PICK SIX: Pete Alonso has recorded at least 25 home runs in each of his six non-shortened seasons...His six such seasons are the second-most in franchise history, trailing only Strawberry's eight years from 1983-90...Since making his Major League debut in 2019, he is one of four players to record six 25+ homer seasons, joining Aaron Judge, Kyle Schwarber and Juan Soto.

ANOTHER MILESTONE: Pete Alonso's 251 home runs since he joined the league in 2019 are the third-most in the majors, trailing only Kyle Schwarber (252) and Aaron Judge (269)...Alonso's 677 RBI are the most in the majors since 2019.

SINCE YOU'VE BEEN BACK: In 11 games since Francisco Alvarez has returned from Triple-A Syracuse, he is batting .286/.405/.514 (10-35) with seven runs, five extra-base hits, four RBI and seven walks.

IN THE CITI: Last night, Jeff McNeil extended his home on-base streak 18 games...It is the longest such streak by a Met since Mark Vientos' 18-game span from 7/28-9/8/24...It is the second-longest such streak of his career (longest: 26 G from 9/5/20-6/21-G1/21)...He is batting .282/.389/.452 in 40 home games this season, compared to .221/.309/.426 in 38 games on the road.

GUARDIANS-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost five straight games to the Guardians dating back to May 20, 2024...They are 8-3 all-time vs. the club in Queens.

REEDING RAINBOW: Since July 4, Reed Garrett has gone 1-0 with one save with a 0.69 ERA (ER/13.0 IP), three walks and 14 strikeouts over 12 games...He has held batters to a .095/.156/.119 (4-42) slashline in this span.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has allowed just one earned run over his last 34 games, posting a 0.26 ERA (ER/35.0 IP) with 11 walks and 52 strikeouts since April 23...His 0.26 ERA is the lowest by a Mets reliever in any 34-game span in franchise history and is the best 34-game span of his career.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets have posted a 38-20 record at home, which is tied for the sixth-best start at home in franchise history...Their .655 home winning percentage is the second-best in the majors this season, while their 38 wins are tied for the second-most in The Show.

BLADES OF STEAL: The Mets have safely stolen 32 consecutive bases, the longest active streak in the majors...It's the longest single season for the Mets since they recorded 35 straight steals from May 14-June 29, 2023...They lead the majors with a 90.0% stolen base rate...This is the highest stolen base rate in franchise history...The previous high was set in 2023 (88.7%)...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the majors...Juan Soto has stolen a career-high 16 bases this year...Brandon Nimmo has swiped 12 bases...His career-best is 15 which he accomplished in 2024.

TWO AWAY: Edwin Díaz has 248 saves in 502 career games in the major leagues...According to *Ellas*, his 248 saves are the ninth most saves for any pitcher through his first 500 career games and the most for any active pitcher...The most saves in first 500 career MLB games among active pitchers: Díaz (248), Kenly Jansen (244), Aroldis Chapman (240), Josh Hader (227 in 465 games), Raisel Iglesias (212).

LAST TIME OUT: Will set a new career high in starts today...He did not factor into the decision in his last start on August 1 vs. San Francisco (6.0 IP, 4 H, 2 ER, 2 BB, 4 K)...With 6.0 IP pitched, he surpassed his previous career high in innings (121.0 IP in 2024)...He retired all seven of his final batters faced...He recorded his fifth consecutive quality start, which is tied for the longest such streak of his career (also: 5 QS from 8/14-9/3/24).

ON A ROLL: Over his last five starts (since July 3), has gone 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA (5 ER/31.2 IP), nine walks and 22 strikeouts...Each of those outings were quality starts...Among pitchers since July 1 (min. 25.0 IP), he ranks sixth in ERA (fourth in NL), ninth in opponents' SLG (.272, sixth in NL) and 12th in groundball percentage (51.6, eighth in NL).

