Non-Losing Season

Atlanta's win last night was its 81st of the season, guaranteeing a non-losing season.

Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, this is the 35th non-losing season for the club. Just four teams in baseball have more such seasons in that span.

The Yankees have 48 seasons at .500 or better, the Dodgers have 46, the Red Sox have 45, and the Cardinals have 43.

Dating to 1991, Atlanta has been .500 or better in 27-of-33 total seasons.

The Braves reached 81 wins in game no. 125, the third-fewest amount of games needed to guarantee .500 in a 162-game season since 1966. The 2003 club did so in game 124, and the 1998 Braves reached the mark in their 122nd game.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Mets tonight conclude a three-game series with what is the 13th and final game between the teams this season...The two last met just nine days ago in the conclusion of a four-game set at Citi Field.

Atlanta's win last night moved the club to 9-3 in 12 games with New York this season, a .750 winning percentage...Since the Mets were founded in 1962, the best single-season winning percentage the Braves have logged against New York is .778, going 14-4 in 18 games with the Mets in both 1964 and 1966...The Braves can go 10-3 (.769) against the Mets this season with a win tonight.

The Braves have won 15 of the last 19 games with New York dating to last season, outscoring the Mets 131-73 (+58) over the stretch.

The Braves went 10-9 against the Mets last season, taking the season set from their N.L. East rivals for the fifth consecutive season...They also went 10-9 in 2021, 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018...Since the start of the 2018 season, Atlanta is 60-38 (.612) against New York overall.

Atlanta is 4-1 against New York here at Truist Park this season, after sweeping the first three games between the teams at Truist Park this season, June 6-8...Since Truist Park opened in 2017, the Braves are 34-23 (.597) against the Mets here.

RH Charlie Morton is set for his 22nd career appearance against New York and his 21st start, including his fourth this season...The 6-foot-5, 215-pound right-hander is 5-6 with a 3.81 ERA (47 ER/111.0 IP) in his career versus New York, and 1-1 with a 4.80 ERA (8 ER/15.0 IP) this season...He pitched 5.0 scoreless innings against them just 12 days ago, August 11 at Citi Field.

LH José Quintana is set for his eighth career start against Atlanta and his second in the last two weeks...The 6-foot-1, 220-pound native of Arjona, Colombia, is 2-4 with a 6.49 ERA (25 ER/34.2 IP) over his first seven games with the Braves...Quintana started Game 2 of a doubleheader with Atlanta on August 12 and took the loss, despite allowing just four hits and one run in 6.0 innings.

WIN: The Braves rebounded to beat the Mets, 3-2, last night, and the two teams have split the first two games of this series...Atlanta and New York will play the rubber match tonight.

Atlanta is 9-2 in rubber games this season, but lost its last such game on August 6 at the Cubs.

All nine Atlanta hits came from just four batters in the lineup, as Ronald Acuña Jr., Marcell Ozuna, Eddie Rosario and Nicky Lopez all collected multi-hit games...Atlanta's other five hitters combined to go 0-for-20.

The Braves improved to 26-8 (.765) against the N.L. East this season...No other team in the division is over .500 in intradivision games this year.

TWENTY HOMERS: Eddie Rosario clubbed a second-inning home run last night, his 20th of the season and fourth of this homestand.

He joins Matt Olson (43), Austin Riley (29), Ronald Acuña Jr. (28), Ozzie Albies (28), Marcell Ozuna (27) and Sean Murphy (20) as Braves with at least 20 homers this season, the first time in franchise history that seven players reached the mark.

Six players had done so twice previously, first in 1965 and most recently in 2003.

Atlanta's seven such players this season are easily most in baseball, and no other team has more than four (Dodgers)...Four teams do not have a 20-homer player yet this season.

The single-season record for 20-homer players is eight, done by the Twins in 2019...Rosario was also a member of that club.

RAISEL IGLESIAS: Pitched a scoreless ninth for Atlanta last night to earn his 25th save of the season, and has converted 16 straight opportunities dating to June 20.

Iglesias' run is the longest active streak in the National League, and trails just Boston's Kenley Jansen and Toronto's Jordan Romano, both with 20 straight saves, for the longest in the majors.

Iglesias has now pitched 13.0 straight scoreless innings, the third-longest streak in the N.L. behind just Derek Law (15.0 IP) of the Reds and teammate Spencer Strider (14.0 IP).

In 71 games for Atlanta since the Braves acquired him last season, Iglesias is 3-4 with a 1.88 ERA (14 ER/67.0 IP) and 26 saves in 29 opportunities.

Since the date of his first appearance with Atlanta, August 5 of last season, his 1.88 ERA is fifth lowest in baseball among pitchers with at least 60.0 innings.

