TONIGHT'S TILT... the Mariners continue a 9-game homestand tonight with the first of 4 games against the Texas Rangers...the Mariners split a 2-game set with San Diego (1-1) to open the homestand and will also see the New York Yankees (3 G, 9/17-9/19) to finish the penultimate homestand of the season... tonight's game against the Rangers will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** on the call, and broadcast live on **Seattle Sports** (710 AM) with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims**.

<u>ODDS AND ENDS</u>...the Mariners won last night's game 5-2 against the Padres to secure the season series (3-1)...the Mariners own a 3-1-2 series record over their last 6 series (8/23-c), going 10-8 in that span.

- Let's Get Wild The Mariners trail Minnesota by 4.0 games for the 3rd Wild Card spot.
- Take Five The Mariners are 49-4 (.925) when they score 5+ runs in a game, <u>best such record</u> in the Majors...Seattle is 25-68 (.269) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs.
- Perry Hill Enjoyer Seattle is tied for the 3rd-highest infield (1B/2B/3B/SS) fielding percentage (.985) in the American League (also: Minnesota), trailing only Texas (.989) and Kansas City (.986).
- The Dan and 'Gar Differential The Mariners have outscored their opponents by 31 runs (93 R, 62 RA) since Dan Wilson took over the as Mariners Manager and Edgar Martinez as hitting coach.
- 20-20 Vision Randy Arozarena has 19 HR and 20 SB this season, 1 HR shy of his 4th-consecutive 20-20 season (2021-c)...with his next home run, he would join José Ramírez-CLE as the only players to record 20+ HR and 20+ SB in each of the last 4 seasons.

<u>CAL RALEIGH: SILVER AND GOLD?</u>...Mariners catcher **Cal Raleigh** is a candidate to win both the <u>Silver Slugger</u> and <u>Gold Glove</u> awards at catcher this season:

- The Offense Cal ranks among the American League leaders at catcher (min. 300 PA) in home runs (30, 1st), runs (64, 1st), RBI (92, 2nd), stolen bases (6, T-1st), wRC+ (113, T-5th), OPS+ (4th, 116), bWAR (4.1, 1st) and fWAR (4.5, 1st)...Cal leads MLB catchers in home runs for the 3rd-consecutive season, after pacing the Majors with 30 home runs in 2023 and 27 in 2022, and is set to become the first catcher to lead the Majors in homers in 3+ consecutive seasons since Mike Piazza did it in 4-consecutive seasons (1999-2002)...Cal is also the 12th catcher in MLB history with multiple 30+ HR seasons and the 3rd to do it within his first 4 MLB seasons (also: Mike Piazza and Rudy York).
- The Defense Cal leads American League catchers in defensive runs saved (18) and strike zone runs saved (11) per *Sports Info Solutions*, catcher framing runs (12) per *Baseball Savant*, catcher caught stealing (24), games played (112) and innings (1006.0), while ranking 2nd in catcher ERA (3.28)...Cal is tied for the MLB-lead in catcher caught stealing after leading the Majors in that category in 2023, and could become the 3rd catcher to lead the Majors in CCS in consecutive seasons, joining Jim Sundberg in 1975-76 (Sundberg tied for the Major League lead in '75) and Hall of Famer Gary Carter in 1982-83.

BIG TEX IS DEALING...Bryce Miller is 5-1 with a 2.11 ERA (15 ER, 64.0 IP), 10 walks, 60 strikeouts and a 0.91 WHIP over his last 11 starts since July 4 and is 3-1 with a 1.56 ERA (6 ER, 34.2 IP), 8 walks, 38 strikeouts and a 0.78 WHIP over his last 6 starts since Aug. 9...among qualified pitchers since July 1, Miller ranks 4th in the Majors in ERA, trailing only Blake Snell-SF (1.45 ERA), Chris Sale-ATL (1.85) and Framber Valdez-HOU (2.00).

KIKITO AND KEKA'S DAD...over his last 17 games (8/17-c), outfielder Victor Robles is batting .411 (23x56) with 12 runs, 6 doubles, 1 home run, 11 RBI, 5 walks and is 7-for-7 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .485 clip, slugging .571 with a 1.056 OPS...his 1.056 OPS is 5th-best in the Majors during that span (min. 50 PA)...overall with the Mariners, Robles is batting .313 (57x182) with an .838 OPS in 63 games, and set a franchise record for most consecutive stolen bases (20) without getting caught to begin a Mariners career.