SUMMER HEAT: Made four starts in the month of July, going 2-0 with a 1.05 ERA (3 ER/25.2 IP)...His July ERA was his lowest in a single calendar month of his career (min. 15.0 IP) and the fifth-best by a Mets pitcher in the month of July in franchise history (min. 25.0 IP)...His ERA was also the eighth-best in a single calendar month by a left-hander in franchise history (min. 25.0 IP), trailing only Jerry Koosman's 1.04 ERA in April 1968, Koosman's 0.72 ERA in June 1969, Jon Matlack's 0.86 ERA in 1972, Frank Viola's 0.86 ERA in April 1991, Al Leiter's 0.92 ERA in April 2002, Tug McGraw's 0.64 ERA in September 1973, Jose Quintana's 0.72 ERA in September 2024...Courtesy of *Elias*.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Mets are 10-1 in Peterson's home starts this season...The team's 10 consecutive wins in Peterson's starts was the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history...The team's 11 straight home wins in David Cone's starts to open the 1989 season are the most...Courtesy of *Elias*...The southpaw has gone 5-0 with a 2.00 ERA (15 ER/67.1 IP), 18 walks and 53 strikeouts at home this year...Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of those 11 games and two runs or fewer in 10...His 15 earned runs allowed in his first 11 home starts are tied for the seventh lowest in franchise history...The Mets are 16-4 in his 19 home starts since the beginning of 2024 and 41-18 in Peterson's games at home in his career.

SEASONS GREETINGS: Over 21 starts this season, has gone 7-4 with a 2.83 ERA (40 ER/127.0 IP), 43 walks and 105 strikeouts...He has allowed three earned runs or less in 19 of his 21 starts this season and in 20 of his last 22 starts dating back to September 29, 2024...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, is third in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.50, second in NL), tied for fifth in opponent GIDP (16, tied for third in NL) and seventh in groundball percentage (54.7, fifth in NL)...Is also fifth in the NL in opponents' SLG (.331) and seventh in ERA.

YEAR IN REVIEW: Since making his season debut last year on May 29, 2024, Peterson has allowed three runs or fewer in 35 of his 42 starts, going 17-7 with a 2.87 ERA (79 ER/248.0 IP), 89 walks and 206 strikeouts...26 of those outings have been quality starts...The Mets are 27-15 over games in which Peterson has started in that span...Since 2024, has allowed just five runs in the first inning, which is tied with Paul Skenes for the fewest in the majors during that span (min. 40 G)...Since May 29, 2024 (min. 40 GS), he is second in HR/9.0 IP (0.54, first in the NL), sixth in groundball percentage (52.6, fourth in NL), and eighth in ERA (third in NL) opponents' SLG (.339, third in NL).

CHECKING IT OFF: Peterson will make his first career start vs. Cleveland today, which is the 26th team he will face in his career...The only teams he has yet to face are now Detroit, Kansas City, Houston and the Mets...Has made four starts vs. Interleague opponents this season, posting a 1.90 ERA (5 ER/23.2 IP)...Has allowed two runs or fewer in each of those four games and his last three Interleague outings were each quality starts.