ACUÑA JR. RUNS: Ronald Acuña Jr. had two more hits last night but failed to score a run, snapping his four-game streak of crossing the plate...Acuña Jr. has a majors-most 113 runs of the season, and 507 in his career.

With his next run scored, Acuña Jr. will move into the Top 10 in Atlanta franchise history (since 1966), tying Javy López...Hall-of-Famer Chipper Jones has the most runs since the team moved to Atlanta, scoring 1,619 times.

The single-season Atlanta record is 131 runs, set by Dale Murphy in 1983...Acuña Jr. is on pace for 146 runs this season.

MORTON DECISIONS: Charlie Morton enters tonight's start 12-10 in 24 total starts, and his 22 decisions on the season are two more than any other pitcher in baseball...No other Braves pitcher has more than 18 decisions this season.

Morton has taken just two no-decisions on the season, and they came in back-to-back starts on June 7 and June 12...He has taken a decision in each of his last 11 turns (7-4, 3.47 ERA).

Today's Game

- ⚡ Set to make his 25th start of the season and fourth against New York (NL).
- ⚡ Struckout 10 New York (AL) hitters through 6.0 scoreless frames in his last start.
 - ⚡ At age 39 years and 277 days old, Morton joined Hall-of-Famers Phil Niekro and John Smoltz as the only pitchers of that age or older in Braves franchise to fan at least 10 hitters while tossing 6.0 shutout innings.
- ⚡ His 12 wins are tied for fifth most in the National League.
 - ⚡ Since 2019, Morton's teams have wone 75 of his starts; fourth most in the majors during that span.
- ⚡ Has 20 starts in 10 different seasons.
- ⚡ Earned his 10th win of the season spinning 7.0 shutout-innings on July 14.
 - ⚡ Morton has now won at least 10 games in six different seasons.
 - ⚡ Became the first Braves pitcher since R.A. Dickey in 2017 to toss 7.0 scoreless frames and get the win age 39 or older.
 - ⚡ Joined Justin Verlander and Adam Wainwright as the only active pitchers in baseball to win at least 10 games at the age of 39 or older in a season.
 - ⚡ Became just the fifth pitcher in the Braves franchise history to record 10 wins in a season after turning 39 (Niekro [5], Spahn [4], Smoltz [2], Dickey [1]).
- ⚡ Morton has struck out 373 hitters with his curveball since the beginning of the 2020; the most in the majors.
 - ⚡ During that span hitters are missing on 5340% of curveballs thrown, the second highest rate in the majors...The MLB average is 11.5% (among QS).
 - ⚡ Utilizing his curveball on 44.1% of pitches thrown this season; the highest rate in the majors among qualifiers this season.
- ⚡ Morton's 1050 strikeouts since the 2018 season are the fourth most in baseball.
 - ⚡ Prior to the 2018 season, Morton threw his curveball on 21 % of pitches throughout his career.
 - ⚡ Since the beginning of 2018 he has thrown his curve on 37 % of pitches.
- ⚡ Morton's 31.5% swing and miss rate is the fifth highest among qualifiers in the NL.
 - ⚡ Teammate Spencer Strider leads league with a rate of 40.1%
- ⚡ Hitters are registering a .321 batting average on balls in play against Morton in '23.
 - ⚡ Since the beginning of June, Morton owns a .302 BABIP.
 - ⚡ Had a .337 batting average on balls in play through his first 10 starts.
- ⚡ Hitters are averaging a 9.1° launch angle against Morton; MLB average is 11.8°.
- ⚡ In his age 39 season, Morton is the sixth-oldest active pitcher in the majors.

2023 Recap

- ⚡ Held New York (NL) to three hits and seven walks over 5.0 scoreless innings with four strikeouts on August 11.
 - ⚡ Joined Jack Flaherty and Dylan Cease as the only players in the majors this year to toss 5.0 shutout innings while issuing at least seven walks and get the win.
 - ⚡ Became just the sixth player in Braves franchise history to do so.
- ⚡ Morton is one six active pitchers with at least 15 starts in 13 different seasons.
 - ⚡ Trails only Zack Greinke (17), Clayton Kershaw (15), Justin Verlander (15), Max Scherzer (14), and Cole Hamels (14).
- ⚡ Morton struck out Miami's Bryan De La Cruz for 1,800 on his career.
 - ⚡ Is now one of 13 acitve pitchers in baseball with as many punchouts.
- ⚡ Became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to pitch at least 6.0 innings and strikeout nine or more in an outing at age 39 or older.
 - ⚡ Passed R.A. Dickey and Hall-of-Famer Cy Young with three such games.
 - ⚡ Trails Hall-of-Famers Phil Niekro (10), John Smoltz (8), and Warren Spahn (4).
- ⚡ Struck out 10 hitters over 6.2 scoreless innings in his win against Texas on May 15.
 - ⚡ Has now struckout at least 10 hitters in six games since turning 38, passing Hall-of-Famer Cy Young for the ninth most such games dating to 1901.
 - ⚡ Morton is the first player with at least seven games of 10 or more strikeouts at his age since Hall-of-Famers Randy Johnson and John Smoltz.

