TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Blue Jays open a two-game set tonight with the first of four meetings between the teams this season...The clubs will play again next week, September 2-3, with two games in Atlanta.

A The Braves and Blue Jays are meeting for the third consecutive year and for the fourth time in five seasons...The Braves have won four of their last five games here, scoring 39 total runs (7.8 per game) over the stretch.

A The Braves have won or split their last four series here, going 2-0-2 in this span...They last dropped a set here in 2008, when Toronto took two-of-three.

A RHP Mike Soroka is set to face Toronto for the second time in his career after he went 4.2 innings on June 19 of last season here at the Rogers Centre...The righty allowed four runs, earned, and eight hits in a 11-4 win.

A RHP Wilmer Font is scheduled to face the Braves for the third time in his career and for the first time as a starter...The righty worked in relief against the Braves twice while with the Mets, collecting a win and retiring all nine batters he faced.

ON THE ROAD: Despite yesterday's loss, the Braves have the best road record in the National League at 41-26 (.612), and trail only Tampa Bay's mark (42-25, .627) for the best in the majors.

A Since May 10, the Braves have not lost more than two consecutive road games, and have gone 33-16 (.673) over this stretch.

A The Braves have 102 home runs on the road this season, marking the first time the club has hit triple-digits since 2006 (122)...This year is just the 10th time in the franchise's modern era the club has hit at least 100 road home runs in a single season.

A The record is 124, set by the 1957 Braves and matched by the 2003 club.

SOROKA IN CANADA: RHP Mike Soroka Makes his second career start against the Blue Jays, and his second in Toronto...He was born in Calgary, Alberta.

A Soroka is just the second Canadian-born Braves pitcher and only Atlanta starter to pitch in his native country...RHP Claude Raymond, born in Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu, Quebec, earned the win with 2.0 innings of scoreless relief on 5/16/69 vs. the Expos in Montreal.

A With his start last season, Soroka became the youngest Canadian-born pitcher to ever pitch in Canada...The previous youngest was Milwaukee's Barry Cort, a Toronto native, who tossed a two-run complete game on 5/3/77 vs. the Blue Jays at the age of 21 years, 18 days.

A Soroka is the third Canadian-born pitcher to start in Toronto against the Blue Jays this season (James Paxton, June 5; Cal Quantrill, May 25).

DONALDSON RETURNS: 3B Josh Donaldson is set to face the Blue Jays for the first time since the club traded him to Cleveland last August...The third baseman appeared in 462 games for Toronto, joining the club in 2015 and hitting 116 home runs while compiling a .931 OPS...He won the American League MVP in 2015, while helping the Blue Jays to the postseason that year and the next.

A Donaldson is a career .292 (263-for-901) with 63 home runs in 244 games here at the Rogers Centre.

A He last played here on May 24, 2018 vs. Los Angeles (AL), going 1-for-4 with a single...His last home run here came on April 3, 2018 vs. Chicago (AL) and Miguel Gonzalez.

SOROKA ON THE ROAD: RHP Mike Soroka makes his 14th start of the season on the road, and is a perfect 6-0 with a 1.32 ERA (12 ER/81.2 IP) in 13 starts away from home...He has a 3.90 ERA (26 ER/60.0 IP) at SunTrust Park.

A Soroka's 1.32 ERA on the road is best in the majors among qualified starters, and nearly a full point lower than the closest pitcher (Jacob deGrom, 2.30).

A His six wins on the road are most in the majors without a loss.

A Soroka's 1.32 ERA is the second-lowest mark by a Braves pitcher on the road since 1913...Greg Maddux went a perfect 13-0 and pitched to a 1.12 ERA in 15 starts on the road in 1995.

A He last started on the road, August 10 at Miami, and pitched 7.0 scoreless innings.

STARTERS: RHP Julio Teheran tossed 6.0 scoreless innings yesterday a day after LHP Dallas Keuchel went 7.0 shutout innings against the Mets.

A These two games marked the first time the Braves had consecutive scoreless starts since July 14 and July 15 at San Diego and Milwaukee...RHP Mike Soroka went 7.0 scoreless, before LHP Max Fried tossed 5.0 shutout innings.

