**RAY REPORT**—The Rays open a six-game homestand against the Giants (three to play) and Blue Jays (three to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...have won 13 of their last 18 games (April 10–pres.) on the heels of a 5-7 start and are an AL-best 16-7 (.696) in their last 23 games since April 4, second in the majors behind the Padres (17-6/.739)...begin a span of 13 games in as many days tonight (May 1-13), the final leg in a stretch of 28 games in 30 days from April 14–May 13...own the majors' seventh-best record and are 1.5 GB behind the AL East-leading Yankees first in the AL...have spent six days occupying first in the AL East, 17 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 17 straight days in first or second...enter May with a top-two record in the AL for the fifth time, joining 2023 (1st), 2019 (1st), 2012 (2nd), and 2010 (1st).

★ The Rays dropped the series finale, 3-1, in Cleveland on Wednesday...despite the loss, the Rays hold a 13-2 (.867) record against the AL, tied for the fifth-best start by an AL club in intraleague games.

★ **Drew Rasmussen** spun 5.0 innings and allowed three runs (2ER) on six hits and one walk with six strikeouts...it marked his 44th consecutive start with four runs or fewer allowed, tying **Shane McClanahan** (April 29, 2021–July 26, 2022) for the longest by a traditional starter in franchise history...he is now tied for the seventh-longest such streak by a traditional starter in major league history and has the longest since **Jacob deGrom** (59G, May 22, 2019–Sept. 18, 2022).

★ Rays relievers allowed no runs over 7.0 innings in the series against Cleveland...it marked the first time since Aug. 4-6, 2025 at LAA that the bullpen allowed no runs in a series...the last time the bullpen allowed no runs in four consecutive games or more was between June 10-16, 2025 (6G).

★ The Rays closed April with 18 wins, the seventh time in franchise history they have won 15 games or more by the end of April, including the first since 2023 (23-6)...each of the previous six Tampa Bay squads went on to win 90 games or more, and five of those six made the postseason.

★ The Rays have won five of their previous seven series openers (April 6–pres.).

★ **Shane McClanahan** makes his sixth start of the campaign tonight and is looking to earn the win in back-to-back starts for the first time since June 5-16, 2023 (3GS).

**THIS AIN'T A SCENE, IT'S AN ARMS RACE**—Rays starting pitchers have gone 10-8 with a 3.45 ERA (151.1IP, 58ER), a .210 (119-for-568) opp. average, and 17 home runs...the staff's .210 opp. average ranks as the third best in the majors and second best in the AL, while the 3.45 ERA is fifth in MLB and third in the AL...their 17 homers have accounted for 28 runs out of the 65 runs they have allowed this season and are tied for the eighth-fewest home runs allowed by starters...starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of the last seven games (April 22–pres.) with three scoreless outings.

★ Over their last seven games, the Rays pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in each game, tied for the eighth-longest streak in franchise history (9x, last: June 3[G2]–9, 2023)...extending the streak to eight games tonight, would tie the fourth-longest streak in franchise history (3x, last: Sept. 15-24, 2024).

★ The pitching staff has combined for a .223 (227-for-1,016) opp. average this season, which ranks fifth in MLB and second in the AL...with runners in scoring position, they have held opponents to an AL-fourth best .241 (63-for-261) opp. average this season and an MLB-best .070 (3-for-43) opp. average since April 22.

★ The bullpen has posted a 1.66 ERA (21.2IP, 4ER) in seven games since April 22, second best in the majors over that span, and a 3.67 ERA (95.2IP, 39ER) in 23 games since April 4, eighth best in MLB...five different Rays have contributed a save this season, tied for most in the majors, with their 12 combined saves tying for the most in MLB with the Padres...their 12 saves in March/April were tied for the most in club history before the calendar flipped to May (also 2019).

**THE GREAT YANDINO**—**Yandy Díaz** reached base safely 56 times, surpassing **Tommy Pham** (52, 2019) for the most TOB during March/April in Rays history and tied **Jonny Gomes** (56, 2006) for the most TOB by any Tampa Bay batter through the club's first 30 games of a season...Díaz's 38 hits are tied for fourth in the AL and were third most by a Ray before the calendar flips to May, trailing **Rocco Baldelli** (40) in 2003 and **Quinton McCracken** (39) in 1998.

★ Díaz is one extra-base hit shy of 300 for his career and 283 with the Rays, which would tie **Carlos Peña** for seventh most in franchise history...he needs 1 HR to tie **Carl Crawford** (104HR) for seventh on the Rays all-time list.

★ Since joining the Rays, Díaz has tallied 271 multi-hit games, fourth most in team history and one behind **Ben Zobrist** (272) for third most...he has also recorded 104 multi-RBI games, seventh most in team history and three behind **Aubrey Huff** (107) for sixth.