RALEY GOOD...Luke Raley has reached base safely in 6 consecutive games, recording a hit in 5-of-6 games during that span (9/5-c)...Raley is batting .282 (24x85) with 17 runs, 6 doubles, 8 home runs, 23 RBI and a 1.035 OPS over his last 29 games (8/2-c), ranking 5th in the Majors in OPS during that span (min. 100 PA)...Luke hit his 19th home run of the season on Tuesday, tying his career-high (19) set in 2023...with his next home run, Luke will become the first Mariners left-handed batter to record 20+ home runs in a season since Kyle Seager (35 HR) in 2021.

PITCHING PROMINENCE...the Mariners pitching staff leads the American League in ERA (3.52), trailing only Atlanta (3.50) for best in MLB...Seattle is attempting to lead the American League in ERA in back-to-back seasons (3.74 ERA in 2023) and the Majors in ERA for the first time since 2001 (3.54 ERA)...this season, the Mariners pitching staff also leads MLB in opponent batting average (.221), WHIP (1.08), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.33), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.42), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.81), opponent OPS (.654) and quality starts (86).

STUNNING STARTERS....the Mariners starting rotation <u>leads MLB</u> in ERA (3.39), opponent batting average (.224), WHIP (1.03), fewest walks-per-9 innings (1.75), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.54), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.83) and quality starts (86)...the 4.83 SO/BB ratio would be the <u>best in Major League history</u> by starters, ranking ahead of the 2019 Dodgers (4.55 SO/BB)...the Mariners have 5 pitchers with 10+ quality starts and 4 with 15+ this season: **Logan Gilbert** (22), **Luis Castillo** (18), **George Kirby** (17), **Bryce Miller** (15) and **Bryan Woo** (10) have all reached double-digits, the only team in the Majors to boast 5 starters with 10+ quality starts and 4 starters with 15+.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...the Mariners continue a 9-game homestand tonight with Apple Cup Night, Bark at the Park and the final Mariners Value Game of the season at T-Mobile Park...remaining promotions and ticket specials on the current homestand include: Dance Party Fireworks Night (Sept. 13), Luis Castillo POP! Collectible Night (Sept. 14), Oktoberfest (Sept. 14), Hispanic Heritage Day (Sept. 15), Seattle College Night (Sept. 17), Flannel Night (Sept. 18) and Frasier Day (Sept. 19).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Bryce Miller is 11-8 with a 3.18 ERA (57 ER, 161.1 IP), 38 walks and 151 strikeouts in his age-25 season while Bryan Woo is 8-2 with a 2.38 ERA (28 ER, 105.2 IP), 10 walks and 82 strikeouts in his age-24 season, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that Miller and Woo are just the 5th and 6th Mariners pitchers age-25-or-younger to make at least 19 starts with a 3.20 ERA-or-better, and the first pair of teammates to do so in the same season?...they join Scott Bankhead (1988), Freddy García (2001) Félix Hernández (2x, 2009-10) and Logan Gilbert (2022).

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 29th start of 2024 and his 2nd against Texas... marks his 54th career start and 4th against the Rangers.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller.
- Spent 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21...also spent 2 seasons playing for Brazos Valley Bombers of the Texas Collegiate League in 2018 and 2020, and 1 season with the Falmouth Commodores of the Cape Cod League in 2019.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas
- LAST TIME OUT...W#11 on 9/6 at St. Louis...pitched 6.0 innings and allowed 0 runs on 3 hits and 2 walks with 8 strikeouts.

HOME SWEET HOME...in his last 13 starts at home (4/12c), he has a 6-2 record, a 1.70 ERA (15 ER, 79.1 IP), 90 strikeouts and 16 walks...in 12 of the 13 starts he has allowed 2-or-fewer runs and has quality starts in 10 of the 13 starts...his 2.03 ERA (19 ER. 84.1 IP) across all home

starts this season is the 2nd lowest on the Mariners pitching staff, behind Bryan Woo with a 1.50 ERA (7 ER, 42.0 IP).

