10-4 in 49 series this year...Tonight, the Mets begin their penultimate series of the season, a three-game weekend series against the Braves...Following these three games, the Mets head back to New York for the final series of the regular season, a three-game set against the Nationals.

FIVE FOR FIGHTING: Eduardo Escobar knocked in all five runs in the team's win over the Marlins on Thursday...According to Elias, that ties the Mets record for most RBI in a game that accounted for all the team's runs, done previously by the following players: Todd Zeile (2004), Carlos Beltran (2008), Jay Bruce (2017), Robinson Cano (2019) and Francisco Lindor (2021).

THE MONTH OF ESCOBAR: Eduardo Escobar is batting .330 (31-94) with 16 runs, three doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 24 RBI, eight walks with a .379 OBP, a .638 SLG and 1.017 OPS in 25 games in September...His eight home runs in September are his fourth-highest total for a single month in his career...Escobar socked 10 home runs in August of 2019.

JUST PEACHY: The Mets are 22-27 at Truist Park...Jeff McNeil is a .370 (27-73) hitter with 10 runs, nine doubles, a home run, five RBI and four walks in 20 career games at the ballpark...Mark Canha has hit .364 (8-22) with three runs, four doubles, two homers, three walks and an .818 SLG in seven games at the yard...Tomás Nido has hit .300 (9-30) with five runs, a double, a home run, three and two walks in 10 career games in Atlanta.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Francisco Álvarez is set to become the seventh player to make his major league debut with the Mets this year...He joins Brett Baty, Jose Butto, Nate Fisher, Nick Plummer, Colin Holderman and Mark Vientos...Earlier this year, Brett Baty homered in his first major league at-bat on August 17 at Atlanta...He became the fifth Met to hit a home run in his first major league at-bat.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Álvarez finished the year playing 112 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse...He batted .260/.374/.511 with 74 runs, 22 doubles, 27 home runs, 78 RBI and an .885 OPS between the two levels...He was named to the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game.

HOTLANTA: In 27 career starts against the Braves, Jacob deGrom is 10-8 with a 2.08 ERA (40 ER/172.2 IP)...That is the fourth-best ERA against the franchise all-time (min. 20 starts)...The three pitchers with a lower ERA all had their careers end by 1945...DeGrom's 222 career strikeouts against the Braves are 18th-most all-time...With four strikeouts today, he would pass Rube Marquard (223), Wilbur Cooper (223) and Curt Schilling (225) to move into 15th place on that list.

TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST: Since Truist Park opened in 2017, 37 pitchers have made at least five starts here...DeGrom and his opposing starter tonight, Max Fried, are in a virtual tie for third on that list with a 2.86 ERA...Only Spencer Strider (2.22) and Dallas Keuchel (2.74) have produced better marks at this venue.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Buck Showalter owns a 1,649-1,575 (.511) career record as a manager...His 1,649 wins place him 20th all-time in major league history...Mike Scioscia ranks 19th with 1,650 career wins...Showalter has now managed four teams to the Postseason...He is the fourth manager to accomplish that feat in major league history, joining Dusty Baker (five teams) and Billy Martin and Davey Johnson (four teams)...With three more victories, Showalter would be the first manager in Mets history to record 100 victories in his first season with the club...He also joins Yogi Berra as the only managers to guide the Mets and Yankees into the playoffs.

MAKE IT A BAKER'S DOZEN: Francisco Lindor is on a 13-game hitting streak, batting .333 (19-57) with 10 runs, three doubles, a triple, two home runs, 11 RBI, a walk, a steal with an .865 OPS over that span...His career-high is 15 games, accomplished from April 29-May 14, 2018...He has reached base safely in 19 straight games...He is batting .346 (28-81) with 16 runs, six doubles, a triple, four home runs, 17 RBI, four walks with a .379 OBP and a .593 SLG in the streak that started on September 7...He has hit 25 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 home runs in 2018 for the most by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .312/.375/.486 with 43 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 37 RBI, 23 walks with an .860 OPS in 63 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 6.8 fWAR this season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets seeking their 48th road win...The team's 47 wins on the road are tied for the fourth-most all-time...Only the 1986 (53), 1999 (48) and 1969 (49) teams won more games on the road...Their 47 road wins are their highest total since they went 47-34 in 2007...Their .603 road winning percentage is the second-best in franchise history...Only the 1986 (.654) team had a better winning percentage on the road...Their .603 road winning percentage is third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...Overall they are 47-31 on the road this year.