★ He has 995 hits in his career, five shy of becoming the 20th Cuban-born player in major league history to tally 1,000 hits.

**GOING ARANDA BASES**—**Jonathan Aranda's** 25 RBI on the season are two behind **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (27) for most in the AL...he finished March/April with an RBI in 16 of 30 games, tied for the second-most contests with an RBI through the Rays first 30 games in franchise history (6x, last: **Brandon Lowe**, 2020)...he tied **Ben Zobrist** (2011) for the second-most RBI in club history through March/April, trailing only **Randy Arozarena** in 2023 (28)...it was also the most in a single month by a Ray since Arozarena's 28 in 2023...an AL-most 22 of his 25 RBI have come against right-handed pitching, third in the majors to **CIN Sal Stewart** (27) and **MIA Liam Hicks** (25)...his team-leading three game-winning RBI are tied for 10th in the AL and match his career high set in 2025...Aranda is on pace for 135 RBI, which would best **Carlos Peña's** franchise record (121) established in 2007.

**CONNECT 4 RUNS**—The Rays have plated four runs or more in 19 games this season, tied for fourth most in the AL...they have recorded a 15-4 (.789) record in those contests, second best in the AL and tied for seventh best in the AL...they have won 14 of their last 15 games (April 4–pres.) when they've scored four or more.

★ In 12 home games this season, the Rays have scored four or more nine times, including each of their last five games (April 21–pres.)...in those nine games, the club is 8-1 (.889) compared to 0-3 in home games when they score three runs or fewer.

★ Prior to Wednesday's 3-1 loss to the Guardians, the Rays had won each of their first 12 games this season when they held their opponents to three runs or fewer...dating back to Sept. 17, 2025 they had won 16 straight such games.

★ The Rays have won six straight one-run games since a 6-5 loss on March 28 at STL, their longest streak since May 15–June 2, 2024 (6G)...they have not had a longer stretch since Aug. 10–Sept. 2, 2019 (7G), and the single-season franchise record of eight games has been achieved twice: May 19–June 18, 2008 and July 12–Aug. 13, 2003.

**BAY TO BAY**—The Giants are making their fifth trip all-time to Tropicana Field, with the Rays holding a 3-1-0 series record in the previous trips...the Rays have won four straight series and six of eight all-time against the Giants...in last season's series between Aug. 15-17, the Rays won back-to-back one-run games to open the series in San Francisco before dropping the series finale 7-1...the pitching staff combined for 35 strikeouts in the three-game series, fourth most of any series in 2025 by the Rays.

★ In 12 games against the Giants in his career, **Yandy Díaz** has hit .286 (14-for-49) with 2 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, 3 BB, and 4 R...he has a hit in five straight (April 13–pres.) and has recorded multiple hits in five of the 12.

★ In last season's series opener on Aug. 15, 2025, three of the five players with the surname "Seymour" in major league history appeared in the same game (TB **Bob Seymour**, TB **Ian Seymour**, SF **Carson Seymour**).

**SUGAR SHANE**—Shane McClanahan, who celebrated his 29th birthday on Tues., will toe the rubber for his sixth start of the season and third at Tropicana Field... will be making his 80th career start and 43rd career home start tonight...missed the last two years after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

- ✦ In first starts after his birthday (3GS), McClanahan has gone 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA (15.OIP, 6ER), logging 25 strikeouts and a .246 (14-for-57) opp. batting average.
- ✦ Through his five starts this season, he has limited opposing hitters to a .132 (5-for-38) batting average the first time through the lineup compared to a .189 (7-for-37) mark and a .333 (4-for-12) clip during his second and third time through the order, respectively.
- ✦ Was selected for the AL All-Star team in 2022 and 2023, earning a starting nod in the former season...joined **David Price** (2010) as the only Rays pitchers to start an All-Star Game...McClanahan and **Evan Longoria** (3x) are the only Rays players to earn All-Star nods in two of their first three major league seasons.

**LAST TIME OUT**—Earned his first win at Tropicana Field in 1,049 days (June 11, 2023 vs. TEX) on April 25 vs. MIN after tossing 5.0 shutout innings on three hits and two walks with a season-high seven strikeouts...was his first scoreless outing since May 19, 2023 vs. MIL and the 12th of his career—the Rays are 11-1 in those 12 starts...his seven strikeouts were his most in a game since May 30, 2023 at CHC (also 7).

**ONE BAY OR ANOTHER**—McClanahan will be starting opposite the Giants for the first time in his career tonight...the Giants are one of seven clubs he has yet to face in his career (also: ATL, AZ, CIN, COL, PHI, and TB).