LUCKY 11...over his last 11 starts (7/4-c) he holds a 5-1 record with a 2.11 FRA (15 ER, 64.0 IP), 6 home run and 10 walks allowed with 60 strikeouts...during this span his 2.11 ERA ranks 2nd in the American League among pitchers with at least 8 starts.

LEFTY VS. RIGHTY...left-handed batters are slashing .216/.277/.413 (68x315) with 27 walks, 75 strikeouts, 15 doubles and 15 home runs in 2024 compared to right-handed batters slashing .196/.234/.283 (54x276) with 11 walks, 76 strikeouts, 9 doubles and 5 home runs.

RUN LIMITER...leads the Major Leagues with starts of at least 6.0 IP and 0 ER allowed with 9 starts...ahead of, Zach Wheeler-PHI (8), Logan Gilbert-SEA (7), Hunter Brown-HOU (7)...Miller has also tied Hisashi Iwakuma's franchise record (8 in 2013) for most 6.0+ scorless IP starts in a season in Mariners history.

IT WORKS 80% OF THE TIME, EVERYTIME...hitters this season are batting .183 (95x517) against his 4-seam fastball, splitter and sinker combined...76.9% of his pitches thrown this year have been one of those three...128 of his 151 strikeouts this season have come via a 4-seam fastball (59), splitter (46) or sinker (23) and he has allowed 16 doubles and 15 home runs on those pitches.

NO FREE BASES: ...through his first 28 starts allowed the fewest amount of base runners in Mariners history with 163 and is the only Mariners pitcher to allow less than 165 baserunners through their first 28 starts in a season...

HAVING SUPPORT...this season, when Miller receives 3 runs of run support while he is still in the game, he is 8-0 in 11 such outings...in those 11 outings this season, the Mariners are 9-2.

YOU GOTTA EARN IT ... has given up 2 ER or fewer in 19 of 28 games this season tied with George Kirby (19) for the most by a Mariner starter and tied for 4th most in the AL.

SOME QUALITY TIME...has tossed 24 quality starts (6.0+ IP, 3 ER or less) in 53 career outings...in games where he tosses a quality start the Mariners are 20-4

NATIONAL PAST TIME...in 2024, he is 6-1 against National League opponents with a 2.22 ERA (17 ER, 69.0 IP) and a .209 average against (37x202)...7 of the 10 outings have been quality starts with 8 of the 10 outings having 3-orless runs allowed...in those outings he has also posted a 0.88 WHIP.

SUMMER SHOWOUT...since June 29, he holds a 2.22 ERA (17 ER, 69.0 IP) with 5 wins, 6 quality starts and an opponent batting average of .209

YOU SHALL NOT SCORE... tossed 16.0 consecutive scoreless innings starting in the 1st inning of his start vs. New York-NL (8/9) and ending in his start vs. Los Angeles-NL (8/20) in the 4th.

250 AND COUNTING...recorded his 250th career strikeout in his start against Los Angeles-NL on 8/21 after striking out Teoscar Hernandez-LAD in the 1st inning...through his first 50 career starts, he tallied 252 strikeouts, the 7th-most in franchise history through 50 starts.

MAKING MARINERS HISTORY...over his first 50 starts Miller is tied with James Paxton for the least amount of total bases allowed (406)...Bryce is also 8th in franchise history with 252 strikeouts, 2nd in walks with 59 and, 8th with a 3.80 ERA.

MAKING IT LOOK EASY...he became the only pitcher in MLB history to have 6.0+ innings pitched and allow 3-or-fewer baserunners in his first 3 career starts...his 3-game streak of 6.0+ innings pitched and 3-or-fewer baserunners allowed is tied for the longest since 1901...Blake Snell-SDP and Corbin Burnes-MIL were the most recent pitchers to achieve this feat, both doing so in 2021.

...in 2024 has added a split-finger fastball to his pitch arsenal...in his 28 starts of the season, opposing hitters are batting .164 (21x128) against the pitch with 46 strikeouts...opponents are slugging .250 off his splitter which is lowest of any pitch in his arsenal.
