**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets Brewers, 7-2, last night...The Mets are 76-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 33-10-3 in 46 series this year...The Mets continue a seven-day, six-game road trip (1-0) to Milwaukee (1-0) and Oakland (three games).

**PLAYOFFS:** With the win last night, the Mets have clinched a Postseason berth...The Mets are headed to the Postseason for the first time since 2016 and for the 10th time in franchise history.

**HIGH FIVE:** The Mets have won five straight games...They have posted a 1.80 ERA (nine earned runs/45.0 innings) with six walks and 68 strikeouts in that span...They are hitting .267/.393/.406 in those five games...The Mets are outscoring their opponents 30-10 over the last five games.

**THE BUCK STARTS HERE:** Buck Showalter has now managed four teams to the Postseason...He is the fourth manager to accomplish that feat joining Dusty Baker (five teams) and Billy Martin and Davey Johnson who each guided four separate clubs to the playoffs...Showalter has won 1,644 games in his managerial career...That ranks 20th in MLB history...Next up on the list is Mike Scioscia who won 1,650 career games.

**SWEET 16:** Carlos Carrasco is 15-6 with a 3.70 ERA (58 earned runs/141.0 innings) with 37 walks and 143 strikeouts in 26 starts this season...He is the seeking earn his 16th win of the year...It would be the most wins by a Mets pitcher since R.A. Dickey won 20 games in 2012...He has posted a 5-2 record with a 2.36 ERA (11 earned runs/42.0 innings) with 11 walks and 43 strikeouts in eight starts in the second half.

**HECK OR HIGHWATER:** The Mets are a season-high 39 games over .500...It is their most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for that year...The Mets have won 94 games...That is the third-most in the major leagues...The last time they won more games was in 2006, when they tallied 97 victories...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets are 94-55 through 149 games...That is the second-best mark in Mets history...Only the 1986 team (97-52) posted a better record.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** Pete Alonso has recorded an RBI in seven straight games...It is the longest current streak in the majors and the streak and the longest streak of his career...He is batting .250 (6-24) in that span with seven runs, a double, three home runs, five walks, a .406 OBP and a .557 SLG...Alonso joins Francisco Lindor as the sixth pair of players in franchise history to record an RBI streak of at least seven games in the same season.

**RIB EYE STEAKS:** Pete Alonso ranks second in the majors and tops the National League with 118 RBI this season...He is six RBI from tying the franchise record...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He has 27 game-winning RBI this season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI are tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

**GRAND CENTRAL STATION:** The Mets are 22-9 against the NL Central this year...They are in a stretch of 10 straight games (5-3) against the division...The Mets have posted a 2.83 ERA with 81 walks and 350 strikeouts against the division...They are hitting .263/.353/.401 against the Central...The team's 22 wins against the division are the most since they went 22-10 in 2016...The team's .710 winning percentage against the division is the highest in franchise history.

**YOU CAN FIND ME IN ST. LUCIE:** The St. Lucie Mets defeated the Dunedin Blue Jays, 6-5, in game one of the Florida State League Championship Series on Sunday...Game 2 is tonight at Clover Park at 6:10 p.m. and if necessary Game 3 will be Wednesday at Clover Park at 6:10 p.m...The Mets are seeking their first FSL title since 2006.

**HOW STRIKING:** The Mets have struck out 1,440 batters this season, which places them a top the majors...The team's 1,440 strikeouts are already the fourth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019 followed by 1,453 in 2021 and 1,446 in 2018...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.78 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.3 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

**BREWERS-METS NOTES:** The Mets snapped a nine-game losing streak at American Family Field last night...It was the team's first victory in Milwaukee since May 24, 2018...The Mets are looking for their first series victory in the Cream City since 2013.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets seeking their 45th road win...The team's 45 wins on the road are tied with the 1988 team for seventh most all-time...Their 45 road wins is their highest total since they went 47-34 in 2007...Their .603 road winning percentage is the second-best in franchise history...Only the 1986 (.654) team had a better winning percentage on the road...Their .603 road winning percentage is third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...Overall they are 44-29 on the road this year...New York is batting .264/.334/.426 away from Citi Field...Their .264 road average is the best in the NL and third in the majors and their .334 OBP on the road tops the majors.

**GIVE ME A BREAK:** The Mets have posted a .643 winning percentage (36-20) following the All-Star break...That is the third-highest winning percentage in franchise history, right below the 1969 (.671) and 1988 (.644) squads...The team's 36 wins are tied for tied for fourth-most in the majors...The Mets are batting .268/.344/.432 with 61 home runs in 56 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets rank third in average, first in OBP and fifth in SLG following the break.

**HURTS DONUT:** The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 102 times this year, setting a franchise record...Since 1901, the Reds set the major league record in 2021 after they were hit by 105 pitches...Mark Canha has been plunked 21 times this year, which is second in the majors...His 21 hit by pitches are tied for the second-highest single-season total in franchise history...He joins Pete Alonso (2019) and Jeff McNeil (2019)...Brandon Nimmo set the record with 22 HBP in 2018.

**HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG:** Edwin Diaz leads major league relievers with 107 strikeouts...That is 17 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Diaz has posted a 0.75 ERA (three earned runs/36.0 innings) with 17 hits, eight walks and 69 strikeouts in 35 appearances since the start of June.

**THE ROAD TO 100:** Francisco Lindor has recorded a career-high 95 RBI this season...His 95 RBI are a franchise record for a shortstop...Pete Alonso is second in the majors and owns the National League lead with 118 RBI this season...Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team...The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado and David Wright).

**LINDOR CITY:** Francisco Lindor has hit 24 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 homer runs in 2018, for the most home runs by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .303/.373/.472 with 36 runs, nine doubles, two triples, eight home runs, 29 RBI, 22 walks with an .845 OPS in 56 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the National League with a 6.4 fWAR this season.

**TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE:** Tomás Nido is on a seven-game hitting streak, tying a career-high, batting 12-26 (.462) with six runs, three doubles, two home runs, six RBI, a walk with a .481 OBP and a .808 SLG in that span...He is batting .308 (28-91) with 14 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, 12 RBI, five walks with a .340 OBP and a .473 SLG in 32 games since the All-Star Break.

**EL JEFF-E:** Jeff McNeil is batting .353 (83-235) with 29 runs, 22 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 24 RBI, 15 walks with a .401 OBP and a .494 SLG in 62 road games this year...His .353 road batting average leads the major leagues...He is batting .348/.398/.485 in 53 games following the All-Star break...His .347 average is second in the NL...McNeil has struck out just 59 times in 482 at-bats this year...Overall this season, McNeil ranks sixth among qualified hitters and second in the NL with an 11.0 percent strikeout rate.

**ABOVE AVERAGE:** Jeff McNeil is third in the majors and in the National League with a .320 batting average...He is behind only Freddie Freeman (.329) and Paul Goldschmidt (.322) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .301 with 57 runs, 14 doubles, three triples, 12 home runs, 40 RBI, 38 walks with a .404 OBP, a .504 SLG and a .908 OPS in 72 road games this year...This compares to a .221/.309/.329 slashline with 16 RBI and a .639 OPS in 68 games at home in 2022...His .404 road OBP ranks seventh in the majors and third in the National League.

### CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

**LAST START:** Earned his 15th win of the season after throwing 6.0 innings of one-run ball on September 15 vs. Pittsburgh...Gave up four hits and two walks while striking out a season-high 11 batters...Was his second double-digit strikeout game of the year and 28th of his career...Was his most punchouts in a game since also striking out 11 on September 20, 2020 at Detroit while with Cleveland.

**WINNER, WINNER:** Carrasco won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Has earned 15 wins in a season for the third time in his career...Is tied for the sixth-most wins in the majors...He is the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joins Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017.

**GOTTA EARN 'EM:** Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last 11 starts since July 3, the longest such streak of his career...Allowed three earned runs or fewer in 14 straight appearances (five starts) from September 6, 2019-August 18, 2020 and in 32 straight games (six starts) from April 30-September 7, 2014...Has given up just two earned runs or fewer in each of his last three starts...His 17 starts this season with two earned runs or fewer are tied for the most on the club with Chris Bassitt.

**VS. MILWAUKEE:** Last faced the Brewers on September 26, 2021 at Milwaukee...Suffered the loss through 4.0 innings after allowing five runs on seven hits (one home run) and four walks with three strikeouts...Has gone 3-1 with a 4.43 ERA (11 earned runs/22.1 innings) in four starts against the National League Central this season.

**QUALITY CONTROL:** Has 11 quality starts this season after notching just two such starts last year...Has double-digit quality starts in a single season for the first time since doing so in four straight seasons from 2015-2018...Registered three straight quality starts from July 30-August 9 for the first time since finishing 2020 with six in a row...Has made seven starts with more than 6.0 innings this year, tied for the third-most on the club.

**CLUTCH COOKIE:** Did not allow a run in 22.2 consecutive innings from July 14-August 4, surpassing his previous career-long scoreless streak of 22.0 innings from July 30-August 11, 2015...He threw three straight scoreless starts for the first time in his career from July 14-30...He has three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018...His six scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings are tied for seventh-most in the National League.

**VENEZUELAN BORN:** Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1400.0 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego...Is the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat when he did so in his 274th career game on July 30 at Miami.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER [12-4, 3.42]

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned his second straight victory on September 16 vs. Pittsburgh... Allowed three runs (two earned) on five hits (one home run) with no walks and five strikeouts through 7.1 innings...Was his career-high 12th win.

**GOT 'EM:** Walker's five pickoffs this season are a career-high and the second-most in the majors behind six from Robbie Ray (SEA)...Previously had four pickoffs during the 2021 and 2015 seasons...Since 2021, his nine pickoffs are tied for the second-most in MLB behind Max Fried's (ATL) 10.