2022 Recap

- ⚡ Made 31 starts during his 15th major league season and went 9-6 with a 4.34 ERA (83 ER/172.0 IP) and 205 strikeouts...Compiled 1.6 bWAR on the year.
 - ⚡ Morton's 205 strikeouts last season were fifth most in the National League, and he is one of just three pitchers in Atlanta franchise history to log at least 200 strikeouts in multiple seasons...He struck out 216 last year...Hall-of-Famers John Smoltz (five seasons) and Phil Niekro (three seasons) were the only others to do so.

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 3 **1st Batter/Retired:** 47/27 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 24/6

- Has held left-handed hitters to a .190 BAA this season...Right-handers are batting .333.
- Was acquired on August 1 prior to MLB's trade deadline in exchange for minor-league RHP Alec Barger.
- Pitching arsenal includes a sweeper (47.3%), four-seam fastball (34.1%) and a sinker (18.6%).
- Prior to joining the Braves, made 40 relief appearances for the Rockies this season, pitching to a 3-1 record and a 4.54 ERA (18 ER/35.2 IP)...He struck out 41 batters and walked 16.
- Has been selected to three All-Star teams: 2017, 2018 & 2019...Hand is in his 13th major league season.
- During the abbreviated 2020 season, he led baseball with 16 saves and paced the American League with 21 games finished.

Raisel Iglesias • RHP • 6-2 • 190 • 33 yrs • #26

Saves/Opp: 23/25 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 43/33 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Across 21 games since June 25, has pitched to a 0.90 ERA (2 ER/20.0 IP), while going 14-for-14 in save opportunities... Since that date, is one of two MLB closers with at least 10 saves without erring (also Kenley Jansen, BOS).
- Since July 26, is one of two National League relievers with a 0.00 ERA and at least 10 outings.
- On May 10, allowed a home run for the first time since June 12, 2022 with the Angels – a homerless span of 45 games and 42.2 innings...It was the fifth-longest active homerless streak by a reliever in the majors.
- On May 5 was activated from the IL after missing Atlanta's first 32 games with a strained right shoulder...Pitched in four spring training games, compiling a 4.50 ERA (2 ER/4.0 IP) in four outings.
- In 2022, had a 2.47 ERA in 67 games with 17 saves and 15 holds between Atlanta and Los Angeles (AL)...After the trade deadline, led N.L. with a 41.7% chase rate (swings out of the zone)...Trailed only CLE's E. Clase.
- Allowed just one earned run in 28 relief appearances after becoming a member of the Braves...His 0.34 ERA during that span dating to the trade deadline is the lowest in baseball (min. 20 appearances).

Joe Jiménez • RHP • 6-3 • 277 • 28 yrs • #77

Saves/Opp: 0/1 **Holds:** 11 **1st Batter/Retired:** 46/34 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 16/8

- Has pitched to a 1.29 ERA (4 ER/28.0 IP) over his last 28 games, dating to May 27...Among National League relievers since that date, his ERA ranks third (min. 25 games).
- Pitched 62 games for DET last year, going 3-2 with a 3.49 ERA (22 ER/56.2 IP), striking out 77 and walking 13.
- Acquired from Detroit on Dec. 7, 2022 in exchange for OF Justyn-Henry Malloy and LHP Jake Higginbotham.
- Named to the A.L. All-Star team in 2018 during his first full major league campaign.
- Last season, his 12.23 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ranked fifth in the American League among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings, and his 1.4 fWAR for the season matched his career high.

Saves/Opp: 13/15 **Holds:** 7 **1st Batter/Retired:** 55/34 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 10/3

- Yesterday allowed his first earned run in 12 appearances since joining Atlanta...Prior to that occurrence, across 11.1 innings, owned a 0.00 ERA with 13 strikeouts and three walks.
- Across 24 games since June 21, has pitched to a 1.96 ERA (5 ER/23.0 IP).
- Pitching arsenal includes a curveball (56.3%), four-seam fastball (37.1%) and a slider (6.6%).
- Was acquired on July 24 from Colorado in exchange for pitchers RHP Tanner Gordon and RHP Victor Vodnik.