ROAD STRIKE: The Mets have struck out 707 batters on the road this year...That is a franchise record, surpassing the previous total of 686 set last season...The team's 707 strikeouts on the road are second in the majors...Only the San Diego Padres have recorded more punchouts on the road with 717.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets need to win one of its three remaining games against Atlanta to lock up the season series...It would be New York's first season series victory since 2017.

HITTING THE ROAD: New York is batting .265/.335/.427 away from Citi Field...Their .265 road average is the best in the NL and second in the majors, while their .335 OBP leads The Show...They rank fourth in MLB with a .427 SLG...Brandon Nimmo (.407), Jeff McNeil (.393) and Mark Canha (.384) rank three through five in road OBP in the National League...Jeff McNeil is batting .346 (89-257) with 32 runs, 23 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 25 RBI, 16 walks with a .393 OBP and a .479 SLG in 67 road games this year...His .346 road batting average leads the major leagues.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 47-23 against the East this year...They have lost only two series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18 and Washington, September 2-4) and have already clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win one of its three remaining games against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes (last accomplished by the Mets in 2015)...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.39 ERA against the East, while hitting .260/.335/.421...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 352-254.

HECK OR HIGHWATER: The Mets are once again a season-high 40 games over .500...Prior to this year, it is their most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for that year...The last time the Mets were 41 games over .500 was when they were 54-games (108-54) above .500 on October 6, 1986, the final day of the season.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 98 games...The team's 98 wins are tied for the fourth-most in franchise history...That is the third-most in the major leagues...The last time the team recorded more than 98 wins was in 1988 when they won 100...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets are 98-58 through 156 games...That is the second-best mark in Mets history...Only the 1986 team (103-53) posted a better record.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .635 winning percentage (40-23) following the All-Star break...That is the third-best winning percentage in franchise in franchise history, right below the 1969 team (.671) and the 1988 squad (.644)...The team's 40 wins are the fifth-most in the majors since the break...The Mets are batting .2678/.343/.429 with 69 home runs in 64 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets lead the majors in average and OBP and are fourth in SLG following the break.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 116 strikeouts...That is 22 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Díaz has posted a 0.69 ERA (three earned runs/39.1 innings) with 18 hits, eight walks and 78 strikeouts in 38 appearances since the start of June.

THIS IS 40: Pete Alonso has hit 40 home runs this season...He is the first player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs...Only two players this season have recorded 40 or more home runs - Aaron Judge and Kyle Schwarber...Alonso's 40 home runs are tied for fourth-most in a single season in Mets history...Alonso owns the franchise record with 53 in 2019...Carlos Beltrán (2006) and Todd Hundley (1996) each recorded 41 home runs.

CLEANUP ON AISLE 4: Alonso has hit all 40 of his home runs this season in the fourth spot in the batting order...127 of his 131 RBI have come as the Mets cleanup hitter...Alonso is one of only six players to tally 40 homers and 125 RBI as the No. 4 hitter in a single season since 2000, joining Alex Rodriguez (2007), Carlos Delgado (2000, 2003), Ryan Howard (2007-2009), Prince Fielder (2009) and Andruw Jones (2006).

ABOVE AVERAGE: Jeff McNeil is second in the majors and in the National League with a .320 batting average...He is behind only Freddie Freeman (.327) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011...Over his last five games, McNeil is batting .455 (10-22) with five runs, a double, an RBI, two walks with a 1.000 OPS.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,504 batters this season, which places them a top the majors...The team's 1,504 strikeouts are already the second-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.75 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.2 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

deGROM NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Allowed five earned runs on six hits through 4.0 innings in the team's 10-4 loss in Oakland on September 24...Threw 80 pitches in his shortest outing of the season, recording five strikeouts and four walks.