LEFTY LEADERBOARD: Today's game will mark a new career high in starts for Peterson (previous: 21 starts in 2023 and 2024)...He has recorded 14 starts of at least 6.0 innings and he is one of nine left-handers to do so this year...Has 569 career strikeouts, the ninth-most by a franchise southpaw...John Franco is next on the list with 592...Vs. left-handers this season, has posted a .215/.263/.280 slash line (23-107) and has allowed just one home run to 115 batters faced...Among qualified left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he is third in groundball percentage (67.1) and is tied for seventh in strikeouts (34)...Among NL southpaws facing lefties, he is seventh in opponents' OPS (.544), eighth in opponents' SLG and opponents' OBP, and ninth in opponents' BA...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning, retiring three straight batters after the leadoff hitter got to third (2 K) on August 4 vs. Cleveland...He has not allowed an earned run in 19 consecutive appearances dating back to June 6, which is tied for the tenth-longest single-season streak in Mets history and his longest such streak since his 21-game span from 6/22-8/17/22.
- On August 4, was named as the NL Reliever of the Month for July after going 2-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA (11.0 IP) over 10 appearances...He held opposing batters to just a .114 average (4-35) and posted four walks compared to 18 strikeouts (14.73 K/9.0 IP)...Marks the 10th Reliever of the Month Award of his career (fifth as a Met), which is the most by any player since the honor was established in 2005...Was also named the NL Reliever of the Month for May...He is the only pitcher to win a monthly award multiple times this year.
- Snapped his season-high 17.1 scoreless inning streak after allowing the free runner to score in the 10th inning on August 1 against San Francisco...It was the longest active scoreless streak in the majors and marked his first loss since September 15, 2024.
- Has allowed just one earned run over his last 34 games, posting a 0.26 ERA (ER/35.0 IP) with 11 walks and 52 strikeouts since April 23...His 0.26 ERA is the lowest by a Mets reliever in any 34-game span in franchise history and is the best 34-game span of his career...During that same span, his 0.26 ERA is the best in the majors and his .144 opponents' BA is the third best (min. 30.0 IP)...The next-best ERA is Nathan Eovaldi's 0.90 ERA in that span...Has not allowed a home run in each of his last 34 outings (since April 23), which is the fourth-longest such streak of his career (most: 52 games from 5/14/22-4/7/24)...Has not allowed a home run to each of his last 159 right-handed batters faced dating back to May 6, 2024...It is the fifth-longest active streak in the majors among RHP vs. RHB, trails Cade Smith (207 BF), Josiah Gray (183 BF), Jhoan Duran (172 BF) and Joe Jimenez (164 BF)...Courtesy of *Elias*.
- With two outs and runners in scoring position, has allowed just one hit in 21 at-bats.
- Among qualified relievers this season, is third in ERA (1.41, first in NL), tied for fourth in K/9.0 IP (13.50, first in NL), fifth in opponents' BA (.159, first in NL), sixth in opponents' SLG (.219, second in NL) and opponents' OPS (.490, second in NL), and ninth in saves (23, fourth in NL) and strikeouts (67, third in NL)...Among pitchers who have thrown at least 40.0 innings this season, his 40.7 swing and miss percentage is the best in the National Leagues and fifth-best in the majors.
- His 40 Interleague saves are tied for the 10th-most in the majors (since 1997) and his 28 such saves as a Met are the most in franchise history...Has made nine career appearances vs. Cleveland, recording four saves and a 0.96 ERA (ER/9.1 IP)...Has held Guardian batters to a .097 average (3-31) with three walks and 18 strikeouts.
- This season, he has gone 3-1 with 14 saves, a 1.30 ERA (4 ER/27.2 IP), nine walks and 45 strikeouts over 28 appearances at home...Has not allowed an earned run at home over his last 22 appearances (since April 23), which is the fifth-longest such streak in franchise history (longest: Pedro Feliciano's 37 G span from 9/23/08-8/3/09)...In 179 career appearances at Citi Field, he has posted a 2.00 ERA (40 ER/180.1 IP) with 80 saves.
- Over 43 games this season, has gone 5-1 with 23 saves, a 1.41 ERA (7 ER/44.2 IP), 17 walks and 67 strikeouts...The Mets are 35-9 in games that Díaz has pitched in...Hitters have posted a .159 (24-151) average against Díaz this season...Has recorded four saves this season of four outs or more, tying Tigers' Will Vest for the most-such games in the majors this season...His six saves this season with three-plus strikeouts are the most such games in the majors...He has 57 career saves with three or more strikeouts are the most since his debut in 2016...Josh Hader is second with 44.
- Has posted a 45.6 whiff rate and a 32.2 put away percentage with his slider this season, the pitch accounting for 37 of his 67 strikeouts.
- Among relievers in franchise history, he ranks second in strikeouts (507), third in saves (139), eighth in appearances (314) and tied for eighth in wins (23).
- Reached the 800-career strikeout milestone in 492.1 innings pitched, which is the fourth-fewest innings to reach the milestone for any pitcher in MLB history...*Courtesy of Elias*...The others are Chapman (480.2 IP), Josh Hader (489.2 IP) and Kimbrel (490.0 IP)...He is one of seven active players to reach the 800-strikeout mark as a reliever.
- Became the 11th pitcher in Major League history to record at least 20 saves in at least seven of their first nine seasons (since saves became an official stat in 1969), joining Craig Kimbrel, Jonathan Papelbon, Troy Percival, Trevor Hoffman, Bruce Sutter, Aroldis Chapman, Kenley Jansen, Huston Street, Mariano Rivera and Robb Nen.
- Was named to the 2025 National League All-Star team...It marks the third time in his career he's gone to the Midsummer classic and the second time as a member of the Mets (also 2022)...He was an American League All-Star with Seattle in 2018...Named the Trevor Hoffman NL Reliever of the Year in 2022...Finished ninth in the NL Cy Young Award balloting.