A The Braves have had three consecutive scoreless starts once this season, May 15-May 17.

A Over the Braves' last 10 games, the rotation is 3-0 with 2.49 ERA (17 ER/61.1 IP) and 61 strikeouts...A starter has not lost since August 15 (Julio Teheran).

REHABILITATION: The Braves today transferred RHP Darren O'Day's major league rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida.

A O'Day made his season debut on August 23 with the rookie-level GCL Braves, tossing a scoreless inning with two strikeouts...O'Day has missed the entire year with a right forearm strain.

A OF Austin Riley played with Triple-A Gwinnett last night, going 2-for-5 as the designated hitter.

- A* Set for his 24th start of the season and 29th of his career.
- A* Makes his second career start against the Blue Jays, and his second in Toronto...Was born in Calgary, Alberta.
- A* Pitched against them in his final start of last season, June 19 here at the Rogers Centre...Allowed eight hits and four runs over 4.2 innings in a no-decision...Atlanta won, 11-4.
- A* Is just the second Canadian-born Braves pitcher and only Atlanta starter to pitch in his native country...RHP Claude Raymond, born in Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu, Quebec, earned the win with 2.0 innings of scoreless relief on 5/16/69 vs. the Expos in Montreal.
- A* With his start last season, became the youngest Canadian-born pitcher to ever pitch in Canada...The previous youngest was MIL's Barry Cort, a Toronto native, who tossed a two-run complete game on 5/3/77 vs. the Blue Jays at the age of 21 years, 18 days.
- A* Ranks third in the majors with a 2.41 ERA (38 ER/141.2 IP).
- A* The Dodgers' Hyun-Jin Ryu has a 2.00 ERA to lead the majors, while Washington's Max Scherzer also has 2.41 ERA, percentage points better than Soroka.
- A* Soroka's current ERA is the second best by a Braves rookie in the live-ball era (since 1920)...Right-hander Jim Turner went 20-11 with a 2.38 ERA for the 1937 Boston Bees.
- A* Soroka's ERA is the lowest by any rookie in the majors since 2013, when Miami's José Fernandez compiled a 2.19 mark over 28 starts.
- A* Makes his 14th start of the season on the road, and is a perfect 6-0 with a 1.32 ERA (12 ER/81.2 IP) in 13 starts away from home...Has a 3.90 ERA (26 ER/60.0 IP) in his home park.
- A* Soroka's 1.32 ERA on the road is best in the majors among qualified starters, and nearly a full point lower than the closest pitcher (Jacob deGrom, 2.30).
- A* His six wins on the road are most in the majors without a loss.
- A* Soroka's 1.32 ERA is the second-lowest mark by a Braves pitcher on the road since 1913...Greg Maddux went a perfect 13-0 and pitched to a 1.12 ERA in 15 starts on the road in 1995.

- A* Atlanta is 3-3 over his last six turns, despite Soroka's 2.29 ERA during the stretch...Four of the six games have been decided in the game's final inning.

2019 Recap

- A* Turned 22 years old, August 4...Went 12-3 with a 2.58 ERA (40 ER/139.2 IP) in 24 starts aged 21 or younger.
- A* Soroka's 24 starts before turning 22 are fourth-most in franchise history since 1908, and the most since Steve Avery made 56 such starts.
- A* He is one of 145 pitchers in the live-ball era (since 1920) to make at least 24 starts aged 21 or younger...Of those 145 pitchers, Soroka's 2.58 ERA was fifth lowest, trailing just José Fernandez (2.25 in 36 starts), Dwight Gooden (2.28 in 99 starts), Mark Fidrych (2.34 in 29 starts) and Vida Blue (2.36 in 49 starts).
- A* Lost to Washington, 7/20 at SunTrust Park, to snap a 10-game winning streak that spanned 15 starts...Allowed nine hits and four runs over 6.0 innings.
- A* Became just the sixth Braves pitcher in the live-ball era (since 1920) with a double-digit win streak and the first since Greg Maddux also won 10 straight in 2001.
- A* John Smoltz holds the franchise record during the live-ball era, winning 14 consecutive decisions during the 1996 season.
- A* Went 9-1 with a 2.42 ERA (24 ER/89.1 IP) over 15 starts to open the season, and became the youngest pitcher in franchise history to be named an All-Star.
- A* Made his All-Star Game debut with a scoreless sixth inning, July 9 at Progressive Field...Retired Whit Merrifield, Carlos Santana and Dan Vogelbach.
- A* Beat the Mets, 6-2, in his start on 6/28 to move to 9-1 on the season, the most wins by a rookie pitcher before the All-Star break.
- A* No Braves rookie has ever had double-digit wins at the break...Soroka is tied with Lou Fette (9-3 in 1937) and Jair Jurrjens (9-4 in 2008) for the most.
- A* Allowed a then season-high four runs, including three earned, 6/1 vs. DET...The outing snapped a streak of eight straight starts allowing one earned run or less to start the season.
- A* Was the third major league starter in the live-ball era to open his season with eight consecutive starts of one earned run or less, and the first Braves pitcher to do so...Edinson Volquez (2008) and Mike Norris (1980) also did so.