VS. ATLANTA: In 27 career starts against the Braves, deGrom is 10-8 with a 2.08 ERA (40 ER/172.2 IP)...That is the fourth-best ERA against the franchise all-time (min. 20 starts)...The three pitchers with a lower ERA all had their careers end by 1945...DeGrom's 222 career strikeouts against the Braves are 18th-most all-time...With four strikeouts today, he would pass Rube Marquard (223), Wilbur Cooper (223) and Curt Schilling (225) to move into 15th place on that list.

TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST: Since Truist Park opened in 2017, 37 pitchers have made at least five starts here...DeGrom and his opposing starter tonight, Max Fried, are in a virtual tie for third on that list with a 2.86 ERA...Only Spencer Strider (2.22) and Dallas Keuchel (2.74) have produced better marks at this venue.

MILESTONE ALERT: With a win on September 7, deGrom tied Jon Matlack for seventh in Mets history with 82 victories...With a win today, he will take sole possession of seventh place...Al Leiter is next in line with 95 wins.

RIGHT WHERE HE LEFT OFF: Since returning from the IL on August 2, deGrom has been one of MLB's top pitchers, ranking among leaders in WHIP (0.74, second), strikeout rate (41.9 percent, first), strikeouts (91, first), opponent average (.169, fourth) and among NL leaders in wins (five, tied for eighth) and ERA (2.93, 11th).

THIS IS GETTING RIDICULOUS: Has 91 strikeouts through his first 10 starts this season, the most by any pitcher in 2022...Last season, he had 103 punchouts in his first 10 starts...DeGrom, Shane Bieber (2020-21), Gerrit Cole (2018-19), Randy Johnson (1999-2002) and Pedro Martinez (1999-2001) are the only pitchers ever to produce 91 or more strikeouts through 10 starts in consecutive seasons...If deGrom strikes out nine or more tonight, he will be the ninth pitcher ever with 100+ strikeouts through 11 games in consecutive seasons more than once in his career.

THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE: Since 2018, deGrom owns a 2.03 ERA in 101 starts...That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 500.0 IP)...He has 341 strikeouts in 37 starts since 2020...He and Dwight Gooden are the only Mets pitchers ever to fan 300 or more in a span of 36 games...See the chart below for an overview of his 2018 and 2019 Cy Young Award-winning seasons compared to his last three seasons combined:

200 CLUB: On August 7, 2022 against Atlanta, deGrom set the MLB record for most strikeouts through a pitcher's first 200 career starts with 1,523...He surpassed the previous record set by Yu Darvish with 1,517...Through his first 200 games, deGrom recorded a 2.50 ERA...Only five pitchers have had a lower ERA through 200 career games (min. 1,000 IP): Dutch Leonard (2.09), Carl Mays (2.23), Reb Russell (2.28), and Baseball Hall of Famers Red Faber (2.41) and Tom Seaver (2.42).

AUGUST IS THE HOTTEST MONTH: In his first month back in over a year, deGrom finished the month of August among the MLB leaders in several categories...He led the majors in strikeouts (55), WHIP (0.55), opponent's batting average (.136), opponent's OPS (.388) and K/BB (18.33).

WALKIN' AFTER MIDNIGHT: On September 18 against the Pirates, deGrom did not issue a walk in his 13-strikeout outing, becoming the first pitcher in major league history with 13 strikeouts and zero walks in a 5.0-inning start...Joins Alex Cobb and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers in major league history with 13 strikeouts in a start of 5.0 innings or less...DeGrom has five career games with at least 13 strikeouts and zero walks, tying Max Scherzer and Gerrit Cole for the third-most such starts since 2015...Dwight Gooden, Tom Seaver and Sid Fernandez are the only other pitchers in franchise history to have multiple starts with 13 or more strikeouts and zero walks.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (11-4, 2.31)

LAST TIME OUT: Facing Oakland for the first time since May 27, 2014, Scherzer allowed just one earned run on four hits through 6.0 innings...He recorded seven strikeouts and no walks as the Mets defeated the Athletics, 13-4.

200 SPRINT: Scherzer's 200th win came in his 428th career game...He became the 30th pitcher to win 200 of his first 428 career appearances...The other 29 pitchers include 23 Hall of Famers as well as Roger Clemens, Andy Pettitte, CC Sabathia, Justin Verlander, Tim Hudson and George Mullin.