- ✦ McClanahan has made one career start against an NL West opponent, posting a quality start on June 16, 2023 at SD...surrendered one run on three hits across 6.2 IP, with his lone blemish being a **Nelson Cruz** homer on a full count that chased him from the game.
- ✦ Has posted an 8-3 record with a 2.48 ERA (90.2IP, 25ER) across 16 career Interleague starts...in three NL starts in 2026, has pitched to a 5.54 ERA (13.OIP, 8ER) with 14 strikeouts...made his most recent Interleague start on April 19 at PIT, allowing four earned runs on eight hits across 4.1 innings.

**ON THE HOOK**—Opposing hitters have gone a combined 8-for-56 (.143) against McClanahan's slider and changeup...he has thrown the pitches a combined 54.8 pct. of the time, with his slider being used at a 27.3 pct. clip and changeup at 27.5 pct. ...McClanahan's 34 whiffs on sliders and changeups rank 11th among AL arms and sixth among AL southpaws in 2026.

**FEELING SUPPORTED**—McClanahan has received three runs of support or more in 40 of his 79 career appearances...in those 40 outings, he holds a 31-1 record, 2.80 ERA (225.1IP, 70ER), .212 (178-for-838) opp. average, 1.08 WHIP, and 250 strikeouts to 66 walks...in games where he receives three runs of support or more, the Rays are 36-4 and have won 16 of the last 17.

**STRIKEOUT ARTIST**—After a season-high seven strikeouts on April 25 vs. MIN, McClanahan is now 13 strikeouts from tying **Matt Moore** (494SO) for ninth on the Rays all-time list and fourth among Tampa Bay lefties.

- ✦ During his first three seasons (2021-23), McClanahan's 10.14 strikeouts per 9.0 IP ranked second among MLB left-handers (min. 400.OIP) behind **Blake Snell** (11.85)...under the same parameter, it was the second-highest mark by a southpaw through his first three major league campaigns, trailing SD/PIT **Óliver Pérez** (10.34)...his 456 career strikeouts were sixth-most by a left-hander in franchise history and were the most by any Ray through his first three seasons, regardless of handedness, outpacing **James Shields** (448, 2006-08) despite McClanahan (404.2IP) throwing 150 fewer innings than Shields (554.2IP).
- ✦ Min. 1,000 BF, his 33.4 pct. whiff rate from 2021-23 ranked fourth in the majors behind ATL **Spencer Strider** (37.0%), SD **Blake Snell** (33.7%), and MIL **Corbin Burnes** (33.7%)...he led the majors with a 48.4 pct. whiff rate on his changeup in that span (min. 1,000 changeups thrown).
- ✦ Min. 400.0 IP, his 3.02 ERA (404.2IP, 136ER) from 2021-23 ranked second in the AL to LAA **Shohei Ohtani** (2.84) and was second among all left-handed pitchers in the majors to ATL **Max Fried** (2.71).

**THE WAY BACK**—McClanahan exited his start on Aug. 2, 2023 at Yankee Stadium with left forearm tightness and was placed on the 15-day IL the next day...he consulted with three doctors before opting for his second Tommy John surgery, performed by Dr. Keith Meister on Aug. 21, 2023 in Dallas, Tx. ...resumed throwing off the mound in August 2024 and faced live hitters at the Rays spring facility in Port Charlotte, Fla. the following month...entered the offseason fully healthy and began his usual spring build up...in his third Grapefruit League start, was removed with left triceps tightness, which was later diagnosed as nerve irritation...began the year on the 15-day IL and was moved to the 60-day IL on April 26...consulted with nerve specialist Dr. Gregory Paul in Dallas after feeling discomfort during his first full-distance bullpen session June 7...resumed throwing progression shortly after the visit...made three rehab starts between the FCL Rays (July 8) and Triple-A Durham (July 8 & 13)...was pulled from his rehab assignment on July 22 with biceps tendinitis...underwent radial nerve decompression surgery on his left triceps Aug. 11, performed by Dr. Steven Shin in Los Angeles, officially ending his hopes of a 2025 return.

**MLB CAREER RUNDOWN**—In 2023, was the Rays Opening Day starter for the second straight year and started 21 games before Tommy John surgery ended his season...after his final start on Aug. 2 at NYY, led the AL in whiff rate (33.4%) while ranking highly in wins (T2nd, 11), opp. average (6th, .222), and ERA (8th, 3.29)...earned the win in each of his first five starts, matching **Matt Moore** (2013) for the longest streak to begin a season in Rays history and was the first Rays pitcher to win 11 of his first 12 decisions in a season...from Opening Day—June 16, went 11-1 with a major-league-best 2.12 ERA (89.1IP, 21ER), 15 points lower than the next closest pitcher (HOU **Framber Valdez** - 2.27)...marked the third-lowest ERA through a Rays pitcher's first 15 starts of a season behind himself in 2022 (1.77) and **Chris Archer** in 2015 (2.08)...was the Rays Roberto Clemente Award nominee.