Career Recap

- A* Selected by Atlanta with the 28th overall pick in the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.
- A* Is 23-20 with a 2.84 ERA (117 ER/370.2 IP) over 69 career minor league games, including 67 total starts.

- Is 1-0 with a 4.21 ERA (12 ER/25.2 IP) in 35 games with Atlanta...Twenty-eight of his 35 appearances have been scoreless, including 15 of his last 19.
- Converted his first save chance of the season, 8/14 vs. NYM...Was the seventh save of his career.
- Celebrated 10 years of major league service time on July 27.
- Has a 27.00 ERA (6 ER/2.0 IP) against LAD this season...Has a 3.42 ERA (6 ER/23.2 IP) against all other teams.
- Twenty of his 35 appearances have been less than 1.0 inning.
- Holding left-handed batters to a .174 (8-for-46) average with 15 strikeouts...Righties are 13-for-51 (.255).
- Atlanta acquired him from the Oakland A's on 4/28 in exchange for cash considerations...Was designated for assignemnt by Atlanta on 5/14 and re-signed to a major league contract on 5/18.

- Is 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA (7 ER/10.1 IP) in 12 games with the Braves, and 0-3 with a 2.23 ERA (12 ER/48.1 IP) in 50 games on the season...He has converted 22 of 27 save opportunities.
- Has six consecutive scoreless appearances spanning 6.0 innings, allowing just three hits and striking out nine.
- Allowed runs in four of his first six appearances with the Braves, and allowed all four inherited runners to score.
- Made his Braves debut on 8/3 vs. CIN, allowing a run in the ninth inning to blow a save.
- Acquired from Detroit on 7/31 in exchange for LHP Joey Wentz and OF Travis Demeritte...Prior to joining the Braves ranked fourth in the American League with his 22 saves, while his 1.18 ERA was the second lowest in baseball to San Diego's Kirby Yates among qualifying relievers.

- Is 1-3 with a 3.70 ERA (20 ER/48.2 IP) in 50 games on the season, including a 5.91 ERA (7 ER/10.2 IP) in 12 games with Atlanta...Has a 2.64 FIP with the Braves.
- Allowed one run on two hits yesterday to snap a five-appearance scoreless streak...Had retired 15 of 17 batters faced, striking out five...Earned his third hold with the Braves, 8/24 at NYM.
- Acquired from Texas on 7/30 in exchange for LHP Kolby Allard...Made his Braves debut on 8/2 vs. CIN with a perfect eighth inning.
- Went 0-2 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP) in 38 games out of the bullpen for Texas this season with 43 strikeouts and just four walks.
- Before joining Atlanta, had a rate of 0.95 BB/9 which ranked fifth best among qualifying relievers in the majors.

- Has converted each of his five save chances with Atlanta, last on 8/25 at NYM...Was his 188th career save.
- Allowed four runs in 0.1 inning, 8/10 at MIA...The outing stopped an 11-game scoreless streak that dated to 7/14.
- Acquired from San Francisco in exchange for RHP Dan Winkler and Tristan Beck on 7/31...Was 4-2 with a 3.50 ERA (18 ER/46.1 IP) in 43 appearances out of the San Francisco pen.
